Annual Report

1. House Bill 3908 Compliance: Celina ISD met the requirements of House Bill 3908 by partnering with Cook Children's to provide a research-based, in-person fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness presentation for students in grades 6–12. Parent opt-in was obtained prior to student participation.
2. Senate Bill 9 Compliance: Senate Bill 9 requires Texas public schools to provide, with parental consent, instruction on child abuse, family violence, dating violence, and sex trafficking. Based on the recommendation of the 2024–2025 Student Health Advisory Council (SHAC), Celina ISD selected Youth Equipped to Succeed (YES) to provide this curriculum. A parent preview presentation is scheduled for November 4, followed by student presentations on November 20 for students whose parents have provided consent.

3. Revised and updated the district-wide weather guidelines to ensure consistency in decision-making and align procedures with current best practices for student and staff safety during inclement weather and extreme heat conditions.
4. Collaborated with the Food Services Department to review, revise, and update the District Wellness Plan to ensure alignment with current state and federal wellness requirements.
5. Reviewed the instructional and support resources utilized by the Counseling Department to ensure alignment with district goals, student needs, and best practices.
6. House Bill 3 Compliance: House Bill 3 requires Texas school districts to train all employees who regularly interact with students to recognize signs of mental health concerns and substance abuse, with full compliance required by the end of the 2028–2029 school year. Celina ISD is ahead of schedule and will achieve 100% compliance by the end of the 2026–2027 school year, with all applicable staff completing Mental Health First Aid training.
7. Completed the annual FitnessGram assessment in April for all students enrolled in physical education and PE-credit courses (e.g., athletics, marching band, cheer, and drill team), ensuring compliance with the state's June reporting deadline.
