Summary/Background Information:

The top priority of Garland ISD and the State of Texas is keeping students and staff safe every day. The Texas School Safety Center recently conducted an Intruder Detection Audit at one or more of our campuses. The audits test whether a campus is accessible to an unauthorized individual. This audit seeks to help districts identify how campuses can improve safety for students, such as ensuring exterior doors are locked. The audit provides us with an opportunity to create a safer learning environment for our students and staff.

We are working closely with our district's School Safety & Security Committee to ensure that we are training all our staff and securing our doors for the protection of everyone at our campuses. The support from the state in conducting the Intruder Detection Audits is just one of the many actions we are taking to ensure our schools are safe. We know that this work does not end, and we appreciate the Board's support.

We acknowledge that parents and community members are likely very interested in the details of the audit results; however, it is in the best interest of the students that we do not share this information to the broader public as it could lead to compromising important campus security information. Specific details of the Intruder Detection Audit will be discussed in the executive session and with the Safety and Security Committee. Garland ISD is committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment for our students and staff.

As a reminder, myON is a student-centered, personalized digital library that gives students access to more than 7,000 enhanced digital books in the core collection. Titles are dynamically matched to each individual student's interests, grade and reading level. Combined with a suite of close reading tools and embedded supports, myON fosters student engagement and achievement.

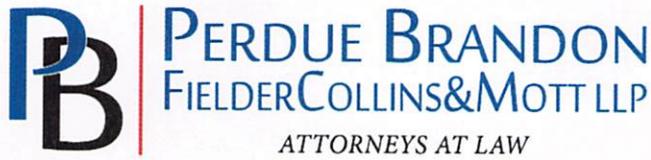

Line Item 2B Disinfectant -The Quat 256 is the effective disinfectant GISD Custodial Department currently uses, switching this chemical will result in:

- There are approximately 1,500 dispensers that will need to be changed to accommodate a new system and will take approximately 60 - 90 hours to replace the dispensers in each custodial closet.
- Time for training all custodians on the new product and Safety Data Sheets.

Line Item 2C All Purpose Cleaner - GISD Custodial Department currently uses the Blue All Purpose, switching this chemical will result in:

- There are approximately 1,500 dispensers that will need to be changed to accommodate a new system and will take approximately 60 - 90 hours to replace the dispensers in each custodial closet.
- Time for training all custodians on the new product and Safety Data Sheets.

Line Item 5 28" Orbital Ride on Floor Machine w/AH Wet Batteries - The Pacific Machine meets GISD specification requirements.

Here are the key points as to why the Pacific machine was selected vs Minute Man's machine:

- Solution capacity for Pacific is 30 gallons vs. 21 for Minute Man.
- It has 12 settings that will allow for more pressure and a better clean. Minute Man has one setting.
- The Pacific Machine has a 5-year coverage and the Minute Man has 3 years.
- The RPM for Pacific is 2,200, and Minute Man is 2,000
- Run time is 5 hours for the Pacific and 3-3.5 hours for Minute Man. The average time for custodians to use the machine is 5 hours. The Minute Man will result in the custodian using 1.5 hours of the custodian needing to mop any area that was not done due to the machines' run time. This will be in the range of \$12 - \$18 for 1.5 hours of labor for 5 days x 30 custodians who would be relying on the machine to do floor care.
- The Pacific Machine uses 360AH (amp hour) wet batteries, Minute Man uses 12-volt 210 AH batteries. life. (The higher the amp hour the better the battery)
- The Pacific Machine has Isolators (reduces vibration and noise) has a 5-year warranty, Minute Man does not have a warranty.
- Pacific batteries last 3 years and if they do not, will be replace free of charge. Minute Man batteries have 0-3 months free replacement, 4-12 if batteries need replacing cost will be pro-rated. Cost for Minute Man batteries range from \$500 and up. If batteries need replacement after 3 months, the cost would be $\$1000 \times 50 = \$50,000$ and this cost could be 2 to 3 times a year.
- Pacific machine has a High Efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filter which is extremely needed for air quality. HEPA filters remove more that 99.9% of the particles from the air which is a great help with people who are asthmatic, have allergies and/or respiratory problems. Minute Man machine does not have a HEPA filter.

- During testing, the Pacific machine performed well and did not break down.
- During testing, the Minute Man machine broke down.
