3. New Items:

A. Buckland & Selawik Reclassifications — 1A vs 2A BBALL & VBALL

- i. Buckland School is currently a 1A school in basketball and a Mix-6 team in the activity of volleyball. However, the 2025-2026 OASIS state enrollment reports Buckland School as having 61 students in grades 9-12. **Therefore, in accordance with the following policy, the ASAA Board of Directors has determined that Buckland School will be classified as 2A for the activity of basketball and will move from Mix-6 to 2A volleyball beginning in the 2027-28 school year.**
 - a) Buckland qualifies for the #1 exemption in yellow below.
- ii. Davis-Ramoth School is currently a 1A school in basketball and a Mix-6 team in the activity of volleyball. However, the 2025-2026 OASIS state enrollment reports Davis-Ramoth School as having 71 students in grades 9-12. **Therefore, in accordance with the following policy, the ASAA Board of Directors has determined that Davis-Ramoth School will be classified as 2A for the activity of basketball and will move from Mix-6 to 2A volleyball beginning in the 2027-28 school year.**
 - a) Davis-Ramoth qualifies for the #4 exemption in yellow below.

ASAA's Reclassification Enrollment Policy allows schools several options to appeal the move to a higher classification. These can be found in the Classification Policy of the ASAA Handbook beginning on page 77. These options include:

1. *Deducting Ineligible 5th Year Students:*

a. Example: Smith High School is currently a 1A school. The 2019-2020 OASIS state enrollment reports an enrollment of 63 students. However, 4 students are also ineligible 5th year students. As verified by the superintendent, the 4 students are then deducted from the total of 63 and the school remains at 1A with an adjusted total of 59 students.

2. *Three-year enrollment average: Schools which will be reclassified to a higher level under this policy may appeal the reclassification based on the average enrollment data for the current and 2 previous years.*

a. Example: Smith High School is currently a 1A school. The 2019-2020 OASIS state enrollment reports an enrollment of 63 students. However, for the previous two years, Smith High had enrollments of 61 and 55. As verified by the superintendent, the school's three-year average is 59.67, so the school remains at 1A. (Also note ineligible 5th year students should also be deducted to determine the adjusted enrollment for each of the three years.)

3. *Unforeseen Circumstances: The Association may consider an appeal of this policy by the school's superintendent for unforeseen circumstances. This may include emergency transfers which affect a school's classification.*

a. Example: Smith High School is currently a 1A school. The 2019-2020 OASIS state enrollment reports an enrollment of 63 students. As verified by the superintendent, the school appeals this number by showing 8 students transferred into the school due to fire at another school within the area. The ASAA Board of Directors considers this an "unforeseen circumstance" and allows Smith High to remain at 1A.

4. *Request to Compete at a Lower Classification – Financial, Geographic, or Scheduling*

Factors: Schools may request to "opt down" one classification level in an activity based on financial, travel, or scheduling challenges.

a. Example: Due to the school's geographic location, the cost of being placed into another conference would cause a significant increase in the cost of travel.

B. Proposed ASAA bylaw amendment to Article 12, Section 7- Semester Credit Rule

The proposed ASAA bylaw change keeps the 2.0 GPA and credit requirements but introduces a tiered eligibility system. Students slightly below the credit requirement can participate at the sub-varsity level and regain full eligibility if they show progress at the quarter mark, while those significantly behind remain ineligible.

Overall, the change promotes student-athlete integrity by emphasizing ongoing academic progress, accountability, and aligning participation more closely with real-time academic performance.

A tiered system reflects the reality that not all academic situations are the same.

Under a strict cutoff, a student who barely misses the credit requirement is treated the same as a student who made little to no progress. The tiered approach creates a more fair and accurate distinction between those situations.

It also promotes accountability without being overly punitive. Students who are close to meeting requirements can stay engaged through limited (sub-varsity) participation, which often keeps them motivated and connected to school, while still requiring them to improve academically to regain full eligibility.

At the same time, it maintains high standards. Students who are significantly behind are still fully ineligible, reinforcing that academics come first.

Finally, the built-in quarter checkpoint encourages continuous effort rather than relying only on past performance. It gives students a clear opportunity to recover, while holding them accountable in real time. In short, the tiered system is more motivating and promotes an increase in academic progress and student development.

EXAMPLE:

Student A (Significant Credit Deficiency)

Student A passed 2 of 6 classes for the previous semester and earned 1.0 credits of the 2.5 current credit requirement. Under the new rule, Student A would stay ineligible for all interscholastic activities for the entire semester. Student A may practice throughout the semester even though they are not eligible and all practices will count towards eligibility for the next semester. This reinforces accountability and emphasizes that academics must come first before participation.

Student B (Near the Credit Requirement)

Student B passed 3 of the 6 classes and earned 1.5 of the 2.5 current credit requirement. Under the previous rule, Student B would have been treated the same as Student A and fully ineligible. Under the new tiered system, Student B would be allowed to participate at the sub-varsity level at the start of the semester with all practices counting towards the 10 required for eligibility. Student B may re-gain eligibility after a quarter grading period if they are passing 5 out of 6 classes.

Key Difference:

Students who have passed 3-4 classes may participate fully in JV levels and regain eligibility for varsity after the quarter mark. Students who have passed only 1-2 classes cannot regain eligibility until the following semester.

NOTE: Typically, KMHS is the only school with a sub-varsity level within our District. ASAA may consider future changes for 1A schools that do not have sub-varsity levels like a possible maximum amount of playing time. The current proposal is as-is for adoption and inclusion immediately for the fall.

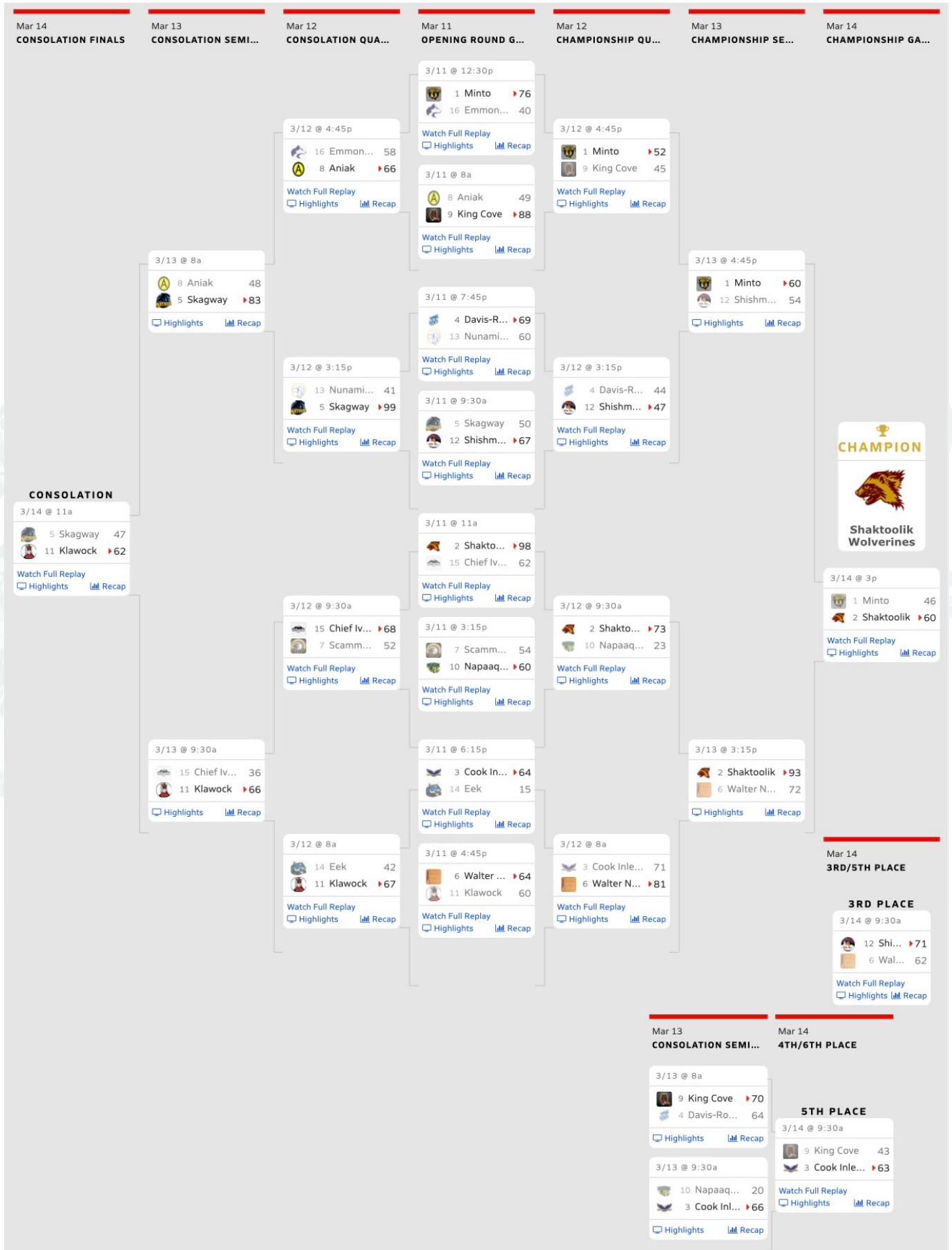


