

Code of Conduct Changes 26-27

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Sexual Physical Contact

Definition: Explicit sexual behavior or activity that is consensual in nature.

Level 3: A level three behavior is a behavior infraction that disrupts the educational setting, targets others, and/or impacts the safety of others. A level three behavior will result in an Office Discipline Referral (ODR) and may result in removal from instruction for part of a day or an entire school day

Level 4: A level four behavior is a behavior infraction that significantly disrupts the educational setting, targets others, and/or impacts the safety of others and is distinguishable by its repetitiveness and/or severity. A level four behavior results in an Office Discipline Referral (ODR), may result in dismissal from school for one or more days, and may result in notification to law enforcement.



Substantial Disruption

Definition: Engaging in, encouraging, organizing, or facilitating conduct that materially disrupts the educational environment, school operations, or the safety of students and staff.

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Level 4: A level four behavior is a behavior infraction that significantly disrupts the educational setting, targets others, and/or impacts the safety of others and is distinguishable by its repetitiveness and/or severity. A level four behavior results in an Office Discipline Referral (ODR), may result in dismissal from school for one or more days, and may result in notification to law enforcement.



Technology Adjacent Codes

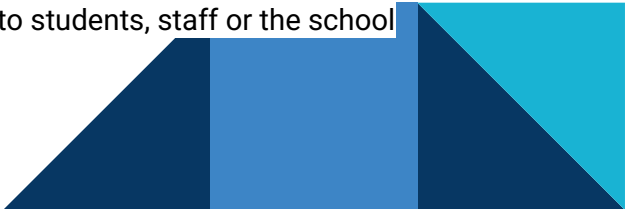
Technology misuse: Engaging in inappropriate use of school or personal device, camera, computer, or other electronic device using the school district system, Internet resources or accounts.

- Levels 1-3
- Addresses the utilization of technology in a way that violates the acceptable use policy and District resources/devices
- This is a current code with additional language & clarification. Key change is the nexus to the acceptable use policy and District resources/devices

Add: Cell Phone & PED misuse: Inappropriate use of cell phone or a personal electronic devices (PEDs).

- Levels 1-3
- Addresses the utilization of personal devices at inappropriate times, playing games, etc. in a way that is not allowed based upon school rules and expectations (elementary, middle and high school).

Add: Inappropriate recording/sharing/creating: Creating, altering, recording, sharing, posting, live streaming, or distributing images, videos, audio recordings, or other digital media that violate privacy, disrupt school operations, harm others, or promote misconduct.

- Levels 3-5
 - Addresses the utilization of technology in a way that creates harm or safety concerns to students, staff or the school environment.
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Adjusting the response & intervention categories
