VI. Administrative Reports

VI.A. Superintendent's Report

VI.A.1. Mr. Fox advised the board that the Joint Annual Conference in Chicago will be held from November 19 - 22, 2026. Registration begins June 1 and to let Angie know if you plan to attend.

Mr. Fox stated that the 2026-2027 online registration will be July 13 – July 20 with walk in registration on July 16 from 10am-6pm.

Mr. Fox updated the board on the IRS penalties from 2019, 2021, and 2022. Mr. Fox stated that these are penalties from the filing of the 1095C. Mr. Fox became aware of these penalties in the Fall of 2024.

The 2019 1095C was filed but the IRS reached out with three requests regarding errors and had been turned over to the collections agency. The penalty is at \$861,666.22. Mr. Fox and Kemper CPA are working to get the amount abated.

The 2021 1095C was not filed and the requests were ignored. Mr. Fox is working with the IRS as the first abatement request was denied and he has filed an appeal providing more information with Kemper CPA. The amount of this penalty is at \$276,011.35.

The 2022 1095C was not filed and we had received 2 requests. Mr. Fox was able to respond in a timely manner and provide correct documentation and the penalty has been waived in the amount of \$283,910.00.

Mr. Fox updated the board on the Community Mapping Project meetings he has been attending. Groups have been given priority areas. Mr. Rusk and Mr. Fox are on the housing and business development plan. Their group will be focusing on what housing is needed and the options for affordable housing.

Mr. Fox updated the board on the Emergency Services Coordination Meetings. The schools, Sheriff, City Police Department, EMS, Hospital, Fire, and OCC discuss plans in

the event of natural disasters, active shooters, etc.

Mrs. Lockley asked Mr. Fox if they are still working on the entrances/road to RCES in case of emergency. It is hard for emergency vehicles to get through in the morning and afternoon during drop off/pick up times. Mr. Fox said they plan to meet with the city this summer to work on a plan.

High School student parking lot discussion. Mr. Fox stated there were 22 parking spots added when the south parking lot was redone. This year all parking passes sold out at the beginning of the school year, so none were available as students received their driver's license during the year. Mr. Kocher asked why we had to charge for parking passes and where does the money go? Mr. Fox will follow up with more information.

High School cafeteria seating and lack of food discussion.

Mr. Fox and Mr. Thompson, RCHS Principal, said there are always seats available, if a large group of students want to sit together, there might not always be that many seats in one spot. Also, some students just prefer to sit on the steps to eat. Also, there is always food available. There are times when the main entrée will run out but there are always other options available. The food service staff is always making more if they are running low.

VI.B. Assistant Superintendent's Report

VI.B.1. Construction Update on the Athletic Complex by Houston Meyer of GeoSurfaces and Rylan Rusk. Mr. Meyer stated the adjustments went well for the change of tennis court orientation. He stated the turf would be arriving and will be installed, light poles are going up and the track work will begin. Mr. Kocher asked about the football end zone turf being "Olney Tigers", he had a few calls regarding and wondered if it is too late to change.

Mr. Rusk let the board know that the South Building release to bid would be on May 28th. There will be a pre-bid meeting on June 4 and bids will be due June 18. With this timeline they hope to have completion sometime in the fall semester.

Mrs. Rodgers gave an update on the assessment data. She gave comparison of scores from 2019/2021 and 2026. The ACT 2026 data was not available yet.
