### **Board Report for Evergreen Elementary School: Trimester #3 2013-14**

Enrollment: 409 (420 with part-time LBMS students) as of May 30, 2014

K- 25, 25, 24 = 74 students

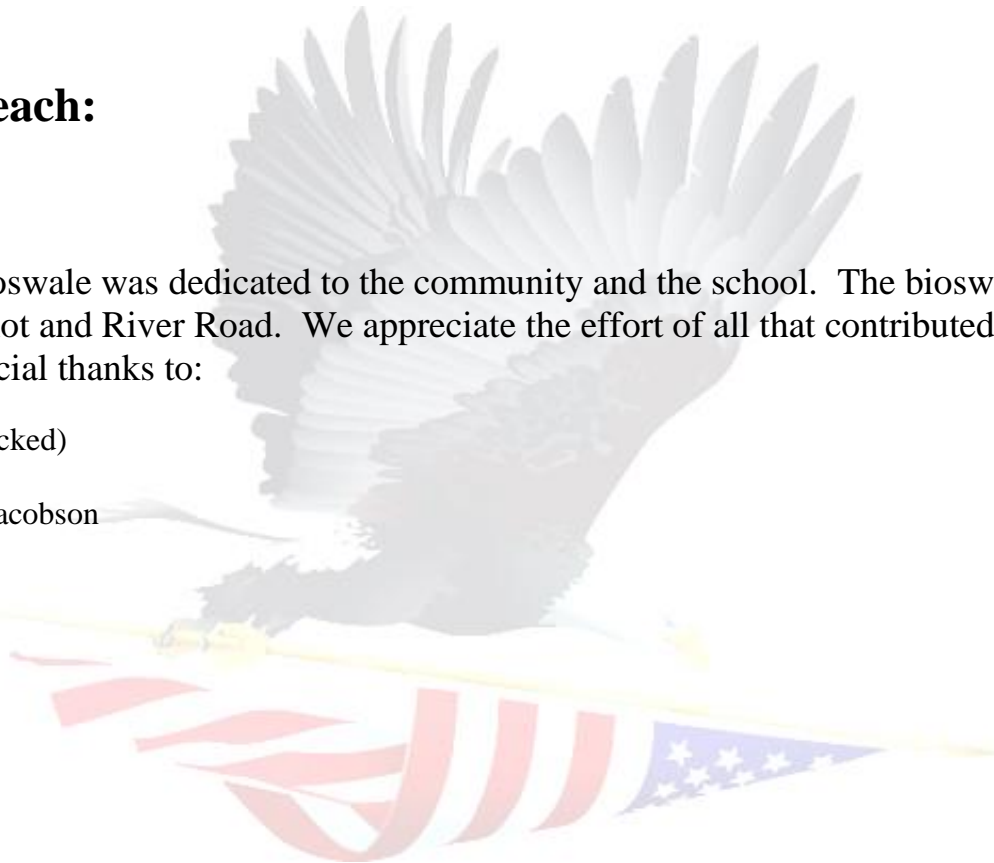
#### **Evergreen Bioswale:**

*Willa started in 2006 as a volunteer reader; she was a reader for two years.*

*In 2008 Willa started as the Evergreen Volunteer Coordinator running and overseeing the program. During that time, 2008-present:*

*534 students have been through the program*

*5,906 books were sent home with children*

*7,362 hours of reading occurred*

*2,130 hours were spent by Willa to oversee, organize and report on program –(this number is probably higher but what was reported*
