Behavior:

In March we had 50 behavior referrals:
25 due to 3 or more times tardy to class for the quarter
5 for skipping class
7 for fighting
2 for instigating a fight/recording a fight on their phone
2 for vaping
9 for disorderly conduct: refusing to give up phone, PD, disrespect to staff

Sukapi Students:

Students who do not have a “F” in any class, no major behavior referrals/classroom behavior log entries, and good attendance are released 5 minutes early for lunch. Student not meeting Sukapi standards are released to lunch at the regular time and are referred to noon tutoring for help getting assignments completed,

Mrs. Hall:

We are in the home stretch of the school year with the 4th quarter. That means we are in our final stages of state and district assessments. Here are the assessments scheduled for the fourth quarter:

- MSA -Science 8th grade students only - Testing was scheduled for this week, but has been moved to next week April 13-17 due to the low enrollment and short week. Mrs. Goss will be giving the assessment in her science classes. In addition, Tristan, Cheyenn, Diane and Andrea will be giving the assessment for their 8th grade students.
- MAST window 3 is open from March 30-May 22 for ELA and Math. Pacing maps show math and ELA classes giving the MAST assessment April 13-24.
- District writing assessment - ELA classes will be giving the MyACCESS writing April 27-May 1st.
- AimswebPlus - ELA and math classes complete the spring benchmark for math and reading assessment scheduled for May 11-15
- Dynamic Learning Map (MAP) Alternate - Diane McDonald will be giving the assessment to her students. Window is currently open and closes May 15th.
- DESSA mini - Window is open from May 4-22, this spring universal screening is completed by the advisory teacher for their advisory students.

March was an exciting and productive month for both students and staff. The Sukapi Student Carnival was a highlight, giving students the opportunity to participate in a variety of fun, interactive games while strengthening positive school culture. Our Sukapi list continues to grow each month, and incentives like the carnival seem to be highly motivating for students.

We welcomed teachers from Anaconda, who visited classrooms to observe the implementation of the Reveal Math curriculum and the ways our teachers actively engage students in mathematics instruction. They also met with our math teachers to discuss the curriculum and share strategies that increase student engagement. The visiting team provided very positive feedback about our school environment, noting the cleanliness of the building, smooth transitions between classes, and the visible presence of staff supporting students in the hallways.

Staff collaborated using our new Science of Reading walkthrough tool to review key instructional Science of Reading (SoR) best practices. The data we gather from the walkthrough will help identify areas for growth, guide future professional development, and ensure continued alignment with effective literacy practices across all curriculums.

Additionally, there has been a strong focus on strengthening writing across the curriculum. Professional development has supported teachers in embedding writing into daily instruction through strategies such as free writes, “perfect sentences,” and quick writes used as bell ringers or exit tickets. With continued support for teachers, these practices will further enhance student writing skills across all content areas.

Finally, the whole school had a blast with our Easter Egg Hunt! Eggs were hidden all around, and some had tickets inside that students could trade for a prize. It was so fun to see kids running, laughing, and enjoying the hunt together—a day full of smiles and excitement!

EVENTS:

Our Family Literacy night for March was conducted by our P.E. department. At the event parents participated in a variety of games and activities. Healthy snacks including fruits, vegetables, and cheese were available. Those who attended had a great time.
