Academy

CTE

CNA - we have really been struggling to find a solution for our CNA students but am pleased with our current prospect. After running into dead ends at every turn, we have finally found an instructor who is currently working and teaching at Cascadia in Nampa. If things work out, direct instruction will occur on Tues & Thurs with Mons & Weds being reserved for individual practice and book work. Students will have the hours they need by Spring Break at which time, they will complete their clinicals (40hrs) the end of March and April. Testing will occur at CWI in May.

All CTE & Academy teachers visited Kuna High and Swan Falls High on Friday, November 7th. Teachers observed and learned from others in their specific fields. The day was productive and helped us to gain valuable info moving forward.

Forty new chromebooks have been distributed into the classrooms. We plan on rotating through all of our technology on a 3yr rotation with 30% being replaced each year. I am hoping this helps us keep our technology current in a cost effective way.

1. Fencing - Pending Solar Project.

3. Get the A-Frame Building Functioning:
We have received our first bid for the foundation. The bid came in at \$19,500. Still waiting for additional bids. We need to have at least 3 and still only have one.
4. Solar Array - Further planning and discussion on the solar array occurred and it was determined that it would be dismantled. We did find out that roughly 60% of the panels are resaleable so we are working to make arrangements.
5. The two bull pens have undergone some major cleaning with quite a bit of items going to auction and/or scraped for metal. Items include outdated tools, technology, culinary equipment that no longer works, student desks, etc. Our goal is to clean out the many trailers we have located on campus and determine the appropriate number needed.
