Finance Report

The Spring Budget conference was held in Albuquerque March 18-20. The unit value for the 26/27 SEG is set at \$7,117.10. That is an increase of \$240.00 over the final 25/26 unit value. The 26/27 preliminary budget is due to PED 05/11/26.

The 120-day student count was certified on 04/07/26. The SY 25/26 120-day count came in at 10,080 FTE. In comparison to last year's 80/120-day average count on which SY25/26 SEG funding is based, the district shows a decrease in enrollment of 314.5 FTE.

The audit committee met on 06/07/26 for the audit exit conference. The audit will now be sent to the NM State Auditor for review.
