Cocurricular/Extracurricular Activities

~~The Board recognizes extracurricular activities, when properly planned and conducted in an appropriate, safe environment, represent an essential part of the educational experience. The Board supports such extracurricular activities and will attempt to make them available on a voluntary basis to the students. It is the Board's goal to provide each student with a balanced program of academic studies and extracurricular activities to be determined by the school, the parents and the students.~~

~~Extracurricular activities will be organized, supervised activities conducted under the auspices of the district, specific school or an element thereof and on district property, which primarily involve students in other than a classroom situation and for which no credit separate from the approved course shall be given.~~

~~The following may be considered extracurricular activities:~~

- ~~1.—— Student government and its related activities and organizations;~~
- ~~2.—— Musical festivals or contests, speaking activities and drama;~~
- ~~3.—— Organized activities which are part of interscholastic athletics;~~
- ~~4.—— All types of interscholastic competition;~~
- ~~5.—— Special interest clubs.~~

~~The Board will approve specific extracurricular activities through the authority it extends to the principals to authorize and administer them in keeping with this policy and any Board approved regulations.~~

Cocurricular/Extracurricular activities will be organized, supervised activities conducted under the sponsorship of the district.

Cocurricular/Extracurricular activities are considered to be any activity such as, but not limited to, student government, contests, athletics and clubs. Participants in these activities will be subject to the basic rules pertaining to cocurricular/extracurricular activities and the district's student code of conduct.

These rules are to be followed and enforced by activity coaches or advisors. Offenses will be handled by district-approved procedures.

Students who represent the school in voluntary activities may be required to conform to dress and grooming standards approved by the superintendent and may be denied the opportunity to participate if those standards are not met.

Activity advisors or coaches who issue any additional rules for individual activities must obtain approval from the superintendent or designee prior to allowing participation.
