❖ Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Project

- The project continues to progress. Throughout the summer there have been some challenges to the project, but progress continues to be on target to finish on time. Work in the high school gym has been completed and access was returned to the district on time. Access to the high school remains closed to the general public, but the gym and pool are available for scheduled activities.

❖ Contract Negotiations:

- Our school district negotiations committee reached tentative agreements with the Bus Drivers and the individual contract employees. These contracts are on the agenda for your approval. I recommend you approve these contracts.
- Our School Board Negotiations Committee continues to meet with Principals to negotiate their contracts.

❖ STOPit! Solutions:

- The District will be contracting for an anonymous reporting system from a company called STOPit! Solutions. This service provides anonymous reporting services for districts across the country. Monitored 24/7, STOPit! Solutions can provide information to law enforcement in our district for concerns that are emergencies, or reported beyond the school work day. This will provide monitored 24 hour a day anonymous reporting services for students, parents, or community that will meet the 2028 State requirements that were passed by the legislature this past spring, 2 years ahead of the requirements.

❖ Student Activity Fees:

- In planning this school year's budget, the Finance Committee has recommended an increase to student sports and activity fees. These increases will affect High School sports, High School Activities, as well as higher fees for specific sports of Clay Target, and High School Football.
- New Fees: High School Sports (\$150), High School Activities (\$105) High School Football \$170, Clay Target \$170.
- All other fees remain the same.
