## 1. DURATION

The duration, or term, of this Agreement shall be for the designated number of years and months as agreed upon below, not to exceed five (5) years, commencing on the Start Date. This Agreement may be renewed by written agreement of the parties. The parties may revise or modify this Agreement only by a written amendment signed by both parties.

Notwithstanding the above, either party may terminate this Agreement by providing at least thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, except that to the extent a student is currently participating in an educational experience contemplated by this Agreement at the time of receipt of the termination notice, the parties shall comply with such applicable provisions in the Agreement to allow such student to complete the educational experience provided such completion does not extend beyond one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of receipt of such notice. The parties may revise or modify this Agreement only by a written amendment signed by both parties

## 2. GENERAL TERMS

- 2.1. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a relationship between the University and the Facility to enable an educational experience for students at Facility's site that may qualify for University academic credit as determined by University.
- 2.2. The University and the Facility will agree on a schedule for student participation at the Facility.
- 2.3. The student's participation should complement the service and educational activities of the Facility. The student will be under the supervision of a Facility employee.
- 2.4. Each student is expected to perform with high standards at all times and comply with all written policies and regulations of the appropriate department of the Facility.
- 2.5. Either the Facility or the University may require withdrawal or dismissal from participation at the Facility of any student whose performance record or conduct does not justify continuance.
- 2.6. Neither the University nor the Facility is obligated to provide for the student's transportation to and from the Facility or for health insurance for the student.
- 2.7. A meeting or telephone conference between representatives of the University and the Facility will occur at least once each semester to evaluate the educational program and review this Agreement.
- 2.8. Statements of performance objectives for this educational experience will be the joint responsibility of University and Facility personnel.
- 2.9. Each student must adhere to the Facility's established dress and performance standards.

## 3. FACILITY'S OBLIGATIONS

- 3.1. Facility agrees to appoint an Educational Coordinator who is responsible for the educational activities and supervision of University students participating under this Agreement.
- 3.2. The Facility agrees to submit to the University an evaluation of each student's progress. The format for the evaluation is established by the University in consultation with the Facility.
- 3.3. The Facility is responsible for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents and must maintain adequate insurance (which may include a bona fide self-insurance program) to cover any liability arising from the acts and omissions of the Facility's employees and agents. The Facility is not responsible for maintaining insurance to cover liability arising from the acts and omissions of the employees and agents of the University. University students are not deemed to be employees of Facility by virtue of this Agreement. Upon written request, Facility will furnish University with proper certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with this section.
- 3.4. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to modify, impair, destroy, or otherwise affect any common law, or statutory right to indemnity, or contribution that the University may have against the Facility by reason of any act or omission of the Facility or the Facility's employees and agents.

#### 4. UNIVERSITY'S OBLIGATIONS

- 4.1. The University will provide an administrative framework, including designating a University faculty or other representatives to coordinate scheduling, provide course information and objectives, and assist in advising students.
- 4.2. The University will be responsible for developing and carrying out procedures for student selection and admission.
- 4.3. The University is responsible for the negligent acts and omissions of its employees and agents and maintains insurance coverage through the State of Arizona's Risk Management Division self-insurance program to cover liabilities arising from the acts and omissions of the University's employees, students, and agents participating under this Agreement, except as provided for in Arizona law, including Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) [ARS §12-820.05](#) and [41-621\(L\)](#). The University is not responsible for maintaining insurance coverage for liability arising from the acts and omissions of the Facility's employees and agents. Upon written request, University will furnish Facility with reasonable documentation evidencing compliance with this section.

#### 5. UNIVERSITY AND STATE REQUIRED PROVISIONS

- 5.1. **Nondiscrimination.** The parties will comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, and executive orders governing equal employment opportunity, immigration, and nondiscrimination, including the Americans with Disabilities Act. **If applicable, the parties will abide by the requirements of 41 CFR §§ 60-1.4(a), 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a). These regulations prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities, and prohibit discrimination against all individuals based on their race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment individuals without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, protected veteran status or disability.**
- 5.2. **Conflict of Interest.** If within 3 years after the execution of this Agreement, Facility hires as an employee or agent any ASU representative who was significantly involved in negotiating, securing, drafting, or creating this Agreement, then ASU may cancel this Agreement as provided in Arizona Revised Statutes ([ARS](#)) § 38-511.
- 5.3. **Arbitration in Superior Court.** The parties agree to arbitrate disputes filed in Arizona Superior Court that are subject to mandatory arbitration pursuant to ARS § 12-133. ARS § 12-1518 requires this provision in all ASU contracts.
- 5.4. **Records.** To the extent required by ARS § 35-214, the non-ASU parties to this Agreement (jointly and severally, Facility) will retain all records relating to this Agreement. Facility will make those records available at all reasonable times for inspection and audit by ASU or the Auditor General of the State of Arizona during the term of this Agreement and for 5 years after the completion of this Agreement. The records will be provided at ASU in Tempe, Arizona, or another location designated by ASU on reasonable notice to Facility.
- 5.5. **Failure of Legislature to appropriate.** In accordance with ARS § 35-154, if ASU's performance under this Agreement depends on the appropriation of funds by the Arizona Legislature, and if the Legislature fails to appropriate the funds necessary for performance, then ASU may provide written notice of this to Facility and cancel this Agreement without further obligation of ASU. Appropriation is a legislative act and is beyond the control of ASU.

## 5. UNIVERSITY AND STATE REQUIRED PROVISIONS

5.6. **Privacy; Educational Records.** Student educational records are protected by the U.S. Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g ([FERPA](#)). Facility will not require any ASU students or employees to waive any privacy rights (including under FERPA or the European Union’s General Data Protection Regulation ([GDPR](#))) as a condition for receipt of any educational services, and any attempt to do so will be void. Facility will comply with FERPA and will not access or make any disclosures of student educational records to third parties without prior notice to and consent from ASU or as otherwise provided by law. If this Agreement contains a scope of work or other provision that requires or permits Facility to access or release any student records, then, for purposes of this Agreement only, ASU designates Facility as a “school official” for ASU under FERPA, as that term is used in FERPA and its implementing regulations. In addition, any access or disclosures of student educational records made by Facility or any Facility Parties must comply with ASU’s definition of legitimate educational purpose in [SSM 107-01: Release of Student Information](#). If Facility violates the terms of this section, Facility will immediately provide notice of the violation to ASU.

5.7. **Advertising, Publicity, Names and Marks.** Facility will not do any of the following, without, in each case, ASU’s prior written consent: (i) use any names, service marks, trademarks, trade names, logos, or other identifying names, domain names, or identifying marks of ASU ([ASU Marks](#)) for any reason, including online, advertising, or promotional purposes; (ii) issue a press release or public statement regarding this Agreement; or (iii) represent or imply any ASU endorsement or support of any product or service in any public or private communication. Any permitted use of ASU Marks must comply with ASU’s requirements, including using the ® indication of a registered mark.

5.8. **Title IX.** Title IX protects individuals from discrimination based on sex, including sexual harassment. ASU fosters a learning and working environment built on respect and free of sexual harassment. [ASU’s Title IX Guidance](#) is available online. Facility will: (i) comply with ASU’s Title IX Guidance; (ii) provide ASU’s Title IX Guidance to any Facility Parties reasonably expected to interact with ASU students or employees, in person or online; and (iii) ensure that all Facility Parties comply with ASU’s Title IX Guidance.

## 6. MISCELLANEOUS

6.1. Neither party shall have the right to assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

6.2. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to its subject matter. No prior or contemporaneous agreement or understanding will be effective. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Arizona, the courts of which state shall have jurisdiction over its subject matter.

6.3. The individual signing on behalf of Facility hereby represents and warrants that s/he is duly authorized to execute and deliver this Agreement on behalf of Facility and that this Agreement is binding upon Facility in accordance with its terms.

6.4. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

**RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS  
AND CALLING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL ELECTION**

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 284, State of Minnesota as follows:

(a) 1. It is necessary for the school district to hold its general election for the purpose of electing four (4) school board members for terms of four (4) years each.

(b) The clerk shall include on the ballot the names of the individuals who file or have filed affidavits of candidacy during the period established for filing such affidavits, as though they had been included by name in this resolution. The clerk shall not include on the ballot the names of individuals who file timely affidavits of withdrawal in the manner specified by law.

2. The general election is hereby called and directed to be held on Tuesday, the 7th day of November 2023, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock am. and 8:00 o'clock pm.

3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the school district combined polling places and the precincts served by those polling places, as previously established and designated by school board resolution for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election, are hereby designated for said general election.

4. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause written notice of said general election to be provided to the county auditor of each county in which the school district is located, in whole or in part, at least seventy-four (74) days before the date of said election. The notice shall include the date of said general election and the office or offices to be voted on at said general election. Any notice given prior to the date of the adoption of this resolution is ratified and confirmed in all respects.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of said general election to be posted at the administrative offices of the school district at least ten (10) days before the date of said general election.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a sample ballot to be posted at the administrative offices of the school district at least four (4) days before the date of said general election and to cause two sample ballots to be posted in each polling place on Election Day. The sample ballot shall not be printed on the same color paper as the official ballot. The sample ballot for a polling place must reflect the offices, candidates and rotation sequence on the ballots used in that polling place.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of said general election to be published in the official newspaper of the school district for two (2) consecutive weeks with the last publication being at least one (1) week before the date of said election.

The notice of election so posted and published shall state the offices to be filled set forth in the form of ballot below, and shall include information concerning each established precinct and polling place.

The clerk is authorized and directed to cause the rules and instructions for use of the optical scan voting system to be posted in each polling place on Election Day.

5. The clerk is authorized and directed to acquire and distribute such election materials as may be necessary for the proper conduct of this election, and generally to cooperate with election authorities conducting other elections on that date. The clerk and members of the administration are authorized and directed to take such actions as may be necessary to coordinate this election with those other elections, including entering into agreements or understandings with appropriate election officials regarding preparation and distribution of ballots, election administration and cost sharing.

6. The clerk is further authorized and directed to cause or to cooperate with the proper election officials to cause ballots to be prepared for use at said election in substantially the following form, with such changes in form, color and instructions as may be necessary to accommodate an optical scan voting system.

Optical scan ballots must be printed in black ink on white material, except that marks to be read by the automatic tabulating equipment may be printed in another color ink. The name of the precinct and machine-readable identification must be printed on each ballot. Voting instructions must be printed at the top of the ballot on each side that includes ballot information. The instructions must include an illustration of the proper mark to be used to indicate a vote. Lines for initials of at least two election judges must be printed on one side of the ballot so that the judges' initials are visible when the ballots are enclosed in a secrecy sleeve.

7. The name of each candidate for office at this election shall be rotated with the names of the other candidates for the same office in the manner specified in Minnesota law.

8. If the school district will be contracting to print the ballots for this election, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to prepare instructions to the printer for layout of the ballot. Before a contract in excess of \$1,000 is awarded for printing ballots, the printer shall, if requested by the election official, furnish, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 204D.04, a sufficient bond, letter of credit, or certified check acceptable to the clerk in an amount not less than \$1,000 conditioned on printing the ballots in conformity with the Minnesota election law and the instructions delivered. The clerk shall set the amount of the bond, letter of credit, or certified check in an amount equal to the value of the purchase.

9. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to provide for testing of the optical scan voting system within fourteen (14) days prior to the general election date. The clerk shall cause notice of the time and place of the test to be given at least two (2) days in advance by publishing the Notice of Testing once in the official newspaper and by causing the notice to be posted in the office of the county auditor, the administrative offices of the school district, and the office of any other local election official conducting the test.

10. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of the location of the counting center or the place where the ballots will be counted to be published in the official newspaper at least once during the week preceding the week of the general election and in the newspaper of widest circulation once on the day preceding the general election, or once the week preceding the general election if the newspaper is a weekly.

11. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121, the Board hereby establishes a ballot board to process, accept and reject absentee ballots at school district elections not held in conjunction with the state primary or state general election or that are conducted by a municipality on behalf of the school district and generally to carry out the duties of a ballot board as provided by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121 and other applicable laws. The ballot board must consist of a sufficient number of election judges trained in the handling of absentee ballots. The ballot board may include deputy county auditor or deputy city clerks who have received training in the processing and counting of absentee ballots. The clerk or the clerk's designee is hereby authorized and directed to appoint the members of the ballot board. The clerk or the clerk's designee shall establish, maintain and update a roster of members appointed to and currently serving on the ballot board and shall report to the Board from time to time as to its status. Each member of the ballot board shall be paid reasonable compensation for services rendered during an election at the same rate as other election judges; provided, however, if a staff member is already being compensated for regular duties, additional compensation shall not be paid for ballot board duties performed during that staff member's duty day.

12. Election officials from the City of Minnetonka shall conduct the election for those individuals residing within the City of Minnetonka. Election Officials from Wayzata Public Schools shall conduct the election for all other individuals. The School Board shall appoint those election judges. The election judges shall act as clerks of election, count the ballots cast and submit the results to the school board for canvass

in the manner provided for other school district elections. The general election must be canvassed between the third and tenth day following the general election. The election judges will be appointed later.

13. The School District clerk shall make all Campaign Financial Reports required to be filed with the school district under Minnesota Statutes, Section 211A.02, available on the school district's website. The clerk must post the report on the school district's website as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) days after the date of the receipt of the report. The school district must make a report available on the school district's website for four years from the date the report was posted to the website. The clerk must also provide the Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board with a link to the section of the website where reports are made available.

## **706 FUND BALANCE**

### **I. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to create fund balance classifications to allow for more useful fund balance reporting and for compliance with the reporting guidelines specified in Statement No. 54 of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB).

### **II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

The policy of this school district is to comply with GASB Statement No. 54. To the extent a specific conflict occurs between this policy and the provisions of GASB Statement No. 54, the GASB Statement shall prevail.

### **III. DEFINITIONS**

- A. “Assigned” fund balance amounts are comprised of unrestricted funds constrained by the school district’s intent that they be used for specific purposes, but that do not meet the criteria to be classified as restricted or committed. In funds other than the general fund, the assigned fund balance represents the remaining amount that is not restricted or committed. The assigned fund balance category will cover the portion of a fund balance that reflects the school district’s intended use of those resources. The action to assign a fund balance may be taken after the end of the fiscal year. An assigned fund balance cannot be a negative number.
- B. “Committed” fund balance amounts are comprised of unrestricted funds used for specific purposes pursuant to constraints imposed by formal action of the school board and that remain binding unless removed by the school board by subsequent formal action. The formal action to commit a fund balance must occur prior to fiscal year end; however, the specific amounts actually committed can be determined in the subsequent fiscal year. A committed fund balance cannot be a negative number.
- C. “Enabling legislation” means legislation that authorizes a school district to assess, levy, charge, or otherwise mandate payment of resources from external providers and includes a legally enforceable requirement that those resources be used only for the specific purposes listed in the legislation.
- D. “Fund balance” means the arithmetic difference between the assets and liabilities reported in a school district fund.
- E. “Nonspendable” fund balance amounts are comprised of funds that cannot be spent because they are either not in spendable form or are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact. They include items that are inherently unspendable, such as, but not limited to, inventories, prepaid items, long-term receivables, non-financial assets held for resale, or the permanent principal of endowment funds.

- F. “Restricted” fund balance amounts are comprised of funds that have legally enforceable constraints placed on their use that either are externally imposed by resource providers or creditors (such as through debt covenants), grantors, contributors, voters, or laws or regulations of other governments, or are imposed by law through constitutional provisions or enabling legislation.
- G. “Unassigned” fund balance amounts are the residual amounts in the general fund not reported in any other classification. Unassigned amounts in the general fund are technically available for expenditure for any purpose. The general fund is the only fund that can report a positive unassigned fund balance. Other funds would report a negative unassigned fund balance should the total of nonspendable, restricted, and committed fund balances exceed the total net resources of that fund.
- H. “Unrestricted” fund balance is the amount of fund balance left after determining both nonspendable and restricted net resources. This amount can be determined by adding the committed, assigned, and unassigned fund balances.

**IV. CLASSIFICATION OF FUND BALANCES**

The school district shall classify its fund balances in its various funds in one or more of the following five classifications: nonspendable, restricted, committed, assigned, and unassigned.

**V. MINIMUM FUND BALANCE**

The school district will maintain a minimum unassigned general fund balance of 5% to 7% with a goal of 7% or higher.[ \_\_\_\_ percent of the annual budget.]

**VI. ORDER OF RESOURCE USE**

If resources from more than one fund balance classification could be spent, the school district will strive to spend resources from fund balance classifications in the following order (first to last): restricted, committed, assigned, and unassigned.

**VII. COMMITTING FUND BALANCE**

A majority vote of the school board is required to commit a fund balance to a specific purpose and subsequently to remove or change any constraint so adopted by the board.

**VIII. ASSIGNING FUND BALANCE**

The board delegates the power to assign fund balances to the superintendent or executive director of finance and operations. Assignments so made shall be reported to the school board on a regular

basis, either separately or as part of ongoing reporting by the assigning party if other than the school board.

An appropriation of an existing fund balance to eliminate a projected budgetary deficit in the subsequent year's budget in an amount no greater than the projected excess of expected expenditures over expected revenues satisfies the criteria to be classified as an assignment of fund balance.

**IX. REVIEW**

The school board will conduct an annual review of the sufficiency of the minimum unassigned general fund balance level.

**734 SCHOOL MEALS POLICY**

**I. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that students receive healthy and nutritious meals through the school district's nutrition program and that school district employees, families, and students have a shared understanding of expectations regarding meal charges. The policy seeks to allow students to receive the nutrition they need to stay focused during the school day and minimize identification of students with insufficient funds to pay for a la carte items or second entrees and meals as well as to maintain the financial integrity of the school nutrition program.

**II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

The Superintendent or designee is directed to formulate regulations to address the following:

1. Negative student meal accounts
2. Collection of delinquent debt
3. Treatment of debts considered to be uncollectible

**III. COMMUNICATION OF POLICY**

- A. This policy and any pertinent supporting information shall be provided in writing (i.e., mail, email, back-to-school packet, student handbook, etc.) to:
  1. all households at or before the start of each school year;
  2. students and families who transfer into the school district, at the time of enrollment;  
and
  3. all school district personnel who are responsible for enforcing this policy.
- B. The school district may post the policy on the school district's website, in addition to providing the required written notification described above.

## SCHOOL MEALS POLICY REGULATIONS

### I. PROCEDURES

The following regulations relate to student meal accounts, communication of negative account balances to families, the collection of delinquent debt, and treatment of debts considered to be uncollectible.

#### A. Payment of Meals:

1. All a la carte items for second entrees or meal purchases are to be prepaid before meal service begins. Payments can be made through the electronic payment system or at the school building. A student who does not have sufficient funds will not be allowed to charge a la carte items or a second meal or entree until additional money is deposited in the student's account. Each school that participates in the free school meals program must:
  - participate in the United States Department of Agriculture School Breakfast Program and the United States Department of Agriculture National School Lunch Program; and
  - provide to all students at no cost up to two federally reimbursable meals per school day, with a maximum of one free breakfast and one free lunch
2. Once a reimbursable meal has been placed on a student's tray or otherwise served to a student, the meal may not be subsequently withdrawn from the student by the cashier or other school official, whether or not the student has an outstanding meal balance. Second lunches and/or entrees will be removed if the student has an outstanding meal balance.

#### B. Low or Negative Account Balances- Notification

1. The school district will make reasonable efforts to notify families when meal account balances are low or fall below zero.
2. Reminders for payments of outstanding student meal balances will not demean or stigmatize any student participating in the school lunch program, including, but not limited to, dumping reimbursable meals, withdrawing a reimbursable meal that has been served, announcing or listing students' names publicly, providing alternative meals not specifically related to dietary needs; providing non-reimbursable meals; or affixing stickers, stamps, or pins.

#### C. Collection of Delinquent Debts

The families of students who have negative meal account balances, who are not eligible for free or reduced-price meals will be asked to make payments eliminating the negative balance of their account. Families who request payment plans will be accommodated at the discretion of the nutrition services program director. Payments can be made by cash or check at the student's school or electronically through the student's online meal account.

#### D. Treatment of Debts Deemed Uncollectible

Student meal account balances that have been negative by 90 days or more as of June 30 of a given year will be considered uncollectible and written-off as bad debt. The review and classification of negative student meal accounts as bad debt will be conducted by the business office and nutrition services program director. Bad debts will be recorded as an operating loss in the General Fund as well as a transfer of cash from the General Fund to the Food Service Fund. Any amounts written-off as operating losses in the General Fund that are subsequently recovered will be recorded as revenue in the General Fund.

#### E. Recordkeeping of Debts Deemed Uncollectible

Records of negative student account balances that are deemed uncollectible and classified as bad debt shall be maintained in accordance with 7 C.F.R. § 210.9(b)(17), 7 C.F.R. § 210.15(b), and the District record retention policy. The following records will be maintained to document the appropriate treatment of bad debts:

1. evidence of efforts to collect unpaid meal charges in accordance the District's adopted unpaid meal charge policy;
2. evidence that collection efforts fell within the timeframe and methods established by the District's adopted meal charge policy;
3. evidence that debts considered uncollectible were written off as operating losses in the General Fund of the District and;
4. evidence that debts written off as operating losses were returned to the Food Service Fund using non-Federal sources.

#### F. Collection and Uses of Donations

Donations that are made to the District for the purposes of relieving negative student meal accounts will be accepted with appreciation by the School Board at a Regular Meeting and deposited into the General Fund of the District. Donations will not be applied to the accounts of specific students or schools unless specified by the donor. Donations will generally be applied to negative student meal accounts on a first in, first out basis and in the following order: negative accounts belonging to students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, negative accounts of students who are not eligible for free or reduced-price meals but demonstrate economic need, negative accounts deemed uncollectible.

The nutrition services program director and their designee will be responsible for applying donations to negative balances and clearing negative balances within the District's school nutrition financial system. The business office will record a transfer of cash from the General Fund to the Food Service Fund to account for the use of donations in the District's financial

## 714 ACCOUNTING FOR FINANCIAL REPORTS AND STATEMENTS

### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to adopt the Uniform Financial Accounting and Reporting Standards for Minnesota School Districts provided for in guidelines adopted by the Minnesota Department of Education.

### II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

It is the policy of this school district to comply with the Uniform Financial Accounting and Reporting Standards for Minnesota School Districts.

### III. MAINTENANCE OF BOOKS AND ACCOUNTS

The school district shall maintain its books and records and do its accounting in compliance with the Uniform Accounting and Reporting Standards for Minnesota School Districts (UFARS) provided for in the guidelines adopted by the Minnesota Department of Education and in compliance with applicable state laws and rules relating to reporting of revenues and expenditures.

### IV. PERMANENT FUND TRANSFERS

Unless otherwise authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 123B.80, as amended, or any other law, fund transfers shall be made in compliance with UFARS and permanent fund transfers shall only be made in compliance with Minn. Stat. § 123B.79, as amended, or other applicable statute.

### V. REPORTING

The school board shall receive a monthly financial statement which reflects District receipts, disbursements, and balances. The report shall be provided to the school board at the first regular meeting of the month.

The school board shall provide for an annual audit of the books and records of the school district to assure compliance of its records with UFARS. Each year, the school district shall also provide for the publication of the financial information specified in Minn. Stat. § 123B.10 in the manner specified therein.

**718 CASH AND CHECKS IN SCHOOL BUILDINGS**

**I. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for cash and checks in school buildings.

**II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

Money collected for any purpose will be submitted to the school principal or a designee, who will provide for its proper deposit.

All monies collected must be deposited on a timely basis. Deposits should be made using the district courier. Locked or sealed bags must be utilized with a completed deposit ticket accompanying each deposit.

Checks and cash should be locked in a secure place at all times. Credit card numbers will not be stored but immediately destroyed.

Monetary gifts should be deposited with the information for inclusion in the board packet and formal recognition by the Board transferred to the district office.

The superintendent, or designee, is directed to develop regulations for safekeeping and deposit of cash and checks.

**722 DEFERRED COMPENSATION PLANS**

**I. PURPOSE**

Minnesota law allows the District to contribute to the Minnesota Deferred Compensation Plan or a tax sheltered annuity under the IRS Code if provided for in a personnel policy or collective bargaining agreement.

**II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

Federal tax law also allows employees to elect to defer taxation on certain amounts of compensation. The District will direct such contributions or elective deferrals to companies that are able to demonstrate their ability to comply with federal and state legal requirements if 15 or more individuals enroll with the company.

#### Administrative Recommended Changes to Middle School Boundaries

Background:

- Two elementary schools (Sunset Hill and Plymouth Creek) align to East Middle School
- Two elementary schools (Greenwood and Gleason Lake) align to West Middle School
- Five elementary schools (North Woods, Kimberly Lane, Meadow Ridge, Birchview, and Oakwood) align to Central Middle School.

This has resulted in the Central Middle School student population becoming over two times larger than either East Middle School or West Middle School. As of August 4, 2023, the school populations are as follows:

	Current Enrollment	Capacity
Central MS	1539	1635
East MS	649	873
West MS	709	829

To provide better balance in the enrollment at Wayzata Middle Schools, administration recommends the following realignment of feeder schools from Central Middle School to East and West Middle School as noted below:

#### Kimberly Lane Elementary School to East Middle School – Starting fall of 2024

East Middle School (EMS) has a capacity of 873 and enrollment of 649 students (as of 8-4-23) with approximately 240 seats available. By moving 5<sup>th</sup> grade from Kimberly Lane (KL) the capacity of EMS should be adequate until about the 2026-27 school year. There are approximately 90 KL 5th graders.

**Oakwood Elementary School to West Middle School from Central Middle school beginning the fall of 2024.**

West Middle School (WMS) has a capacity of 829 and enrollment of 709 students (as of 8-4-23) with approximately 120 seats available. With the influx of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade for Oakwood (OW) the capacity of WMS should have capacity until about the 2026-2027 school year. Historically, portions of Oakwood have attended West Middle School. There are approximately 70 OW 5th graders.

Several options were considered such as moving portions but not all of Kimberly Lane and Oakwood attendance areas. This resulted in isolating some students from a peer group. Other elementary schools were also studied but proved to have issues with capacity or transportation.

**Recommended Action:** Approve the realignment for Kimberly Lane from CMS to EMS and realign Oakwood from CMS to WMS beginning the 24-25 school year. Additionally, allow younger siblings to follow their older siblings to middle school and provide transportation only if they would attend at the same time.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF PROPOSED DEBT

## Proposed Issue:

\$3,105,000 General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2023A

District voters authorized the issuance of up to \$70,000,000 in bonds in a bond referendum election held on November 7, 2017. In February 2018, the District issued General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2018A totaling \$66,895,000, leaving a remaining unused authority of \$3,105,000.

## Purposes:

The proposed bond issue will finance the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, including the acquisition of a District administration building, as authorized by the passage of the November 7, 2017 special bond election.

## Authority:

The Bonds are being issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 and the successful election noted above. The Bonds will be general obligations of the District for which its full faith, credit and taxing powers are pledged. Payments will be financed from the District's annual debt service tax levy.

## Term/Call Feature:

The Bonds are being issued for a term of 3 years, 4 months. Principal on the Bonds will be due on February 1 in the years 2025 through 2027. Interest is payable every six months beginning August 1, 2024.

The Bonds are being offered without option of prior redemption.

## Bank Qualification:

Because the District is expecting to issue no more than \$10,000,000 in tax exempt debt during the calendar year, the District will be able to designate the Bonds as "bank qualified" obligations. Bank qualified status broadens the market for the Bonds, which can result in lower interest rates.

### **State Credit Enhancement:**

By resolution the District will covenant and obligate itself to be bound by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, which provides for payment by the State of Minnesota in the event of a potential default of a school district obligation.

To qualify for the credit enhancement, the District must submit an application to the State. Ehlers will coordinate the application process to the State on your behalf.

### **Rating:**

Under current bond ratings, the state credit enhancement would bring a Moody's "Aa1" rating. The District's most recent bond issues were rated by Moody's Investors Service. The current rating on those bonds is "Aaa" (underlying rating) and "Aa1" (credit enhanced rating). The District will request a new rating for this issue.

### **Basis for Recommendation:**

Based on your objectives, financial situation and need, risk tolerance, liquidity needs, experience with the issuance of Bonds and long-term financial capacity, as well as the tax status considerations related to the Bonds and the structure, timing and other similar matters related to the Bonds, we are recommending the issuance of Bonds as a suitable option. Ehlers has reviewed other reasonably feasible alternatives to the recommended issuance of municipal securities to finance the proposed projects.

### **Method of Sale/Placement:**

We will solicit competitive bids for the purchase of the Bonds from underwriters and banks.

We will include an allowance for discount bidding in the terms of the issue. The discount is treated as an interest item and provides the underwriter with all or a portion of their compensation in the transaction.

If the Bonds are purchased at a price greater than the minimum bid amount (maximum discount), the unused allowance may be used to reduce your borrowing amount or increase the net proceeds for the project.

### **Premium Pricing:**

In some cases, investors in municipal bonds prefer "premium" pricing structures. A premium is achieved when the coupon for any maturity (the interest rate paid by the issuer) exceeds the yield to the investor, resulting in a price paid that is greater than the face value of the bonds. The sum of the amounts paid in excess of face value is considered "reoffering premium." The underwriter of the bonds will retain a portion of this reoffering premium as their compensation (or "discount") but will pay the remainder of the premium to the District. Any net premium received may be used to reduce the principal amount of the Bonds, increase the net proceeds for the project, or to fund a portion of the interest on the Bonds.

## **Review of Existing Debt:**

We have reviewed all outstanding indebtedness for the District and find that there are no refunding opportunities at this time. We will continue to monitor the market and the call dates for the District's outstanding debt and will alert you to any future refunding opportunities.

## **Continuing Disclosure:**

The District will be agreeing to provide certain updated Annual Financial Information and its Audited Financial Statement annually, as well as providing notices of the occurrence of certain reportable events to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB"), as required by rules of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The District is already obligated to provide such reports for its existing bonds, and has contracted with Ehlers to prepare and file the reports.

## **Arbitrage Monitoring:**

The District must ensure compliance with certain sections of the Internal Revenue Code and Treasury Regulations ("Arbitrage Rules") throughout the life of the issue to maintain the tax-exempt status of the Bonds. These Arbitrage Rules apply to amounts held in construction, escrow, reserve, debt service account(s), etc., along with related investment income on each fund/account.

IRS audits will verify compliance with rebate, yield restriction and records retention requirements within the Arbitrage Rules. The District's specific arbitrage responsibilities will be detailed in the Signature, No-Litigation, Arbitrage Certificate and Purchase Price Receipt (the "Tax Compliance Document") prepared by your Bond Attorney and provided at closing.

The Bonds may qualify for one or more exception(s) to the Arbitrage Rules by meeting 1) small issuer exception, 2) spend down requirements, 3) bona fide debt service fund limits, 4) reasonable reserve requirements, 5) expenditure within an available period limitations, 6) investments yield restrictions, 7) de minimis rules, or; 8) borrower limited requirements.

An Ehlers arbitrage expert will contact the District within 30 days after the sale date to review the District's specific responsibilities for the Bonds. The District is currently receiving arbitrage services from Ehlers in relation to the Bonds.

## **Investment of Bond Proceeds:**

Proceeds of the Bonds will be available for investment from the closing date (October 5, 2023) until project costs are paid. We recommend using an SEC registered investment advisor. Ehlers can assist in developing a strategy to invest Bond proceeds until they are needed to pay project costs.

## Other Service Providers:

This debt issuance will require the engagement of other public finance service providers. This section identifies those other service providers, so Ehlers can coordinate their engagement on your behalf. Where you have previously used a particular firm to provide a service, we have assumed that you will continue that relationship. For services you have not previously required, we have identified a service provider. Fees charged by these service providers will be paid from proceeds of the obligation, unless you notify us that you wish to pay them from other sources. Our pre-sale bond sizing includes a good faith estimate of these fees, but the final fees may vary. If you have any questions pertaining to the identified service providers or their role, or if you would like to use a different service provider for any of the listed services please contact us.

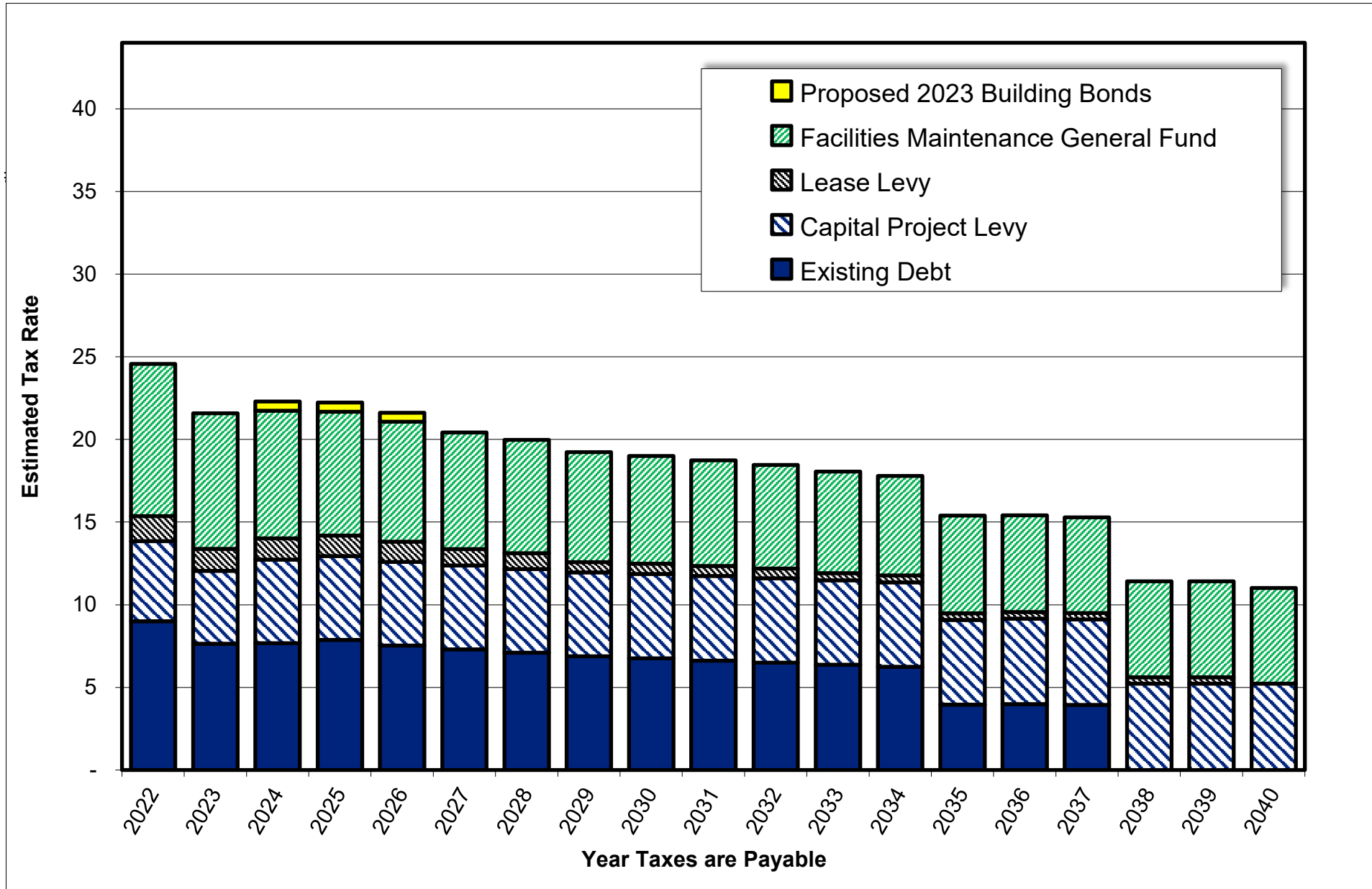

RESOLUTION RELATING TO \$3,105,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS, SERIES 2023A; AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE, PROVIDING FOR SALE, AND COVENANTING AND OBLIGATING THE DISTRICT TO BE BOUND BY AND USE THE STATE CREDIT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM, AND ESTABLISHING COMPLIANCE WITH REIMBURSEMENT BOND REGULATIONS UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board (the Board) of Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), Minnesota (the District), as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION AND ELECTION. This Board hereby determines it is in the best interests of the District to authorize the issuance and sale of its General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2023A in the approximate principal amount of \$3,105,000 (the Bonds), the proceeds to be used to finance the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities, as approved by the electors at a special election held on November 7, 2017 (collectively, the Project), pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475.

SECTION 2. SALE. The District has retained Ehlers & Associates, Inc., in Roseville, Minnesota (Ehlers), as its independent municipal advisor in connection with the sale of the Bonds. Ehlers is authorized to solicit proposals for the purchase of the Bonds in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.60, subdivision 2, paragraph (9). The Board shall meet at the time and place specified in the Official Statement for the Bonds to receive and consider such proposals for the purchase of the Bonds.

SECTION 3. OFFICIAL STATEMENT; PROPOSALS. Ehlers is authorized to prepare and distribute an Official Statement for the Bonds and to open, read, and tabulate the proposals for presentation to the Board.

SECTION 4. STATE CREDIT ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM. (a) The District hereby covenants and obligates itself to notify the Commissioner of the Department of Education of the State of Minnesota (the Commissioner of Education) of a potential default in the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds and to use the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55 to guarantee payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds when due. The District further covenants to deposit with the Registrar or any successor paying agent three (3) days prior to the date on which a payment is due an amount sufficient to make that payment or to notify the Commissioner of Education that it will be unable to make all or a portion of that payment. The Registrar for the Bonds is authorized and directed to notify the Commissioner of Education if it becomes aware of a potential default in the payment of principal or interest on the Bonds or if, on the day two (2) business days prior to the date a payment is due on the Bonds, there are insufficient funds to make that payment on deposit with the Registrar. The District understands that as a result of its covenant to be bound by the provision of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, the provisions of that section shall be binding as long as any Bonds of this issue remain outstanding.

(b) The District further covenants to comply with all procedures now and hereafter established by the Departments of Management and Budget and Education of the State of Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, subdivision 2(c) and otherwise to take such actions as necessary to comply with that section. The chair, clerk, superintendent or business manager is authorized to execute any applicable Minnesota Department of Education forms.

SECTION 5. REIMBURSEMENT. (a) (i) The Internal Revenue Service has issued Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the Regulations) dealing with the issuance of tax-exempt obligations all or a portion of the proceeds of which are to be used to reimburse the District for Project expenditures made by the District prior to the date of issuance (the Reimbursement Obligations).

(ii) The Regulations generally require that the District make a declaration of its official intent to reimburse itself for such prior expenditures out of the proceeds of a subsequently issued series of tax-exempt obligations within 60 days after payment of the expenditures, that such obligations be issued and the reimbursement allocation be made from the proceeds of such obligations within the reimbursement period (as defined in the Regulations), and that the expenditures reimbursed be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the obligations.

(iii) The District desires to comply with requirements of the Regulations with respect to the Project.

(b) (i) The District proposes to undertake Project and to make original expenditures with respect thereto prior to the issuance of Reimbursement Obligations, and reasonably expects to issue Reimbursement Obligations for such project in the maximum principal amounts shown below:

Acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities.	\$3,105,000

(ii) Other than (i) de minimis amounts permitted to be reimbursed pursuant to Section 1.150-2(f)(1) of the Regulations or (ii) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, the District will not seek reimbursement for any original expenditures with respect to the foregoing Project paid more than 60 days prior to the date of adoption of this resolution. All original expenditures for which reimbursement is sought will be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the Reimbursement Obligations.

(c) As of the date hereof, there are no District funds reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside (or reasonably expected to be reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside) to provide permanent financing for the original expenditures related to the Project other than pursuant to the issuance of the Reimbursement Obligations.

Consequently, it is not expected that the issuance of the Reimbursement Obligations will result in the creation of any replacement proceeds.

(d) The District's business manager shall be responsible for making the "reimbursement allocations" described in the Regulations, being generally the transfer of the appropriate amount of proceeds of the Reimbursement Obligations to reimburse the source of temporary financing used by the District to make payment of the original expenditures relating to the Project. Each reimbursement allocation shall be made not later than (i) eighteen (18) months after the date of the original expenditure or (ii) eighteen (18) months after the date the Project is placed in service or abandoned (but in no event later than three (3) years after the original expenditure is paid) and shall be evidenced by an entry on the official books and records of the District maintained for the Reimbursement Obligations and shall specifically identify the original expenditures being reimbursed.
