This is their 6th year of operation and will benefit over 600 students from September 2026 to July 2027 at the following schools: Pace ECHS, Brownsville ECHS, Lopez ECHS, Garcia MS, Stell MS, Oliveira MS, Stillman MS, Martin Elementary, Sharp Elementary, Russell Elementary, Putegnat Elementary, Yturria Elementary and Skinner Elementary. This program targets 5th and 8th grade, but will serve students in other grade levels should they be interested in the program. Services include working with students in achieving their academic goals and staying on track, participate in district and school sponsored events, especially in regards to parent and family engagement, partner with after school programs to provide recreation and leadership services to youth already participating in a after school program. It will also provide opportunities for students to volunteer and develop leadership skills during the year and in one or more summer day camps.

Amended Memorandum of Understanding Regarding  
Cooperative Services Agreement with Brownsville I.S.D.

It is proposed that Good Samaritan Community Services (GSCS) and Brownsville I.S.D. (BISD) enter into the following Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding certain cooperative services agreements:

**Purpose:** The purpose of the cooperative services is to provide supportive services to BISD students that would further their academic and personal success.

Both parties agree to maintain a cooperative, interactive, and supportive relationship for the 2026-2027 school year. Either party may terminate the services described in this MOU at any time, with thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

**A. Good Samaritan Community Services agrees to:**

1. After acquiring written consent from parents, legal guardian and the BISD, work with BISD students in an attempt to aid BISD in achieving its students' academic goals in accordance with federal and state law and District policy.
2. Provide reasonable accommodation to those students with special needs in accordance with federal and state law and District policy.
3. Support and participate in district and school sponsored events, especially in regard to parent and family engagement.
4. Provide opportunities for students to engage in learning during out-of-school time hours and offer support services, if possible, that ensure students remain on track academically.
5. Provide opportunities such as Camp Good Sam for students to engage in learning during out-of-school time hours, in particular during the summer months when BISD schools are not in session, and offer support services, if possible, that ensure students remain on track academically. When such programs are offered, GSCS:
  - Will provide a Program Manager and program staff to deliver program services;
  - Will host recruitment activities and parent enrollment meetings in accordance with school availability prior to delivering services; and
  - Will provide all instructional and support materials for the successful delivery of services;
6. Partner with the school and staff at which summer programming may be held to provide Camp Good Sam and other academic, recreation and leadership services to youth participating in the Camp.
7. Partner with select schools after-school program to provide recreation and leadership services to youth participating in the after-school programs.
8. Provide BISD and key personnel with program reports upon request.

9. Deliver the Achieving Beyond the Classroom (ABC) program, a juvenile justice prevention program, to select students attending school in the 78520 and 78521 zip code.
10. Conduct annual criminal background checks in accordance with Chapter 22, Texas Education Code, for all staff, interns and volunteers involved with direct service delivery and make results available to BISD prior to the commencement of program services and upon request.
11. Have all GSCS staff wear clearly identifiable wear such as polo's or other identifying clothes.
12. Provide general, professional, auto, works compensation and excess liability insurance with coverages and limits approved by the BISD prior to the commencement of program operations.
13. Pursuant to Texas Education Code, § 22A.055, all staff, interns, and volunteers who will act as a service providers for a school district must submit an executed affidavit (on a District provided form) to the District prior to the commencement of services under this Agreement.

**B. More specifically, GSCS will:**

1. From August to May, deliver services to over 860 students at select schools agreed upon between GSCS and BISD. From August to May, engage youth 13- 17 years old in the Youth Advisory Committee. This committee focuses on empowering youth via leadership skills development and aids them in completing service-learning projects to support community involvement. Students who have joined this initiative come from select BISD middle schools and high schools.
2. Target students in 5<sup>th</sup> and 8th grade but serve students in other grades should they be interested in the program.
3. Provide weekly class lessons for the duration of the school year.
4. Provide at least one trained instructor to deliver the ABC curriculum instruction.
5. Provide all instructional and support materials needed for the successful delivery of program services.
6. Provide opportunities for students to volunteer and develop leadership skills.
7. Recruit youth from select middle and high schools to participate with priorparent or legal guardian written consent in various leadership initiatives during the out-of-school time program.
8. Provide all program operations and services at its sole cost with no charges or financial liability incurred or to be charged to BISD, which if applicable are waived.
9. **GSCS SHALL FULLY RELEASE, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE BISD, ITS BOARD OF TRUSTEES, OFFICIALS, TRUSTEES, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS AND REPRESENTATIVES, EACH IN THEIR OFFICIAL AND INDIVIDUAL CAPACITIES, [HEREINAFTER "INDEMNIFIED PARTIES"] FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL LIABILITIES, LOSSES, DAMAGES, ACTIONS, SUITS, PROCEEDINGS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, ASSESSMENTS, FINES, PENALTIES, FEES, JUDGMENTS, COSTS AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS, OF EVERY NATURE AND KIND, WHICH AN INDEMNIFIED PARTY MAY**

**INCUR, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, AND RELATING TO OR ARISING FROM THE OBLIGATIONS OR THE PERFORMANCE OR LACK THEREOF UNDER THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.**

**C. Brownsville I.S.D. agrees to:**

1. Provide a school calendar and other general information to GSCS staff regarding school course offerings, class schedules and course requirements, as well as campus activities and family engagement events
2. Identify prospective participants in GSCS programs via a roster and/or other means and provide them with program contact information
3. Provide opportunities for GSCS staff to deliver recruitment activities before, during or after the school day.
4. Involve GSCS staff in parent engagement and other campus events.
5. Provide access to campus resources, including space for large group gatherings or activities both indoor and/or outdoor, access to the Internet and other forms of technology to enhance the quality of services delivered, storage space and other resources to enhance program delivery.
6. Will serve as a summer feeding site for children provided by BISD.
7. Provide the following to support the ABC and Camp Good Sam programs:
  - Identify and offer classrooms and/or other adequate space for students to participate in the Achieving Beyond the Classroom program (ABC).
  - Identify and offer classrooms and/or other adequate space for staff to prep for Camp Good Sam from June 4 to June 9 and for students to participate in Camp Good Sam from June 10 to July 23.
  - Two holidays will be recognized: June 18th and July 5th; no youth or staff will be present on host site.
  - Offer cafeteria space to Camp Good Sam staff and participants to provide daily meal service.
8. Identify those Brownsville ISD staff who will serve as support when GSCS delivers programs on the school campus.
9. Provide custodial support, as needed.
10. May terminate the MOU, for convenience, upon thirty (30) days notice to GSCS.

**D. FERPA Compliance**

Both parties agree and understand that this MOU requires that GSCS will strictly comply with FERPA at all times. At a minimum, the following terms and conditions will apply to all FERPA data disclosed by BISD to GSCS:

1. Data will be collected and managed by GSCS staff and administrators after obtaining prior written consent from parent(s) or legal guardian.
2. Data to be collected will include but not be limited to student attendance records, grades, test scores and transcripts, including identifying information on students in order to evaluate the program's success.
3. GSCS shall ensure that FERPA data is accessed by GSCS staff only for the purposes of conducting GSCS work related to services discussed in this MOU.

4. GSCS shall ensure that GSCS staff obtain access only to student records for which a School Records Release Form has been secured.
  5. GSCS shall securely destroy all FERPA data, in paper or electronic format, once the FERPA data is no longer needed for the staff's work and program evaluation, based on appropriate federal guidelines.
- E. 1. This MOU may:
- only be amended or modified by written agreement executed by authorized representatives of the Parties.
  - be terminated for convenience upon ten (10) days written notice to the other party.
  - not be assigned to another party by Admore.
  - constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties and supercedes any prior understanding or oral or written Agreement between the Parties.
2. Notices to either party must be in writing and delivered in person by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid. Notice shall be effective on the date of delivery in accordance with this paragraph.

- Partner with the after school program provided at Skinner Elementary to provide recreation and leadership services to youth participating in the Skinner Elementary after school program. Services may be provided to additional school campuses upon request by BISD and staff availability.
- Provide BISD and key personnel with program reports upon request.
- Pay for use of transportation services provided by BISD, when they are used to serve students to meet program needs outside of the regular school day or schedule.
- Deliver the Asset Building for Clients (ABC) program, a juvenile justice prevention program, to select students attending school in the 78520 zip code. As part of this program, GSCS will:
  1. From August to May, deliver services to over 860 students at schools agreed upon between GSCS and BISD, including: Stell Middle School, Stillman Middle School, Manzano Middle School, Sharp Elementary, Russell Elementary, Putegnat Elementary School, Yturria Elementary, Garden Park Elementary and Skinner Elementary.
  2. From August to May, engage youth 13-17 years old in the Youth Advisory Committee. This committee focuses on empowering youth via leadership skills development and aids them in completing service learning projects to support community involvement. Students who have joined this initiative come from: Pace ECHS, Veterans ECHS, Lopez ECHS, Porter EHCS, Brownsville ECHS, Stell Middle School, Stillman Middle School, Oliveira

Middle School, and Faulk Middle School.

3. Target students in 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade, but serve students in other grades should they be interested in the program.
4. Provide weekly class lessons for the duration of the school year.
5. Provide at least one trained instructor to deliver the ABC curriculum instruction.
6. Provide all instructional and support materials needed for the successful delivery of program services.
7. Provide opportunities for students to volunteer and develop leadership skills
8. Recruit youth from Stillman Middle School, Stell Middle School, Manzano Middle School, Pace ECHS, BECHS and Veterans ECHS to participate in various leadership initiatives during the out-of-school time program.

GSCS also agrees to provide general liability insurance necessary for program operations. In addition, GSCS will conduct annual background checks for all staff, interns and volunteers involved with direct service delivery and make results available to BISD upon request.

Brownsville I.S.D. agrees to:

- Provide a school calendar and other information to GSCS staff regarding campus activities and family engagement events.
- Identify prospective participants via a roster and other means and provide them with GSCS program contact information so that they can learn more about the program
- Identify to GSCS staff the names of those Brownsville ISD staff who will serve as support during ABC instruction in the classroom.
- Provide opportunities for GSCS staff to deliver recruitment activities before, during or after the school day.
- Involve GSCS staff in parent engagement and other campus events.
- Provide access to campus resources, if available, including access to connection to the Internet and other forms of technology to enhance the quality of services delivered.
- Provide the following to support the ABC program:
  1. Identify and offer classes and/or other adequate space for students to participate in the Asset Building for Clients program (ABC).
  2. Share general information regarding school course offerings, class schedules, and course requirements with GSCS staff, to help determine the most effective instructional schedule.

#### FERPA Compliance

Both parties agree and understand that this MOU requires that GSCS will strictly comply with FERPA at all times. At a minimum, the following terms and conditions will apply to all FERPA data disclosed by BISD to GSCS:

- Data will be collected and managed by GSCS staff and administrators.
- Data to be collected will include but not be limited to student attendance records, grades, test scores and transcripts, including identifying information on students in order to evaluate the program's success.
- GSCS shall ensure that FERPA data is accessed by GSCS staff only for the purposes of conducting GSCS work related to services discussed in this MOU.
- GSCS shall ensure that GSCS staff obtain access only to student records for which a School Records Release Form has been secured.
- GSCS shall securely destroy all FERPA data, in paper or electronic format, once the FERPA data is no longer needed for the staff's work and program evaluation, based on appropriate federal guidelines
