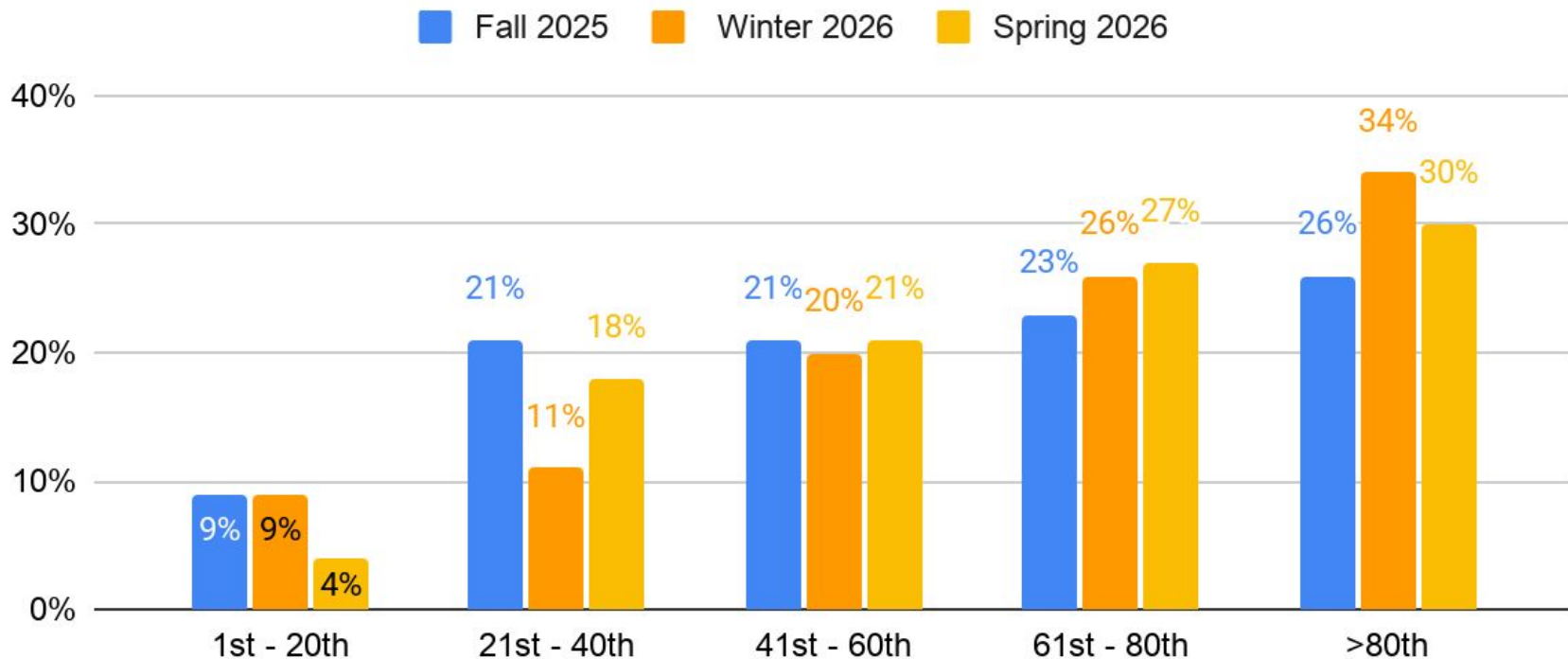

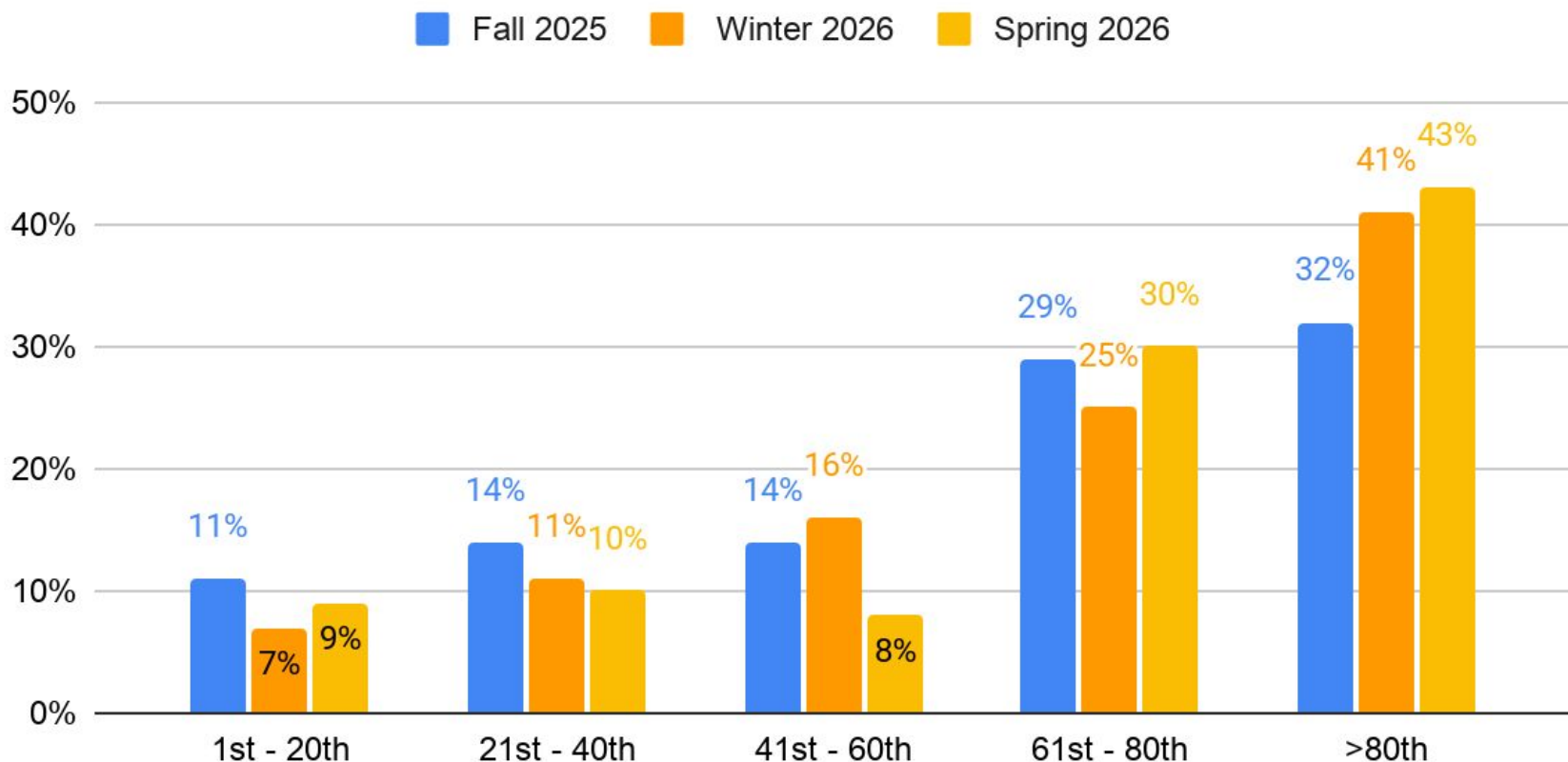
Percent of 2nd graders in each RIT Performance Category Reading MAP Test

School Improvement Plan Update

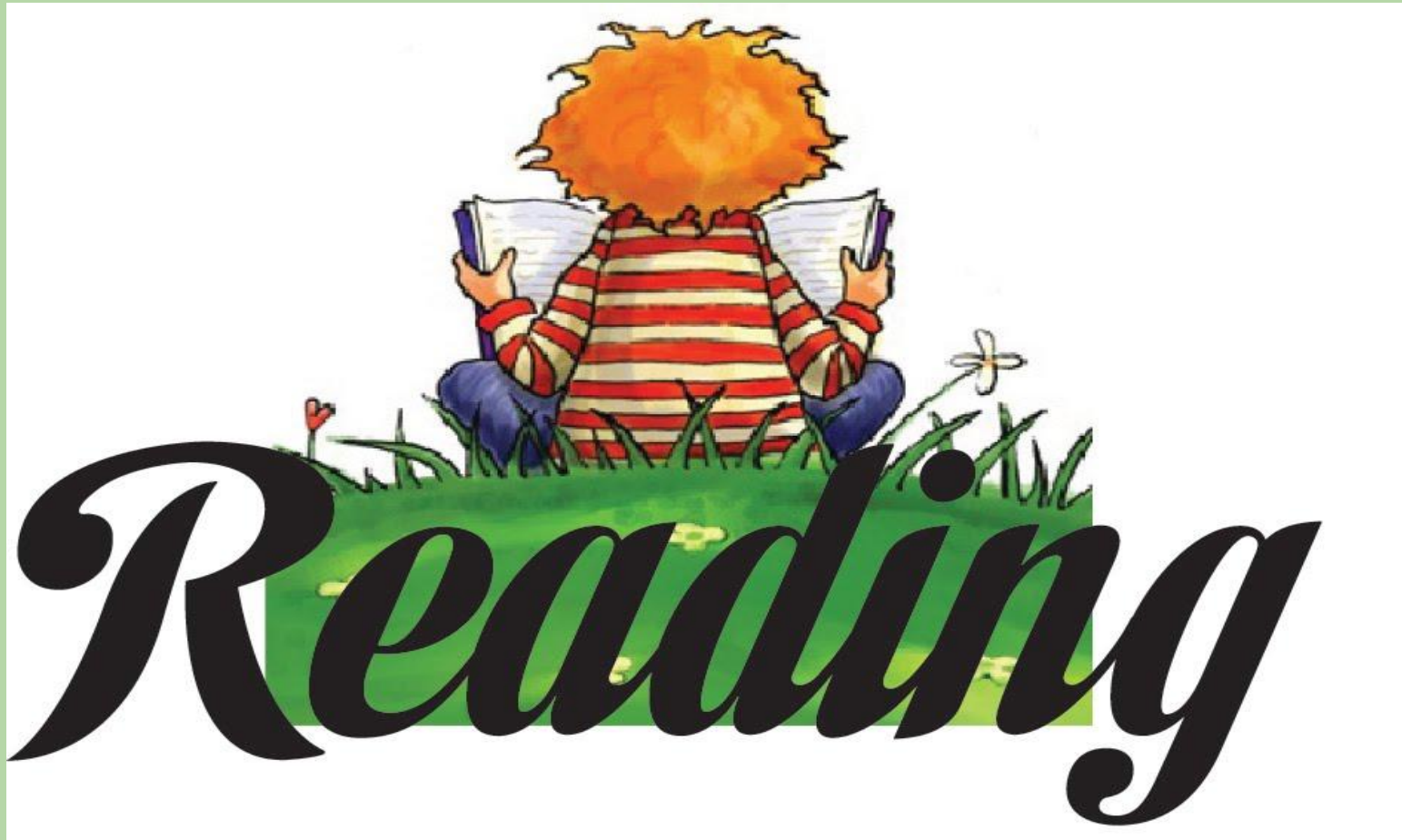
By May 2026, 80% of K-2 students will meet or exceed grade level benchmarks in Aimsweb+ Reading composite scores as measured by their Spring Benchmark Assessment. After the spring assessment, 87% of students are meeting or exceeding grade level benchmarks.

By May 2026, 80% of K-2 students will meet or exceed grade level benchmarks in Aimsweb+ Math composite scores as measured by their Spring Benchmark Assessment. After the spring assessment, 92% of students are meeting or exceeding grade level benchmarks.

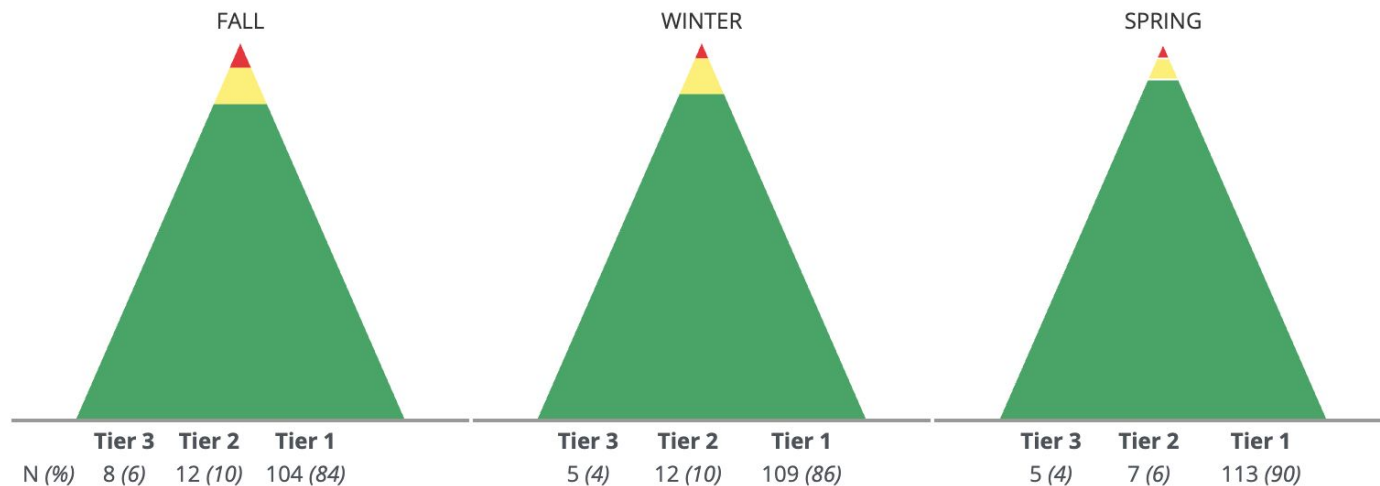
By May 2026, 80% of PreK-2 teachers will “respond favorably” when identifying students in the area of self-management using the Panorama Screener. After the spring assessment, 69% of PreK-2 teachers responded favorably in the area of self-management. Note: This was a 12% increase from fall.

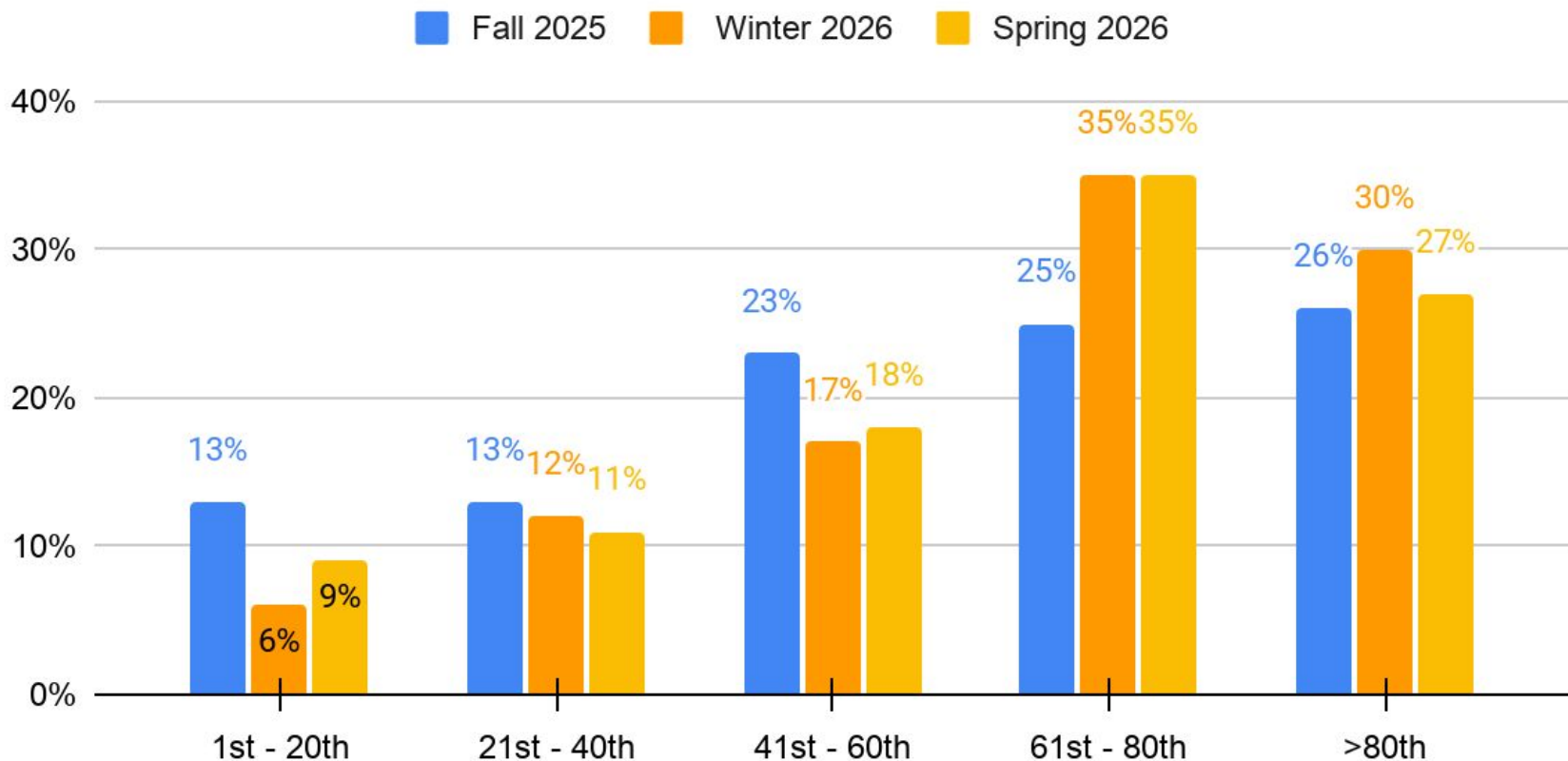

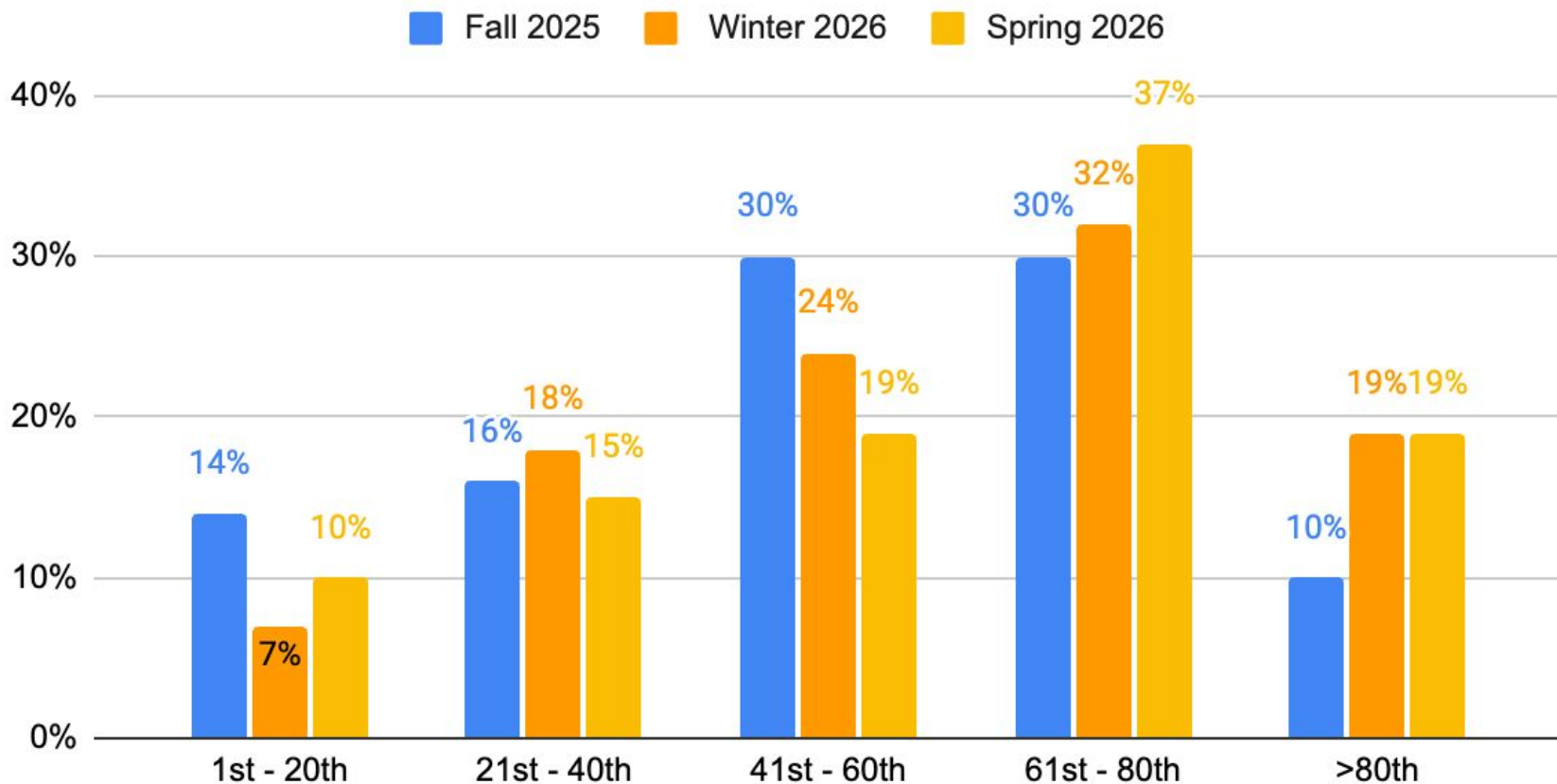

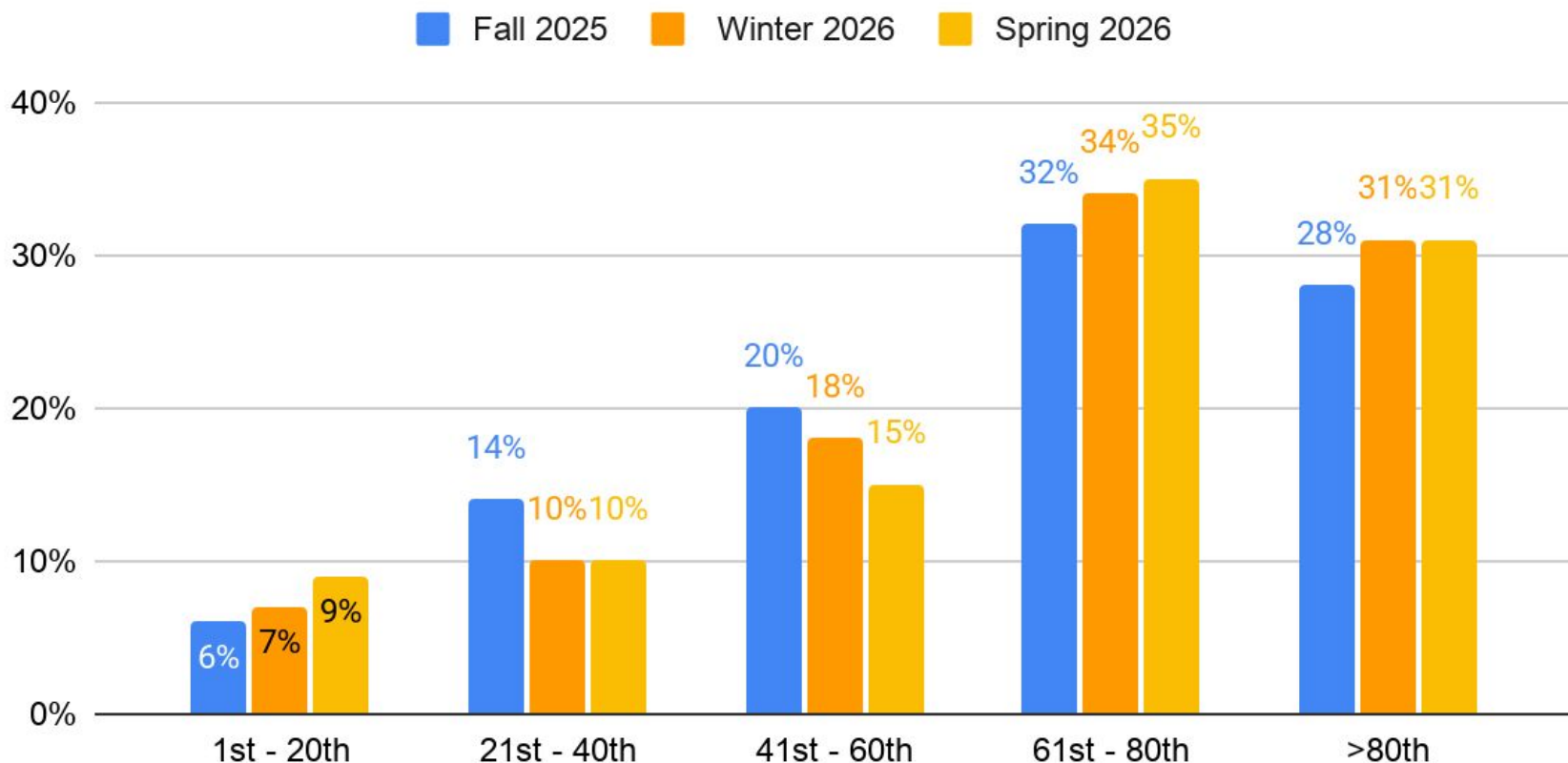
Percent of 3rd graders in each RIT Performance Category Reading MAP Test

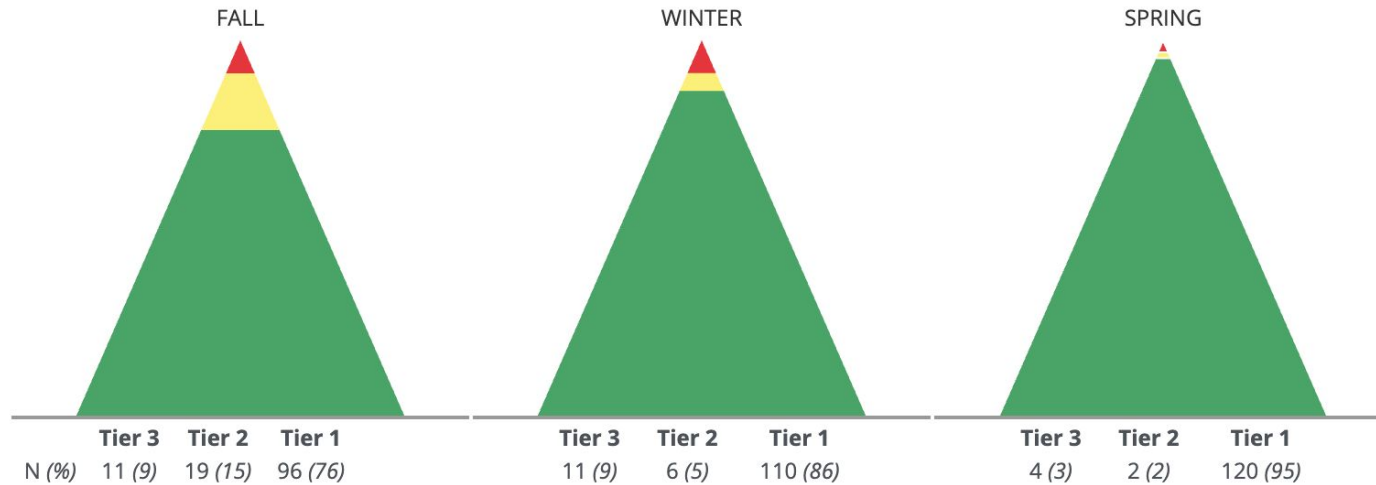

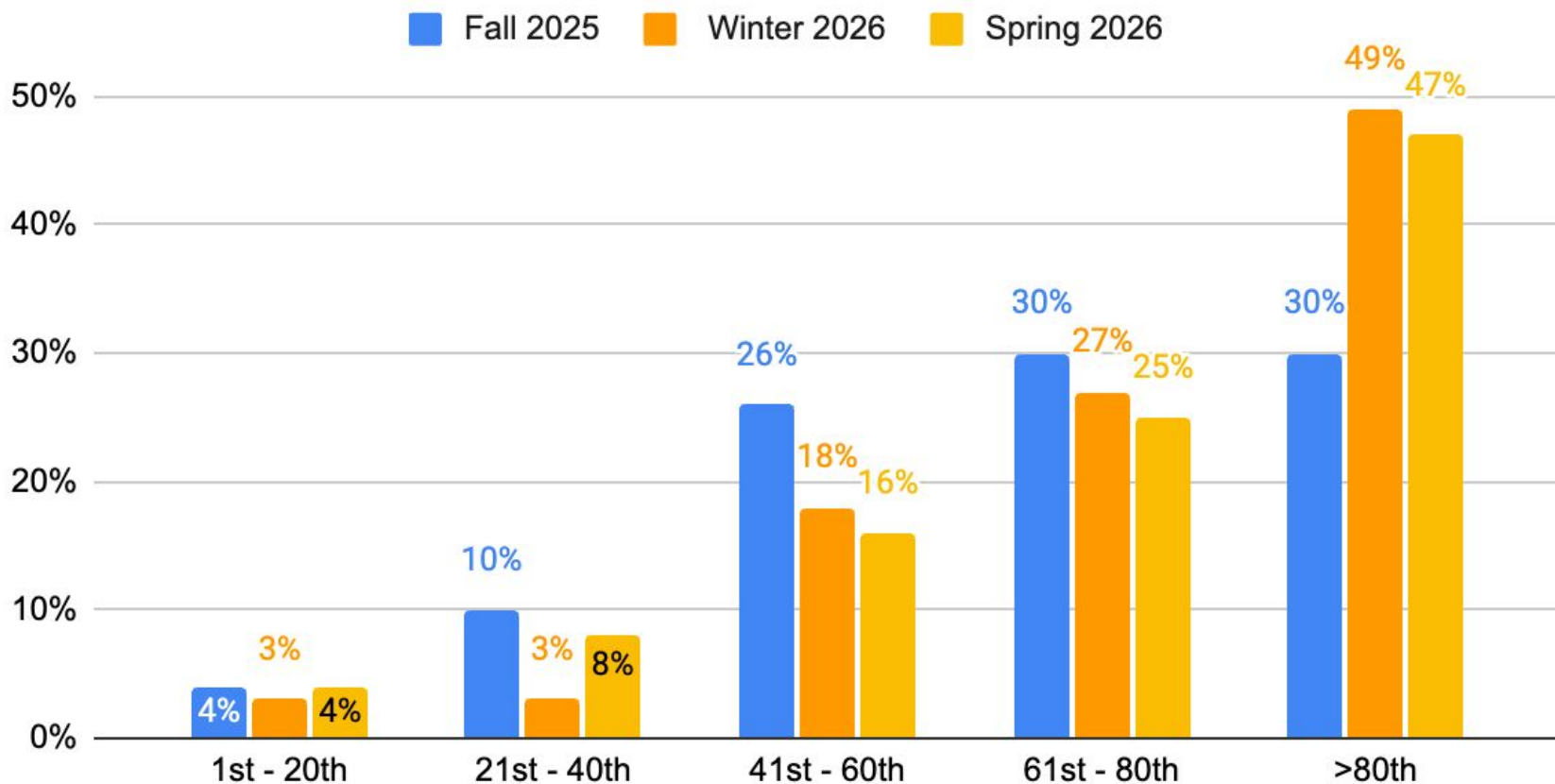

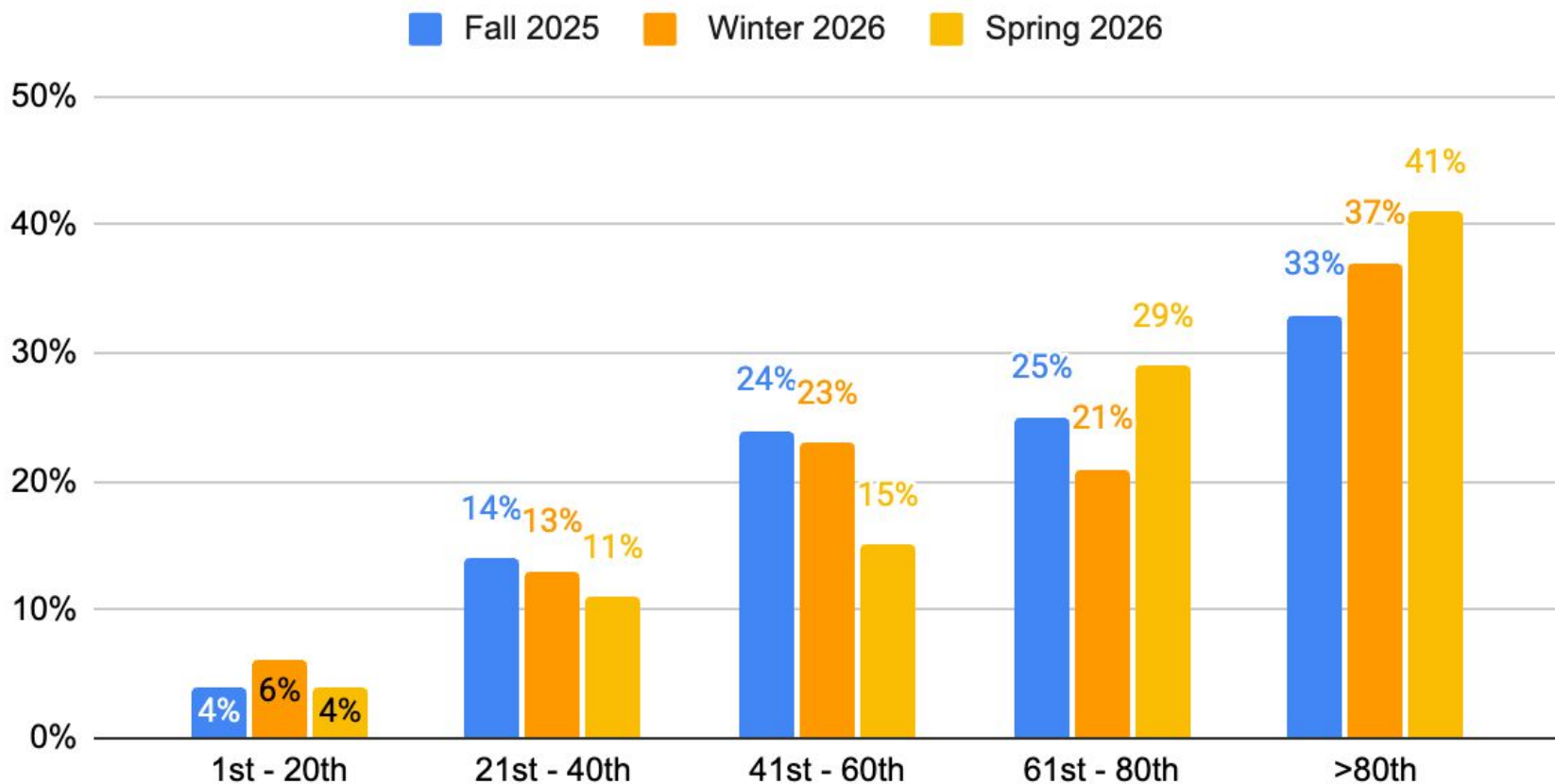

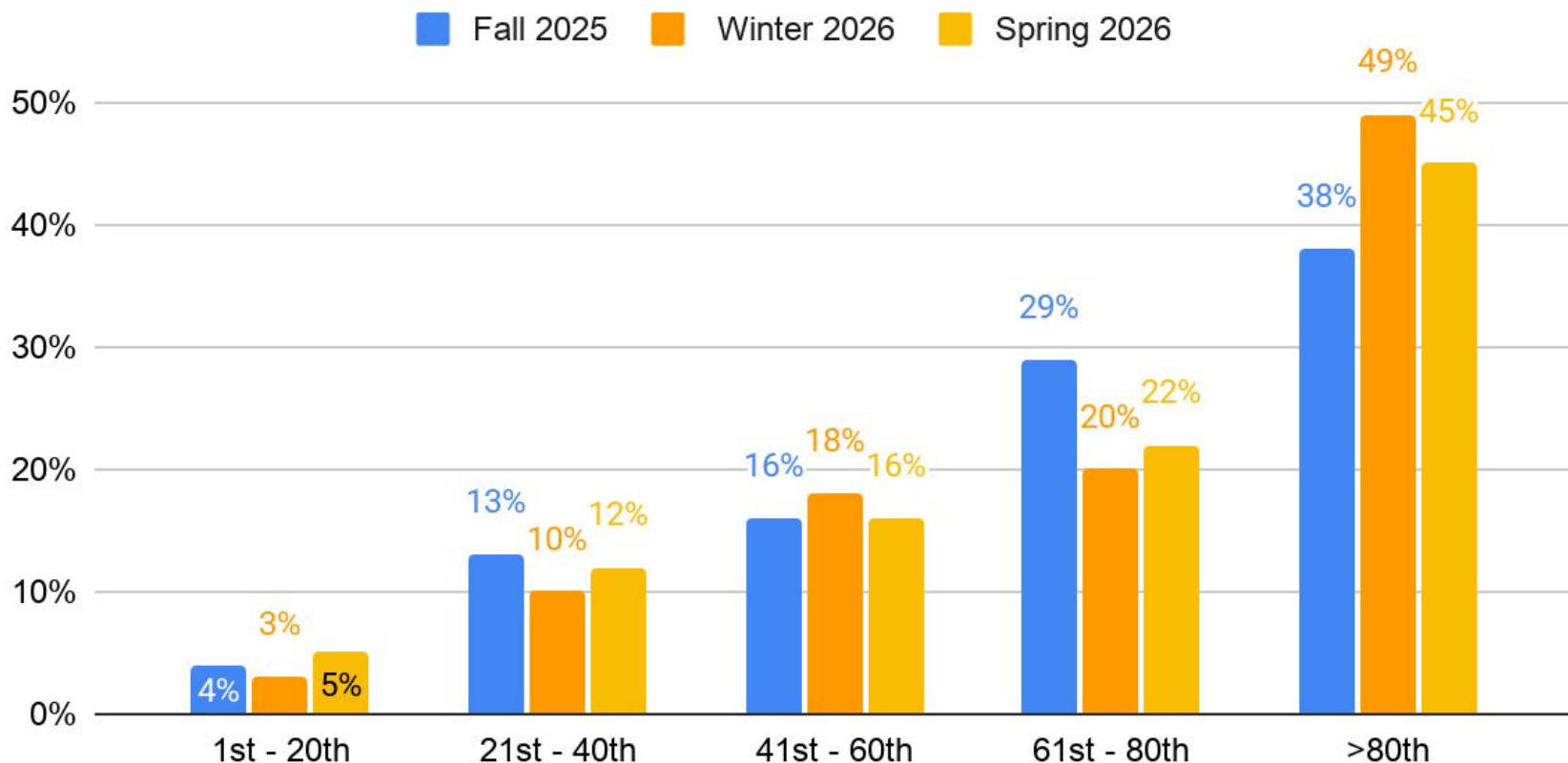
Percentage of 3rd graders in each RIT Performance Category Math MAP Test

National Average RIT Comparison

91% of our Third Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (199) on Math**

81% of our Fourth Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (210) on Math**

77% of our Fifth Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (216) on Math**

School Improvement Plan Update

- By May 2026, 80-100% of Prairieview students will meet their growth projection in *Math* as evidenced by NWEA MAP Spring 2026 scores.
 - ◆ 98% of 3rd graders grew from fall to spring; 87% reached their RIT growth goals
 - ◆ 94% of 4th graders grew from fall to spring; 61% reached their RIT growth goals
 - ◆ 94% of 5th graders grew from fall to spring; 67% reached their RIT growth goals
- By May 2026, 80-100% of Prairieview students will meet their growth projection in *Reading* as evidenced by NWEA MAP Spring 2026 scores.
 - ◆ 91% of 3rd graders grew from fall to spring; 68% reached their RIT growth goals
 - ◆ 88% of 4th graders grew from fall to spring; 71% reached their RIT growth goals
 - ◆ 77% of 5th graders grew from fall to spring; 67% reached their RIT growth goals
- By May 2026, 100% of Prairieview Students will have an attendance rate of 95% or higher.
 - ◆ 69% (272) have attended > 95%
 - ◆ 21% (83) have attended 90 - 95%
 - ◆ 8% (32) have attended 80-90%
 - ◆ 2% (6) have attended < 80%

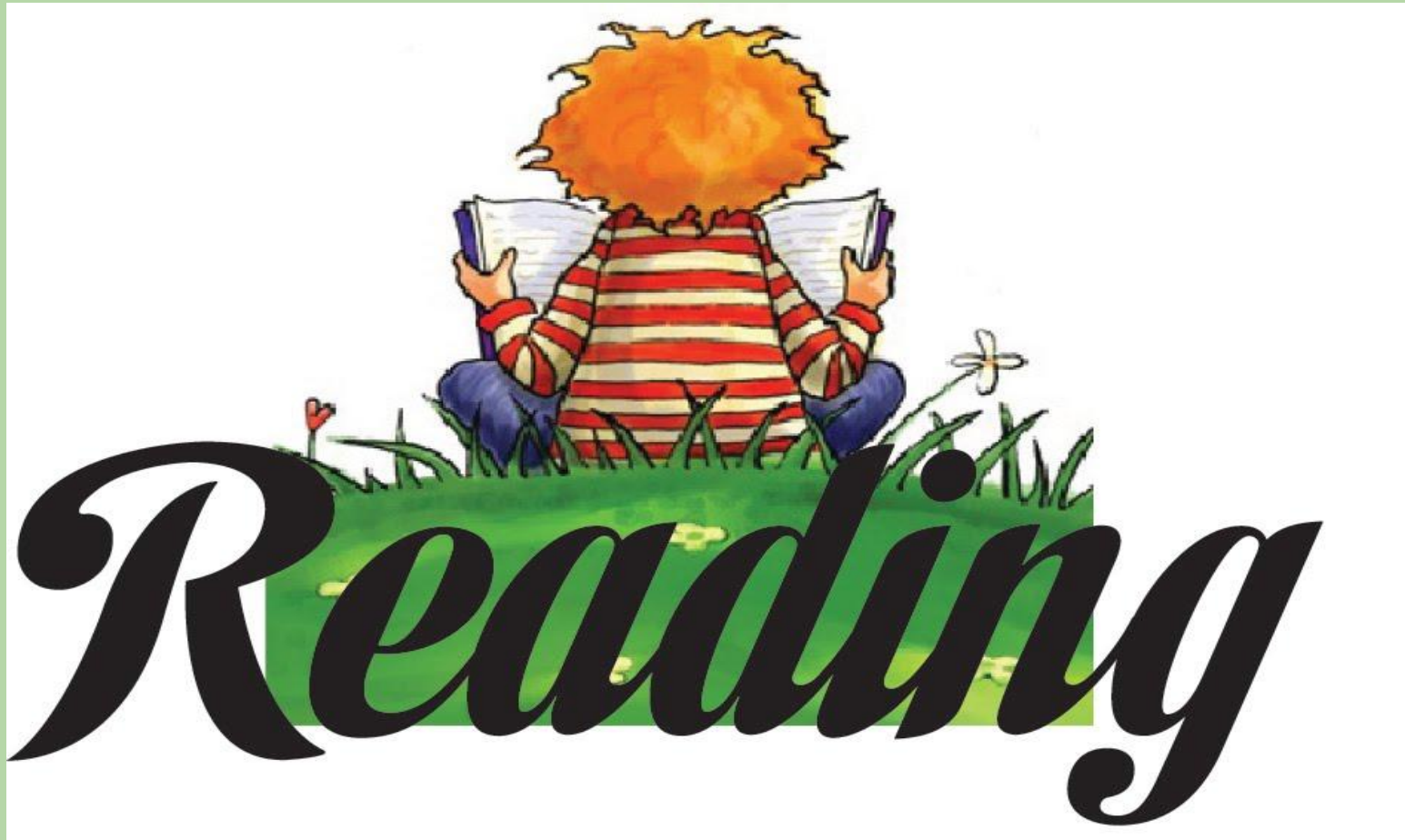

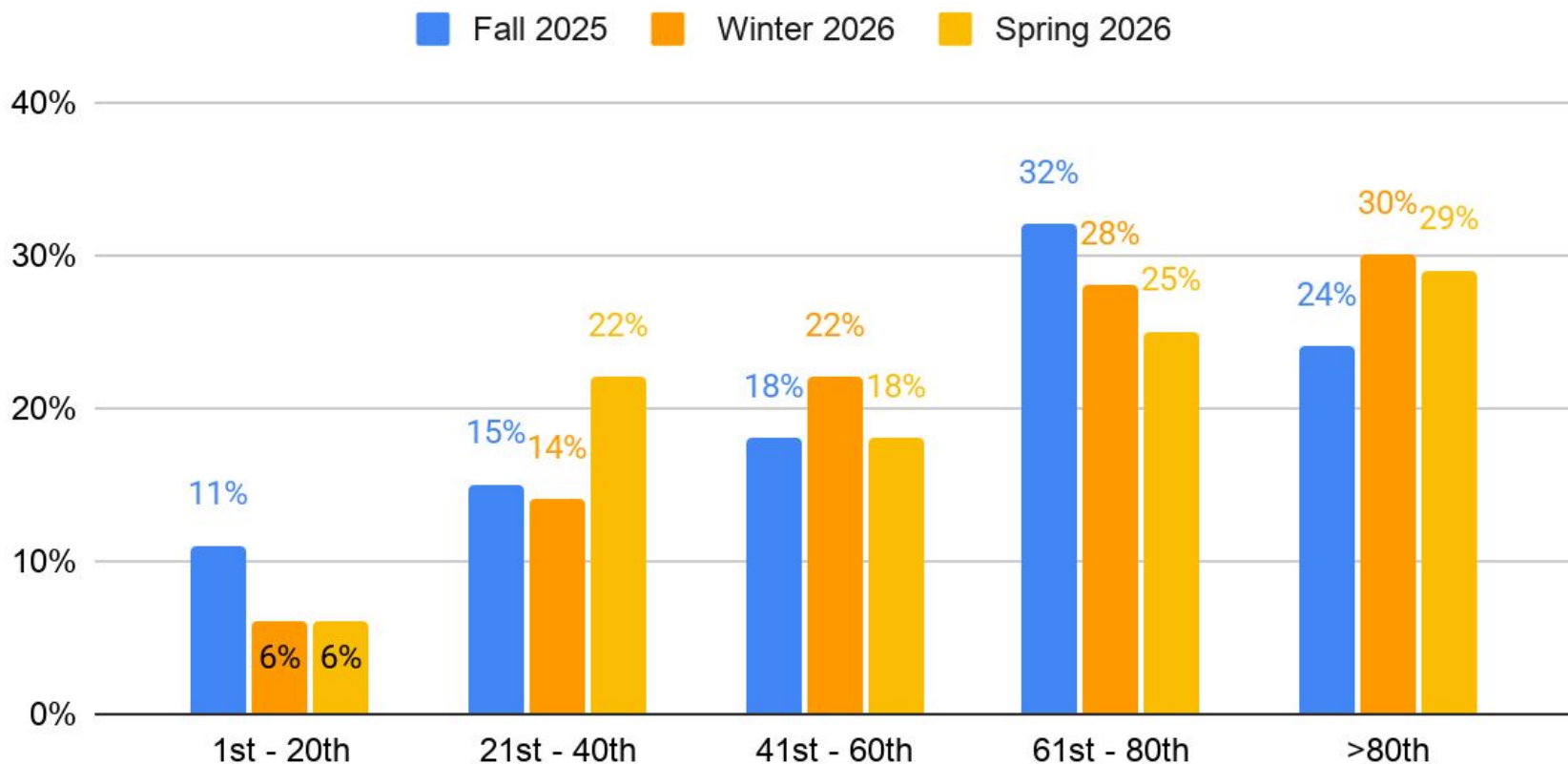

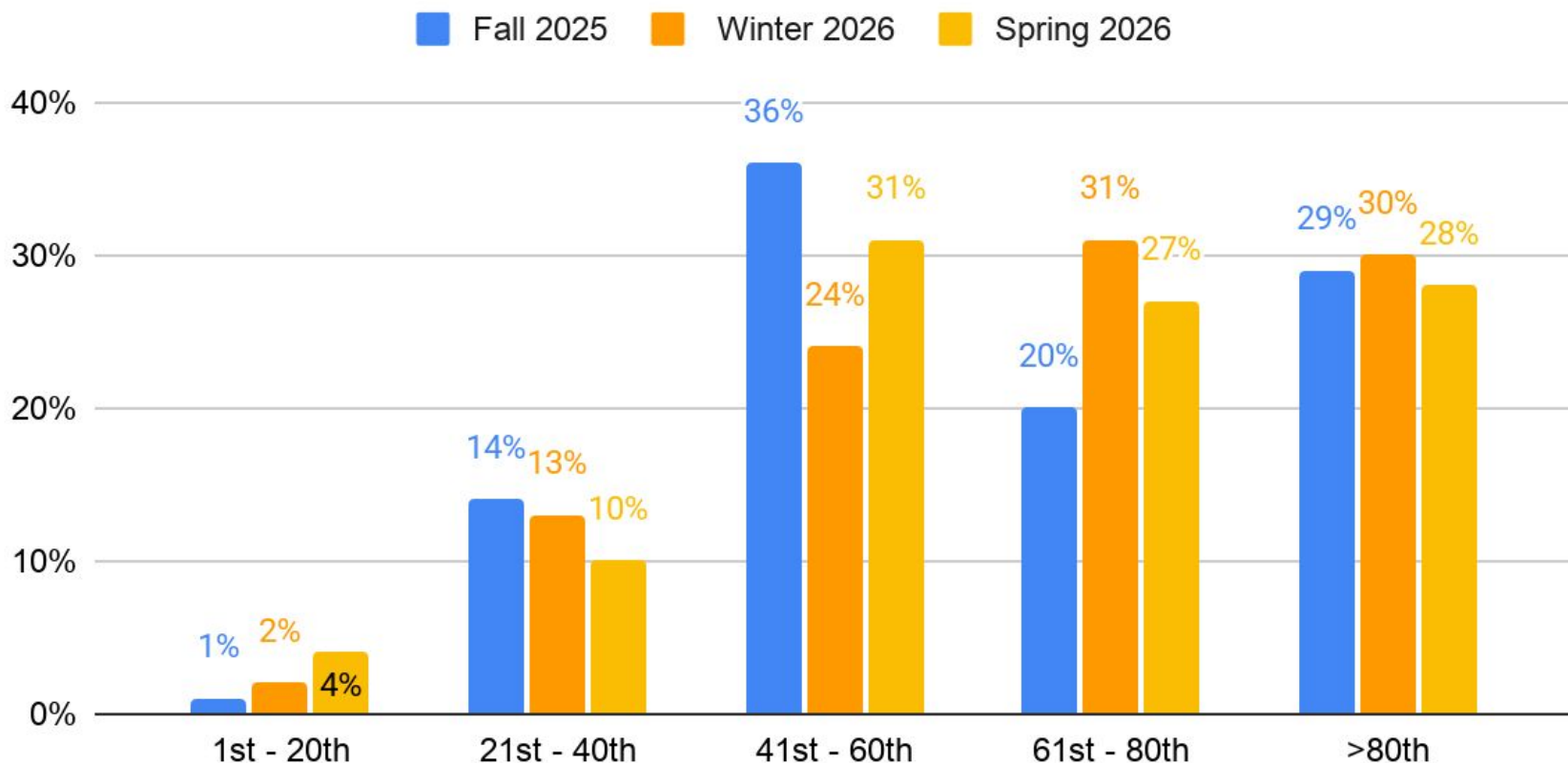




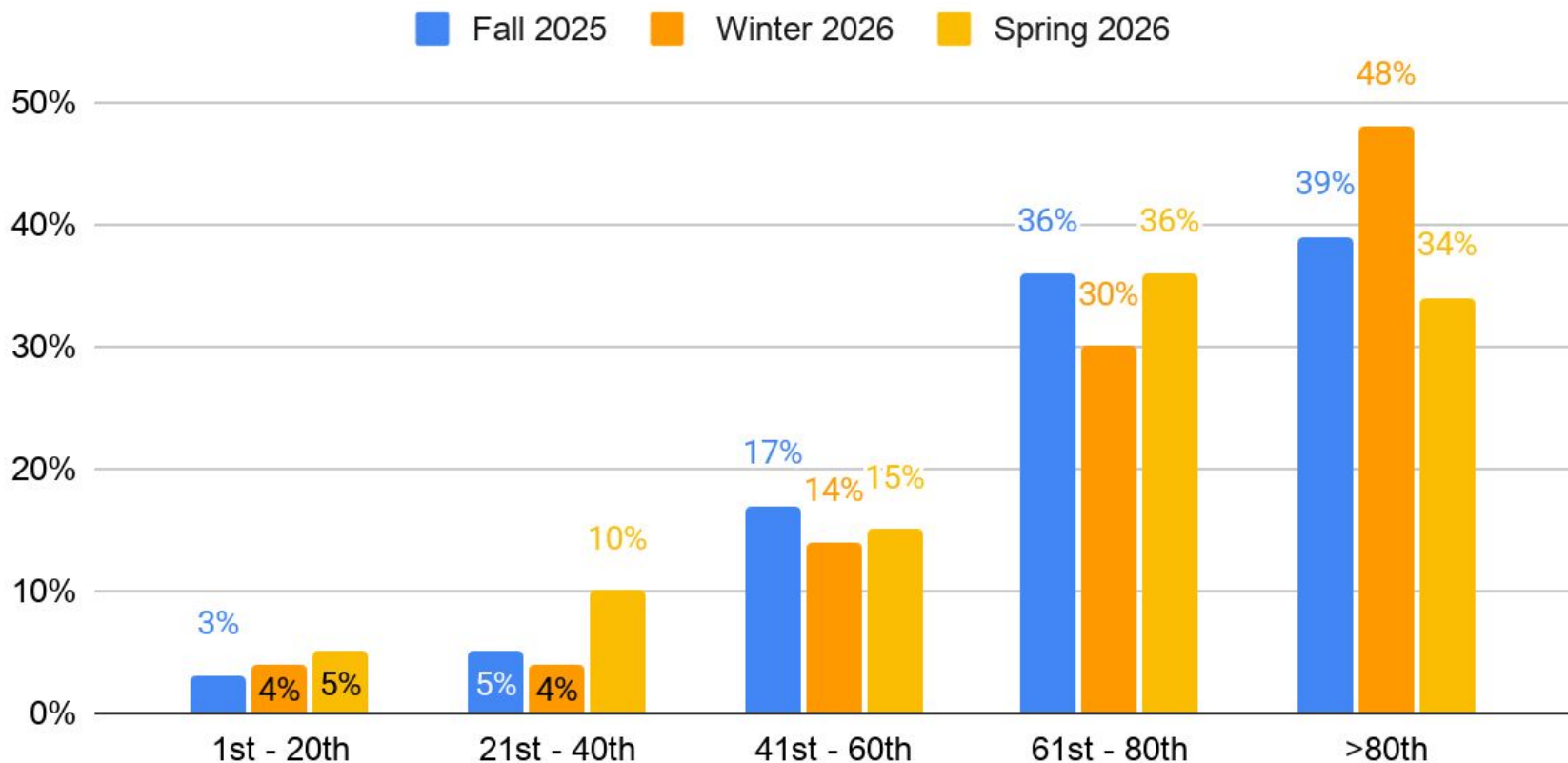
Percentage of 6th graders in each RIT Performance Category Reading MAP Test

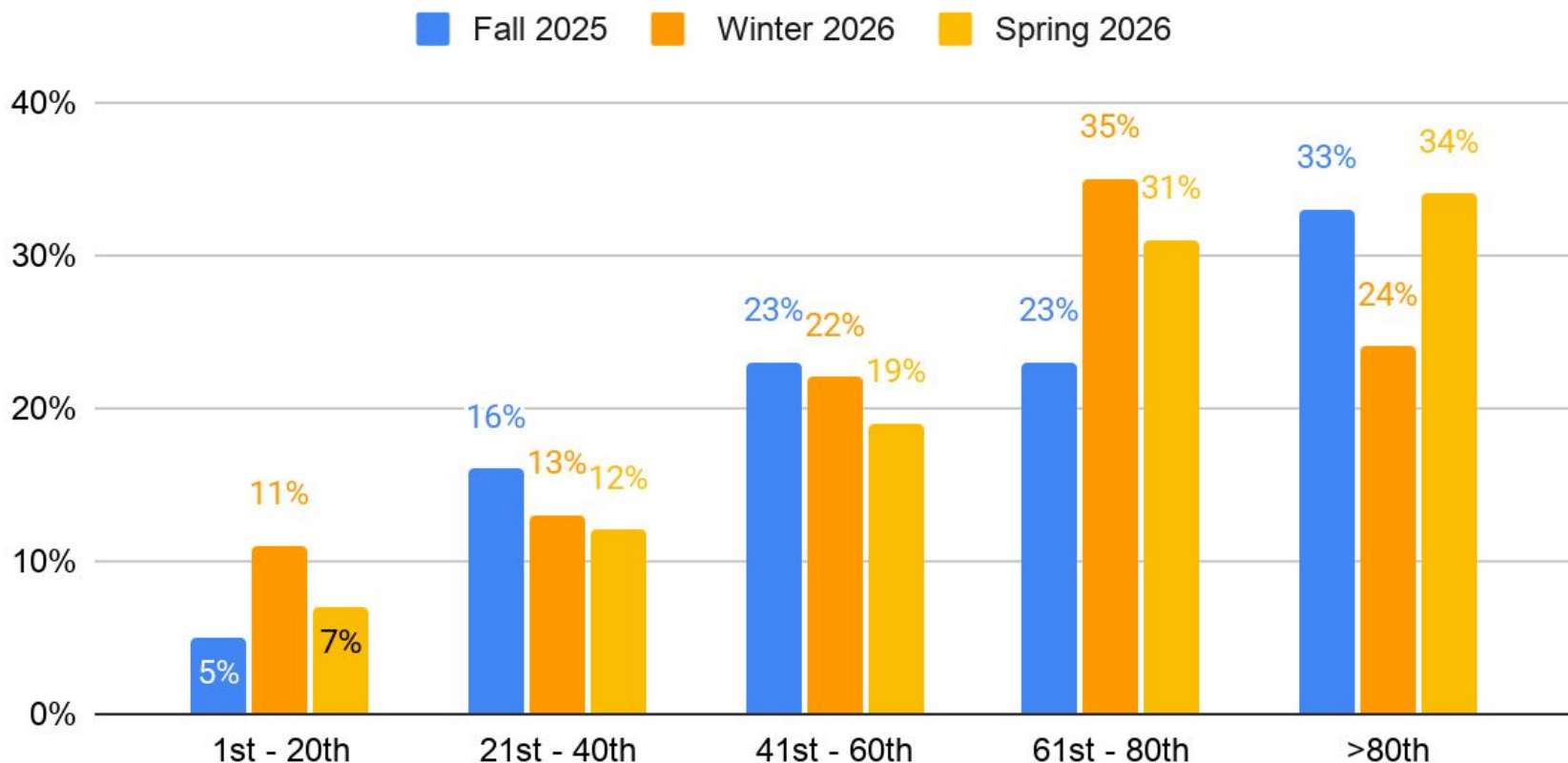

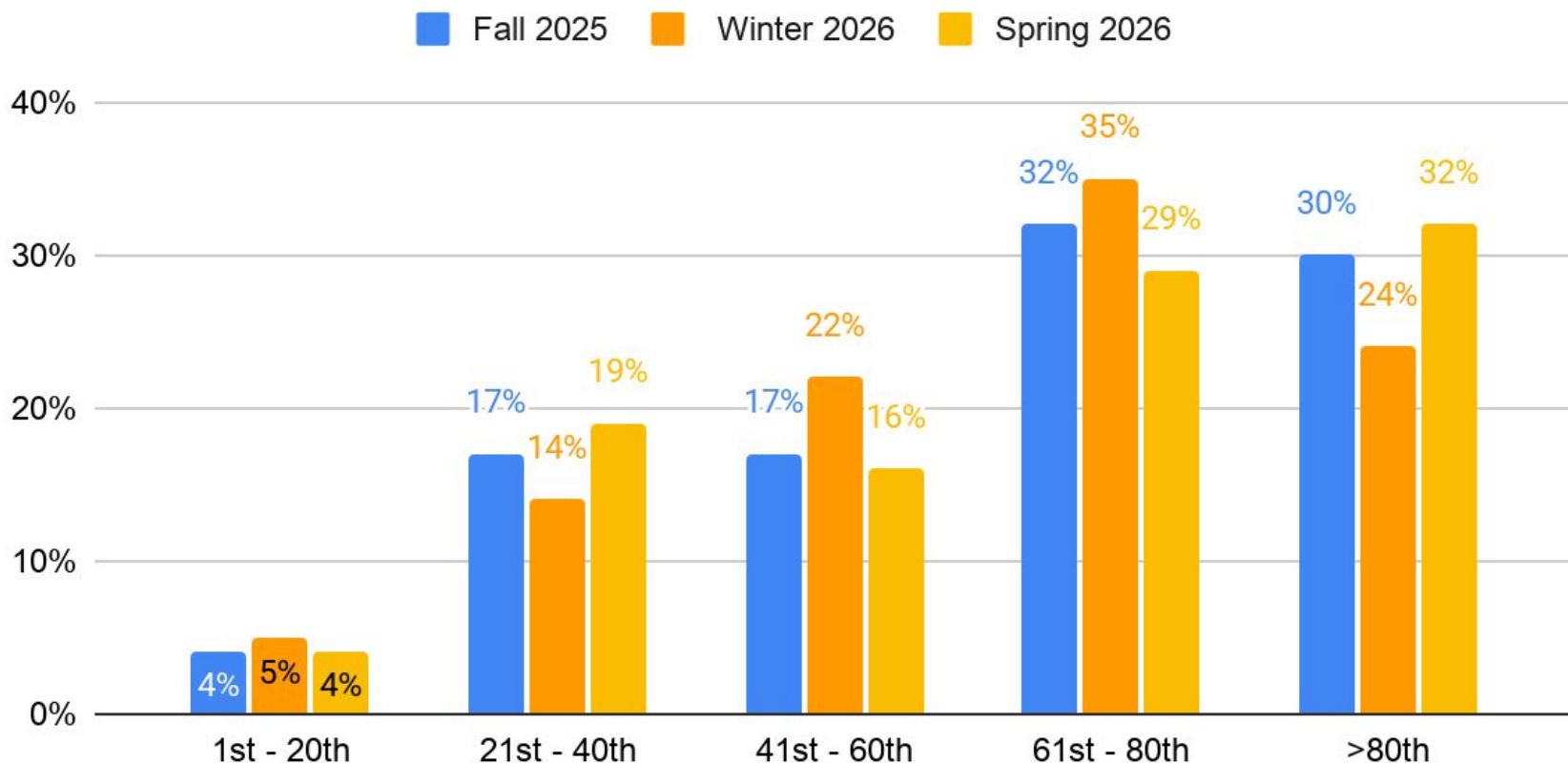

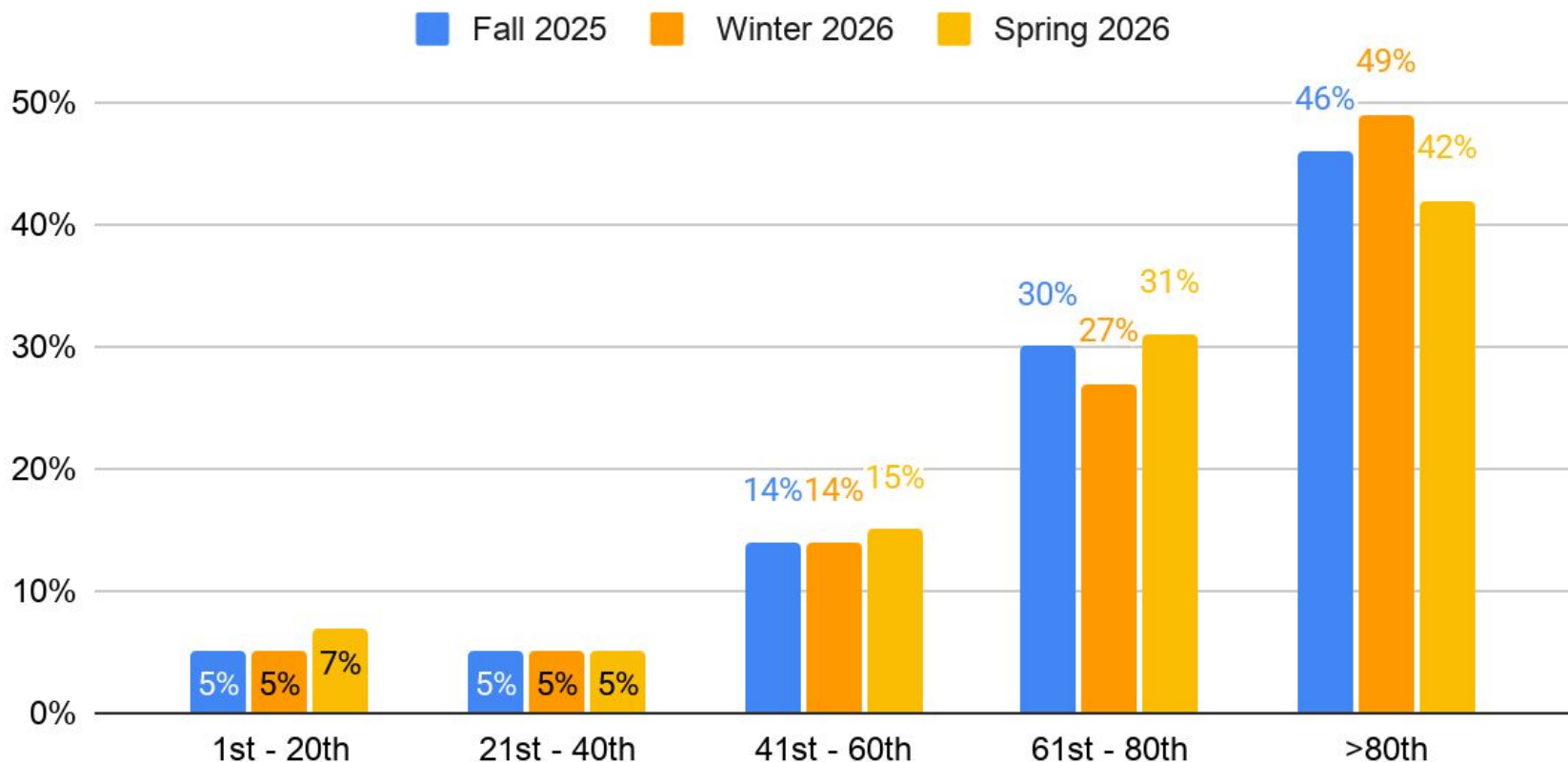
Percentage of 6th graders in each RIT Performance Category Math MAP Test

72% of our Sixth Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (220) on Math**

72% of our Seventh Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (224) on Math**

94% of our Eighth Graders, in Spring 2026, scored at or above the **national average RIT (224) on Math**

School Improvement Plan Update

1. By May 2026, 85% or more of Lakeview students will meet their growth projection in Math as evidenced by NWEA MAP Spring 2026 scores. After the spring assessment, 49% of 6th graders, 47% of 7th graders and 51% of 8th graders have met their growth goal for the year.
2. By May 2026, 85% or more of Lakeview students will meet their growth projection in ELA as evidenced by NWEA MAP Spring 2026 scores. After the spring assessments, 64% of 6th graders, 62% of 7th graders and 55% of 8th graders have met their growth goal for the year.
3. By May 2026, 99% of Lakeview students will have less than 9% school absences (chronic truancy)
As of spring we have 88% of students who have less than 9% of school absences (306/347).

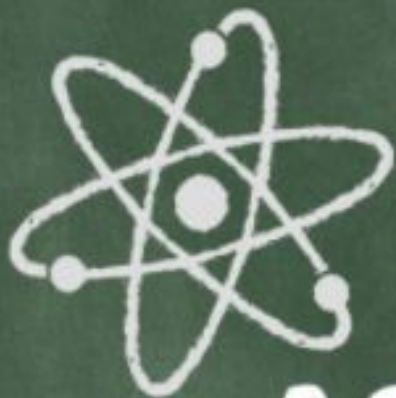
