Subject: Adoption of the Statewide Anonymous Threat Reporting System

The purpose of this memo is to recommend that St. Louis Park Public Schools utilize Minnesota's statewide anonymous threat reporting system (See it, Say it, Send it) administered through the Department of Public Safety as the district's anonymous reporting resource rather than implement a separate local reporting system.

Background:

Recent Minnesota legislation requires school districts and charter schools to either implement a local anonymous reporting system that meets statutory requirements or promote the statewide anonymous threat reporting system. For districts that choose not to establish a local system, the law encourages providing information about the statewide system through the district website, student handbooks, and annual parent notifications.

We believe the statewide system offers a reliable and cost-effective option for students, staff, families, and community members to report safety concerns anonymously. Utilizing the statewide system avoids duplicating services already available through the Department of Public Safety while allowing district resources to remain focused on prevention, intervention, and student support. The statewide approach also provides a consistent reporting mechanism aligned with state guidance and public safety coordination.

Proposed Board Action: Approve the use of Minnesota's statewide anonymous threat reporting system as the district's anonymous reporting resource and direct administration to implement the related communication and notification practices outlined in state law.

Upon approval, administration will incorporate information about the statewide system into district communications, including the district website, student handbooks, and annual notifications to families, consistent with state law.
