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	<p>Please respond with the number/type of community engagement opportunities you hosted this year this includes classroom guests, voc rehab, etc.</p> <p>I'm not entirely sure what the exact parameters are for community engagement, but I wanted to share a few things we've done this year that might qualify:</p> <p>Scientist Skype Sessions In all of my high school classes, we hosted nine virtual sessions with scientists from around the world—including the U.S., U.K., Sweden, and South Africa. This was part of our PLC goal to bring the broader community into our curriculum and expose students to real-world science experiences.</p> <p>Biweekly Mini-Community Projects To help build SEL skills, we did small community-focused activities every other week. These included writing letters to friends, thanking school staff, picking up litter, and cleaning the halls. We also took on slightly larger projects like making tie blankets for grieving individuals and helping animals—rehabbing fish from PetSmart, raising butterflies, and returning fallen eggs to nests.</p> <p>Community Service Club Involvement Our Community Service Club participated in off-campus service opportunities, including packing meals at Feed My Starving Children and assisting with the Adaptive Hockey event.</p> <p>Prom Cleanup Support While not formally planned as a community engagement initiative, prom cleanup and chaperoning brought in support from local groups like the American Legion and individuals such as Belinda. Their involvement helped connect our school with the wider community.</p> <p>Upcoming Zoo Kudos Project My 6th graders will soon be writing kudos letters to zookeepers at the Como Zoo, sharing what they've learned and highlighting their favorite animals. We're excited about this upcoming project as a way to show appreciation and connect with local professionals.</p> <p>Regular Family Communication Each Monday, my high school students email their families to share updates on grades and classroom happenings.
