The bid opening for Central Middle School Indoor Air Quality Upgrades 2007 was held at the Administration Building on Thursday, November 16, 2006, at 2:00 p.m. A total of four (4) contractors submitted bids as follows:

The scope of this project involves replacement of five (5) air handling units and temperature control systems at Central Middle School D-Wing and A-Wing, to comply with air quality standards. It was recommended the District accept Alt

#3 for liquidated damages for no change in the contract cost, but not proceed with Alt #1 and Alt #2 for additional units in the E-Wing.

The project will be funded with Health & Safety revenue. Operating Capital funds will cover the portion of costs not eligible to be paid for with Health & Safety dollars.

Karen Keffeler, Principal at Sunset Hill Elementary and representatives of the Shared Decisions Site Team representing Sunset Hill Elementary, presented the proposed Shared Decisions Agreement between Sunset Hill and the Wayzata School Board for the 2006-2008 school years. Principal Keffeler and representatives attended the November 27, 2006 Board work session and provided the School Board with a preview of the agreement and answered questions.

The proposed agreement has been reviewed by the Superintendent, Executive Directors of human Resources, Curriculum and Instruction, Finance & Business, and by the Wayzata Education Association leadership to ensure compliance with statutes, contracts, policies, and administrative regulations.

According to Minnesota Statute 124.03, Subdivision 2, "A Board may, by resolution, limit the enrollment of nonresident pupils in its schools or program according to this section to a number not less than the lesser of:

- One percent of the total enrollment at each grade level in the district; or
- The number of district's residents at that grade level enrolled in a non-resident district according to this section."

After reviewing current enrollments, projected enrollments, and building capacities, administration has made the following recommendations for school year 07-08:

- For the remainder of the school year 06-07, Kimberly Lane, Greenwood, and Plymouth Creek be closed. Eighth grade be closed across the district; 7th grade at East be closed. Any grade whose numbers exceed 800 be closed at the high school.
- For the school year 07-08, Kimberly Lane, Greenwood, and Plymouth Creek be closed. East would be closed at 8th grade. Wayzata High School would be closed whenever the numbers in a grade exceed 800. Currently, grades 9 and 10 would be closed.

A motion was made by Ms. Gleason and seconded by Ms. Droegemueller to approve the recommendations made by administration. The motion passed unanimously.

**STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES**

The Standard Operating Procedures have been developed in accordance with Board of Education policies and reflect past and present practice. It is intended that these procedures be reviewed annually, modified as necessary, and approved at the Board's Organizational Meeting each January.

Should anything in these Standard Operating Procedures be found to be in conflict with state or federal law or regulations, these procedures shall be modified accordingly.

**A. BOARD ORGANIZATION**

1. The officers of the Board of Education, as established by law, are the Chair, the Clerk, and the Treasurer.
2. It is the practice of the Wayzata Board of Education to also elect a Vice-Chair.
3. All officers shall be elected at the Organizational Meeting held annually on or as close to January 1 as practical, but not later than the second Monday of January.
4. A Board of Education member not elected to an office shall be designated as "Director."
5. Annually the Board of Education may establish "Standing Committees" and further designate the membership and charge of such committees.
6. The Board of Education may, for specific purposes, establish "Ad Hoc Committees." The Board shall set a charge, membership specifications, and timeline for such committees.
7. Annually it is necessary to name Board representatives to other organizations. The Board Chair shall appoint such representatives, subject to ratification by the Board of Education.

**B. BOARD MEETINGS**

1. Schedule
  - a. On or as close to January 1 of each year as practical, but not later than the second Monday in January, the Board of Education shall conduct an Organizational Meeting. The purposes of such meeting shall include:
    - 1) Election of officers
    - 2) Designation of Board committee structure
    - 3) Appointment of Board representatives to other bodies
    - 4) Such other action as may<sup>35</sup> be deemed necessary

**B. BOARD MEETINGS – Schedule (continued)**

- b. At the first meeting of each new school year in July, the Board will:
  - 1) Establish a calendar of Regular Board Meetings and Work Sessions
  - 2) Establish and/or confirm District goals/directions
  - 3) Designate official relationships
  - 4) Approve membership in professional organizations

2. Agendas

- a. Board agendas will be prepared according to a schedule established by the Superintendent. The following is a one-month example:

- Monday, Aug. 22 - First draft of agenda reviewed at Board Work Session

- Tuesday, Sept. 6 - Reviewed at Cabinet Meeting
- Tuesday, Sept. 6 - Finalized by Board Chair, Vice Chair and Superintendent
- Thursday, Sept. 8 - Public Agenda Posted
- Friday, Sept. 9 - Board packets released to Board in a.m.
- Friday, Sept. 9 - Board packets released to public in p.m.
- Monday, Sept. 12 - Regular Board Meeting

- b. Board members may place items on the agenda for Regular Board Meetings or Work Sessions by contacting the Board Chair, Vice Chair or the Superintendent, or for a Regular Board Meeting, at the time the tentative agenda is reviewed at a prior work session. After the agenda has been prepared and posted, new items may be considered for placement on the agenda at the Regular Board Meeting under the "Approval of Agenda" item.
- c. The Board shall annually review and establish its Regular Board Meeting agenda format. The format shall include a "Consent Agenda" which provides for routine items to be enacted with one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Board member or citizen so requests, in which event the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and addressed in sequence. Changes in agenda format may be approved by the Board during the school year.
- d. Board packets shall either be e-mailed or delivered to Board members' homes so that they are received no later than three (3) days prior to a Regular Board Meeting.
- e. All Board meeting agendas and notices shall be posted on the District web site, the official bulletin board at the Administration Building, and in each of the buildings of the District at least three (3) days in advance of the meeting.

**B. BOARD MEETINGS** (continued)3. Conduct of Meetings

- a. The rules of parliamentary procedure in the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail if there is any question concerning the conduct of any meeting.
- b. Voting on Motions/Resolutions
  - 1) When calling for a vote on a motion, the Board Chair will use the following procedure:
    - All in favor say "Aye."
    - All against say "No."
    - Any abstentions?
  - 2) In the event of a divided voice vote, the Board Chair may request a roll call vote.
  - 3) The Board Chair will vote last on all motions and resolutions and will summarize the vote tally.
  - 4) The Clerk will record all votes on the "Clerk's Record of Motions" sheets.
  - 5) Resolutions will have a roll call vote.
- c. Public hearings may be established by Board action for specific purposes.

4. Public Participation in School Board Meetings and Work Sessions

## a. Audience Opportunity to Address Board

The School Board shall normally provide a specified period of time during a Regular Board Meeting where citizens may address the School Board on any topic, subject to the limitations of policy (212). The School Board reserves the right to allocate a specific period of time for this purpose and limit time for speakers accordingly.

## b. Agenda Items

- 1) Citizens who wish to address the School Board on a particular subject may speak during the discussion of that item only at the discretion of the Board Chair.
- 2) The School Board Chair will recognize one speaker at a time and only those speakers recognized by the Chair will be allowed to speak. Each speaker must fill out a form that discloses their name, address, and the issue they would like to speak on.
- 3) The School Board retains the discretion to limit discussion of any agenda item to a reasonable period of time as determined by the School Board.

**B. BOARD MEETINGS – Public Participation - Agenda Items (continued)**

- 4) The School Board Chair shall promptly rule out of order any discussion by any person, including School Board members, that would violate the provision of state or federal law, Board Policy as specified, or the statutory rights or privacy of an individual.

**5. Record of Meetings**

- a. The Board Clerk is legally responsible for the official Board records; however, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the responsibility for providing the personnel and equipment for Board meeting record keeping.

- b. The Board minutes will record votes as follows (samples):

Unanimous voice vote: "The motion passed unanimously on a 7-0 vote."

Roll call vote on a motion: "A roll call vote was taken and the following voted in favor thereof: (names will be listed); and the following voted against the same: (names will be listed); whereupon said motion carried (or failed) on a (numbers to be inserted) vote."

Standard resolution roll call vote: "Board member (name) introduced the (title of resolution) and moved its adoption. The motion for adoption of the resolution was duly seconded by Board member (name) and upon vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor thereof: (names will be listed); and the following voted against the same: (names will be listed); whereupon said resolution was declared duly passed and adopted (or failed) on a (numbers to be inserted) vote."

- c. Regular Board Meetings will be broadcast live on cable television; Special Board Meetings will be videotaped or recorded.
- d. All Board Work Sessions will be recorded and tapes will be kept on file for a period of ninety (90) days.
- e. Published minutes will list a summary of Board Action and Other Business items.
- f. Complete minutes of all Regular and Special Board Meetings will be kept on file in the Superintendent's Office. As soon as practical following the completion of a school year, official minutes will be bound and maintained as a permanent record in the Administration Building.

**C. OTHER BOARD PROCEDURES**1. Access to Administrative Support

a. Board members should direct requests for information to the following:

- 1) Superintendent of Schools
- 2) Executive Director of Human Resource Services
- 3) Executive Director of Curriculum and Instruction
- 4) Executive Director of Finance and Business Services
- 5) Executive Assistant

b. The Administration will furnish all Board members with information prepared at the request of an individual Board member.

2. Legal Advice

a. The Superintendent is empowered to seek legal counsel as required during the normal course of business and within the limits of the budget.

b. If there are legal concerns involving the Board and the Superintendent, the Board Chair is empowered to seek legal counsel.

3. Attendance at State and National Meetings of School Board Organizations

a. The School Board feels it would be most beneficial to have representation at state and national meetings of School Board organizations with consideration given to timely issues and the established budget.

4. News Media/Board Relations

a. When the Board issues news releases and/or responds to questions from the media, the "official" spokesperson for the School Board will be the Board Chair.

b. Board agenda materials will be available to the public at the same time they are released to School Board members. Items of new Board business should not be given to the public other than through release of Board agenda materials.

c. When individual Board members speak to the news media, they should issue a standard disclaimer that emphasizes: "These are my personal views and do not necessarily reflect the views of the full School Board."

d. The Superintendent will administer the District Public Information Program according to the guidelines established under Board Policy 901.

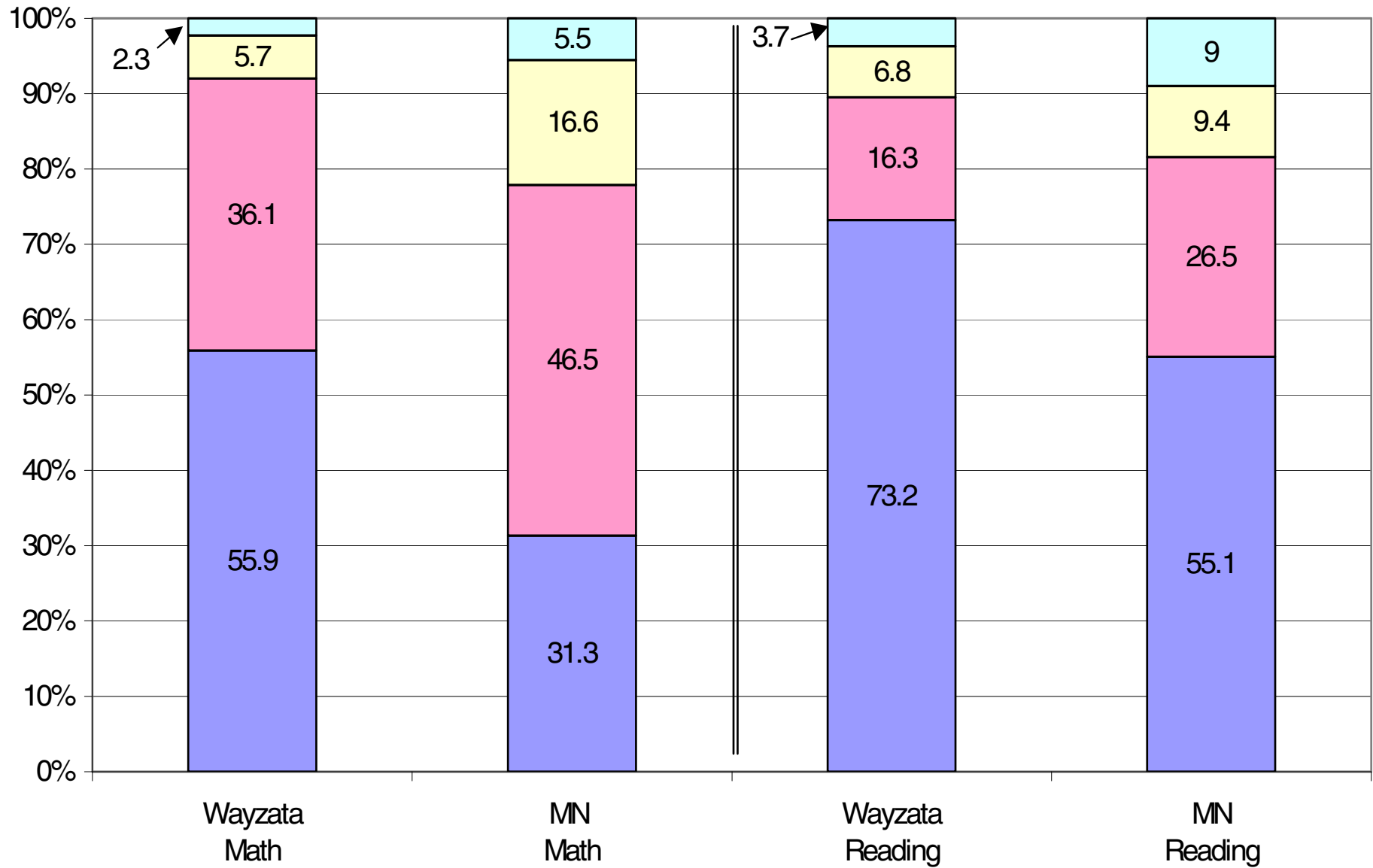

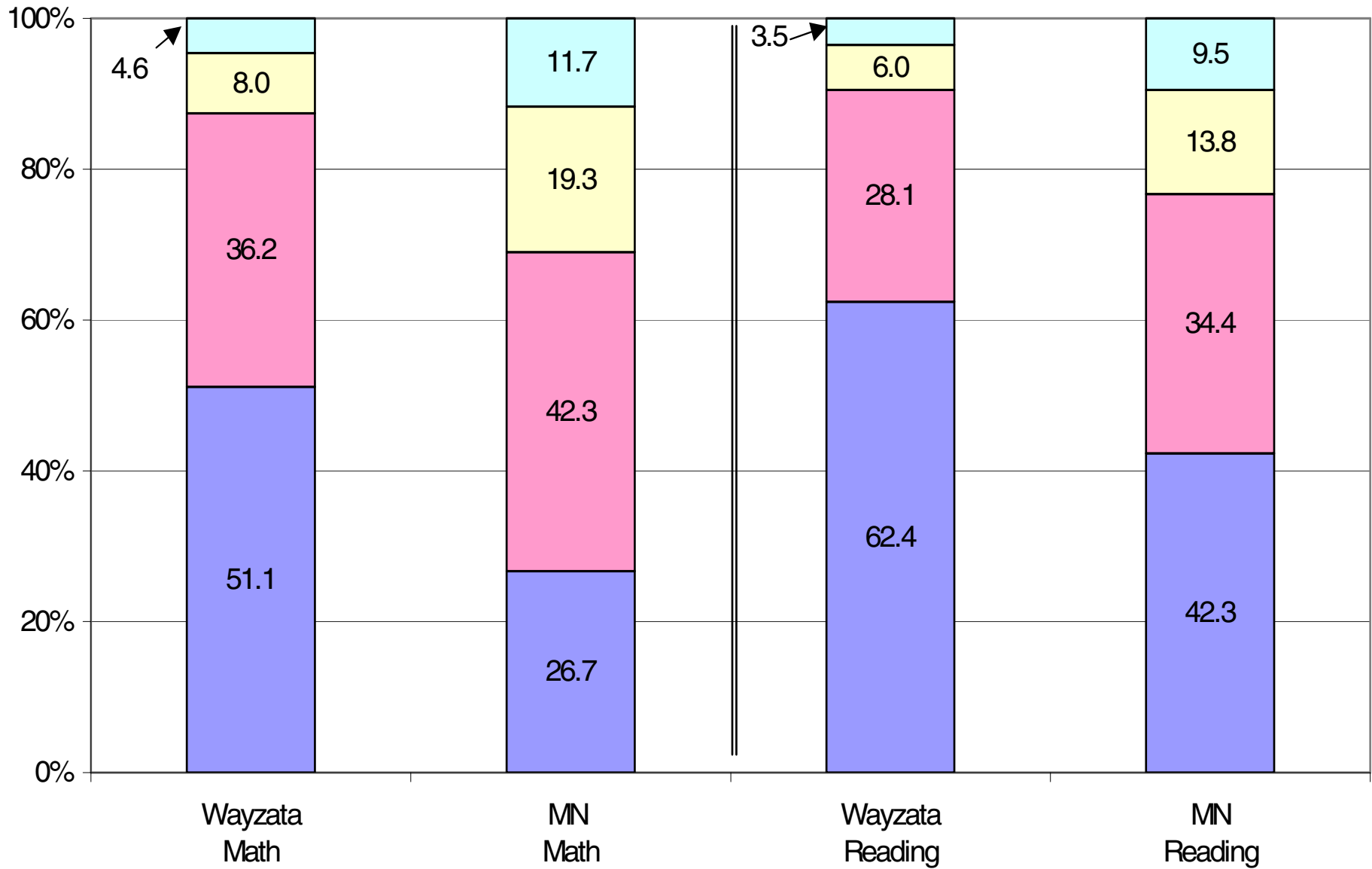

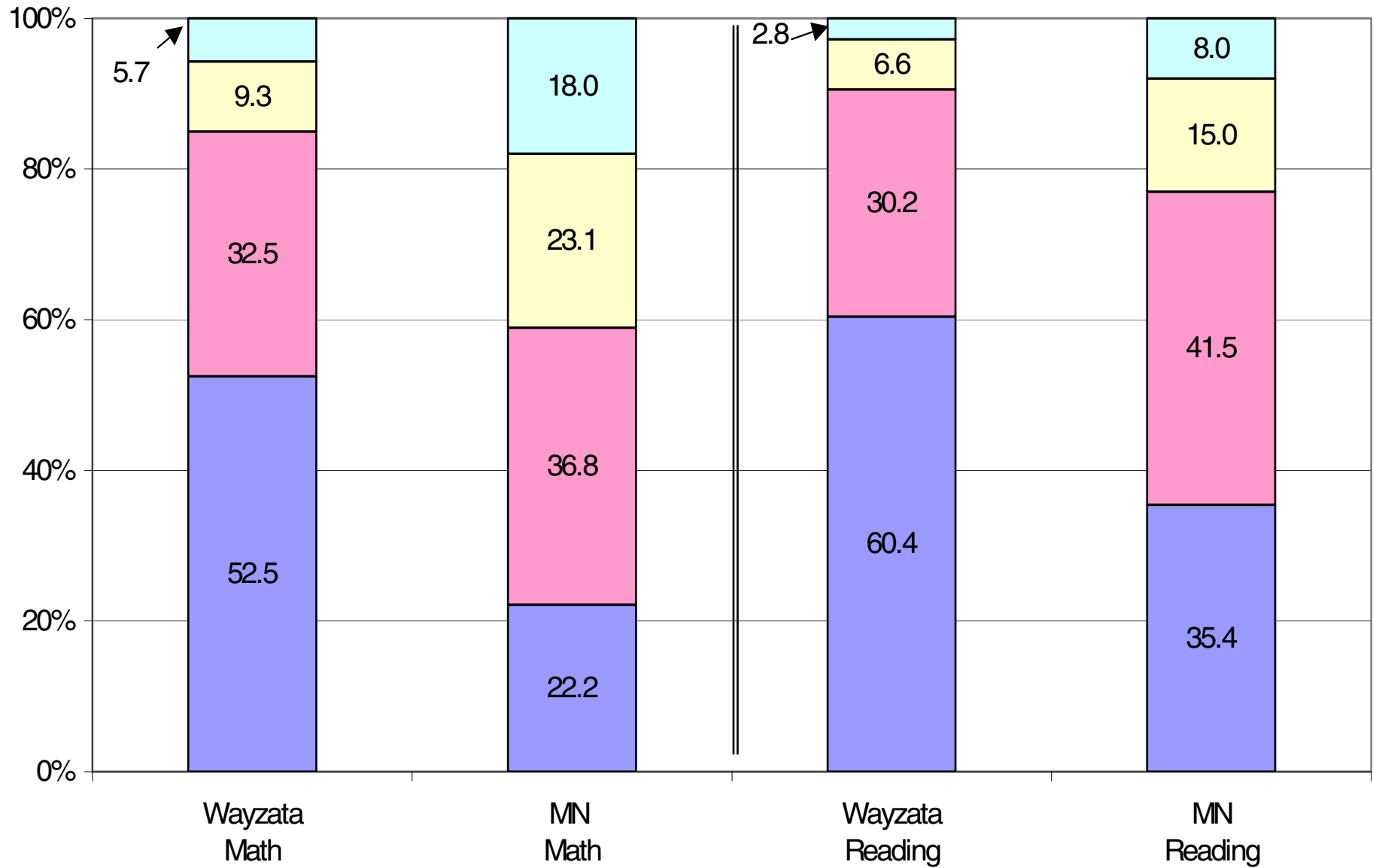
## 2006 Grade 3 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level



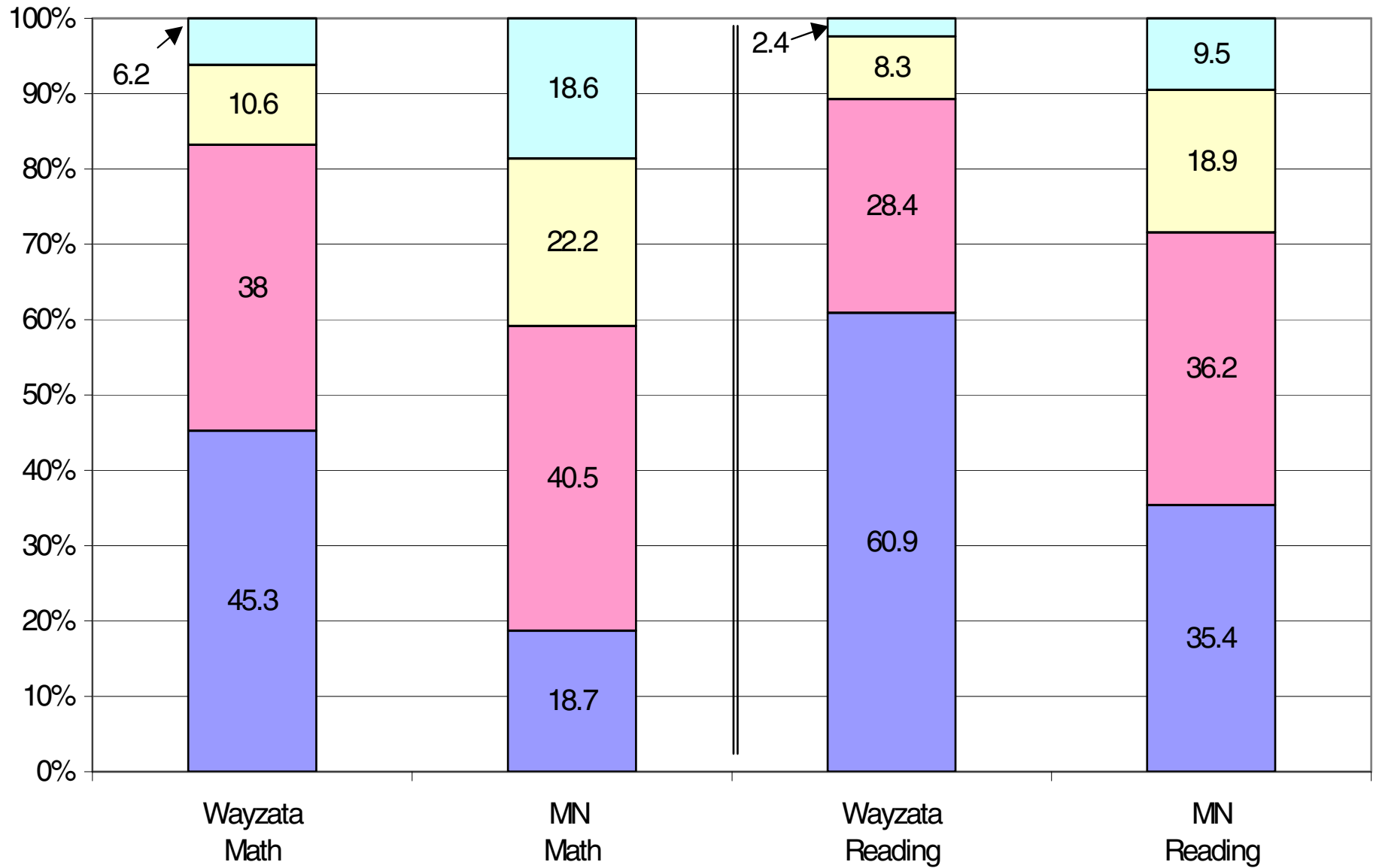
## 2006 Grade 4 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level



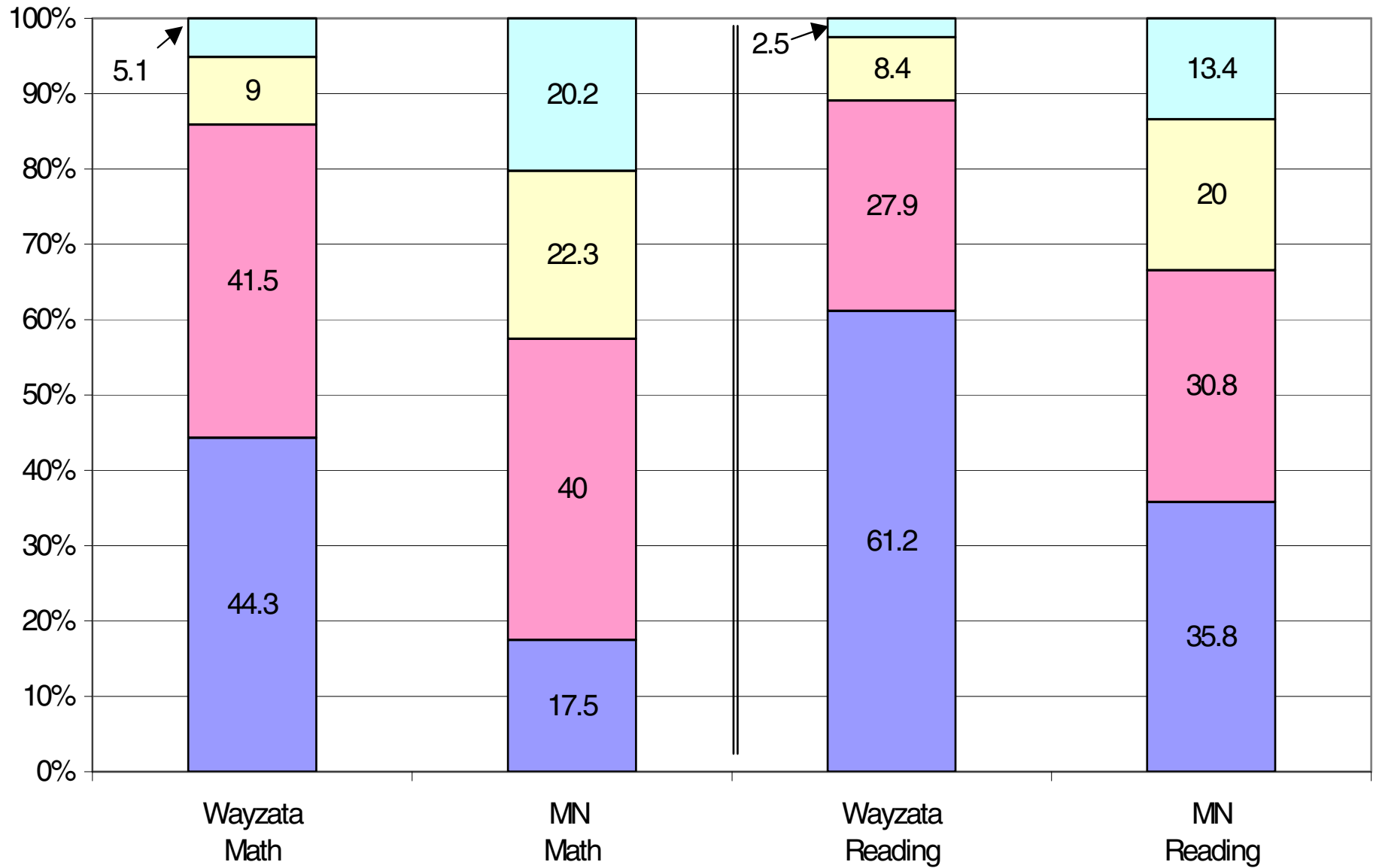
## 2006 Grade 5 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level



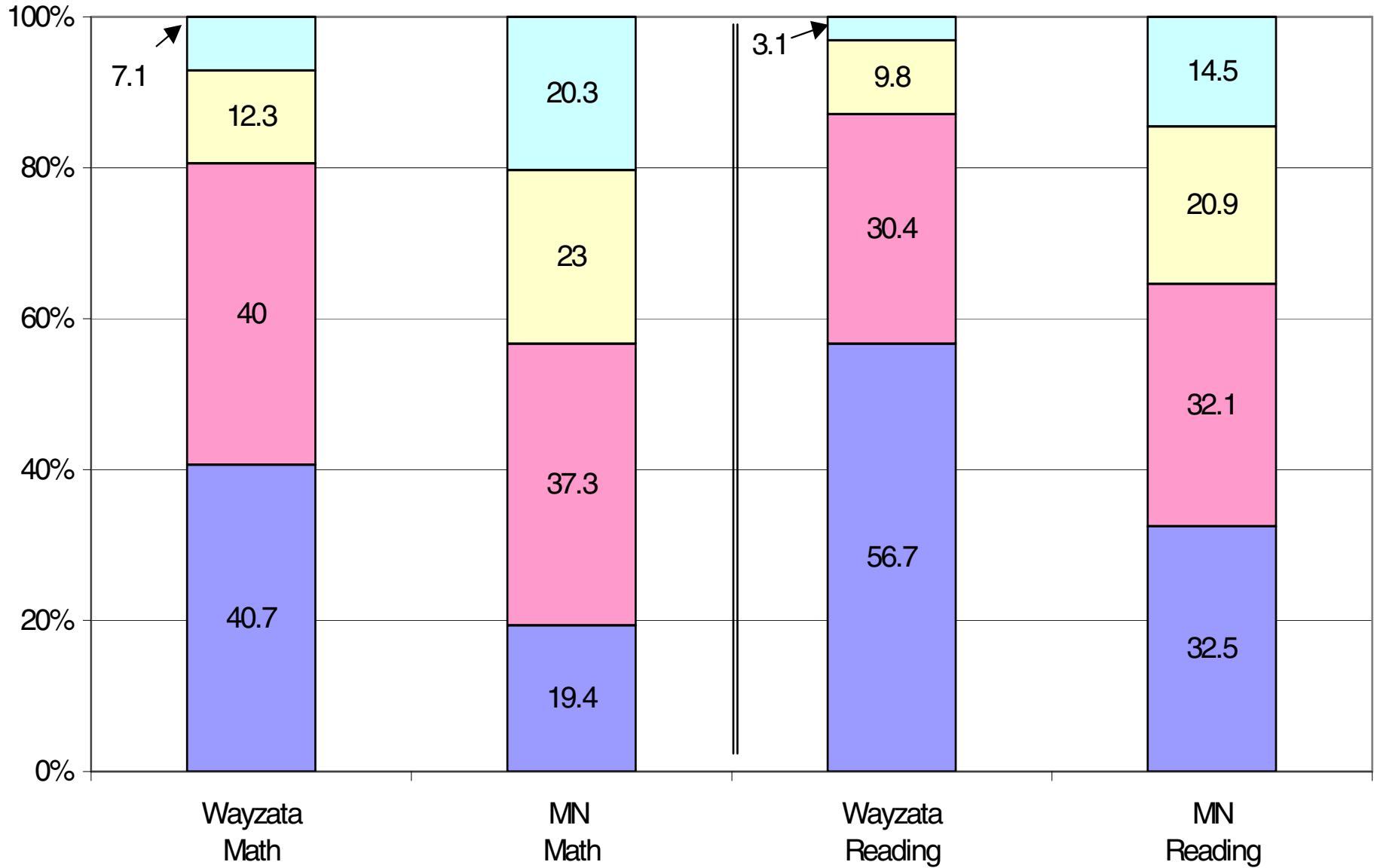
## 2006 Grade 6 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level



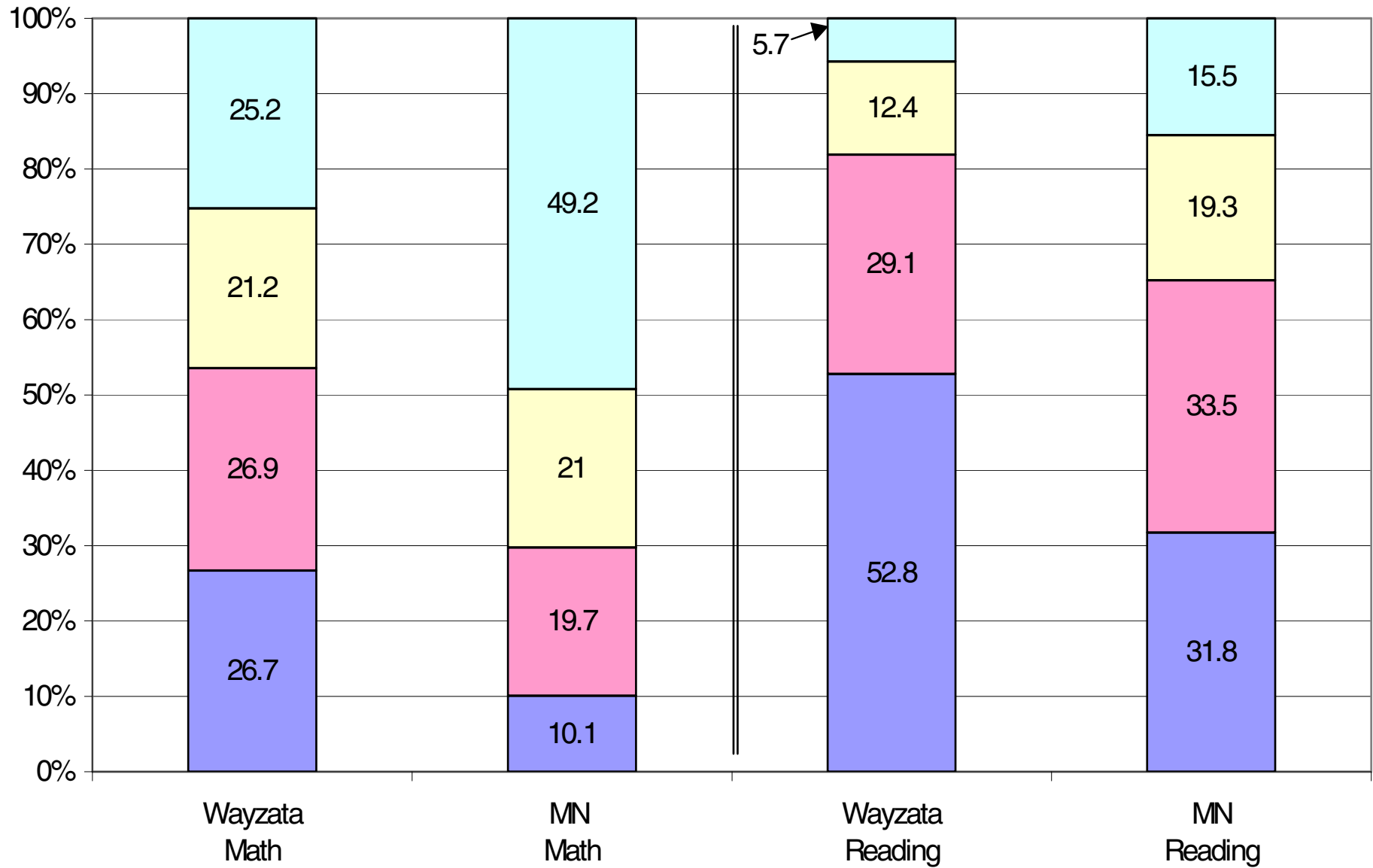
## 2006 Grade 7 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level

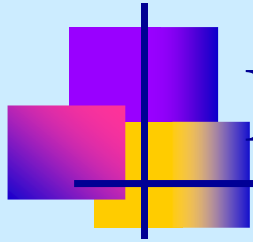


## 2006 Grade 8 MCA II Percent of Students at Each Performance Level



## 2006 High School MCA Percent of Students at Each Performance Level

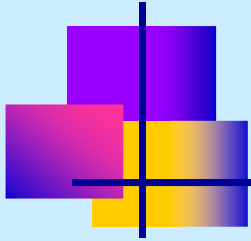

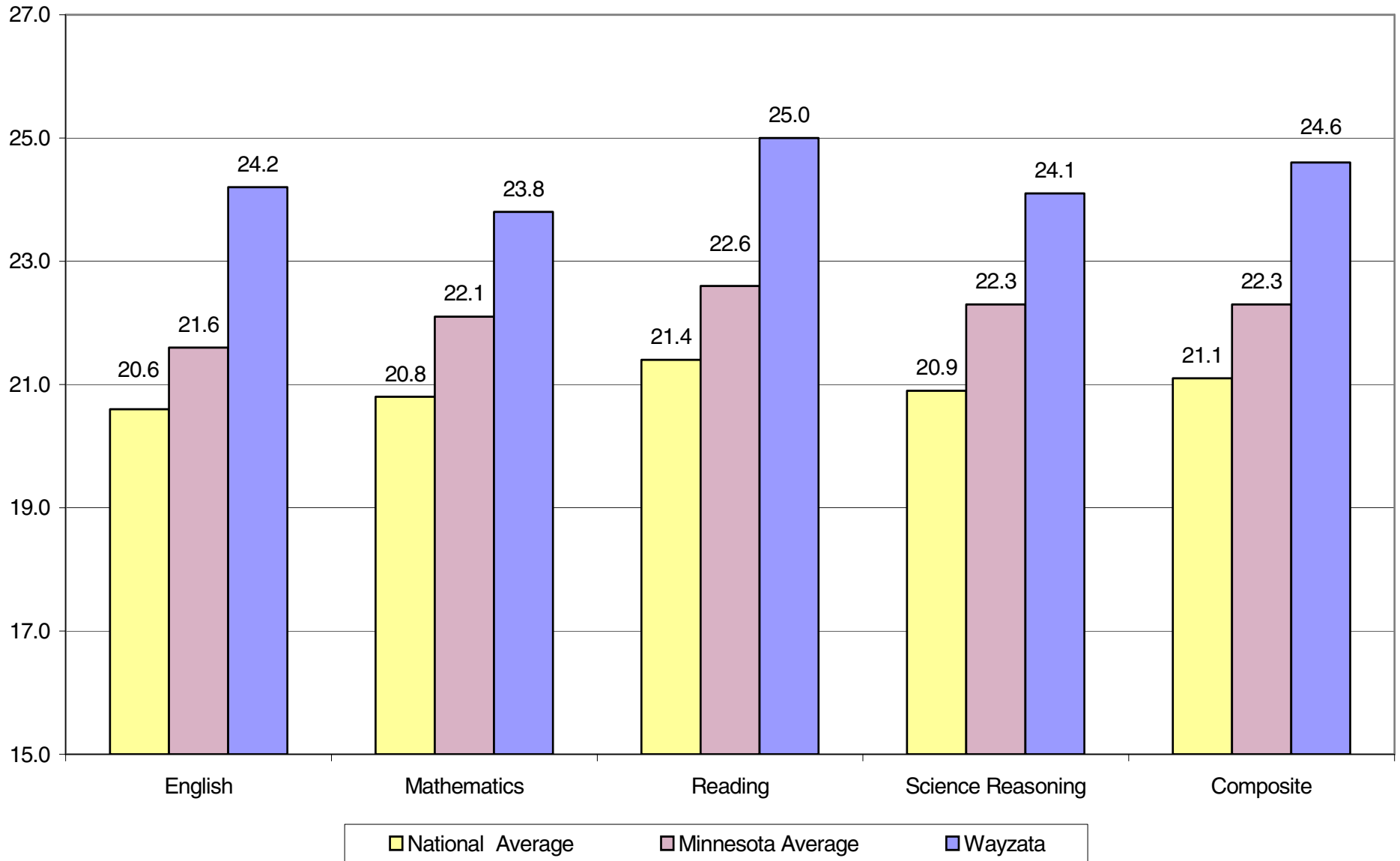


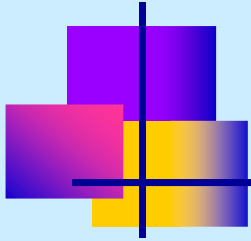

## Wayzata 2006 ACT Score Comparison Average Scores for All Graduates



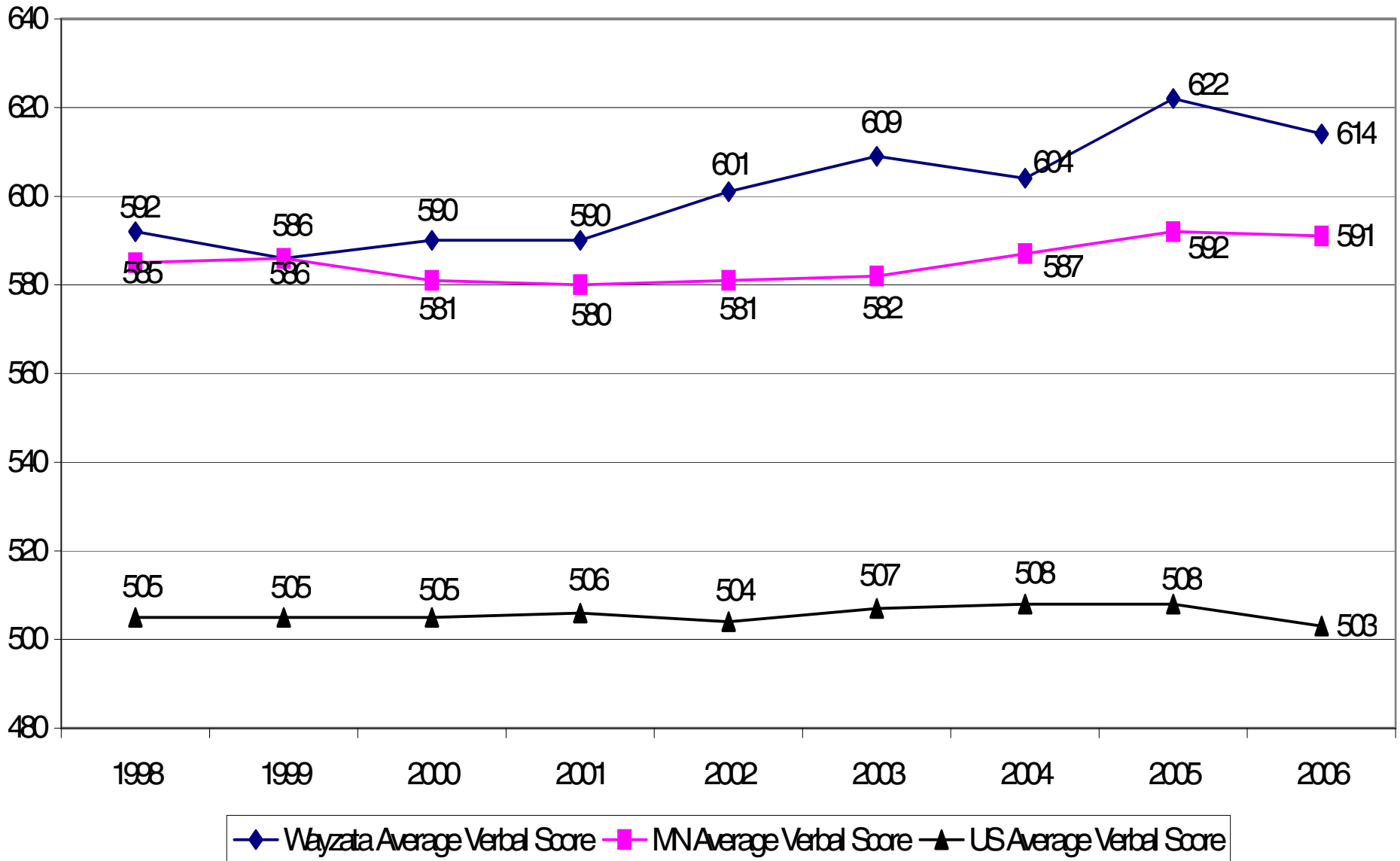

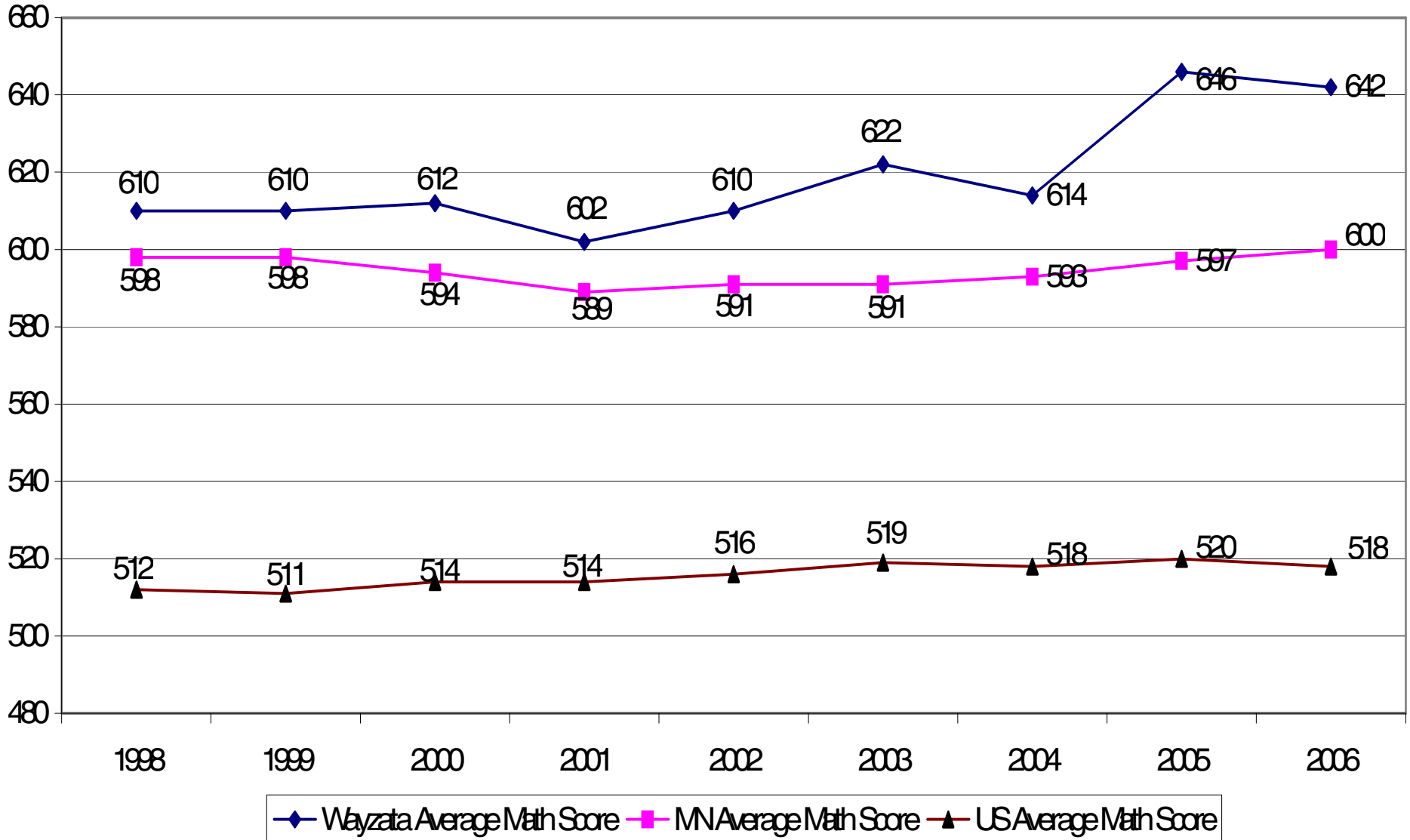

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## Executive Summary

The Mission of the Wayzata School District is to prepare all students for the future by providing a challenging education which builds academic competence, develops responsible citizenship, encourages creativity, promotes lifelong learning, advances critical thinking skills, instills a commitment to personal wellness, and fosters respect for self and others.

The Vision Statement for Wayzata Public Schools is:

*A Model of excellence among learning communities*

The district directions for 2005-2006 are:

- Apply our vision to all components of the district
- Erase organizational barriers that limit participation of all cultural groups
- Strive for smaller class sizes
- Work toward a more individualized model of education
- Promote a “client-centered” district

Achieving the District’s mission, vision and directions requires both an effective evaluation and reporting system, plus availability of data to drive instruction. This [Achievement Profile](#) provides an annual reporting system for student achievement. The profile contains information on general district characteristics and achievement assessment results. This, along with easy access to data for our instructional staff, help Wayzata Public Schools staff make informed decisions to improve achievement for all students.

### **No Child Left Behind**

*No Child Left Behind* legislation mandates accountability measures for all districts in the areas of assessment, school safety, teacher licensure and public reporting. The area receiving the most attention has been assessment. States are required to develop tests and establish the minimum scores needed for students to show proficiency. Schools are required to test grades 3 through 8, and 10 in reading and grades 3 through 8 and 11 in mathematics. Beginning in 2007, science will be added at grades 5, 8 and 10. The first year of the science test will be a field test, in which all Wayzata schools will participate.

Schools are held accountable for a set target percentage of students achieving a proficiency score. The target proficiency will increase annually until it reaches 100% in the 2013-2014 school year. Because the goals are based on school population and past performance, individual schools may have different targets within a single district. Additionally, schools and districts will report results, not only by all students (aggregated), but also by separate categories (disaggregated), including gender, ethnicity, Limited English Proficiency, Special Education, and Free/Reduced Lunch. The impact of these changes has been that schools nationwide need to improve their ability to identify students that are not proficient, and to target specific and effective instruction toward helping those students improve.

## **Key Findings**

- Attendance rates for Wayzata students range from 97% in grade 3 to 94% in grade 12 (04/05). Wayzata's attendance rates continue to exceed those in most outstate, suburban and urban school districts.
- More than 66% of Wayzata teachers hold MA or higher degrees. That is considerably higher than the state average of approximately 45%.
- The results of the spring 2006 Wayzata Achievement Level Tests show Wayzata students performing at least one grade level above their national peers in reading and math.
- The proficiency and average scale scores on the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA II) place Wayzata students at or near the top of the west metro districts comparison group at all grades and subjects.
- Wayzata students continue to score significantly higher than the state and nation, across all subjects on the ACT and SAT.

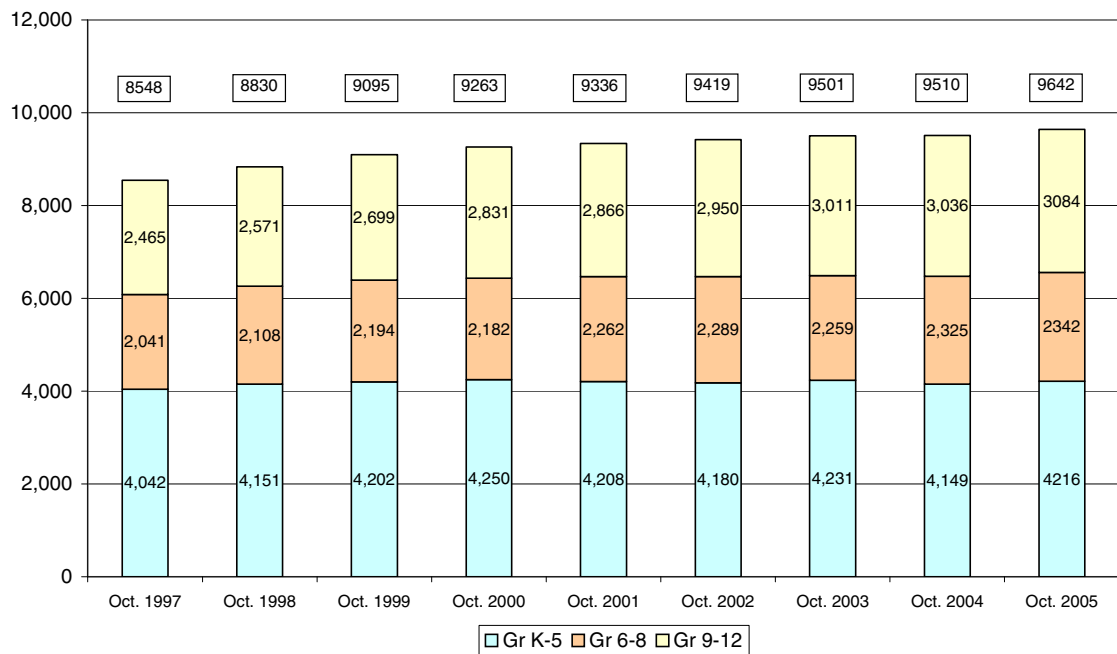

1997/98 - 2005/06**

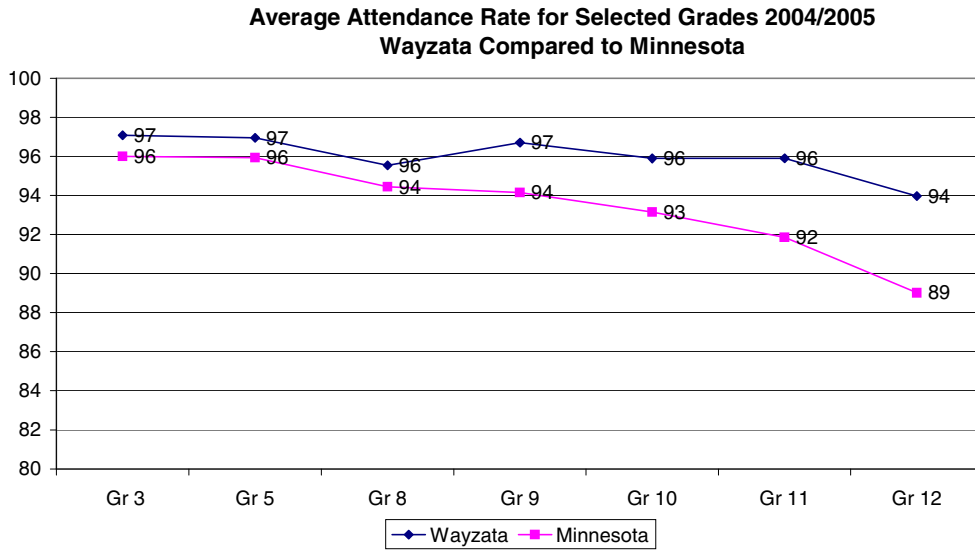

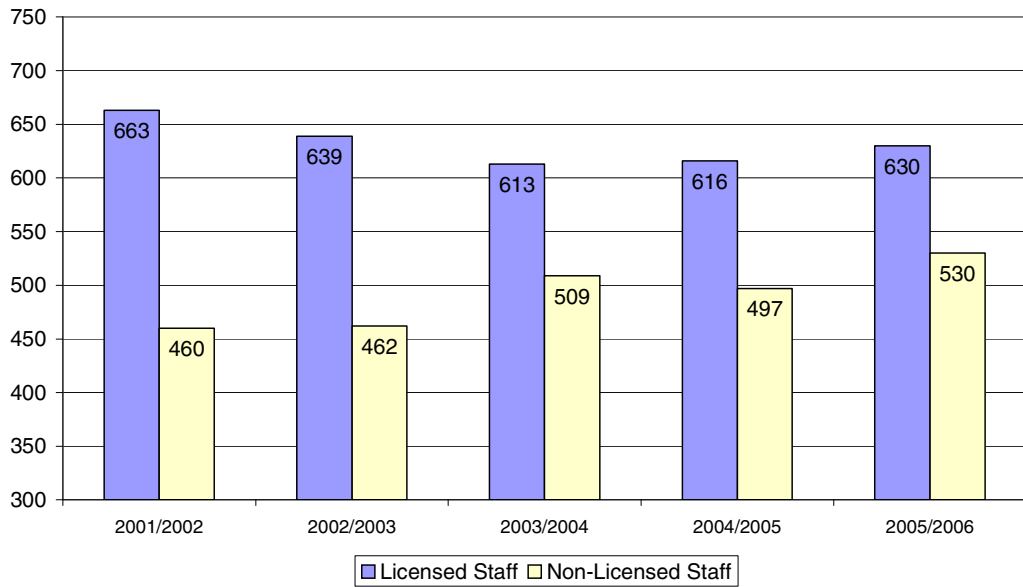

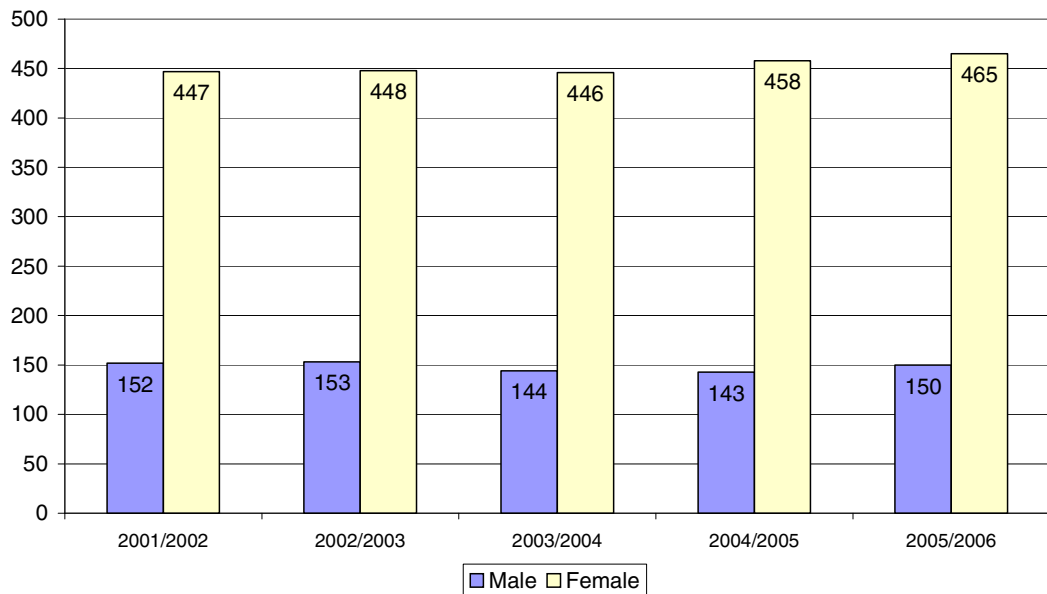

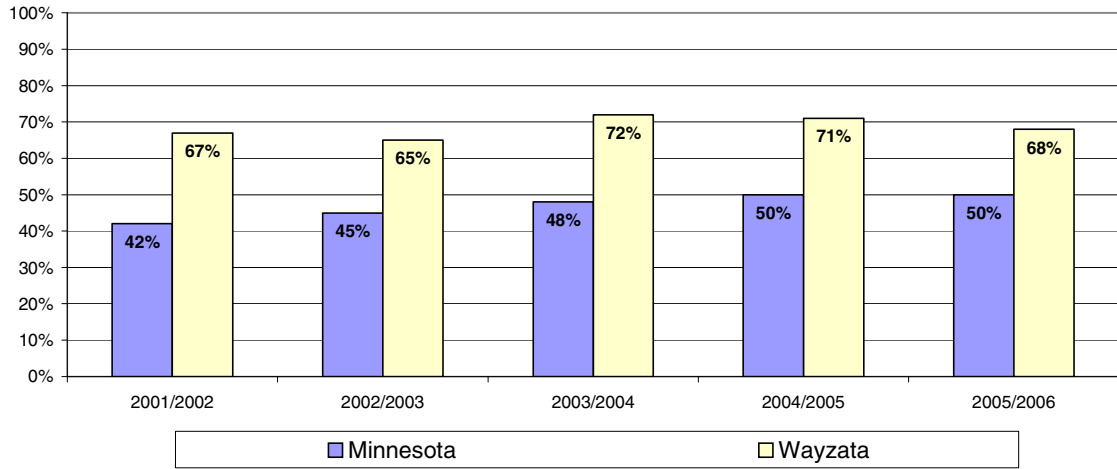
**Staff Composition

## Chapter 2

### Elementary School Achievement

#### Key Findings

- Wayzata's elementary schools have ranked at, or near, the top of the state since the MCAs were initiated in 1997. In 2006, the tests were revised and the scoring rubric changed. As a result, comparison between the previous MCA and the new MCA II is not recommended. All 7 elementary schools made AYP, with 6 schools receiving 5 stars in math and reading; the seventh school made 5 stars in math.
- Wayzata students average scale scores placed Wayzata grade 5 in the top position for both math and reading, when compared to similar west metro districts. Grades 3 and 4 were also at, or near, the top for both subjects.
- The results of the Wayzata Achievement Level Tests show that the average 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grader is reading at least one grade level above the national average. In math, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students perform nearly two grade levels above average; 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders are more than two years ahead of their national peers.

#### Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments

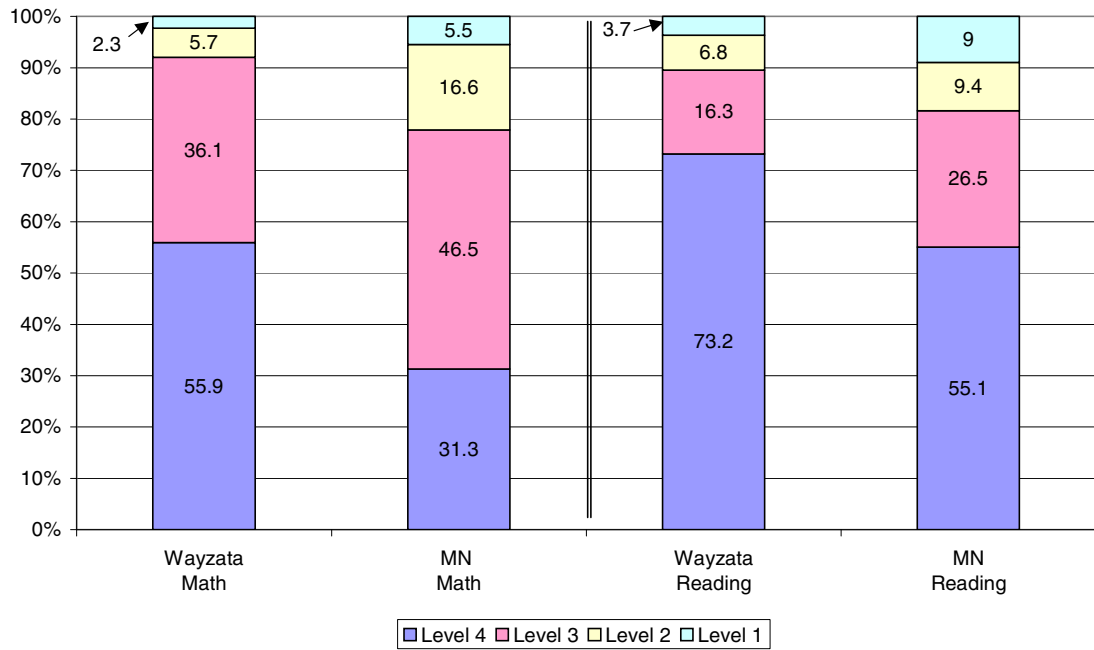
The revised Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA IIs) measure how well a student has mastered math and reading content standards at grades 3 through 5. These tests include a combination of multiple-choice and open-ended questions. The MCA provides performance levels that measure whether students meet the Minnesota standards. The levels are described as follows:

##### MCA II Achievement Levels

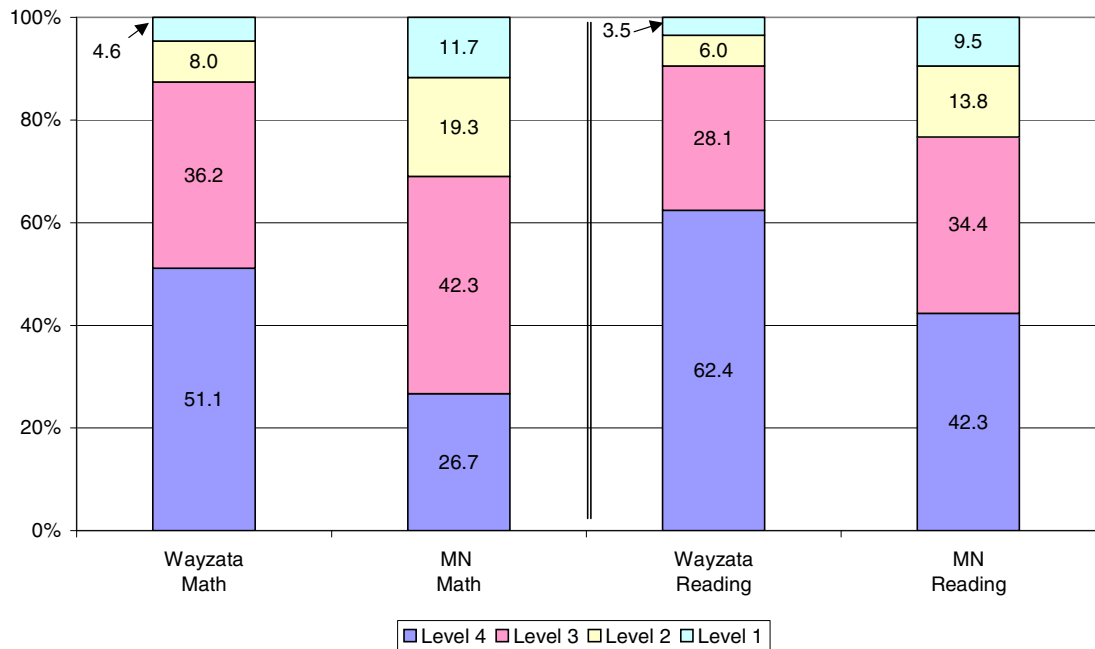
E (Level 4)	Exceeds state standards
M (Level 3)	Meets state standards
P (Level 2)	Partially meets state standards
D (Level 1)	Does not meet state standards

A student in level 3 or 4 is considered proficient for NCLB reporting. Results for the MCA II were reported in November 2006. 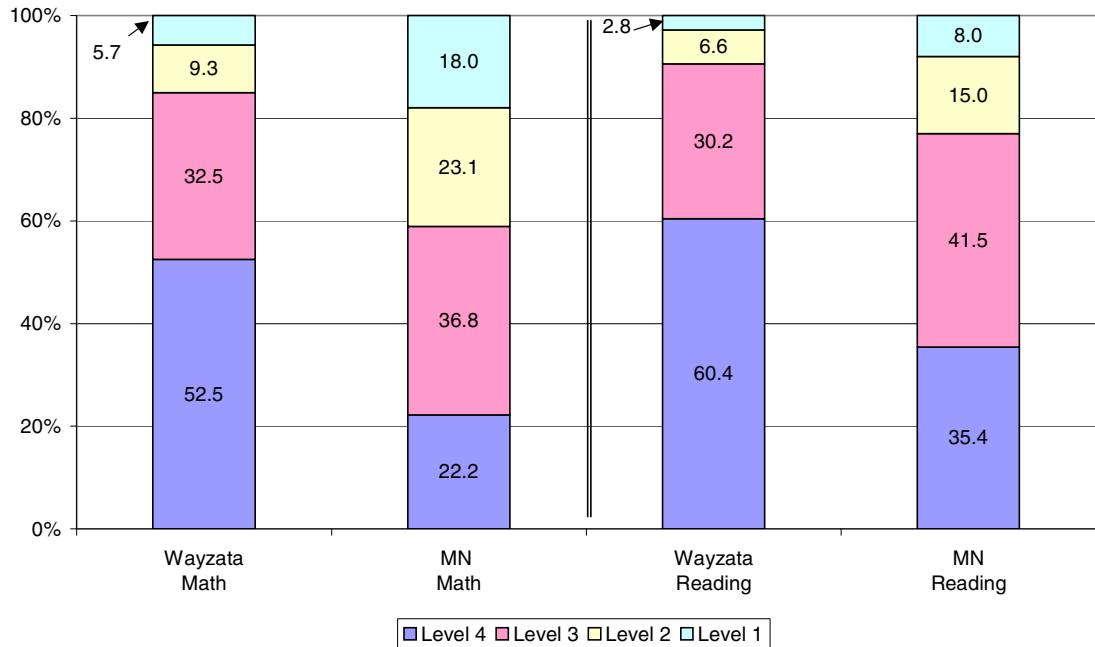
**2006 Grade 3 MCA II

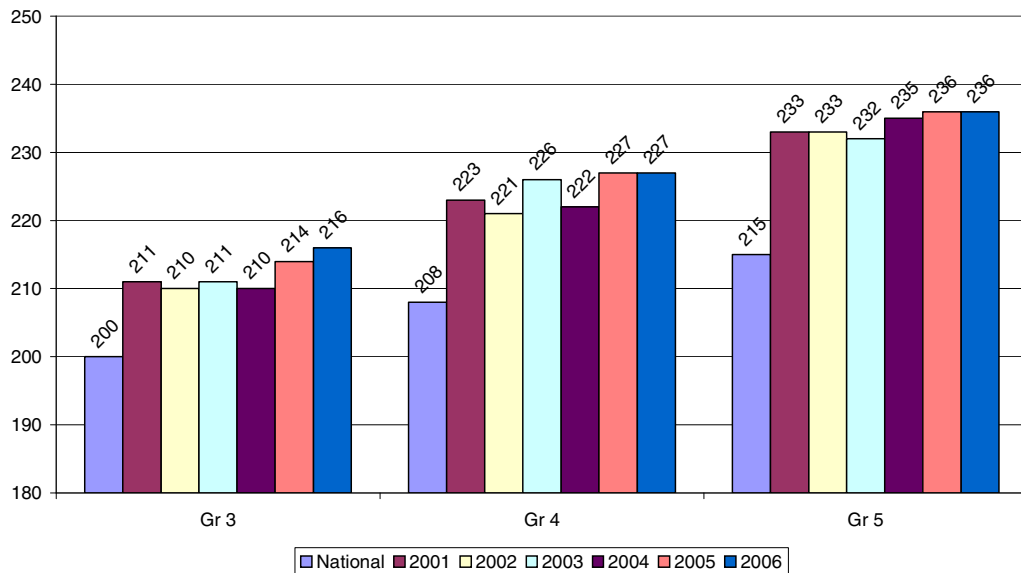
## Wayzata Achievement Level Tests (WALT)

The Wayzata Achievement Level Tests have been given to students in grades 3 through 7 since the spring of 2000. The WALTs include a series of achievement tests that systematically increase in difficulty from one level to another.

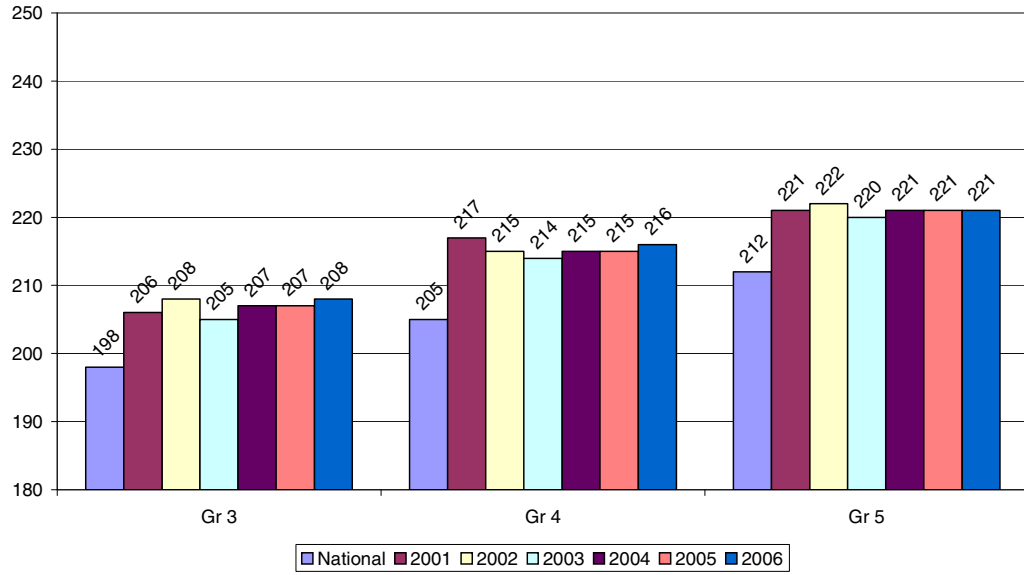
The multiple levels of WALTs make it possible to give each student a test appropriate to his/her current achievement level. Because the tests are linked from level to level and grade to grade, it is possible to get an accurate measure of the growth at the student, class, school and district levels. With this information, teachers can determine instructional interventions and the district can measure program effectiveness.

The following figures show the comparison of average scores between Wayzata students and the national norm groups. These bar charts show that Wayzata students achieve consistently one grade level or higher above the national norm groups. The average scores also show a level-to-increasing pattern in all grades and subjects.

## Chapter 3

### Middle School Achievement

#### Key Findings

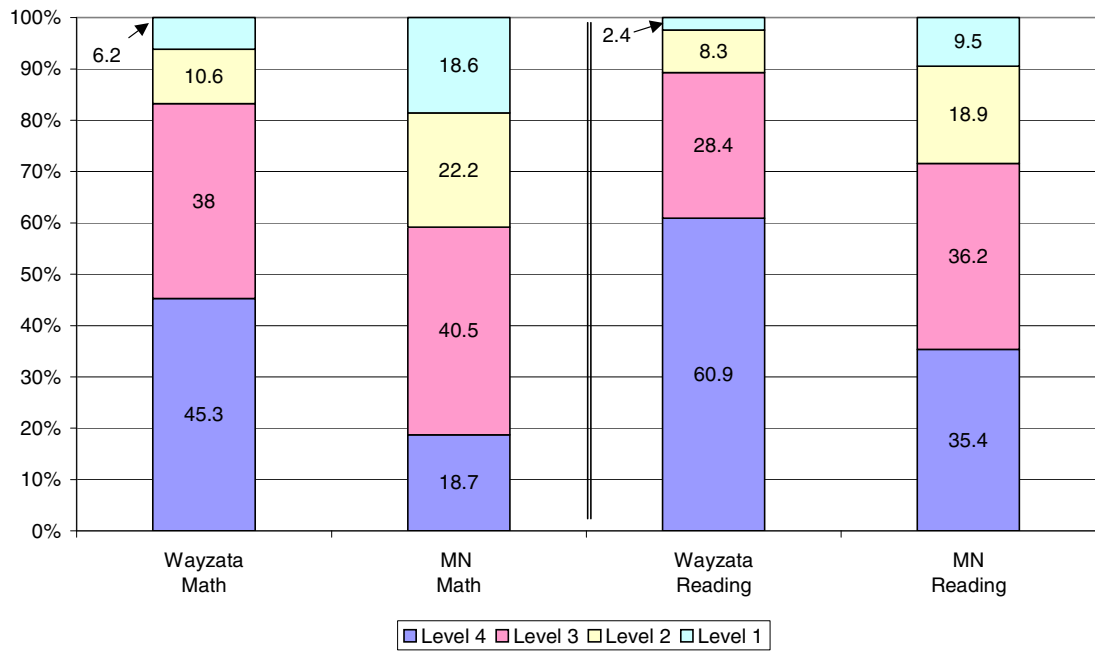
- Wayzata students scored at, or near, the top of the west metro comparison group on the 2006 MCA II tests.
- On the Wayzata Achievement Levels Tests (WALT), students in grades 6 and 7 scored at least on grade level or higher above the national norm group in reading and math.
- The average middle school student in Wayzata is scoring in the 74<sup>th</sup> national percentile in reading, and in the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile in math on the WALT.

#### Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments

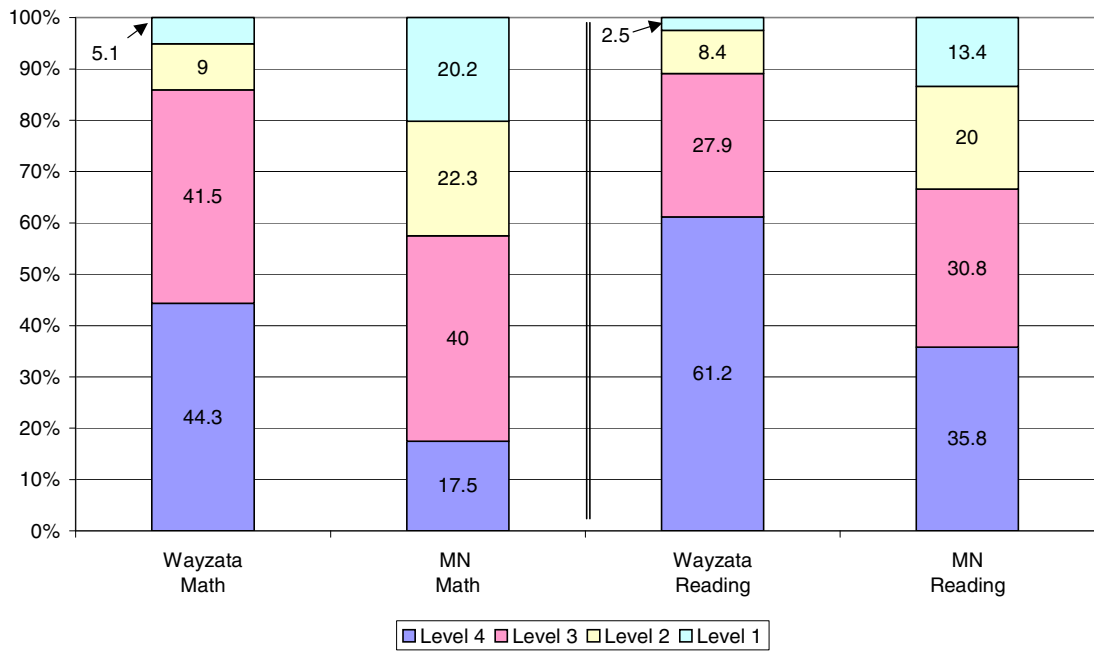
The Minnesota Comprehensive tests were redesigned for the 2006 administration. Grade levels were added and the scoring was restructured. As a result, comparisons between previous years' tests and the 2006 MCA II are not recommended. What is consistent with earlier test results, however, is that Wayzata students are performing at a higher level than their peers.

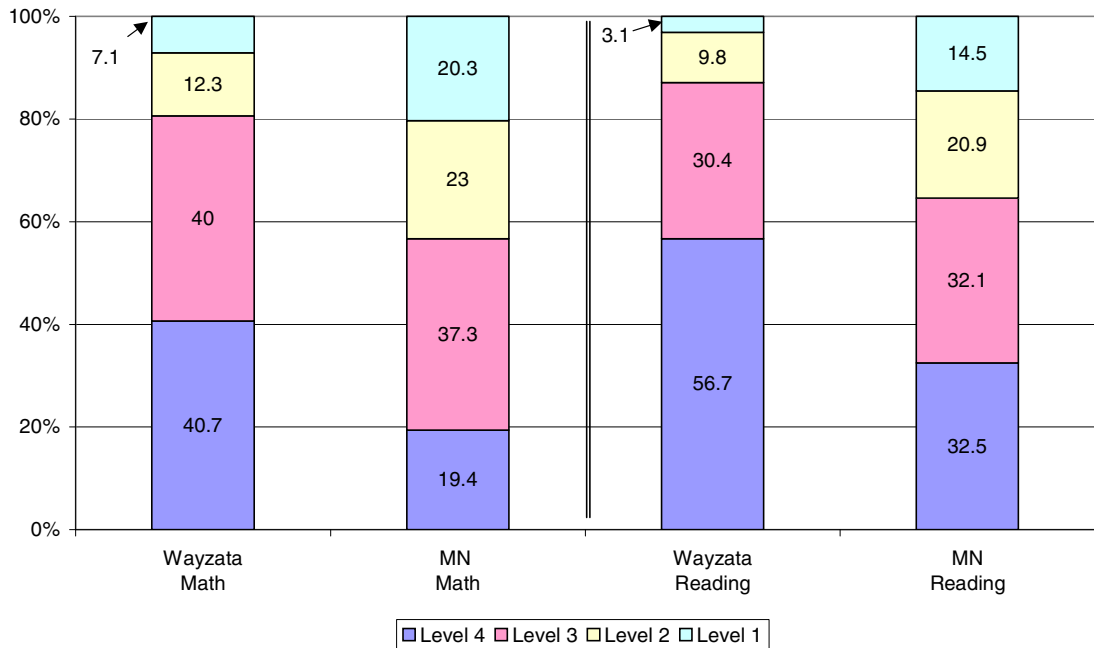
**2006 Grade 6 MCA II

Percent of Students at Each Performance Level**



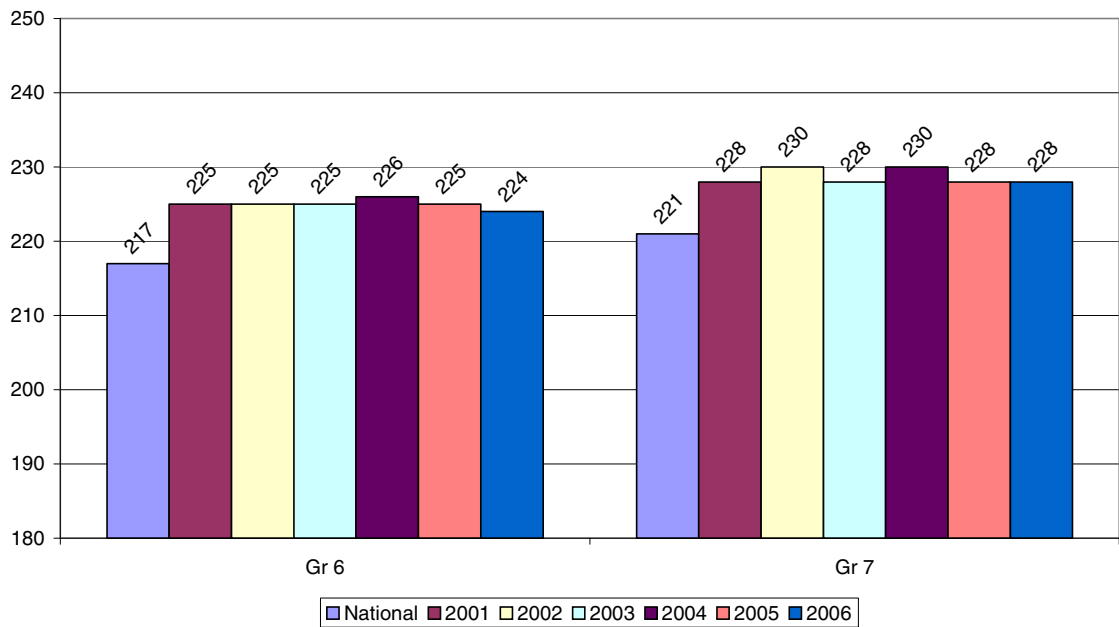

Percent of Students at Each Performance Level**



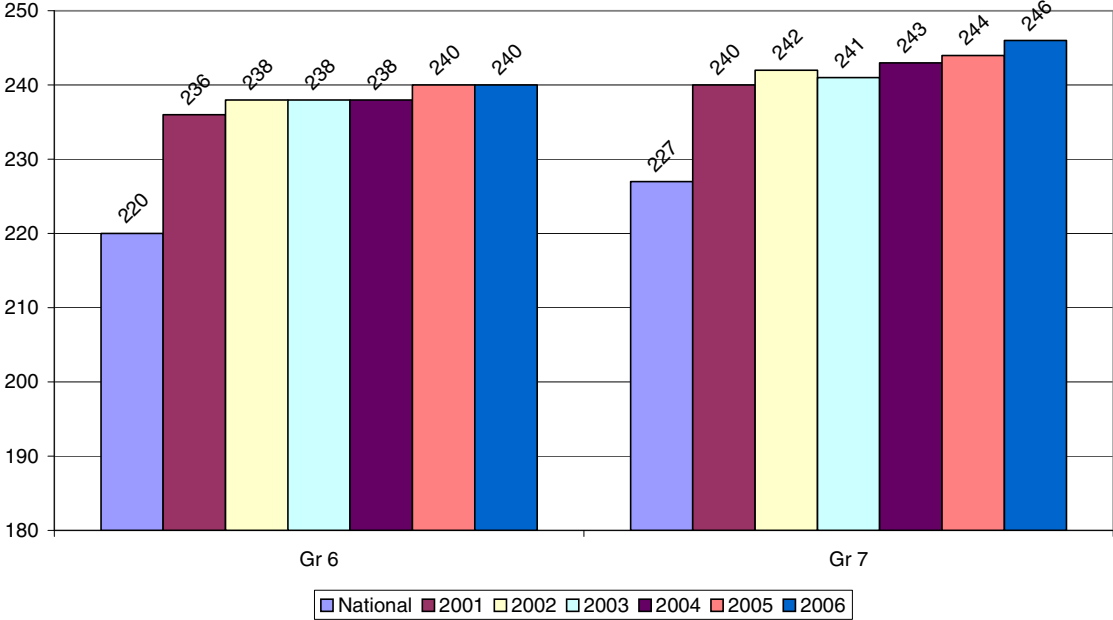

## Chapter 4

### High School Achievement

#### Key Findings

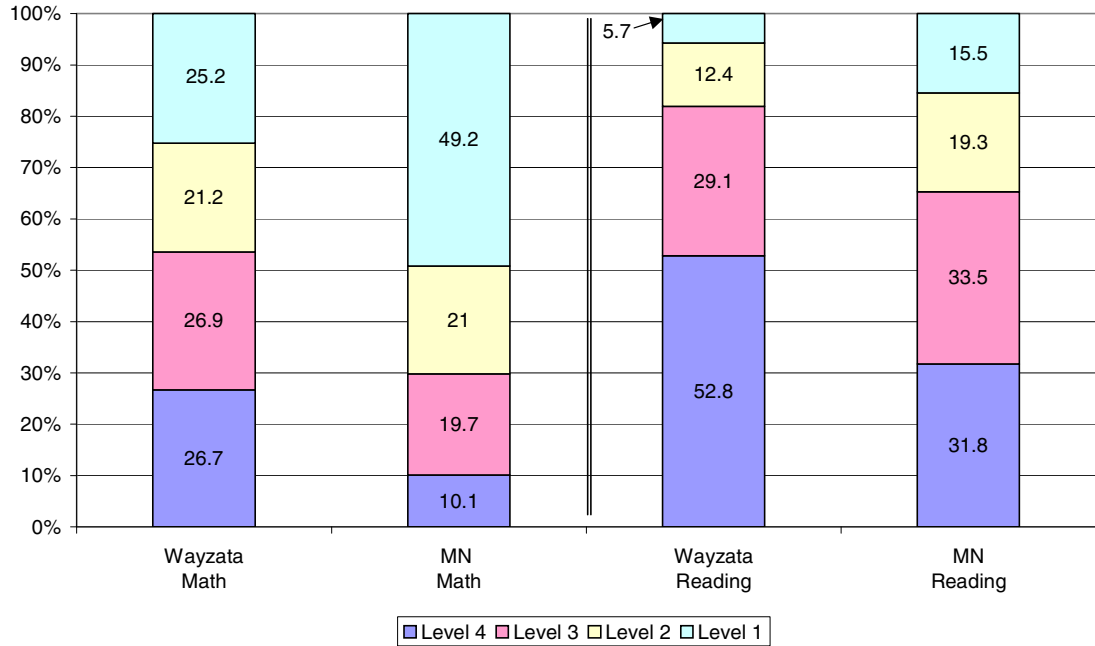
- The results of the revised MCA IIs show that Wayzata High School students earned an average scale score in math was higher than the west metro comparison districts.
- The average MCA II reading score average was a very close second among the comparison group.
- The grade 10 passing rate on the Basic Skills Test in writing was once again one of the highest in the state at 98%.
- Wayzata students scored significantly higher than the nation across all subjects and over the years on ACT and SAT.
- Participation in AP courses has increased over the past several years. Wayzata students taking AP tests are achieving a score of 3 or higher (level required for college credit) at a rate of 87%.
- Wayzata High School had 10 National Merit Finalists and 11 Commended Scholars in 2006.

#### Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments

Wayzata High School Students performed well above the state averages in both math and reading on the 2006 MCA IIs. The revised test has a new scoring system and comparison to previous editions of the test is not recommended. The following table uses the 2006 scores to compare to other west metro districts and the state average results.

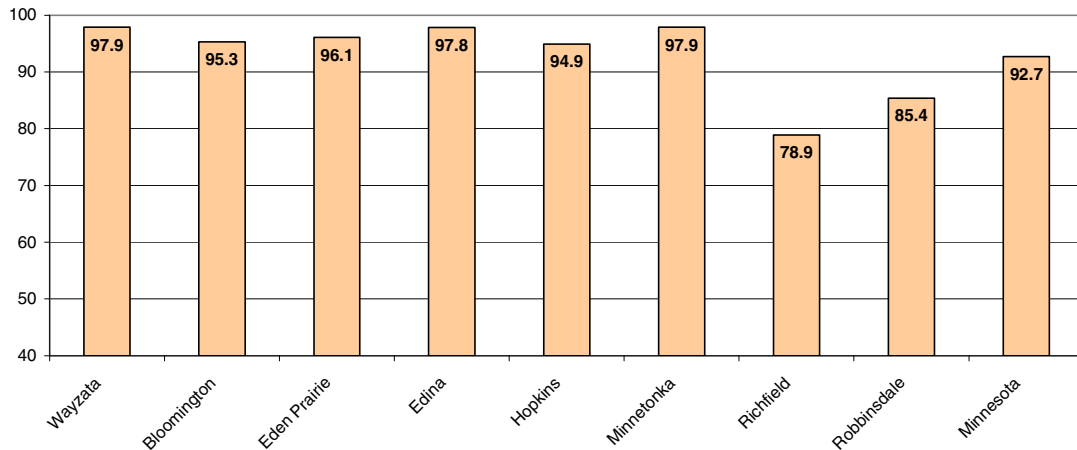
**2006 High School MCA

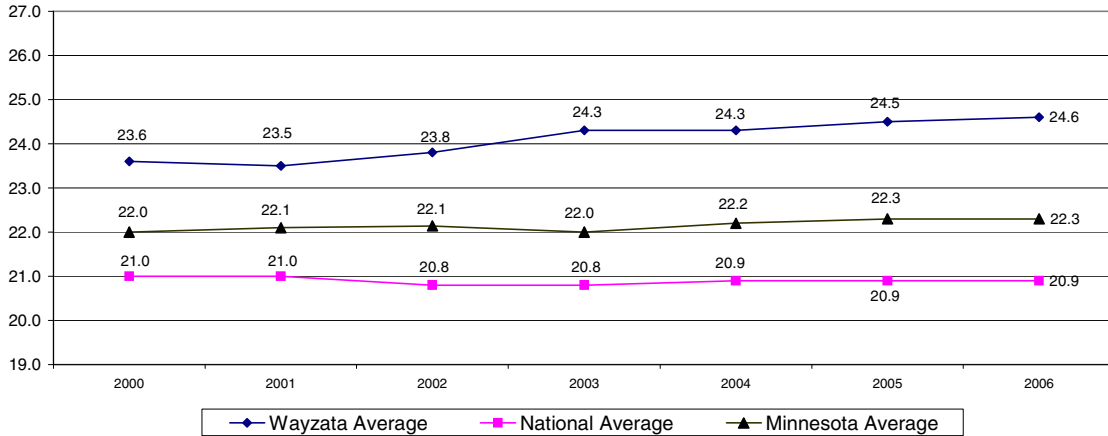
**2006 Grade 10 Writing BST  
West Metro Comparison - Percent Passing**



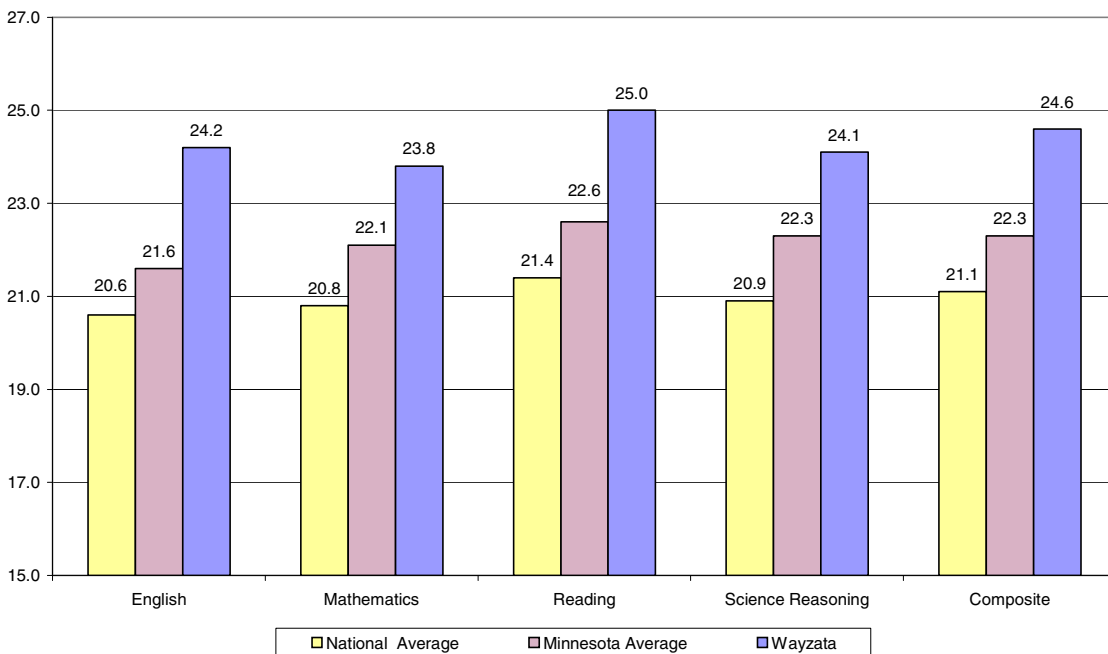

1997/1998 - 2005/2006

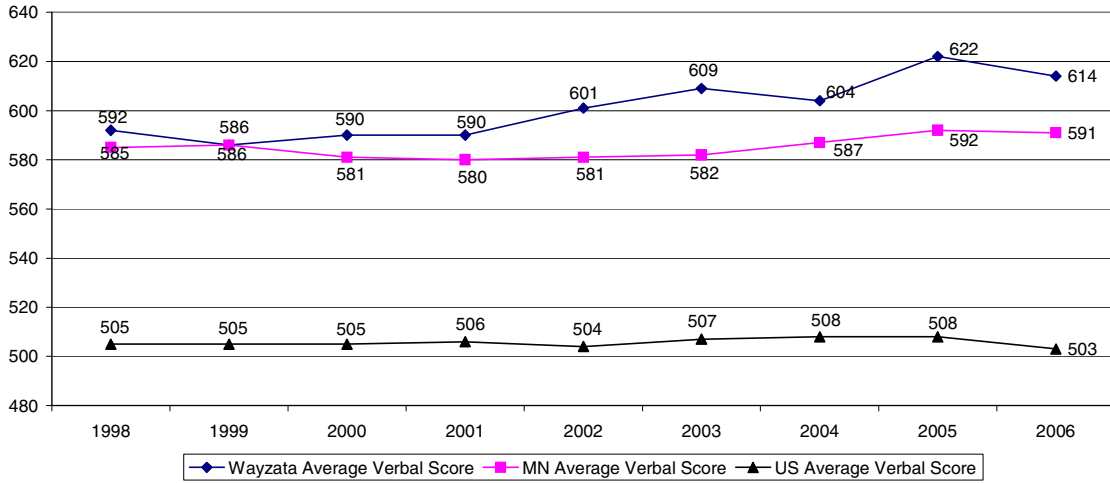


**Wayzata 2006 ACT Score Comparison**  
Average Scores for All Graduates

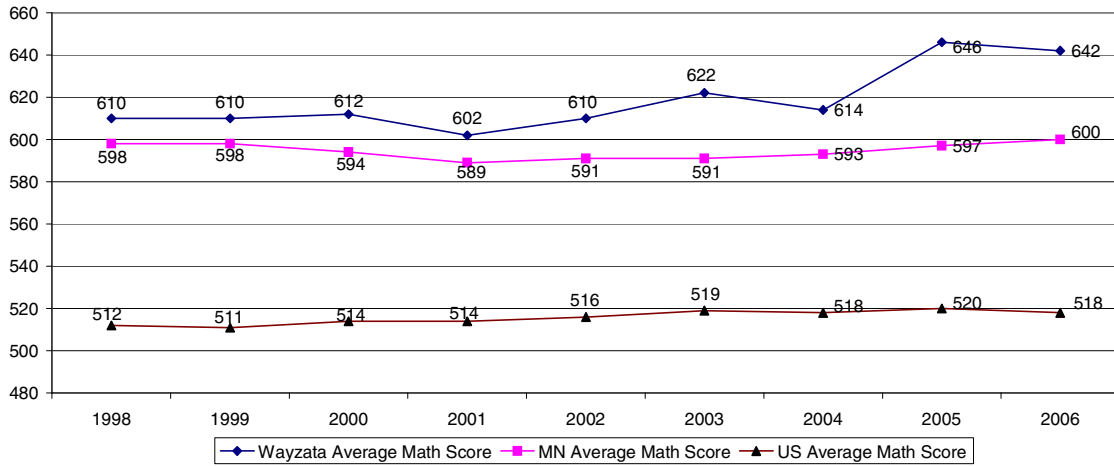

## Advanced Placement Tests

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program is a cooperative educational endeavor between secondary schools and colleges/universities. The program encourages students to apply themselves in college-level studies through their secondary and post-secondary school experiences. It also provides the means for colleges to grant credit, placement, or both, to students who have applied themselves successfully. The following table shows an increase in the number of students in AP classes and tests taken, and the number of courses offered is at its highest level. The percentage of students scoring 3 or higher (the level required for college credit) has increased over eight years to a current level of 87%.

## **Position Statement on Student Assessment Wayzata Public Schools**

The Wayzata School District's purpose is to develop students who can read, write, compute, think creatively, solve problems and use technology. All students should also enjoy and perform in the arts, athletics and personal fitness, in addition to understanding history, science, health and other cultures and languages. Each student must be responsible for his or her learning and behavior, work well with others and contribute to the community. Every student must graduate from high school and be prepared to move on to productive work, to further study, and to function in the global economy. Ultimately, students must become active citizens and lifelong learners who lead healthy lives.

We can meet our responsibility of providing an educational experience that achieves these purposes only if we regularly and consistently assess how well our students are doing and make the changes that are necessary in order to improve all facets of our schools.

### ***Setting Standards***

A critical set of responsibilities for Wayzata Schools is to articulate clearly what success means in our District. Responsibilities which define success include establishing standards of performance, measuring performance against those standards, making this information available to the public, and ensuring that this information is used to make good decisions which support student learning. Defining standards for success and continually monitoring progress enable schools and the District to make informed decisions about allocation of resources, curricular priorities and new initiatives that will directly enhance the success of all their students. Schools must constantly build on their accomplishments, while also addressing areas in need of improvement.

### ***Assessment System***

Assessment is the process of gathering, describing, or quantifying information about student performance. The District's assessment system combines multiple assessments into a reporting format that produces comprehensive, credible, dependable information upon which decisions can be made about students, schools, and the District. The assessment system includes norm-referenced assessments, alternative assessment systems, State standards assessments and classroom assessments.

Student learning is a multifaceted process, which must be assessed using multiple measures that include both academic achievement over an extended period of time and student achievements that are other than academic. In educational settings, a decision or characterization that will have a major impact on a student should not be made on the basis of a single assessment or test score. Other relevant information should be taken into account if it will enhance the overall validity of the decision.

### *Assessment Purposes*

Information collected through the District's assessment system may be used for multiple purposes. These purposes may include:

- Monitoring student progress toward standards at all levels
- Modifications to the instructional process
- Identification of students for assistance or program placement
- Evaluation of programs or curriculum
- Certification of student achievement of state graduation requirements
- Feedback to students and parents on post-high school placement and options
- Reporting to the public on achievement of standards and goals

### *Assessment Methods*

A variety of assessment methods are used to support these multiple purposes. The attached table lists the assessments currently in use, and the purpose(s) they support.

## Final Budget Adjustments

2006-2007

### Overview

The attached spreadsheet shows the budget adjustments for the 2006-2007 fiscal year. The general fund budget situation is improved somewhat. The significant changes for this January, 2007 adjustment are:

- General fund revenue is \$294,691 higher than was the case in the preliminary budget. This is largely due to revised pupil counts, as well as revised investment earnings estimates. The equity revenue loss is an offsetting reduction.
- General fund expenditures are increased by \$1,559,814. Most of this is the \$1,438,031 budgeted for building carryover. The money to pay the carryover amount is held in a designated reserve account in the general fund.
- The Debt Service Fund has been adjusted on the revenue side to show interest earnings on refunding bonds held in escrow, and on the expenditure side for the \$23,725,600 payments on bonds held in escrow. This includes a payment of \$22,450,000 to pay off the January, 1997 bond issue, which has reached its maturity date and will be called.

Normally salaries are adjusted in the final budget. However, this year we are still reviewing salaries, so another budget adjustment will have to be made at a later date.

### Revenue

*General Education Aid*—The preliminary budget was based on a projection of 11,380 pupil units. Based on October 1 enrollments, we now expect this number to be 11,450. This means an increase in basic aid of \$348,258, an increase in gifted aid of \$630, and an increase in operating capital revenue of \$13,950.

*Integration Revenue*—Integration revenue increased by \$24,136, due to increased pupil units. This is offset by a reduction in alternative attendance revenue of \$9,994, with a net increase of \$14,142.

*Project Interconnect*—This multi-district project raised funds from various sources to fund internet connection costs for districts. The project has ended and this distribution of \$1,315 represents the district's share of the balance.

*Equity Revenue*—Data changes at the state level caused Wayzata’s referendum revenue per pupil unit to rise above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile for the metro region, which meant a significant reduction in equity revenue for the district. The district’s estimated equity revenue for FY07 is reduced by \$440,246. The data change that caused this was an increase in the rate of inflation, which caused the district’s referendum revenue to rise. This correction was included in the levy for 2007-08, which normally would be recognized in FY08, but we are showing this adjustment this year because of its magnitude.

*Deferred Revenue*—Three deferred revenue items are unspent grant amounts carried forward from the previous year.

*Kern Foundation Grant*—The Kern Foundation has awarded a grant of \$8,650 for “Project Lead the Way.” The grant is for teaching engineering concepts at Wayzata High School.

*EMS Anti-Bullying Grant*—This grant amount of \$10,000 is actually an unspent balance from FY06.

*Interest Adjustment*—General fund investment earnings are expected to increase by \$250,000 over the preliminary budget, to a total of \$650,000. This is a sharper estimate than we were able to do last spring. The increase is due largely to rising interest rates, but also due in part to improved cash flow attributed to improved state aid payment schedules.

*Interest Adjustment, Dome Escrow Account*—The dome escrow account holds an amount equal to about one year’s lease payment on the dome. It is a cushion to provide some assurance to holders of the financing notes. Investment earnings are increased in the account by \$14,000 due to improved interest rates. The interest earnings are used to offset the lease cost.

## **Expenditures**

Many expenditure items, such as grant expenditures, are equal to revenue amounts shown above. Other budget additions are as follows:

*Growth and Goals Workshop*—This allocation of \$1,500 is staff development money for elementary principals to attend a workshop to help refine alternative compensation goals and align them with student needs as measured by standardized tests.

*Transforming School Counseling Consultant*—The Curriculum and Instruction Department has retained a consultant to work on “Transforming School Counseling.” Staff development money will be used for this.

*Capital Reserves Expenditures at WMS*--\$5,134 is allocated for conversion of computer labs to classrooms at West Middle School.

*Blue Ribbon Schools*--\$6,000 of staff development money is allocated to Birchview and Gleason Lake (\$3,000 each). The purpose is to pay for the required travel of the principal and one teacher to Washington, D.C., to accept the Blue Ribbon Schools awards earned by those schools.

*Building Allocation Adjustment*—Allocations to schools are finalized each year based on actual October 1 enrollments. This year the allocation is increased by \$23,207 to reflect enrollments above projections.

*Carryover*—Carryover balances for building staff development, compensatory revenue, building allocations, field trips and schools' beverage revenues are carried over for expenditure.

*Reduction in Estimated Reemployment Insurance Claims*—This is an improved budget estimate. Reemployment insurance claims are paid from a reserve account for this purpose, which is being spent down over time. The budgeted amount is reduced here from \$70,000 to \$30,000 with the goal of reducing year-end budget variance.

*Community Services Fund*—The Minneapolis Greater Day Care Association has awarded grants for use at four sites (Kimberly Lane, Plymouth Creek, Sunset Hill, and Greenwood). The grants total \$43,359 and are to be used for staff training, accreditation, and cultural responsiveness training.

*Health and Safety*—The state now requires that Alternative Facilities projects (which are Health and Safety projects over \$500,000) be accounted for in the Building Construction Fund rather than the Health and Safety account of the General Fund. The moneys are initially received in the General Fund, and we omitted this revenue and expense (transfer to the Building Construction Fund) in the preliminary budget.
