Background Information:

This summer we are working to expand our successful 2025 intervention to support at-risk students. Last year we facilitated a K-5 summer school with approximately 17 students attending. These students demonstrated lower regression when entering in the Fall and appear to have held on to these gains through winter MAP testing. This year we are expanding some of our opportunities to some of our neediest groups (preschool) and developing opportunities for those we have not serviced Middle School.

The Preschool Summer School will be a 16 day program occurring in July targeting at-risk students mostly from the Preschool for All program. We are currently targeting 10 students for this program. The projected cost of this program is \$6,200. It will be funded through Preschool for All Grant funds.

The K-5 Summer School will be a 16 day program occurring in July targeting at-risk students with needs primarily in Reading with some math support. We are currently targeting 32 students for this program. The projected cost of this program is \$9,450. It will be funded through Title 1 Grant funds.

The Kindergarten Kickoff program will be 4 mornings in August the week before school aimed at at-risk students that staff believe will have difficulty with the transition into Kindergarten. This program is meant to help the students establish the kindergarten routine prior to school starting. We are currently targeting 3 students for this program. The projected cost of this program is \$800. It will be funded through Title 1 Grant funds.

The Middle School Transition program will be 8 mornings in August the two weeks before school starts. This program is aimed to help develop skills of current middle school students in reading and mathematics while also assisting new middle school students with the transition. Its aim is to help gear up at-risk students to be in a better academic space to start the school year. The group will be doing a novel study together in addition to targeted math supports and transition activities. We are currently targeting 9 students for this program. We anticipate that this is a dry run for the

2027 summer which will potentially have significantly more at-risk students. The projected cost of this program is \$1600. It will be funded through Title 1 Grant funds.
