

FPC Allen Campus Board Report April 2026

- The Allen Campus hosted an ALERRT Active Attack Integrated Response (AAIR) course over Spring Break for 30 trainees from local departments. The training focused on improving coordination among law enforcement, fire, telecommunicators, and EMS during active attack events. Participants learned key medical skills based on TECC guidelines for point-of-injury care, along with strategies for integrated response using the rescue task force model to enhance victim survivability and overall response effectiveness.
- T-shirts were presented to 71 graduating seniors from Perryton High School who maintained their Pathways designation and qualified for the Pathways Scholarship to attend FPC this fall.
- Students enjoyed a variety of treats and participated in an Easter egg hunt held on campus in April. The event provided a fun and engaging opportunity for students to connect, celebrate the season, and build a sense of community outside the classroom.
- The CDL department successfully completed a testing audit conducted by the Texas Department of Public Safety in March. The audit reviewed testing procedures and compliance standards, and no findings were reported, reflecting the department's adherence to all required guidelines and regulations.
- ESL students toured FPC's campuses in Perryton to explore the range of programs and opportunities available to them. The visit introduced students to potential academic and career pathways, helping build awareness and interest in continuing their education at FPC and creating a strong pipeline of future students.
- Team members assisted incoming dual credit students from Perryton ISD with completing admissions applications for the 2026–2027 academic year during March and April workshops, resulting in 100 submitted applications.
- Karen Metzger and Nancy Angeles met with counselors in April from Canadian, Booker, Spearman, Darrouzett, and Follett ISDs to prepare for dual credit registration for the upcoming academic year. The meeting included an overview of program updates, important deadlines, and course availability. Counselors were provided with resources and training to assist students with eligibility, enrollment procedures, and academic planning. This coordinated effort supports student success by improving communication and ensuring a smooth registration process across partner districts.
- The Rural Pathway Excellence Partnership Program (R-PEP) for the northeast panhandle has been established and includes Canadian, Follett, Darrouzett, and Perryton ISDs. This collaborative initiative will focus on developing career pathways in Information Technology and Diesel Mechanics. Students will have the opportunity to begin coursework in these pathways starting in Fall 2026.
