Primary Campus

Daily lessons emphasize phonics, reading fluency, number sense, and mathematical thinking. Students are also building speaking and listening skills through collaborative learning, partner discussions, and small-group activities.

Intermediate Campus

Intermediate students are participating in teacher-led and hands-on learning experiences focused on strengthening math fluency and mastery of highly tested TEKS. Instruction is targeted to address areas identified through STAAR and classroom data while providing students with opportunities to apply skills through engaging activities and small-group support.

Junior High (Grades 6–8)

Junior High students are utilizing Edgenuity courses and targeted intervention activities designed to address unfinished learning and close academic gaps. Teachers are actively monitoring student progress, analyzing performance data, and pulling small groups for focused instruction to ensure students receive support in critical skill areas.

High School (Grades 9–11)

High School students are working through Edgenuity coursework aligned to their individual learning needs while teachers closely monitor progress and provide targeted small-group instruction to address academic gaps. In addition, English I students participated in a Summer STAAR EOC Boot Camp focused on reading, writing, and test-taking strategies in preparation for the June STAAR EOC retake administration.
