Grade checks will typically occur during weeks 1, 4, and 7 of each season. Students failing one or more classes will be placed on academic probation and will create a support plan with school staff. If grades do not improve by the next grade check, administration may place the student on academic suspension, which could include temporary removal from competition or participation. Parents or guardians will be notified, and students with IEPs, 504 Plans, or special circumstances will be reviewed individually.
