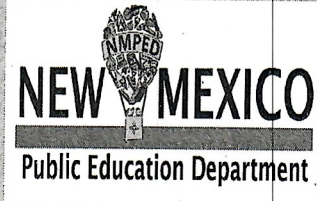

SUPPLEMENT

PURPOSE OF FUNDING

This award is an expansion of the seven-year pilot CTE (Career Technical Education) program, concluding in 2025-26. This funding is designated to support high school projects that foster workforce preparedness, educational program improvement, and CTE program quality. The CTE Extension Grant fund provides a one-time, non-recurring reimbursement-based appropriation to eligible public educational institutions. Funds must be used to implement high-impact initiatives that align with state economic and workforce priorities while ensuring measurable and sustainable outcomes.

State funds must be aligned to NMSA 22.1.12, NextGen requirements. NextGen funds are awarded to support CTE programs of study that align to the priority sectors identified in the regional Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA).

ALLOWABLE USES OF FUNDING

The NextGen expansion may be used to support pre-approved expenses as detailed in the approved/revised budget sent to you by the Grant Manager. This may include:

- Payment to students for time spent in work-based learning activities that are directly aligned to career development, and for which they are enrolled in an appropriate PED-approved course code.
- Purchasing of assets/equipment (or related expenses) needed to improve program quality in an existing Program of study with concentrators enrolled in the 2025-26 school year
- Purchasing of items needed to add a Concentrator course where only an intro course exists; may include items such as assets, equipment, software, purchased services, and professional development costs
- Purchasing of items needed to add a Completer course where only an intro and concentrator course exists

FISCAL REQUIREMENTS

Reporting Requirements

Please review Exhibit C and submit a BAR through OBMS for the appropriate amount using fund code **27595** and revenue object code **43202**. Please adhere to the following timelines and cited statutory regulations, required for budgeting, obligation, and RfR submission:

- Submit your BAR, and copies of Exhibit C, and the supplement, through OBMS by **May 9, 2026**.
- Pursuant to NMSA 6-5-3, the appropriate fund shall be encumbered prior to the issuance of vouchers or purchase orders or the engagement of contracts.
- NMAC 6.20.2.10 BUDGET MAINTENANCE STANDARDS:
 1. Budget adjustment requests shall be submitted on the most current form prescribed by the department. The school district shall maintain a log of all budget adjustment

requests to account for status, numerical sequence, and timely approval at each level. The log is to be retained for audit purposes.

2. School districts shall submit budget adjustment requests for the operating budget to the department for budget increases, budget decreases, transfers between functional categories, and transfers from the emergency reserve account. Expenditures shall not be made by the school district until budget authority has been established and approval received from the department. Budget adjustments shall not be incorporated into the school district's accounting system until approval is received by the department.
3. School districts shall submit periodic financial reports to the department using the department-approved format. Reporting shall be either monthly or quarterly. Required reporting frequency may be changed by the department at any time during the year. Reports are due at the department by the last working day of the month following the end of the required reporting period, unless extended to a later date by the secretary of education.
