



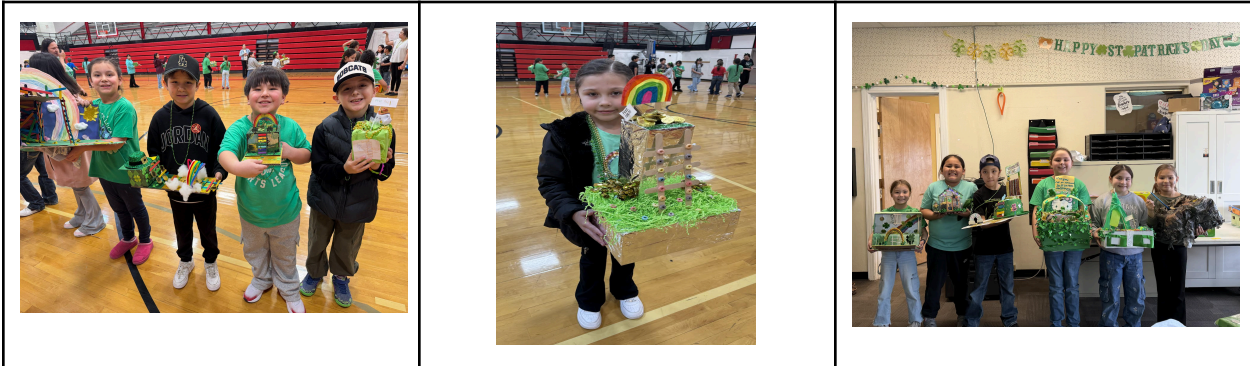

Coaches Corner

This month has been a busy month as we continue to roll out instructional frameworks and tighten up routines in the areas we see needing support.

Earlier in the month we held our MTSS Meeting. Teachers added Winter Benchmark Data from Aimsweb, then analyzed each student's progress monitoring goals and added the sticky note to the data wall. Growth within each intervention group (WIN) was

celebrated and next steps were put in place to ensure students continue to stay on track till the next May benchmark.

Walk to Tiered Math groups began. Using the IXL Level Up Diagnostic reports showed our tier 1 and tier 2 groups who began receiving small group support with our Teacher Aides out of the homeroom class. Students bring math folders and iPads and follow a structured lesson that meets their needs. Homeroom teachers keep their tier 3 students and low tier 2 to receive instructional support with manipulatives and instructional support through gradual release along with continuous practice.
