A Data-Driven Vision

NCSD aims to reduce the number of repeat offenders by 45%.

- ✓ **AB 285 & AB 330:** Restorative mandates & removal protocols.
- ✓ **NRS 392.4645:** Removal protocols for safety.
- ✓ **Due Process:** Manifestation determinations for IEP/504 students.

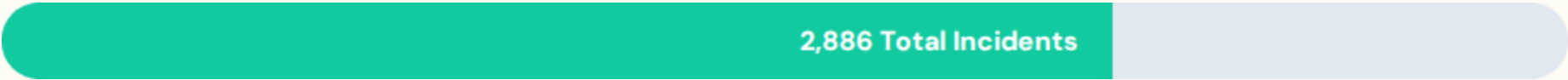


DISCIPLINE SNAPSHOT: YEAR-OVER-YEAR

Strategic Reduction: 29.1%

Targeted restorative practices and clear administrative guidelines have led to a nearly 30% drop in overall disciplinary actions district-wide.

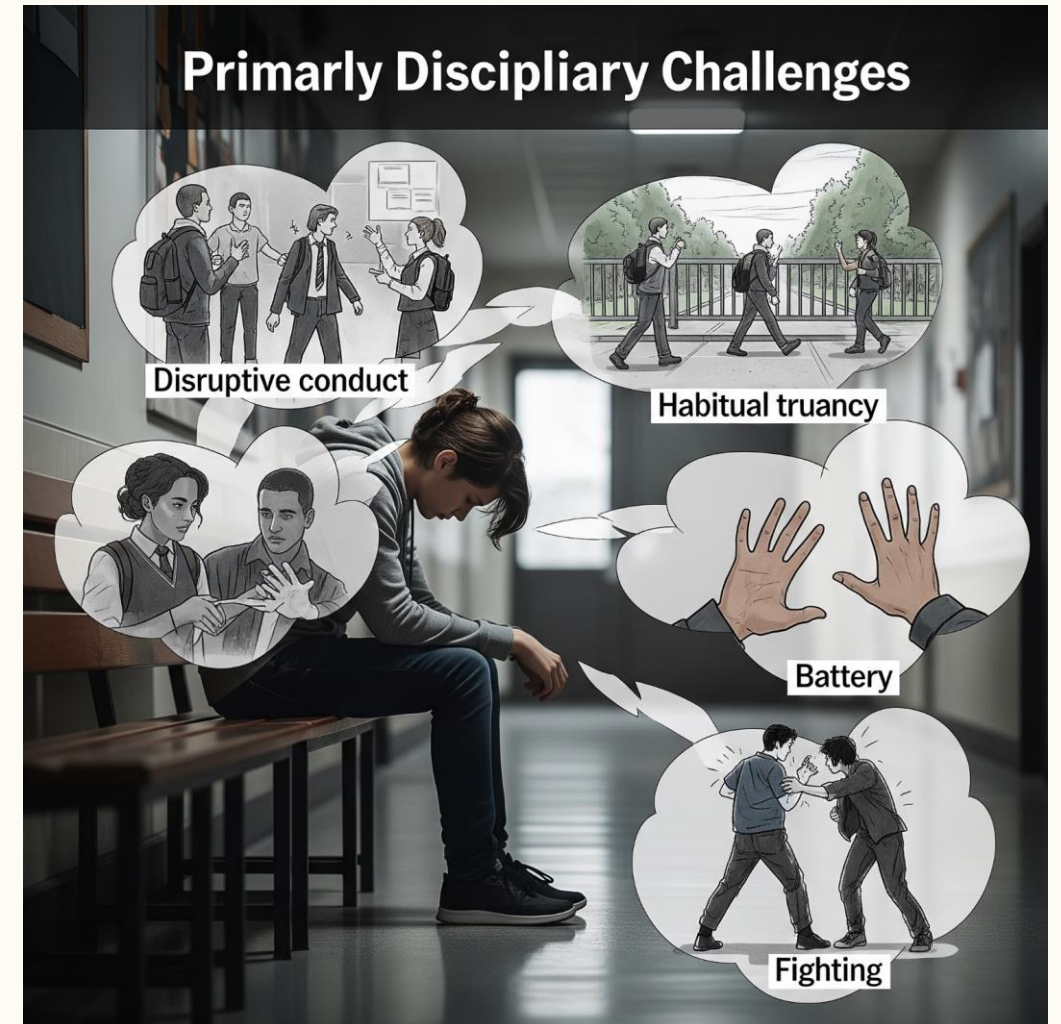

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE IMPACT

Significant Improvement

The percentage of students committing more than one offense dropped by nearly **8 percentage points** year-over-year.

Volume Reduction

Repeat offenders dropped from **nearly half** (2024-25) to **one-third** (2025-26) of the disciplinary population.

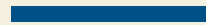
Incident Correlation

Lower recidivism directly fueled a **29.1% reduction** in total disciplinary incidents district-wide.

The transition to restorative justice practices has successfully targeted repeat behavior, leading to a safer and more stable educational environment for all students.

Strategic Progress

Core Changes for the 2026/27 School Year



DEFINING "FIGHTING"

A standardized definition is essential for safety and consistent enforcement.

"A physical altercation involving mutual or non-mutual combat between two or more parties. This includes any intentional, hostile physical contact; such as striking, kicking, pushing, or grappling, that compromises the safety of the individuals involved and disrupts the educational environment."



STRUCTURAL POLICY SHIFTS



Saturday School Removal

Removal of Saturday School to redirect administrative resources into real-time, school-day restorative support.



Conduct Escalation

Added tiered escalation for **Disruptive Conduct** to move beyond repeated cycles of low-level restorative action.



Nicotine Inclusion

Formal addition of **Nicotine Products** (pouches) to the existing Tobacco and Related Products section.

CATEGORICAL PRECISION

Refining definitions allows for targeted interventions and clearer reporting of climate issues.

Bullying / Cyberbullying

Separated into distinct infractions/events to track digital versus in-person intimidation patterns more accurately.

Racial Discrimination

Isolated "Incident of Discrimination Based on Race" for specialized restorative hearing and investigation protocols.

Sexual Misconduct

Increased Consequences:

Significantly hardened penalties for sexual harassment and misconduct to ensure victim safety.
