Attendance and Absences

Regular attendance is important for your child's success, but we understand absences may be necessary.

Attendance [graphic](#) of impact, if 1-2 days are missed a month.

Absences

- Up to **five absences per year** accompanied by a parent or doctor's note will be accepted as excused for truancy purposes; however, they still count toward the 90% attendance rule required for course credit.
- Notes must be submitted to the campus attendance clerk **within 3 days** of the absence.
- Parents may call the campus to report absences, but a written note is required upon the student's return.
- Students are responsible for obtaining and completing all makeup work. See the makeup work policy under grades for details.

Texas Law on Truancy: The laws regarding truancy can be found in Chapter 25 of the Education Code, and these laws emphasize the importance of your child attending school all day. Any absences must be excused by their school, and excessive unexcused absences could result in charges being brought against:

- You as a parent for Parent Contributing to Non - attendance, if your child is required by law to attend school; and
- Your child for Failure to Attend School, if he or she is 12 years of age or older, but not yet 18.

If your child has unexcused absences for **10 or more days** or parts of days in a **6 month period** the school district **MUST** file the above charges on the student.

In addition, the school district **MAY** file on your child if your child has unexcused absences for **3 or more days** or parts of days in a **4-week period**.

You should receive a warning letter at the beginning of the school year stating you are subject to prosecution if your child fails to attend school for the periods stated above.

Failure to receive is not a defense prosecution, and you should call the school attendance clerk to ask about your child's absence.

Assessment Calendar

Snyder ISD follows a district-wide assessment calendar that includes important testing dates throughout the year. These assessments help us monitor student progress, guide instructional decisions, and ensure every child receives the support they need to succeed. We kindly ask families to avoid scheduling appointments during these times, as attendance is critical. Thank you for valuing these opportunities to support your child's growth and learning.

Appointments

- Absences for medical appointments (doctor, dentist, orthodontist, physical therapist, etc.) will **not count as an absence** if the student attends school before and/or after the appointment on the same day and provides a note from the health care provider confirming appointment time and dismissal.
- If the appointment occurs late in the day and the student attended school beforehand, the absence will be excused with a note from the health care provider submitted the following day.

Checkout Student During School Day

If you need to pick up your child during the school day, you will need to go to the front office with a **valid ID**. Only adults listed as emergency contacts will be allowed to pick up students from the office.

Unless there is an emergency, we are asking that parents/guardians NOT check out their students after 3:00 PM. This means that the front office will not allow parent walk-ins or call-ins for a last minute checkout, unless it is a true emergency (not a scheduled appointment). This will ensure a smoother and safer dismissal.



Cell Phones + Smartwatches → “Away for the Day”

In accordance with Texas House Bill 1481, Snyder ISD prohibits the use of personal communication devices during the instructional day to support academic success and maintain a distraction-free learning environment.

Definition:

Personal communication devices include: cell phones, smartwatches, wireless earbuds/headphones, and any other personal device with messaging, calling, or internet access.

During the School Day

Devices must be turned off and stored in backpacks or in personal belongings when on any Snyder ISD campus during the school day (7:00 am - 4:00 pm).

Use is only allowed if explicitly approved for medical reasons with documentation or if included in a 504 Plan or IEP.

This policy applies in all areas of the campus, including hallways, restrooms, and during lunch periods. Open campus lunch at the high school does not apply.

Prohibited Actions:

Texting, calling, gaming, social media access, or recording video/audio; displaying or using devices without permission; using smartwatches for messaging or notifications.

Disciplinary Consequences:

- First Offense – Device is confiscated by admin and will be returned at the end of the school day; parent notified.
- Second Offense – Device held in the office until a parent picks it up at the end of the school day.
- Subsequent Offenses – Parent conference required; possible lunch detention, in-school suspension, or extended loss of privileges.

Important Notes: The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices. Parents are encouraged to contact the front office for urgent communication during school hours.

Chromebooks

Chromebooks will be checked out to each student at the beginning of the school year. Students are responsible for taking care of their Chromebooks or devices. Any damages to the Chromebook will be charged to the parents/guardians of the student.

Snyder ISD is a 1:1 device district. Students are expected to use school-issued Chromebooks for all digital tasks during the day. Personal devices may not substitute for Chromebooks.

Students in grades K-12 will need to pay a technology fee. Households will receive a 50% discount on technology fees with the completion of free and reduced lunch forms!

- 1 student: \$40 (\$20 with discount)
- 2 students: \$60 (\$30 with discount)
- 3 or more students: \$70 (\$30 with discount)



Devices requiring repair will be repaired by the Technology department. The following are the Chromebook Repair Fees:

- Broken Screen/display issues: \$100.00
- Liquid Damage/Total Loss: \$400.00
- Broken/lost charger: \$25.00
- Missing keys: \$25.00
- Broken Trackpad: \$25.00
- Broken Hinge: \$10.00

Class Parties

You must coordinate with your child's teacher before planning a class birthday party. Birthday foods are limited to store-bought items and a drink (water, milk, or 100% juice). Students with allergies must be provided with an alternative. If you plan to send birthday party invitations home with students, all students in the class must be included.

Dress Code

A child's parent/guardian will be contacted to bring a change of clothes. If the parent can't or doesn't show up within 1-hour, a "clothing closet" option is offered to the student. If a student refuses, they will be in ISS for the remainder of the day.

OSS may be utilized when deemed necessary by the administration.

Food Service / Free & Reduced-Price Meal Program

We provide a variety of nutritious, low-cost meals for students and staff. In accordance with the Federal Child Nutrition Program, foods of minimal nutritional value are not permitted in food service or eating areas during meal times.

All students are expected to follow cafeteria rules, including entering calmly, practicing good table manners, and showing courteous behavior. Cutting in line, loud talking, and other disruptive behaviors may result in disciplinary action.

Our schools participate in the Federal Child Nutrition Programs, which provide free breakfast to all students and free or reduced-price lunches based on family income. Student participation is kept strictly confidential. Families must reapply each year for free or reduced-price lunch; applications are available in the front office.

Student Lunches, Outside Food & Lunch Visitors

Students who do not eat school meals must bring lunch from home.

On Fridays, parents or emergency contacts listed in Skyward may bring outside food and eat with their child. Food may not be shared with other students, and outside food is not permitted on other days.

The legal parent/guardian can update emergency contacts anytime in Skyward. After logging in, select your child's name from the dropdown menu. Next, select online registration, then edit Emergency Contacts (section 1d).

Individuals may not bring lunch or food to share with other children, and we will not accept outside food on any other day.

This policy does not apply at the high school level, because it is an "open campus".

Grading Guidelines

Immunizations / Medications

Immunizations are required to come to public school. To check what records we have on file:

1. Log in to Skyward www.snyderisd.net/skyward
2. Select your student's name from the top drop-down menu
3. Select "health info" in the left column.
4. View the vaccinations we have on record for your child and if any are out of compliance.

Schedule an appointment with your healthcare provider or call the Scurry County Health Unit to make arrangements for needed vaccinations asap.

Late Work

Teachers will notify students of due dates for all assignments and any changes to due dates. Students who do not turn in assignments by the designated date(s) may be subject to grade penalties in accordance with campus or classroom procedures. The following maximum penalties may be applied to secondary students:



- One school day late – A maximum grade of 90
- Two school days late – A maximum grade of 80 (Parents should monitor Skyward for grades)
- Three to five days late – A maximum grade of 70
- After five school days, work does not have to be accepted and a grade of 0 may be assigned.

Long-term projects may not be accepted after the due date resulting in a grade of 0 in certain instances with the approval of the principal.

Lost, Damaged, Stolen and Personal Items

We ask that you discourage your child from wearing or bringing to school expensive or irreplaceable jewelry, watches, or sunglasses. Students are responsible for all of their personal possessions while at school or any school-sponsored or school-related event.

The school district is not responsible for any personal items that are lost, damaged, or stolen at school or a school-related activity. We recommend that all personal belongings have the child's name printed on them somewhere for identification.

Parent / Guardian Involvement

ParentSquare

ParentSquare is the primary school-to-home communication tool for receiving important information and an easy way to communicate with your child's teachers. This platform sends information to the parents / legal guardians listed in Skyward via text, email, and/or through the ParentSquare App.

New to the District? Your ParentSquare account will activate within 24 hours after your online registration is verified and accepted.

Important Setup Tips:

- Double-check your contact information in Skyward.
- Avoid entering the same phone number or email for both parents/guardians, as this may merge your accounts in ParentSquare.

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Snyder ISD uses PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) to promote a safe, respectful, and supportive learning environment. PBIS teaches clear behavior expectations and reinforces positive choices across all campuses.

To support PBIS, we use Minga, a digital platform that helps manage student behavior, track points, recognize positive actions, and communicate with students in real time. Minga also allows us to organize student IDs, hall passes, and campus events in one easy-to-use system. Together, PBIS and Minga help us build a strong, positive school culture focused on student success.

School Bus / Transportation

Riding the school bus is a privilege, not a right. To maintain effective discipline and ensure safe transportation, a bus driver may refer a student to the principal's office for misbehavior. The principal or appropriate administrator will implement additional discipline management techniques as needed, which may include restricting or revoking the student's bus privileges. Because the primary responsibility of the district is to transport students safely, drivers must remain focused on the road without being distracted by misconduct.

Bus Routes

Bus routes are created to enhance student safety while maximizing vehicle efficiency. Stops are created at locations that allow students to wait off the main roadway for the bus if at all possible.

Bus stops are placed at centralized locations that can be safely accessed by a significant number of students and to minimize the time length and mileage of the run. If you have concerns about your child's safety you are encouraged to accompany your child to the bus stop or arrange a neighborhood buddy to walk with your child.

General Bus Rules and Regulations

Riding the bus is a privilege, not a right. The goal of Snyder I.S.D. is to provide safe and efficient transportation to and from school.

- An eligible transported student is defined as one who resides two (2) or more miles from school, or a student who participates in special classes for exceptional children and who meets applicable state criteria.
- Snyder ISD may videotape a route to monitor student behavior and for quality control. Your child may be videotaped at any time while riding the bus to and from school. However, *state law governing student privacy does not permit a parent to view a videotape on which any other student can be recognized.*
- Students and parents are to follow all safety precautions at all times.
- Students shall load and unload at designated stops only. Each student will be assigned one designated pick-up and drop-off point.
- Pets must be restrained and kept away from the bus! It is extremely important that parent/guardian's keep the family pets out of the road. Every year pets get injured or killed by buses. Students have been known to run after their pet in front of, or behind the bus and into traffic. *PLEASE, help us with this very big problem! The only recourse Snyder I.S.D. has is to call animal control or suspend service.*



- Students are required to be at their designated bus stop ten (10) minutes prior to the scheduled pick-up time. In order to ensure that the bus arrives to school in a timely manner, the bus cannot wait for students that are running late to the bus stop. Drivers may wait for students who are in sight if they are hurrying. Drivers will not blow horn for students. If a student misses the bus, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to provide transportation to, or from the child's school.
- Parents are not to enter the bus at any time. It is a misdemeanor for parents or non-authorized personnel to board a school bus without proper authorization, or to refuse to exit if asked by the bus driver; resulting in the interference with the transportation of students. Please call the transportation office if you have any concerns.
- A parent/guardian, or an authorized adult, must be present at the morning and afternoon bus stop for all students assigned to the Special Education Program, and students in Kindergarten through 2nd grade. Please call if you are unable to meet the bus. If no one is at the stop to meet the bus, the student will be returned to the home campus for parent pickup.
- Classroom conduct is expected at all times while on the bus. The school day begins when the student boards the bus and ends when the student departs the bus.
- Students shall wait off of the roadway for the bus to come to a complete stop before walking toward the bus to board.
- If students are required to cross in front of the bus, they must wait for the driver to signal them when it is safe to cross. They must then walk ten (10) feet in front of the bus, never behind the bus!
- Students will be assigned seats on the bus, and are expected to sit in their assigned seat at all times.
- Students are required to wear their seatbelt if their bus is equipped with seatbelts.
- Students and/or parents will be held financially responsible for any damage caused to their assigned seat while on the bus. If a student notices any change in condition of his/her seat, the driver must be notified immediately.
- Students are never permitted to stand on the bus while the bus is in motion. Students must sit facing forward with their feet on the floor. No part of the body should extend into the aisle.
- At no time shall a student extend any part of his/her body out of the bus window. Nor shall a student yell, throw, spit, or pass any items through the windows.
- No eating or drinking will be allowed on the bus. During the hot summer months, an exception of a water bottle will be allowed so students may stay hydrated. As a safety precaution, water bottles must be kept in the student's lap, and not left on the seat or floor when the student exits the bus.



- Possession and/or use of alcohol, tobacco, or any other form of drugs are not allowed on the bus.
- Firearms, knives, slingshots, or any other weapons are prohibited. It is a felony to exhibit, threaten to exhibit, or use firearms on any school bus transporting students to and from school, or school sponsored events.
- Electronics: Headphones, Radios, Cassette Players, CD Players, MP3 Players, DVD Players, electronic handhelds (ex. Gameboys, Nintendo DS, PSP, Etc.) or computers (laptop or handheld) are not to be brought on the bus. Any of these items may be confiscated by the driver. The parent/guardian can retrieve the item at the SISD Transportation office.
- The following items are not allowed on the bus: fireworks, lighters, matches, sports balls, skateboards, glass items, balloons, water balloons, cameras, laser pointers, flashlights, make-up, perfume/cologne, hairspray, deodorizers, shaving cream, or any aerosol products.
- Toy guns, water guns, replica firearms, look-alike weapons, or any item that could reasonably be mistaken for a weapon are strictly prohibited. Possession of such items on a school bus or other district transportation is considered a serious safety violation. Students may be removed from transportation immediately, and appropriate school officials and authorities, including law enforcement when warranted, will be notified.
- Students will not be permitted to carry any large items on the bus that will not fit into their laps or on an empty seat, if available. This includes large band instruments, duffel bags, science projects, etc.
- Audio or video recording of other students, staff members, or the bus driver without permission is prohibited.
- No animals, insects, reptiles, birds, or fish will be allowed on the bus at any time.
- Profanity or obscene gestures will not be tolerated.

Field Trip and Extracurricular Transportation

All General Bus Rules and Regulations apply during field trips, extracurricular activities, athletic trips, and all other school-sponsored travel, whether transportation is provided by a school bus or any other district-owned or district-operated vehicle.

In addition, the following expectations apply:



- Students must follow the directions of the driver and trip sponsor/chaperone at all times.
- Seat assignments will be required and may be changed at the discretion of the driver or sponsor/chaperone.
- Students may only ride transportation approved by the district and authorized for the trip.
- Students must remain with their assigned group and follow sponsor/chaperone instructions during stops.
- Excessive noise, horseplay, standing while the vehicle is in motion, or behavior that distracts the driver is prohibited.
- Sponsors/chaperones are responsible for assisting with student supervision and accountability during the trip.
- Parents/guardians who wish to remove their child from school-sponsored transportation at the conclusion of a trip must comply with all applicable campus checkout and release procedures. Students will only be released in accordance with campus policies and approved district procedures.
- Violations of transportation rules during field trips or extracurricular travel may result in disciplinary action and/or loss of future trip privileges.

Disciplinary Regulations

- The Principal and authorized personnel for SISD Transportation will take necessary steps to maintain acceptable student conduct on school buses.
- Students who fail to conduct themselves in an acceptable manner may be denied the privilege of school bus transportation.
- It is recommended that the parent/guardian's cooperation be sought in each case before a student is excluded from transportation.
- It is understood that the bus driver has the responsibility and authority to maintain order on the school bus.
- Student behavior that endangers the safety of others will not be tolerated.
- It is the duty of the campus principal to exclude a student from riding. However, the Bus Driver is authorized to exercise reasonable judgment in order to protect other passengers or themselves.



Corrective Action

Please see the student handbook for consequences.

Notification or exception of the disciplinary steps must be approved by district administration.

Social Media

- The student's full name and grade
- The specific types of media use you do not allow

Requests are valid for the current school year only and must be renewed each year.

2. **Log In:** Enter your Skyward Family Access username and password. If you do not know your Skyward username or password, you can click “Forgot Your Login / Password?” on the Skyward login screen.
3. **Choose Your Child:** If you have more than one child, select their name from the dropdown menu.
4. **View Grades:** Click on the **Gradebook** tab to see current grades and missing assignments.
5. **Set Up Notifications (Optional):** You can choose to receive email updates when grades are entered.

Tardies

- Elementary: marked tardy if arrive after 7:50 AM.
- Secondary: marked tardy if arrive after 8:00 AM.
- We define “tardy” as less than an hour and fifteen minutes of missed instruction for elementary instruction. If a student arrives over an hour late, the administration's discretion for next steps.
- Secondary tardy is defined as more than 10 minutes to class, after 10 minutes the student is considered absent to that class.
- Tardies will begin being entered into Skyward the 3rd week of school.
- Consequences and rewards are assigned per 6 weeks, as the tardy count is reset at each grading-cycle.
