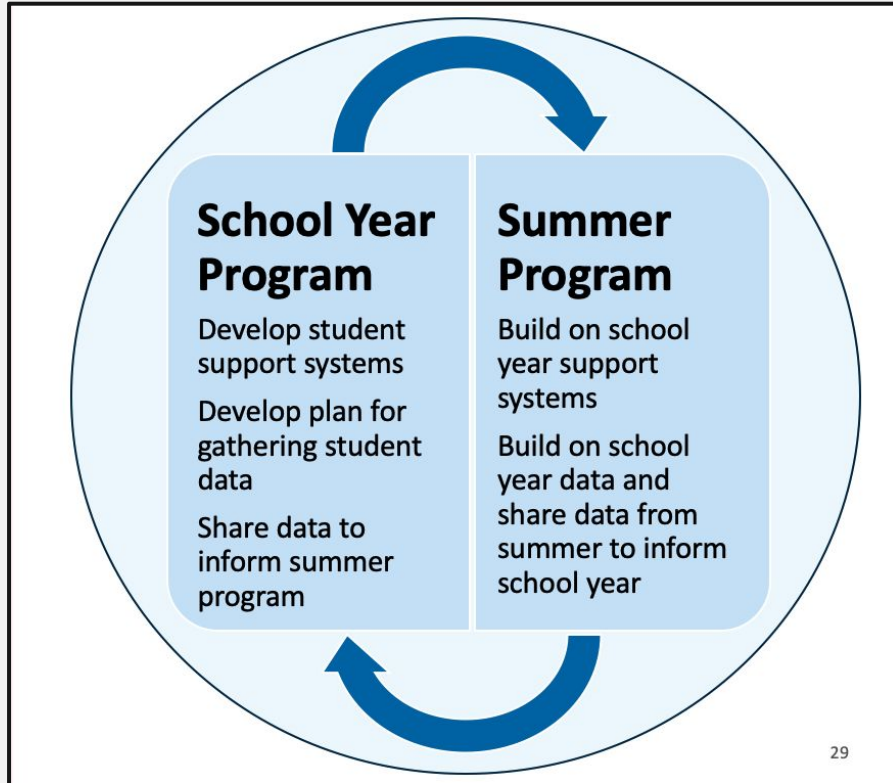


Grant Overview



- Deliver at least **80 continuous hours** of in-person Summer Programming
 - *Kindergarten transition programs must provide a min of 30 continuous hours*
- Prioritize students **not yet reading at grade level**, based on local data and Oregon's ELA standards
- Encourage **regular and sustained student attendance** throughout the program duration
- Meet the three key **grant goals**
- Prioritize **literacy** instruction aligned with Oregon's **ELA standards** along with other academic areas as needed
- **Partner** with another youth-serving organization
- Provide **in-person services** (example: meals)
- **Comply with reporting and fiscal requirements**, including direct service delivery, contracted services, and adherence to reimbursement, data gathering, and reporting guidelines.

What students experience

- Literacy first, with math close behind
- Small-group, high-dosage tutoring

- Mon–Thu, 8:30 am – 1:30 pm, at Corbett Grade School & Corbett Middle School
- One teacher + one instructional assistant per class
- 15 students per classroom
- Local field trips & partnerships
- Roving IA, daily health assistant, weekly nurse
- Lunch and snack provided; busing available

What students experience

- Learning school routines (bus safety, cafeteria etiquette, walking in the hall)
- Early literacy skills
- Story telling
- Counting
- Sorting
- Building

- Mon–Thu, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, at Corbett Grade School

- Lunch and snack provided; busing available

Program's Purpose



Summer widens the gap for the kids who can least afford it. COur Summer Learning Program is four weeks of catching up, in a place kids actually want to be.

1 Accelerate literacy

- Small-group, high-dosage tutoring
- Every IA trained in the method
- Math close behind reading

2 Spark engagement

- A camp-like culture, not summer school
- Enrichment that pulls kids into learning
- Kids who want to come back tomorrow

3 Reach every student

- Free, and open to all K–8 families
- Two adults in every classroom
- Capacity for more small-group instruction

Our measure of success: kids leave in August more confident than they arrived, and a little more in love with learning.

Timeline

Year 1: Implementation year

- Implement the summer learning model as designed.
- Build staff capacity, establish systems for data collection, and monitor early implementation.

Year 2 & 3: Continuous Improvement

- Use program and outcome data to identify successes and opportunities for improvement.
- Refine program design, strengthen instructional practices, and enhance participant engagement.
