In the interest of encouraging and recognizing outstanding academic achievement, a valedictorian and a salutatorian will be selected for each graduating class ~~at Pacific High School.~~

The district's valedictorian and salutatorian may be permitted to speak as part of the district's planned graduation program at the discretion of the principal or designee. All speeches must be reviewed and approved in advance by the principal or designee. Titles and Privileges granted to students designated as valedictorian or salutatorian may be denied and/or revoked for violation of Board policy, administrative regulation or school rule.]

The valedictorian and salutatorian will be selected according to the following procedure:

1. The valedictorian will be the student with the highest grade point average as computed at the ~~end of seven semesters of high school work~~ ~~semester break in January of the graduating year;~~
2. The salutatorian will be the student with the second highest grade point average as computed at the ~~end of seven semesters of high school work~~ ~~semester break in January of the graduating year;~~
- ~~3. To be considered for valedictorian or salutatorian honors, a senior must have accumulated at least 21.5 credits of approved classroom work;~~
- ~~4.3.~~ In case of a tie for valedictorian, co-valedictorians will be honored;
- ~~5.4.~~ In case of a tie for salutatorian, co-salutatorians will be honored;
- ~~6.5.~~ Foreign exchange students and other students not earning a regular diploma will not be considered in computing class rank and, therefore, will not be eligible for any academic honors;
- ~~7.6.~~ To be eligible for valedictorian or salutatorian honors, a student must be enrolled at Pacific High School prior to and continuously following the 10th school day of the student's senior year.
