

## **2024-25 HLWW Middle School Improvement Plan Results**

### **Strategic Goal # 1: All students perform at or above expectations**

**Middle School Goal:** The number of students at or above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile will increase by 5% from the fall baseline score of 54% to the spring score of 59% in reading as measured by the FastBridge assessment.

**Result:** 55% of students scored at or above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile. Overall, our students showed significant growth, but the goal was not met.

**2025-26 Goal:** The number of students at or above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile will increase by 5% from the fall baseline score to the spring score in reading as measured by the FastBridge assessment.

### **Strategic Goal #2: All students feel they belong and are supported**

**Middle School Goal:** By the end of 3rd quarter, the percentage of HLWW Middle School students scoring in the “Not At-Risk” category in the SAEBRS assessment will increase by 5% from the fall baseline score of 85% to the March score of 90%

**Result:** 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 83% of the students scored at the “Not at Risk” category on the SAEBRS Assessment. We did see a decrease in the number of students who were at “High Risk” but did not meet our intended goal.

**2025-26 Goal:** We will continue to have a goal that focuses on measuring student belonging. Over the summer we will be in contact with trainers that work with SAEBRS to gain a better understanding of how to measure this growth.

### **Strategic Goal #3: Effective and efficient use of resources**

**Middle School Goal:** We will maximize paraprofessional efficiency by transitioning to a resource room model of student support.

**Result:** This model change was embraced by both paras and teachers. Their collective efforts made the transition in a timely and effective manner. As a result, we were able to service more students with less staff and did not need to hire additional paraprofessionals. This goal was achieved

**2025-26 Goal:** Our goal for next year will focus on students as resources as we look to create a “Reading Buddy” student mentoring program. This will pair 8<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students and our 6<sup>th</sup> grade students with students in Laker Care.

### **Strategic Goal #4: Demonstrate HLWW school communities as the BEST choice for students, staff and residents**

**Result:** The Middle School parent advisory committee was formed and met quarterly. Through their work we identified ways to increase parent involvement and communication at the Middle School. For 2025-26

we will have grade level parent meetings before school similar to VIP breakfast that we will call “Laker Launch”. This time will be used to share information with parents about the day-to-day workings of the middle school. This goal has been achieved.

**2025-26 Goal:** This goal will continue with the implementation of Laker Launch as well as a monthly Middle School newsletter.

**Strategic Goal #5: Create and maintain a collaborative culture, focused on learning and results**

**Middle School Goal: The number of students scoring a 3 “Consistent” for Responsible on Laker Skills will increase by 5% from the 75% 1st quarter to 80% 3rd quarter report card.**

**Results:** 85% of students scoring a 3 “Consistent” for being responsible for Laker Skills on their third quarter report card. Goal achieved.

**2025-26 Goal:** The number of students scoring a 3 “Consistent” for being responsible for Laker Skills will increase by 5% from the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter baseline score to the third quarter report card score.
