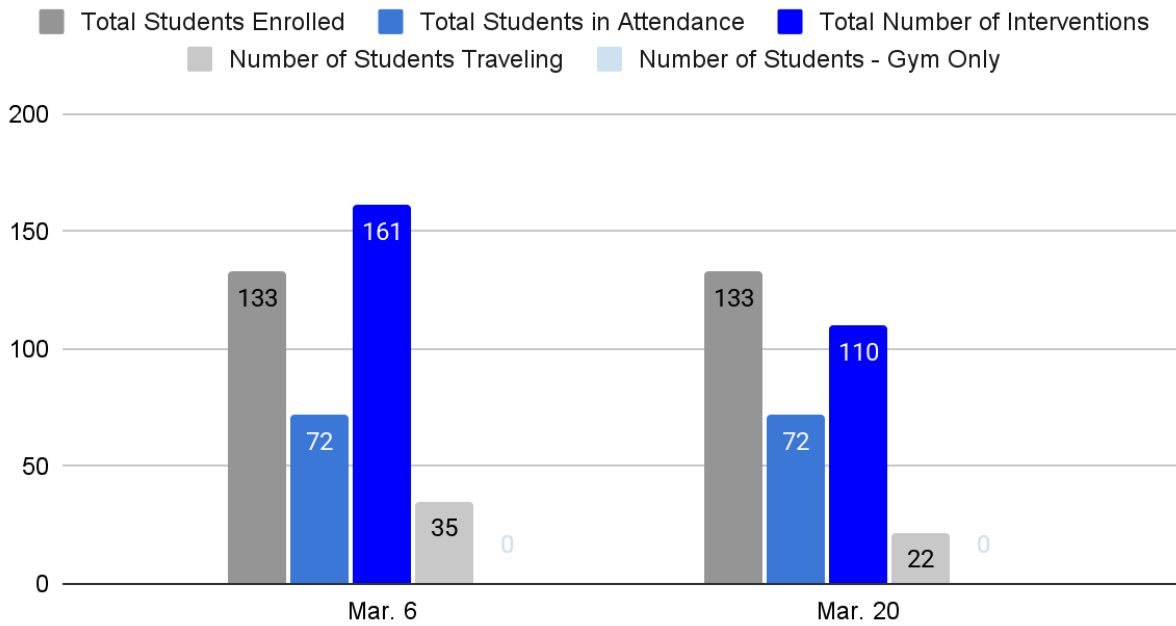

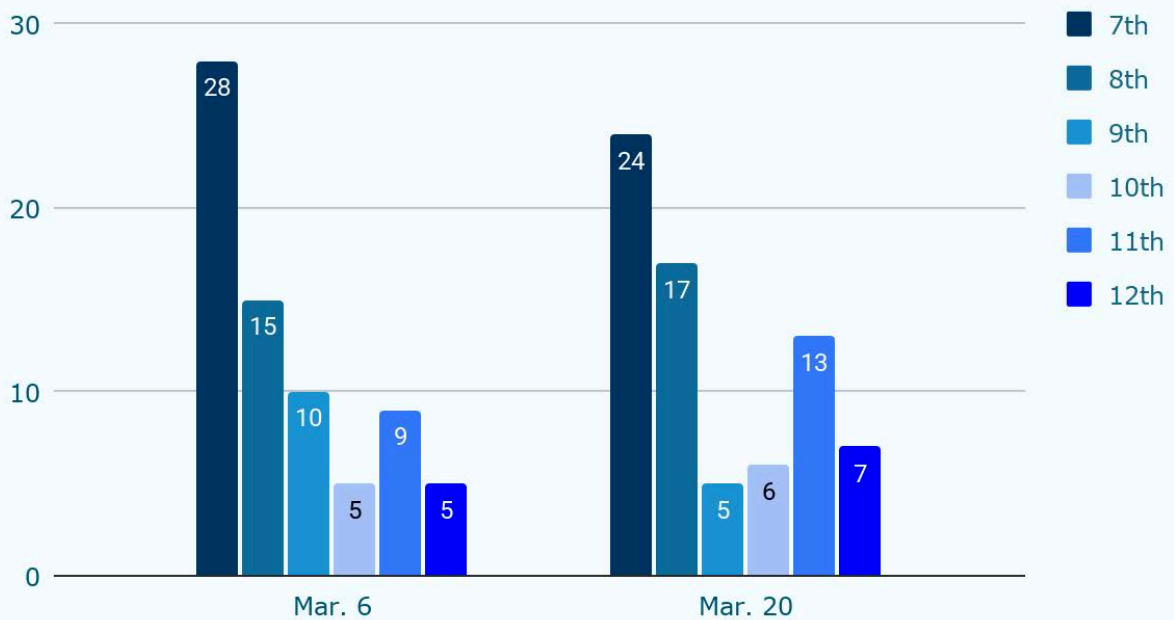

NAEP

In March, CHS participated in NAEP testing over the course of two days, with NAEP test administrators assessing students in either reading or math. 90% of our 8th grade students were assessed. While CHS will not receive individual student results, the data collected will contribute to The Nation's Report Card and help inform a broader understanding of student achievement across the country.

PSAT 8/9

CHS 8th and 9th grade students completed the PSAT 8/9 on Tuesday, March 24. Participation in this assessment helps satisfy the state requirement that all high school students take a general knowledge exam as part of graduation qualifications, while also contributing to the body of evidence used to monitor and support student academic progress.

Planetarium at CHS

The University of Alaska Fairbanks, in conjunction with the Prince William Sound Science Center held a morning of celestial fun at CHS by bringing in the university's inflatable planetarium to CHS. Students had the opportunity to stargaze and explore the heavens with scientists from UAF. Although the planetarium was presented during parent-teacher conferences, which was a student non-contact day, over



40 students attended this opportunity. Thanks goes out to the Prince William Sound Science Center, and the University of Alaska Fairbanks for making this opportunity available for our students.
