V. Informational Items



A. Executive Director Report

Special Education Child Count Across MAWSECO Districts

Minnesota's annual child count reports provide a snapshot of children and youth (birth through age 22) who are eligible for and receiving special education services, using data collected through the MARSS system and reported to the U.S. Department of Education. To be included, a student must have a current IEP (less than one year old as of December 1), a recent evaluation (within three years), and be actively receiving services on that date. Statewide, 18.71% of students receive special education services, while MAWSECO districts average slightly lower at 18.28%, with individual district rates ranging from 15.10% to 23.89%.

New Federal Requirement for School-Based Medicaid Providers

A new federal requirement mandates that individual school-based providers obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI) for districts to bill Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) for IEP-related health services. The NPI is a 10-digit identifier required under HIPAA that identifies the licensed professional delivering Medicaid-billable services. Providers such as audiologists, mental health professionals, occupational therapists, physical therapists, and speech-language pathologists must complete a two-step process to obtain a Type 1 NPI by September 1, 2026. Guidance is still pending on whether school nurses and psychologists are included. Additional details will be shared by the Minnesota Departments of Education and Human Services at the Medicaid in Education Spring Forum on April 28, 2026, with MAWSECO leadership expected to provide further updates and support afterward.

Staffing Updates

MAWSECO is entering the 2026–2027 school year with several positive staffing updates, including being fully staffed with Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs) for the first time in years and a fully staffed Birth–2 team, bolstered by a speech-language pathologist transitioning to a full-time role. The Village Ranch Alternative Program has filled two teaching positions internally, while efforts continue to fill resulting vacancies. The Cooperative is also transitioning from contracted custodial services to an in-house model with a new Buildings and Grounds Technician role. Additionally, HLWW will partner with MAWSECO for a part-time Due Process Specialist, restructuring an existing role, and Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose Public Schools will share Audiologist and Deaf/Hard of Hearing Teacher positions to maintain service continuity. Remaining certified staff vacancies include positions for a School Psychologist in Delano, a General/Special Education Teacher for Wings, and a Floating Special Education Teacher.

Disproportionality Status Update

Under IDEA regulations, states must identify districts with significant disproportionality in special education identification, placement, or discipline, and districts that meet thresholds for three consecutive years must reserve 15% of



federal funds for early intervening services. Last year, Maple Lake District was identified for a second consecutive year due to disproportionate identification of White students with Speech-Language Impairments. Over the past two years, MAWSECO leadership and district speech therapists worked to address the underlying issues, and as a result, the district no longer meets criteria for significant disproportionality and did not receive a notice this year.

Spring All-Staff Inservice

MAWSECO's end-of-year all-staff inservice will be held on Friday, June 5. The keynote session, "Managing Stress Naturally in Trauma-Exposed Work: Protecting Those Who Protect Others," will focus on how ongoing exposure to stress and trauma affects staff and will offer practical strategies to support stress regulation, resilience, and sustained effectiveness in demanding roles.

B. Director of Finance Report

Accounts Payable items were higher than usual this month due to the FY26 SRO payment to Wright County for \$60,840, the remaining 75% payment for the FY26 Technology Director to HLWW for \$60,000, and the second FY26 lease payment to HLWW for \$121,790.20. The FY27 Preliminary Budget is in process. The finance department is exploring ways to streamline and improve Purchase Service billing processes. PFM notified the department on February 19, 2026 that the P-Card program will transition from BMO to US Bank.

C. Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Specialist Report

Cheryl Ulik, Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Specialist provided highlights on the 2025–2026 school year so far. Paraprofessionals participated in Structured Literacy Training, with the first session held virtually on January 23, 2026, covering theoretical frameworks and phonemic awareness. A second session is being planned to address phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension. A new assessment requirement mandates that students in grade four and above who are not reading at grade level be screened for reading difficulties, including dyslexia, using an MDE-approved tool- Capti ReadBasix. Capti ReadBasix evaluates multiple literacy skills including Word Recognition and Decoding, Vocabulary, Morphology, Sentence Processing, Reading Efficiency, and Reading Comprehension. Cheryl has trained staff on its implementation and supported programs during its administration. A Data Informs Instruction professional development session is scheduled for April 7. Additional efforts include exploring curriculum updates to meet new state requirements in areas such as mental health, cannabis and other substance use education, physics/chemistry, and personal finance. Cheryl also continues to support staff in using online curriculum platforms and administering both district and state assessments.
