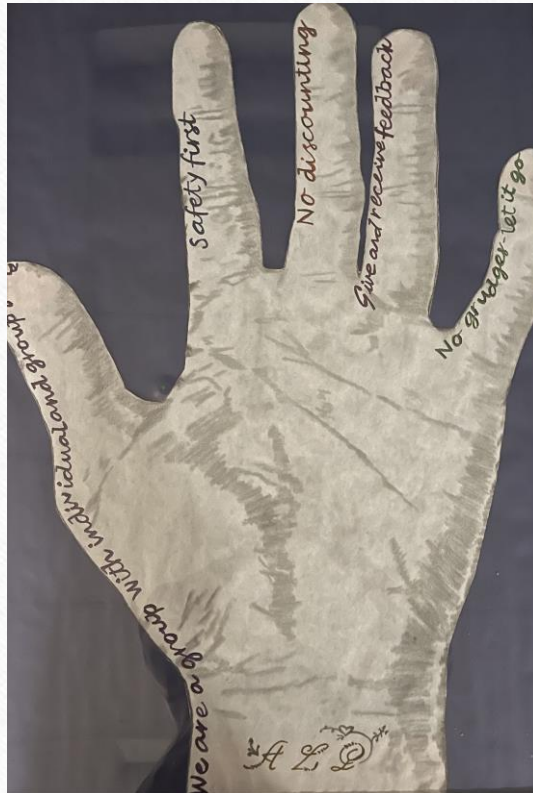

Prioritize Relationship-Building

Communication

Morning meetings, encouraging to others, praise often, create stronger connections.

Support

Celebrate achievements, student-centered, respect, be vulnerable, laugh often.

Engagement

Give choices on assignments/projects, hands-on and cooperative learning activities.

Incorporated a Democratic Classroom Model

- Provide a platform for students to have a voice in their education
- Communication goes both ways
- “Real World” Critical Thinking and Problem Solving
- Open minded and considerate of others perspectives & develop empathy
- Foster solutions that work for everyone
- Shared decision making helps students manage their own behaviors

Moved Focus to the Enabling Component Model

- Make immediate changes to instruction
- Supportive through students difficult transitions
- Get students connected with the high school and activities
- Connect families with community resources
- Identify barriers to learning
- Build a sense of competence, self-determination and connections with others

Where we were.....

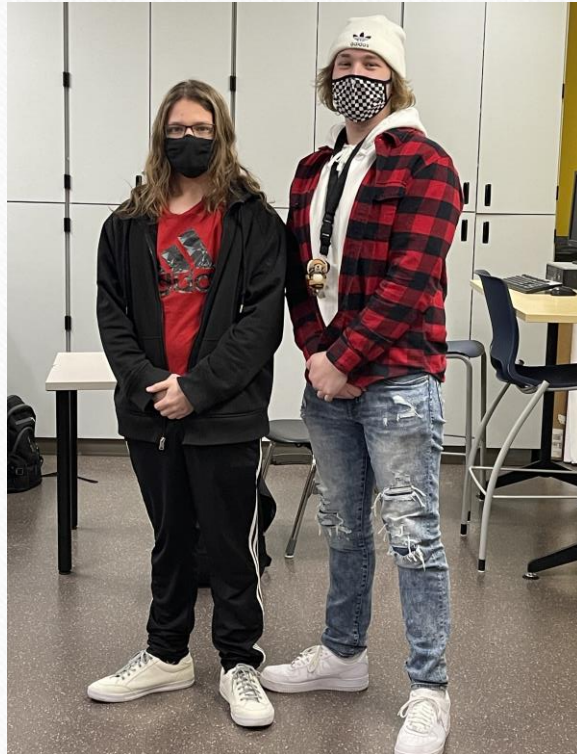
- Started ALP 2015 with 8 full-time students and 6 part time students
- Attendance rate= 71% Semester 1
- Attendance rate= 93% Semester 2

Where we are today!

- Full-time enrollment- 16 students
- Part-time enrollment- 14 students
- Students are eligible for Work Experience
- Volunteering in the community
- Attendance rate- 98.7%
- Pandemic= No problems, we are good online learners!
