We have a few openings in most classes at this time. Most openings are in the afternoon classes. Now partnering with Kids Junction to offer wrap-around care.</li> <li>• Colvill Family Center joined Sunnyside kindergarten registration to connect with families with younger children.</li> <li>• Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) Classes like Toddler Time and Mixed Ages continue to be full and use a lottery system. We offered a Music Class in partnership with Community Education, and that class has a waitlist as well. We could grow this program if we had more classroom space. They are in a smaller classroom since Covid-19. **Twin Bluff**

- Magic for Everyone performed two shows on February 27th for our students with special needs. All in attendance enjoyed a wonderful, interactive show, that produced many smiles and laughs.
- Water Street Dance from Milwaukee performed two shows on March 4th which allowed all students to see and experience their dancing passion while sharing a positive message about individual growth, challenges, and development of "gifts". It was an interactive show that allowed students and staff to get on stage and participate. Each show culminated with a Twin Bluff student choreographer choosing positions, moves, and exits for the dancers and then a quick presentation of it to music. The dance troop then performed at the Sheldon Theatre.
- Twin Bluff Leaders Dance was held on Friday, March 6th. 275 middle school students enjoyed and expanded program that included additional challenges to the 18-hole put-put course, updated music playlists, and more space with expanded board game, artwork, and "chill" spaces.
