

Ramona Rock Tikigaq School (Point Hope)



Ramona Rock has coached the Tikigaq girls varsity basketball program for 12+ years, serving students and families in Point Hope. In a community where school sports can be a central gathering place, her leadership has helped build a program marked by consistency, discipline, and team identity.

Under her guidance, the Harpoonerettes have become one of Alaska's premier small-school programs, winning four Class 2A girls state championships since 2018, including two back-to-back championship runs. Her work has also been recognized through Coach of the Year honors multiple times.

But the Harpoonerettes' accomplishments under Coach Rock have extended beyond banners. Her teams have pursued excellence in the full student-athlete experience — including strong academic

achievement, team-first play, and representing their school with pride. They have also competed successfully outside Alaska, including notable performances in Las Vegas, highlighted by wins against larger-classification competition.

Rock is quick to point away from herself, giving "all the honor and glory to God" and expressing gratitude for her family and for the young women who have done the work. She has emphasized that nothing was given — that success was earned through hard work on the floor, in the classroom, and through commitment to their community and culture.

Ramona Rock's Hall of Fame recognition honors a coach whose impact is measured not only in championships, but in the standards she set and the opportunities she helped create for student-athletes from one of Alaska's most remote communities.

Attendance and Behavior Incentives

Students are given tickets for good behavior and perfect weekly attendance.

- Tickets are drawn weekly and the students drawn are permitted to get one prize from the weekly prize chest

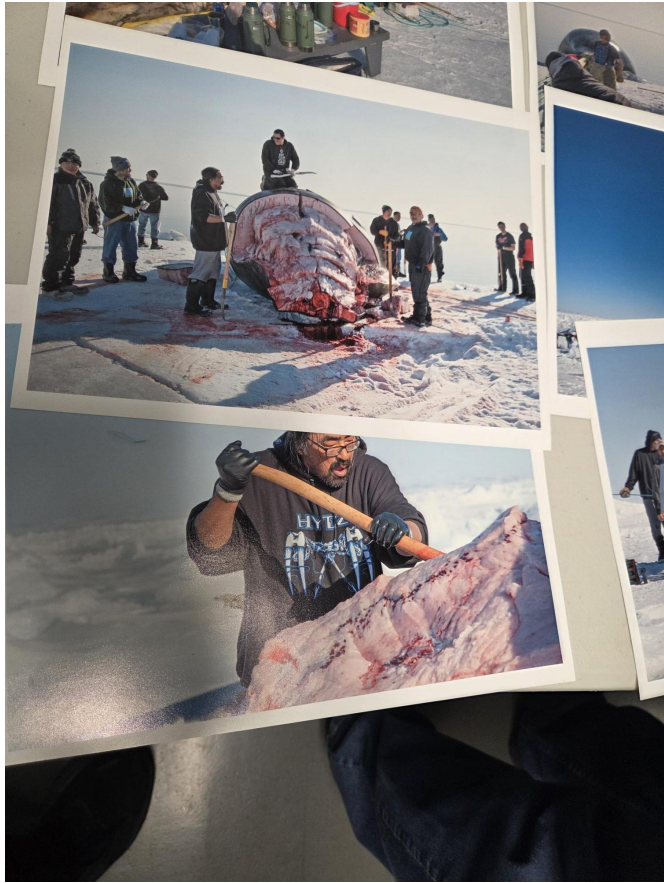
