- Kid's College kicked off in June with an exciting lineup of classes and activities, including Animal Day, Vet Clinic, Fine Arts, Popsicle Stick Crafts, Origami, Wooden Crafts, Sewing, Oobleck, Solar Oven, Magnet Maze, Ice Melt Race, Elephant Toothpaste, Mani/Pedi Spa Day, and Cookie Decorating. A special thank-you to Rene Schwalk for organizing these fun, educational, and enriching summer opportunities for our youth. We also extend our appreciation to all of the Kid's College instructors and volunteers for investing their time, talents, and energy into making these experiences memorable for the kids.

- The Testing Center has remained a vital resource for students, professionals, and community members throughout the 2025–2026 academic year. Through May 2026, the center administered more than 300 exams across a variety of academic, professional, and licensure testing programs. Testing services included 27 CLEP exams (25 Spanish, 1 Sociology, and 1 Psychology), 11 Texas Commission on Law Enforcement exams (5 Telecommunicator and 6 Jailer), and 47 Texas Commission on Environmental Quality exams in Wastewater C&D and Irrigation. The center also administered 22 GED exams, 33 TSI exams, and 155 ACT exams for students representing Perryton, Spearman, Canadian, Guymon, Gruver, Stratford, Booker, Higgins, Pampa, Gage, Dumas, Cactus, Turpin, Follett, Hooker, and Allison. In addition, the Testing Center facilitated 18 Phlebotomy Licensure exams and recently expanded its offerings to include CNA Licensure Testing, serving candidates from Perryton, Spearman, Gruver, and Booker. These numbers reflect the Testing Center's continued commitment to supporting educational advancement, workforce development, and professional certification opportunities throughout the region.

- The Allen Campus continued to serve as a valuable community resource throughout the semester by hosting a variety of seminars, training sessions, meetings, and special events. Organizations utilizing the campus included Courson Oil and Gas, Capture Point, Phillips 66, Perryton ISD, the City of Perryton, Coffee Memorial Blood Drive, Leadership Perryton, Adult Driver Education, Student Driver Education, the Rotary Cherry Pie Contest, Imagination Library, and Acts Community.
