SHARED SERVICES/INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT TO IMPLEMENT
STUDENTS WITH AUTISM GRANT PROGRAM

The Mesquite Independent School District ("Mesquite ISD" or "MISD") acting as Fiscal Agent/ Member District and Member District Garland Independent School District ("GISD") (collectively the "Member Districts"), hereby agree to this Shared Services (Interlocal) Agreement ("SSA" or "Agreement") as follows:

1. PURPOSE:

- 1.1 The purpose of this SSA is to create a cooperative arrangement through which each Member District can administer and implement the 2023-2024 Services to Students with Autism Grant Program award (Exhibit A).
- 1.2 The Member Districts do not intend by entering into the SSA, or otherwise, to create a separate or additional legal entity.

2. FISCAL AGENT:

- 2.1 The Mesquite Independent School District shall serve as the fiscal agent for this SSA. As Fiscal Agent, MISD is responsible for:
 - A. Coordinating distribution of funds awarded under the grant;
 - B. Ensuring that funds awarded to Member Districts MISD and GISD under the 2023-2024 Services to Students with Autism Grant Program are used in accordance with the grant award and the Texas Education Agency (TEA) Financial Accountability System Resource Guide;
 - C. Maintaining financial accounting records as required by the grant;
 - D. Preparing any necessary amendments to the grant budget with assistance from Member Districts;
 - E. Preparing and submitting on behalf of the Member Districts any reports required by federal or state law related to the entire grant; and
 - F. Maintaining records as required by state and federal guidelines.
- 2.2 The Fiscal Agent shall maintain fiscal records as required by district policy, state and federal laws.

3. TERM:

This SSA shall be effective from the date of the grant award and shall continue through August 31, 2024, or in the event that TEA extends the grant expenditure timelines, then

thus agreement will automatically be extended until expenditure of all grant sums, but not be extended past August 31, 2024.

4. ORGANIZATION:

- 4.1 MISD Executive Director of Special Education, and the MISD Executive Director of Grants, and the Superintendent or Designee of the Member Districts are the authorities enacting the fiscal and programmatic components of this SSA.
- 4.2 For purpose of this SSA, both MISD and the GISD Member Districts may act as Purchasing Entities for purchases made with their fiscal allocations.
- 4.3 Each Member District will maintain appropriate staff to provide fiscal support or technical assistance to the its own Member District.
- 4.4 Member Districts agree to cooperate with the Fiscal Agent by providing information or records as reasonably requested by the Fiscal Agent.
- 4.5 Member Districts must remain in the SSA for the entire period of the grant award.

5. PROVISIONS, ASSURANCES, AND CERTIFICATIONS:

Each Member District is responsible for operating in accordance with the Provisions, Assurances, and Certifications stated in the Texas Education Agency Standard Application System (SAS) grant application 2020 — 2021 Services to Students with Autism (Exhibit A).

6. BASIS FOR FISCAL AGENT AND MEMBER DISTRICT ALLOCATIONS WITHIN THE SSA:

Each Member District shall be allocated the funding amount set forth in the Grant Application and as more particularly described in the grant budget for the Member District as identified in the "Member District Allocation" (Exhibit B).

7. OWNERSHIP OF ASSETS AND NOTICE OF GRANT AWARD STATUS:

- 7.1 All assets, both liquid and fixed (if any), will be owned by the purchasing Member District.
- 7.2 Purchases made by a Member District with its Member District Allocation as detailed within this SSA will be owned by the purchasing Member District.

8. LIABILITIES:

- 8.1 Should liabilities be incurred due to complaints, grievances, litigation, or required refund due to monitoring or audits, each Member District bears its own risk of loss attributable to its own actions and will be responsible for all costs associated with any damage to or loss of personal or real property, administrative costs, litigation expenses, awards of actual damages, court costs, attorney's fees, settlement costs attributable to its actions, and/or any other costs.
- 8.2 Uncontrolled costs due to actions taken against the SSA will be assessed on a prorated basis between the Member Districts on the same basis as the Member District grant allocations that funded the SSA at its commencement. Mesquite ISD as the Fiscal Agent will have the sole discretion to determine if an uncontrolled cost is due to an action taken against the SSA.
- 8.3 Each Member District shall be responsible for any and all legal fees incurred due to complaints, grievances, or litigation arising from or related to an employee with whom the Member District has an employment contract or with whom the Member District has an employment relationship. Member Districts will assume no liability for actions of other Member District's employees, or service providers hired to provide services under this SSA.
- 8.4 The legal responsibilities stated herein shall survive the expiration of this contract should litigation arise from events that occurred during the term of the contract.
- 8.5 The Member Districts and the Fiscal Agent agree to negotiate in good faith in an effort to resolve any disputes that may arise among or between some or all of the parties to this Agreement. If the dispute cannot be resolved by negotiations, the dispute shall be submitted to mediation before resort to litigation. If the need for mediation arises a mutually acceptable mediator shall be chosen by the parties to the dispute who shall share the cost of mediation services based upon an equal split among the Member Districts. Mediation is a voluntary dispute resolution process in which the parties to the dispute meet with an impartial

person called a mediator, who will help resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators facilitate the resolution of dispute but cannot impose binding decisions. The parties to the dispute must agree before any settlement is binding.

9. USE OF FUNDS:

- 9.1 MISD, as Fiscal Agent, will pay flow through funds to Member Districts for properly documented expenditures that are authorized by the Grant.
- 9.2 Member Districts must not exceed the amounts authorized by Class/Object Code as described in the TEA SAS without prior written approval of MISD as Fiscal Agent. Member District budget changes must be approved by MISD prior to expenditures of funds in the changed budget categories.
- 9.3 The Member District must account for its Member District Allocation in its official accounting records. The Member District must budget, expend, and report funds according to the TEA Financial Accountability System Resource Guide.
- 9.4 All expenditures must occur after the full execution of this agreement by Member District representatives, and prior to the grant end date of May 31, 2024, unless the grant timeline is extended by TEA. All travel must occur by the ending date of the grant. All materials and equipment must be delivered before the ending date of the grant and must be ordered and delivered in time to substantially benefit the current grant period in no case after the ending date of the grant. No expenditures will be reimbursed to Member Districts until the funds are released by TEA and received by the Fiscal Agent. In the event that TEA fails to fund the grant, each Member District will be responsible for its own expenditures to the extent any may have occurred.
- 9.5 Member Districts shall expend funds in a time and manner designed to follow the Milestones and Projected Timelines in the Management Plan of the SAS Grant Application.
- 9.6 Expenditures of grant allocations are restricted to the provision of services in accordance with the guidelines under which this agreement is made.

10. PAYMENT:

- 10.1 A Member District must return an executed original or counterpart of this SSA before any properly documented and approved cost expenditures will be reimbursed.
- 10.2 To receive reimbursement payment, the Member District shall on a monthly basis, send dated invoices/receipts to the MISD, specifying the nature of the tasks covered by the invoices/receipts not to exceed in the aggregate the maximum sum of member allocation.
- 10.3 A Member District will be paid in monthly installments during the term of the Agreement, if all invoices/receipts are approved and the maximum sum does not exceed the remaining balance of the member allocation.
- 10.5 If a Member District receives payment for an expenditure that TEA or an auditor disallows, the Member District shall be responsible for refunding the disallowed payment(s).
- 10.6 The MISD shall pay all undisputed requests for reimbursements within (30) days of receipt. The MISD preferred method of payment will be thru Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or E-payables.

11. RECORDS AND REPORTS:

- 11.1 Member Districts must maintain financial records related to the SSA and grant for seven (7) years after the end of the SSA and such records are subject to an audit by MISD and TEA.
- 11.2 Fiscal and Expenditure Reports:
 - A. Each Member District must submit interim and final expenditure reports to MISD. The reports must be prepared from the Member District's official accounting records and must reflect actual expenditures with the term of this SSA. The reports shall include the name and signature of the Member District Superintendent or Designee.
 - B. Each Member District must submit its final expenditure report within 30 calendar days of the end date of this SSA. In no case shall a Member District file its final expenditure report after April 30, 2024.
- 11.3 Program Reports as required by the SAS shall include the name and signature of the Member District Superintendent or Designee.

12. ACCESS TO SERVICES BY MEMBER DISTRICTS:

- 12.1 Each Member District may contract directly with a selected service providers to provide training to its employees, as authorized by this grant.
- 12.2 Member Districts also agree to allow employees from other Member Districts to attend such training at each others District.
- 12.3 A Member District that desires to send its employees to training sessions in another Member District must notify the training district in advance to ensure space will be available.
- 12.4 Each Member District is responsible for documenting its own employees' attendance at training and for seeking/providing any applicable reimbursement for payments to its own employees that attend training.

13. NOTICES:

All Notices given under this SSA, except for emergency requests, shall be made in writing to the address contact stated herein. A Member District may change its address or name of contact by submitting a written notice of change to the other Member Districts at the addresses noted herein.

14. MISCELLANEOUS:

- 14.1 Entire Agreement[Amendments]: This SSA sets out the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes and replaces all previous agreements among the parties related to its subject matter. This Agreement may not be changed, amended, or altered except by written amendment signed by all parties.
- 14.2 Hold Harmless: To the extent allowed by law and without waiver of any immunity or defense, the Member Districts agree to hold each other harmless against claims arising from the alleged negligent acts or omissions of their respective public employees or agents, which occurred or are alleged to have occurred during the performance of this Agreement.
- 14.3 Governing Law and Venue: This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Texas, with venue in Dallas County.
- 14.4 Binding Effect: This agreement shall be binding and inure benefit of the parties hereto and their respective permitted successors.
- 14.5 Severability: In case any provision hereof shall, for any reason, be held invalid or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid or unenforceable provision had not been included herein.
- 14.6 Nondiscrimination: In connection with the execution of this Agreement, the Member Districts shall fully comply with their respective non-discrimination policies when implementing services via the grant.

- 14.7 Immunity: This SSA is expressly made subject to each party's governmental immunity under state and federal law. The parties hereto expressly agree that no provision of this Agreement in any way is intended to constitute a waiver of any immunities or defenses from suit or from liability that any party has by operation of law.
- 14.8 Interpretation/Waiver: This SSA shall be deemed drafted equally by all parties hereto and its language shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning and not in favor of or against any party. The failure of a party to insist on strict adherence to any term of this SSA will not be construed as a waiver or deprive a party of the right thereafter to insist upon strict adherence to the terms of this Agreement.
- 14.9 No Third-Party Beneficiaries: Notwithstanding any provision herein, the parties to this SSA do not intend to confer any rights to this agreement to any non-party.
- 14.10 Counterparts: This SSA may be executed in several counterparts each of which shall be deemed an original but off of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This SSA may be transmitted by facsimile or by electronic scanning and electronic mail, and the parties intend that their faxed or scanned signatures shall constitute original signatures. A facsimile copy of any counterpart or conformed copy of the agreement with the signatures, original, faxed, or scanned of all of the Member districts shall be binding the parties.
- 14.11 Compliance with Applicable Laws and District Policies: Each member District will comply with any and all state, federal and local laws, and District policies when seeking and implementing the services under this agreement.
- 14.12 Texas Public Information Act (TPIA): Member Districts acknowledge that both MISD and GSD are subject to the Texas Public Information Act (TPIA). As such, upon receipt of a request under the TPIA, Member Districts are required to comply with the requirements of the TPIA with regard to PIA requests made to the respective District. For purposes of the TPA, "public information" is defined as information that is written, produced, collected, assembled, or maintained under a law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business:
1. by Member Districts; [or]
 2. for Member Districts and Member Districts
 - a. own the information; [or]
 - b. has a right of access to the information; or

- c. spends or contributes public money for the purpose of writing, producing, collecting, assembling, or maintaining the information; or
- 3. by an individual officer or employee of Member Districts in the officer's or employee*s official capacity and the information pertains to official business of the Member Districts.

Member Districts will each be responsible to respond to its own respective PIA requests. To the extent required by law, Member Districts will fully cooperate in responding to public information requests.

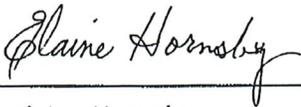

Executive Summary:

The purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding is to continue the cooperative arrangement whereby member districts may provide for efficient delivery of legally required special education and related services to eligible students who need additional emotional and behavioral support. The Region 10 Educational Service Center has partnered with Specialized Education Services, Inc. to provide a therapeutic learning environment for students. This environment includes a social worker, behavior specialist, and program director, as well as classroom teachers and assistants. The continuing partnership expands the district's special education continuum of services. This program is limited to students who require more services than are available in the Functional Behavior Classroom and who may otherwise be referred to a residential placement. Referral decisions are subject to the Admissions, Review, and Dismissal (ARD) committee recommendations. There are currently 2 students served through this agreement.

Memorandum of Understanding:

Region 10 ESC Student Placement & Servicing—Sierra School at Plano ISD.

This Memorandum of Understanding is by and between Region 10 Education Service Center and Garland ISD, outlining the mutual responsibilities and agreements surrounding the placement and servicing of Students within the Special Education Program operated by Sierra School at Plano Independent School District, in Plano, Texas.

For SY 2024-2025, the Program consists of Classrooms co-located at 1300 19th Street, Plano, TX, serving Students in Grades ACI (6-9) and (9-12), who have qualified for Special Education and/or Related-Services through IDEA. Students are placed through the District's ARDC, as a result of meeting the established criteria for placement in a more restrictive setting, for 100% of the School Day. Students will have dedicated access to Specialized Instruction, Positive Behavioral Supports and Interventions, Student Counseling and Mental Health Services, and Intensive Case Management. Upon placement, the Student's IEP shall be updated to reflect the scope and intensity of service delivery in a more restrictive setting, in addition to defining clear criteria for consideration of reintegration into a District's Least Restrictive Environment.

The Program's Executive Director and/or Designee shall review all placement considerations in collaboration with the Placing District Team. Considerations of available data, availability of seats in the Program, and ARDC recommendations shall be reviewed, along with any other relevant data or information. The potential for a more restrictive placement option shall be discussed with Parents/Guardians prior to Sierra School's involvement. Districts placing Students in Sierra School at Plano ISD's Program should refer to the *Program Manual* for more detail.

Upon placement with Region 10's Program, Sierra School at Plano ISD is responsible for the scope of programming and services, as outlined in their Contract with Region 10 ESC. This includes, but might not be limited to, the following:

- Providing an ACI Specialized Programs for Students in Grades 6th - 9th and 9th - 12th.
- The Program's Staffing shall include one (1) Special Education Teacher per Classroom, in addition to the support of up to two (2) Para-Educators for specialized instructional support and the provision of social, emotional, and behavioral support as indicated within each Student's IEP or the *Program Manual*.
- Specialized Instructional Services for up to one hundred and eighty (180) school days, at the State's established minimum requirement of instructional hours on a daily or annual basis; the School Calendar and

Program Hours shall be mutually defined and aligned with the Host School System's, whenever possible.

- Access to Student Counseling and Mental Health Services, as required within each Student's IEP and as needed resulting from a Student's Behavioral or Mental Health Crisis.
- The Program shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations in relation to the education of students, as well as all Policies and Procedures of the ESC's Board of Education. Specialized Education Services, Inc, SESI TX, will ensure that the special education programming and administrative services provided meet the requirements of all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations, including, but not limited to the Texas Education Code ("TEC"), Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Texas Constitution, Texas Statutes, IDEA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act ("Section 504"), and that it has policies and procedures in place related to following these laws.

Executive Summary:

The purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding is to continue the cooperative arrangement whereby member districts may provide for efficient delivery of legally required special education and related services to eligible students who need additional emotional and behavioral support. The Region 10 Educational Service Center has partnered with Specialized Education Services, Inc. to provide a therapeutic learning environment for students. This environment includes a social worker, behavior specialist, and program director, as well as classroom teachers and assistants. The continuing partnership expands the district's special education continuum of services. This program is limited to students who require more services than are available in the Functional Behavior Classroom and who may otherwise be referred to a residential placement. Referral decisions are subject to the Admissions, Review, and Dismissal (ARD) committee recommendations. There is currently 1 student served through this agreement.

Memorandum of Understanding:

Region 10 ESC Student Placement & Servicing—Sierra School at Wylie ISD

This Memorandum of Understanding is by and between Region 10 Education Service Center and Garland ISD, outlining the mutual responsibilities and agreements surrounding the placement and servicing of Students within the Special Education Program operated by Sierra School at Wylie Independent School District, in Wylie, Texas.

For SY 2024-2025, the Program consists of a single Academic Model co-located at Achieve Academy, 400 Pirate Drive, Wylie, TX, 75098 serving Students in Grades 4-8 who have qualified for Special Education and/or Related-Services through IDEA. Students are placed through the District's ARDC, as a result of meeting the established criteria for placement in a more restrictive setting, for 100% of the School Day. Students will have dedicated access to Specialized Instruction, Positive Behavioral Supports and Interventions, Student Counseling and Mental Health Services, and Intensive Case Management. Upon placement, the Student's IEP shall be updated to reflect the scope and intensity of service delivery in a more restrictive setting, in addition to defining clear criteria for consideration of reintegration into a District's Least Restrictive Environment.

The Program's Executive Director and/or Designee shall review all placement considerations in collaboration with the Placing District Team. Considerations of available data, availability of seats in the Program, and ARDC recommendations shall be reviewed, along with any other relevant data or information. The potential for a more restrictive placement option shall be discussed with Parents/Guardians prior to Sierra School's involvement. Districts placing Students in Sierra School at Wylie's Program should refer to the *Program Manual* for more detail.

Upon placement with Region 10's Program, Sierra School at Wylie ISD is responsible for the scope of programming and services, as outlined in their Contract with Region 10 ESC. This includes, but might not be limited to, the following:

- Providing a Specialized Program for Students in Grades 4th-8th.
- The Program's Staffing shall include one (1) Special Education Teacher per Classroom, in addition to the support of up to two (2) Para-Educators for specialized instructional support and the provision of social, emotional, and behavioral support as indicated within each Student's IEP or the *Program Manual*.
- Specialized Instructional Services for up to one hundred and eighty (180) school days, at the State's established minimum requirement of instructional hours on a daily or annual basis; the School Calendar and

Program Hours shall be mutually defined and aligned with the Host School System's, whenever possible.

- Access to Student Counseling and Mental Health Services, as required within each Student's IEP and as needed resulting from a Student's Behavioral or Mental Health Crisis.
- The Program shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations in relation to the education of students, as well as all Policies and Procedures of the ESC's Board of Education. Specialized Education Services, Inc, SESI TX, will ensure that the special education programming and administrative services provided meet the requirements of all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations, including, but not limited to the Texas Education Code ("TEC"), Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Texas Constitution, Texas Statutes, IDEA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act ("Section 504"), and that it has policies and procedures in place related to following these laws.
- The Program represents that it has the qualifications and ability to provide special education programming and administrative services in a professional manner. In the event that the ARDC believes that a change in educational programming or placement is necessary for any student placed by a District in one of the Program's classrooms, the Program will notify the District's Director of Special Education.
- To the extent that a student placed in the Program needs speech language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, or adaptive physical education, the Parties agree that the ESC or Placing District will provide such services and will bear the cost of such services. The ESC or Placing District shall also remain responsible for the psycho-educational evaluation and eligibility determination of all students, if required; the Program will contribute to the process and/or participate in required meetings when appropriate.

Attached are lists of delinquent taxes we recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll as required by the Texas Property Tax Code §33.05(c)(1) and (2) and mobile home and business personal property accounts we have determined to be uncollectible and are beyond the statute of limitations and recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll.

Exhibit A contains the accounts that should be removed from the tax roll pursuant to §33.05 (c)(1) of the Texas Property Tax Code. This provision of the Code provides that a tax on real property that has been delinquent for more than 20 years shall be removed from the delinquent tax roll. This includes the 2003 and prior tax years. The total amount of base taxes for this list is \$45,661.17.

Exhibit B contains the delinquent taxes that we recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll that we have determined to be uncollectible and are beyond the statute of limitations. Texas Property Tax Code §33.05 (a)(1) provides that property may not be seized and a suit may not be filed to collect a tax on personal property that has been delinquent more than four years. The total amount of base taxes for this list is \$186,267.04.

COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT

This Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (“Agreement”) is made and entered into between the Garland Independent School District (“Garland ISD”) and the City of Fort Worth, Texas (“Fort Worth”).

WHEREAS, both Garland ISD and Fort Worth have each determined a need for a cooperative agreement to purchase like goods and services to avoid duplicate procurement efforts and obtain the benefits of volume purchasing; and

WHEREAS, Garland ISD and Fort Worth are authorized by Section 271.102 of the Local Government Code to pursue mutually beneficial and cooperative purchasing programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual obligations and benefits contained herein, Garland ISD and Fort Worth agree as follows:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide Garland ISD and Fort Worth with additional purchasing options by satisfying the provisions of Section 271.102 of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 2. The Parties agree that each shall respectively designate a person to act under the direction of, and on behalf of, the designating party (the “Designated Representative”).

SECTION 3. At the request of the other Party, a Party that enters into a contract with a vendor for goods or services (the “First Purchasing Party”) shall attempt to obtain the vendor’s agreement to offer those goods and services to the other Party (the “Second Purchasing Party”) for the same price and on the same terms and conditions as have been offered to the First Purchasing Party. If the vendor so agrees, and if the Second Purchasing Party is agreeable to such terms and conditions, the Second Purchasing Party may enter into its own separate contract with the vendor for the purchase of such goods or services.

SECTION 4. Unless otherwise agreed between the Designated Representatives, payments for a purchase made by the Second Purchasing Party shall be paid directly to the vendor and not to the First Purchasing Party. The Second Purchasing Party shall have the responsibility of determining whether the vendor has complied with any provisions in its contract with the vendor, including but not limited to those relating to the quality of items and terms of delivery, and shall be responsible for enforcement of its contract against the vendor, including all cost of enforcement.

SECTION 5. This Agreement will be subject to all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

SECTION 6. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party, without cause or penalty, upon not less than thirty days written notice to the other Party.

SECTION 7. The Parties acknowledge that each Party and, if it so chooses, its counsel have reviewed and revised this Agreement and that the normal rule of construction to the effect that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting Party must not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement or any amendments or exhibits hereto.

SECTION 8. If any action, whether real or asserted, at law or in equity, arises on the basis of any provision of this Agreement, venue for such action shall lie in state courts located in Tarrant County, Texas or the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas – Fort Worth Division. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas.

SECTION 9. If any term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the legality, validity or enforceability of the remaining terms or provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and in lieu of each such illegal, invalid or unenforceable term or provision, the Parties shall endeavor to agree to a legal, valid or enforceable term or provision as similar as possible to the term or provision declared illegal, invalid or unenforceable.

SECTION 10. Execution of this Agreement does not obligate Garland ISD or Fort Worth to make any purchase, to pay any membership fee or to otherwise or in any manner incur any cost or obligation.

SECTION 11. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

SECTION 12. The undersigned officers and/or agents are properly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Parties hereto and each Party hereby certifies to the other that any necessary actions extending such authority have been duly passed and are now in full force and effect.

SECTION 13. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications which are required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given upon the delivery or receipt thereof, as the case may be, if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the respective city representative set out below, or his/her designee.

Section 14. Pursuant to Texas Government Code 791(d)3 each party must make payments from current revenues available to the paying party

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Garland Independent School District (GISD), a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter called "Grantor"), being the owner in fee simple of real property located in this County and within the territorial jurisdiction of the CITY OF SACHSE, TEXAS, said parcel of land described and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein for all purposes, the same as if fully copied herein (the "Easement Property"), as Grantor, for and in consideration of the sum of ten dollars and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid by the said CITY OF SACHSE, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, having its address at 3815-B Sachse Road, Sachse, Texas 76048, as Grantee, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, has dedicated, granted, sold and conveyed, and by these presents does dedicate, grant, sell and convey unto the said CITY OF SACHSE, a 614 square feet drainage easement as described in Exhibit "A" over, along, across and under the Property, to erect, construct, reconstruct, install, replace, repair, operate, use, inspect, modify, remove and maintain Independent any drainage facilities, together with all lines, pipes, conduits and other equipment, improvements, and appurtenances used in the supply and provision of drainage utilities, deemed necessary thereto by said City, over, along, across, under, into and through the Property. Subject to the following conditions:

1. Grantee shall have the right of ingress and egress to the Easement Property over adjacent lands of Grantor located within fifteen feet (15.0') on either side of the Easement Property ("Adjacent Property") for the purposes described above.
2. Grantor retains all rights to the Easement Property, provided that Grantor's exercise of such rights does not interfere with Grantee's rights under this easement. Grantor agrees not to interfere with Grantee's ability to use or maintain the Facilities. Interference includes, but is not limited to, physically modifying the Easement Property such as altering topography; installing fences, structures, rockeries, walls or other like improvements; planting of difficult to restore landscaping; piling or storage of dirt, trash, garbage, debris or other materials. Grantor shall, upon receipt of written notice from Grantee, remove cited interference from the Easement Property which prevents proper use of the Easement Property for the purposes intended herein. Grantee may grant written permission to the Grantor to physically modify the Easement Property upon receipt of a written request.
3. Grantor grants Grantee the right to use as much of the surface of the Adjacent Lands to the Easement Property as may be reasonably necessary to install and maintain the Facilities within the Easement Property that are reasonably suited for Grantee's purpose.
4. Grantee shall at all times after doing any work in connection with the construction, installation, modification, operation or repair of the Facilities, at Grantee's sole cost and expense, restore the surface of the Adjacent Property and Easement Property to the condition in which it was found before such work was undertaken; provided, however, with respect to any above-ground improvements removed by Grantee in accordance with the terms of this Easement, Grantee's repair obligation shall be limited to grading and sodding the areas from which the improvements were

removed, and returning the Easement Area to a substantially similar condition to that when the Grantee first commenced work, including but not limited to the repair of damage to landscaping or irrigation caused by the Grantee.

5. Grantor authorizes Grantee to cut and remove any vegetation or remove any physical interference within the Easement Property which, in the sole judgment of Grantee, constitutes an interference with, or obstruction or hazard to, Grantee's use of the Easement Property for the purposes granted herein.
6. Grantee shall provide a copy of the plans for work to be done within the Easement Property for Grantor's review prior to commencement of work within the Easement Property. If Grantor has any objection or suggested change(s) to the plans Grantor shall notify Grantee in writing within ten (10) business days of the receipt of Grantee's plans. Grantor and Grantee agree to use good faith efforts to work together to address any reasonable objection or reasonable suggested change(s) to the mutual satisfaction of both parties. If Grantee has not received any reasonable objection or reasonable suggested change(s) to the plans within ten (10) business days, Grantee may proceed with commencement of work within the Easement Property.
7. Grantor shall be permitted to use and/or tie into Facilities for the benefit of Grantor's property. Grantor shall be allowed to upgrade or improve the Facilities as desired should Grantor require additional drainage. In exercising this right, Grantor shall work with the Grantee to the same extent required of Grantee in the aforementioned section 6 in the event Grantor uses, ties into, upgrades, improves, or otherwise alters the Facilities.
8. Grantor shall not be responsible for any claims of damage to property, personal injury, or death in connection with any work undertaken by Grantee related to this Easement or the Facilities installed by Grantee in connection with this Easement.
9. Grantee is responsible for determining whether any other utilities, underground utilities including fiber optics, easements and/or improvements exist within the Easement Property and Grantee will be responsible for repairing and/or paying for any damage done to any such utilities, underground utilities, including fiber optics, easements and/or improvements within the Easement Property.

This instrument is governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any dispute that arises from this instrument shall be in Dallas County, Texas.

To have and to hold the above described Easement Property for the drainage purposes granted herein, with the right of ingress, egress, and regress therein, together with all and singular the usual rights thereto in anywise belonging, unto the said Grantee, its successors and assigns, until Grantees' adjoining property or Facilities are abandoned, and in that event the Easement shall cease and all rights herein granted shall automatically terminate and revert to Grantor or Grantor's heirs, successors or assigns, and legal representatives. 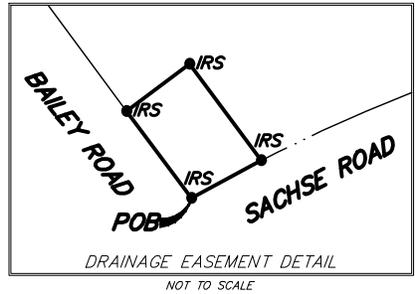

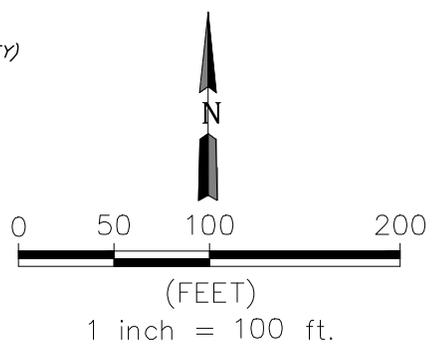

That Garland Independent School District (GISD), a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter called "Grantor"), being the owner in fee simple of real property located in this County and within the territorial jurisdiction of the CITY OF SACHSE, TEXAS, said parcel of land described and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein for all purposes, the same as if fully copied herein (the "Easement Property"), as Grantor, for and in consideration of the sum of ten dollars and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid by the said CITY OF SACHSE, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, having its address at 3815-B Sachse Road, Sachse, Texas 76048, as Grantee, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, has dedicated, granted, sold and conveyed, and by these presents does dedicate, grant, sell and convey unto the said CITY OF SACHSE, a 71.81 square feet drainage easement as described in Exhibit "A" over, along, across and under the Property, to erect, construct, reconstruct, install, replace, repair, operate, use, inspect, modify, remove and maintain any drainage facilities, together with all lines, pipes, conduits and other equipment, improvements, and appurtenances used in the supply and provision of drainage utilities, deemed necessary thereto by said City, over, along, across, under, into and through the Property. 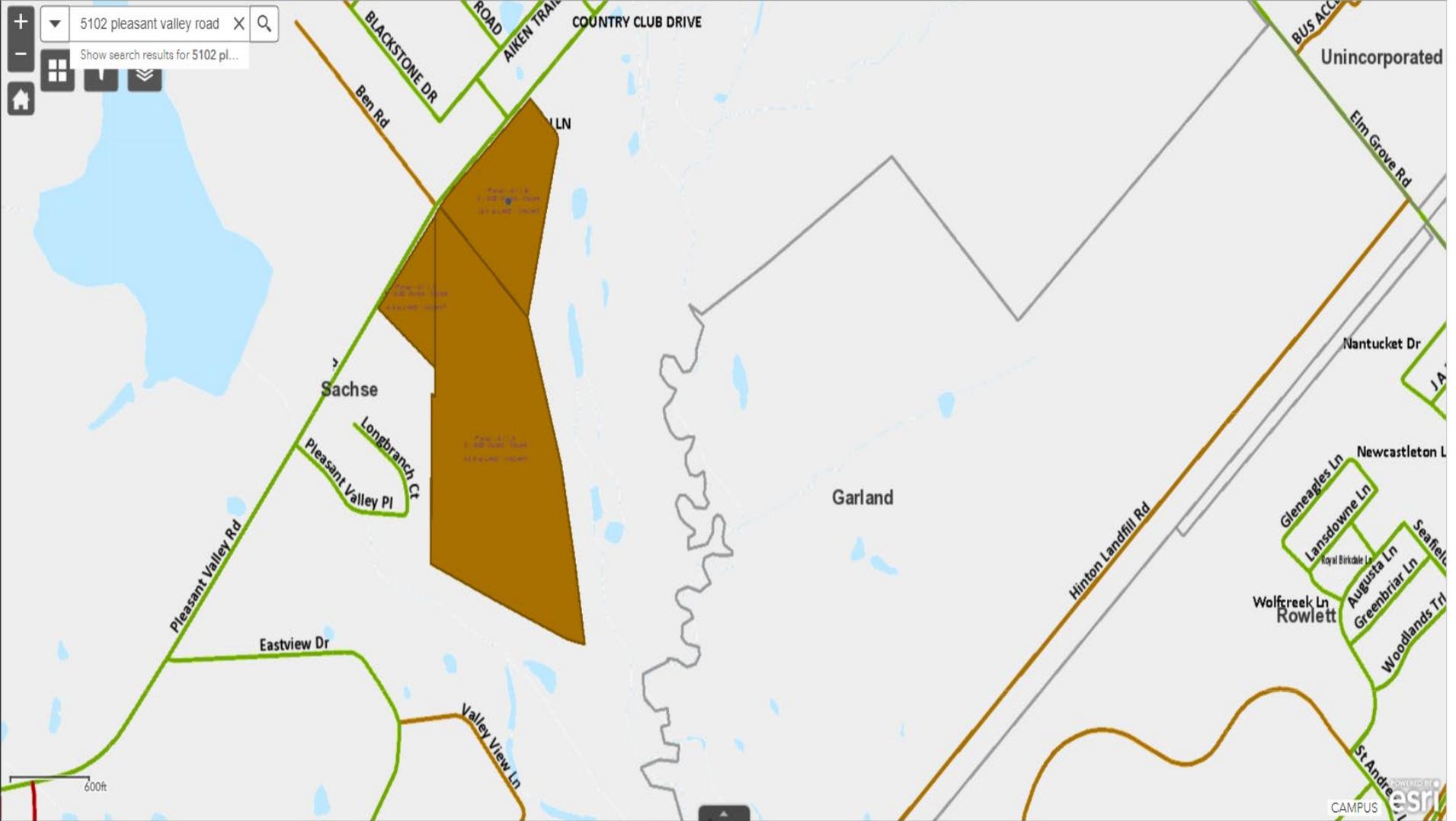

NAMING FACILITIES

CW
(LOCAL)

Definitions

Facilities shall be defined as:

1. A school campus building, permanent or temporary;
2. Rooms within a school building;
3. Structures related to a school building;
4. Athletic fields and facilities; and
5. Any other building or adjacent land area that is the property of the District and the Board.

General

It shall be the responsibility of the Board to name District facilities. The Board intends that names given to school buildings and other District facilities be meaningful and appropriate.

Naming New Facilities

When naming a new facility, the Board shall consider criteria to ensure the name is meaningful and appropriate, including the following:

1. A school building may be named after a street or local, state, or national geographic area if such a name has significance and does not lead to confusion.
2. A school building may be named after a prominent person or public official who has served the District or the community with distinction, a person who has gained recognition in education or the arts, or a national hero whose name shall lend prestige and status to an institution of learning and whose life and achievements shall serve as a positive role model for students who shall attend the particular school.
3. A school building may be named after a person who donated significant property to the District whose name shall lend prestige and status to an institution of learning and whose life and achievements shall serve as a positive role model for the students who shall attend the particular school.
4. Other District facilities shall be named in a descriptive manner to identify their purpose or location, e.g., Agricultural Training Center, Student Services Center, Tax Office.
5. To avoid confusion, names for schools shall not be duplicated in north-central Texas in Dallas, Collin, and Rockwall Counties.

NAMING FACILITIES

CW
(LOCAL)

Definitions

Facilities shall be defined as:

1. A school campus building, permanent or temporary;
2. Rooms within a school building;
3. Structures related to a school building;
4. Athletic fields and facilities; and
5. Any other building or adjacent land area that is the property of the District and the Board.

General

It shall be the responsibility of the Board to name District facilities. The Board intends that names given to school buildings and other District facilities be meaningful and appropriate.

Naming New Facilities

When naming a new facility, the Board shall consider criteria to ensure the name is meaningful and appropriate, including the following:

1. A school building may be named after a street or local, state, or national geographic area if such a name has significance and does not lead to confusion.
2. A school building may be named after a prominent person or public official who has served the District or the community with distinction, a person who has gained recognition in education or the arts, or a national hero whose name shall lend prestige and status to an institution of learning and whose life and achievements shall serve as a positive role model for students who shall attend the particular school.
3. A school building may be named after a person who donated significant property to the District whose name shall lend prestige and status to an institution of learning and whose life and achievements shall serve as a positive role model for the students who shall attend the particular school.
4. Other District facilities shall be named in a descriptive manner to identify their purpose or location, e.g., Agricultural Training Center, Student Services Center, Tax Office.
5. To avoid confusion, names for schools shall not be duplicated in north-central Texas in Dallas, Collin, and Rockwall Counties.

Agreement

1. This Agreement is between the Garland Independent School District (the “District” or “GISD”) and the Garland Economic Development Partnership (the “Partnership”).
2. The subject matter of this Agreement is the payment of funds by the District to the Partnership and the conditions for such payment.
3. The purpose of this Agreement is to satisfy the legal requirement that the District maintain sufficient control over this expenditure to ensure that the public purposes of the District will be accomplished.
4. Therefore, in consideration of the agreement by the District to pay \$50,000 to the Partnership, the Partnership agrees that:
 - A. The Partnership shall use District funds only to assist local businesses adversely affected by District construction projects, to fund educational programs, and/or for programs identified in Exhibit A, and for no other purposes;
 - B. Any direct grants made with District funds to businesses or other entities for such purposes may only be made to entities located in whole or in part within the District;
 - C. The Partnership shall keep complete records identifying the expenditures made with District funds and shall furnish an accounting to the District at least semi-annually demonstrating that all District funds were spent by the Partnership in accordance with this Agreement. The semi-annual reports must be sent in the March and August following payment. The semi-annual report must be sent to: Board Service Manager; Garland Independent School District; 501 South Jupiter Road; Garland, Texas 75042; and
 - D. The Partnership shall acknowledge and publicize the District’s assistance and contribution to the programs of the Partnership so as to foster good relations between the District and the recipients of the benefits of such programs.
5. To receive the consideration in the amount of \$50,000, the Partnership shall send an invoice to the District in September of the District fiscal year for the payment. The invoice must be sent to: Board Service Manager; Garland Independent School District; 501 South Jupiter Road; Garland, Texas 75042.
6. The term of this Agreement is one year beginning on the date both parties have signed the Agreement. However, the limitations on the Partnership’s use of District-paid funds outlined in item 4 of this Agreement remain in effect beyond one year to the extent the Partnership has not expended all of the funds paid by the District or returned unused funds to the District. This Agreement may be renewed for additional one-year terms upon the written agreement of both parties.

7. This Agreement may be terminated by the District or the Partnership with or without cause by providing 30 days advanced written notice. If the Partnership terminates the Agreement, it shall refund to the District all unspent District funds no later than 30 days after the date of termination.

Agreement

1. This Agreement is between the Garland Independent School District (the “District”) and the City of Sachse Economic Development Corporation (the “Corporation”).
2. The subject matter of this Agreement is the payment of funds by the District to the Corporation and the conditions for such payment.
3. The purpose of this Agreement is to satisfy the legal requirement that the District maintain sufficient control over this expenditure to ensure that the public purposes of the District will be accomplished.
4. Therefore, in consideration of the agreement by the District to pay \$10,000 to the Corporation, the Corporation agrees that:
 - A. The Corporation shall use District funds only to help assist local businesses adversely affected by District construction projects, to fund educational programs, and/or for programs identified in Exhibit A, and for no other purposes;
 - B. Any direct grants made with District funds to businesses or other entities for such purposes may only be made to entities located in whole or in part within the District;
 - C. The Corporation shall keep complete records identifying the expenditures made with District funds and shall furnish an accounting to the District at least semi-annually demonstrating that all District funds were spent by the Corporation in accordance with this Agreement. The semi-annual reports must be sent in the March and August following payment. The semi-annual report must be sent to: Board Service Manager; Garland Independent School District; 501 South Jupiter Road; Garland, Texas 75042; and
 - D. The Corporation shall acknowledge and publicize the District’s assistance and contribution to the programs of the Corporation so as to foster good relations between the District and the recipients of the benefits of such programs.
5. To receive the consideration in the amount of \$10,000, the Corporation shall send an invoice to the District in September of the District fiscal year for the payment. The invoice must be sent to: Board Service Manager; Garland Independent School District; 501 South Jupiter Road; Garland, Texas 75042.
6. The term of this Agreement is one year beginning on the date both parties have signed the Agreement. However, the limitations on the Corporation’s use of District-paid funds outlined in item 4 of this Agreement remain in effect beyond one year to the extent the Corporation has not expended all of the funds paid by the District or returned unused funds to the District. This Agreement may be renewed for additional one-year terms upon the written agreement of both parties.

7. This Agreement may be terminated by the District or the Corporation with or without cause by providing 30 days advanced written notice. If the Corporation terminates the Agreement, it shall refund to the District all unspent District funds no later than 30 days after the date of termination.

Compliance with Law

The Superintendent shall establish procedures that ensure that all school facilities within the District comply with applicable laws and local building codes.

Construction Contracts

Prior to advertising, the Board shall determine the project delivery/contract award method to be used for each construction contract valued at or above \$50,000. To assist the Board, the Superintendent shall recommend the project delivery/contract award method that he or she determines provides the best value to the District. [See CV series generally and CBB(LEGAL) for requirements if federal funds are involved.]

For construction contracts valued at or above \$75,000, the Superintendent shall also submit the resulting contract to the Board for approval. Lesser expenditures for construction and construction-related materials or services shall be at the discretion of the Superintendent and consistent with law and policy. [See also CH and CBB(LEGAL)]

Note: For provisions regarding delegation of authority for construction contracts in the event of a catastrophe, emergency, or natural disaster affecting the District, see CH(LOCAL).

Change Orders

Change orders permitted by law shall be approved by the Board or the Superintendent prior to any changes being made in the approved plans or the actual construction of the facility.

In this policy A Change Order means any change to the contract sum, not to exceed 10 percent of the contracted for construction cost, contract time, or construction documents approved by the Board of Trustees or the Superintendent.

Construction Contingency Funds

Where a contract includes a construction contingency, the Superintendent may approve an expenditure from the contingency fund not to exceed the greater of an amount expressly delegated to the Superintendent in the underlying contract or amount granted to the Superintendent under Board Policy CH(LOCAL). Where the contract does not delegate to the Superintendent authority to approve expenditures from the construction contingency in terms of a specific dollar amount, the Superintendent's authority to approve and individual contingency expenditure shall be limited to the purchasing authority granted to the Superintendent under Board Policy CH(LOCAL). Contingency expenditures shall be supported by written documentation required in the contract. Where the contract does not express the minimum documentation requirements, supporting documentation shall include a written explanation of the reason for the contingency expenditure by the

design professional, construction manager or contractor, and project manager (if applicable) and such written documentation shall be provided to the Board of Trustees for review on or before the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees following the approval of the contingency expenditure. Where the contract states a specific dollar limitation on the Superintendent's Authority to approve a contingency expenditure, the Superintendent shall not have authority to approve a contingency expenditure that exceeds the limits described by this Policy (CV[LOCAL]) and any such approval shall be void to the extent that it exceeds the limitations set forth herein. .

Change Order
Procedures

The following guidelines have been established by the Board for the District to implement Change Orders:

1. The Board of Trustees has the sole authority to approve Change Orders and may delegate limited authority to the Superintendent to approve Change Orders
 - a. The Board of Trustees may delegate the authority to approve Change Orders through the approval of Board Policy
 - b. The Board of Trustees may delegate the authority to approve a specific Change Order that has been presented for the Board's consideration.
 - c. The Board may delegate the authority to approve Change Orders by approving a contract that sets forth the limits of the Superintendent's authority to approve Change Orders.
2. Where the Board of Trustees delegates the authority to approve Change Orders to the Superintendent through the Board's approval of a contract that contains a provision which delegates limited authority to the Superintendent to approve Change Orders, the dollar limit of the Board's delegation of authority shall be equal to or less than the total dollar amount of the line-item contained of the contract sum identified using the term "contingency" (i.e. "The Owner's Contingency" or "The Construction Manager's Contingency")
3. Where the Board of Trustees delegates the authority to approve Change Orders, the maximum amount of authority shall be no greater than the budgeted amount expressly stated in the board's action.

4. No Change Order shall be valid and enforceable unless the Board of Trustees has budgeted for the expenditure prior to execution of the Change Order by the School District.
5. Where the contract does not express the minimum documentation requirements for a Change Order, supporting documentation shall include a written explanation of the reason for the Change Order expenditure by the design professional, construction manager or contractor, and project manager (if applicable) and such written documentation shall be provided to the Board of Trustees for review at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees that follows the date the Change Order is presented to the school district for execution.
6. Where the contract is silent as to the limits of the Superintendent's authority the Superintendent shall not have the authority to approve a Change Order that exceeds the amount set forth by law or this policy.

**Project
Administration**

All construction projects shall be administered by the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent shall keep the Board informed concerning construction projects and shall also provide information to the general public.

Final Payment

The District shall not make final payments for construction or the supervision of construction until the work has been completed and the Board or the Board's designee has accepted the work.

Updating Credentials All employees who have earned certificates, endorsements, or degrees of higher rank since the previous school year shall file with the District:

1. An official college transcript showing the highest degree earned and date conferred.
2. Proof of the certificate or endorsement.

Contract Personnel The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that contract personnel possess valid credentials before issuing contracts.

State Teacher Certification In accordance with the District's Innovation plan, the District will have the flexibility to hire individuals who are knowledgeable in the subject area and equipped to effectively perform the duties of the position in question, as permitted by law. The District is able to locally certify teachers in areas of high demand to better meet the educational needs of our students. Teachers with industry certifications and qualified experience could be eligible to teach a course through a local teaching certification. In addition, the Superintendent shall have the authority to permit a certified teacher to teach outside his or her certified field(s). (See DK)

Social Security Number The District shall not use an employee's social security number as an employee identifier, except for tax purposes [see DC]. In accordance with law, the District shall keep an employee's social security number confidential.

Note: This policy addresses discrimination, harassment, and retaliation against District employees. For Title IX and other provisions regarding discrimination, harassment, and retaliation against students, see FFH. For reporting requirements related to child abuse and neglect, see FFG.

Definitions Solely for purposes of this policy, the term “employee” includes former employees, applicants for employment, and unpaid interns.

Statement of Nondiscrimination The District prohibits discrimination, including harassment, against any employee on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by law. Retaliation against anyone involved in the complaint process is a violation of District policy and is prohibited.

Discrimination Discrimination against an employee is defined as conduct directed at an employee on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by law, that adversely affects the employee’s employment.

In accordance with law, discrimination on the basis of sex includes discrimination on the basis of biological sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, gender stereotypes, or any other prohibited basis related to sex.

Title VI
Desegregation Order

The District has a continuing intent to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and with the provisions of its court order in the case of United States of America v. Garland Independent School District, C.A. No. 3-4100 C (N.D. Tex. Sept. 10, 1970), as Amended (July 14, 1987). Accordingly, the District will maintain aggressive efforts to recruit, employ, and promote qualified minorities for professional teaching and administrative positions. Recruitment, employment, and promotion practices, as spelled out in administrative regulations and related procedures, will be systematic, racially nondiscriminatory, and as objective as possible. The Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for the establishment and maintenance of regulations and procedures aimed at compliance.

Teacher Recruitment

In accordance with provisions of the July 14, 1987, Agreed Judgment and with assurances given to the U.S. Office for Civil Rights, the District shall employ the following strategies set forth in administrative regulations in its effort to recruit and employ minority teachers:

1. Recruit annually at no fewer than seven predominantly Black colleges, at least four of which shall be outside of Texas.

2. Recruit annually at no fewer than four major Texas colleges that have a significant number of Black senior students expected to graduate with teaching credentials.
3. Include Black professional employees in no fewer than six recruiting trips annually.
4. Proffer teaching contracts to Black candidates whose credentials are acceptable, whose interview results are competitive, and whose employment is approved by the building principal, the Superintendent, and the Board.
5. Maintain records to document the ethnicity of all applicants, the job qualifications and personal qualifications of the applicants, and the recommendation to hire or not-to-hire and reasons therefore.
6. Notify minority community groups of teaching vacancies and establish a referral process for these groups to recommend applicants. These minority groups will include a proportion of Black groups that is at least commensurate with the proportion of Black persons in the minority population within the District's jurisdiction. Interested community groups shall be advised annually of the District's employment procedures, including screening and interview processes, Superintendent's recommendations, and Board action. Participating minority organizations shall also receive feedback on the status of minority applicants whom they have recommended.
7. Advertise teaching vacancies on job placement and social media sites at the beginning of each school semester and at other times during the year when no qualified candidate is available in the applicant pool.
8. Develop recruitment materials that outline the District's "new employee benefits" packages.
9. Establish a certification "hotline" for applicants, notify minority organizations identified in item 6, above, of the existence and purpose of the hotline, and include the hotline telephone number in district website.
10. Seek input on the recruiting schedule from the Multi-Ethnic Committee.
11. Work with community groups to establish college scholarships for interested minority students. The District shall annually seek scholarship support from the same minority groups involved in the recruitment/referral process, as well as from

other community groups who regularly sponsor scholarships for graduating seniors. The Superintendent shall apprise the federal court of the results of the scholarship solicitation as a component in the June 20 required report.

*Teacher
Employment*

With a general aim to employ the most qualified person for each teaching position, and with an ancillary aim to employ an increased number of minority teachers whose credentials are equal or superior to nonminority applicants, the District shall implement procedures as follows:

1. Screen all applicants to ascertain that they have valid certification or a state-approved alternate in the grade levels or subject areas where vacancies exist or are anticipated.
2. Interview at the central office level selected candidates who meet the criterion in item 1, above. The total number of persons interviewed shall be at the discretion of the assistant superintendent for personnel.
3. Notwithstanding item 2, above, grant an interview at the central office level to all minority teacher applicants who have valid certification in an area of need.
4. Refer for interview by the building principal a minimum of three persons for the vacancy, if available, and with the proviso that all Black and other minority applicants with appropriate certification will be interviewed.
5. Require written documentation from the appropriate administrator any time a recommendation is made to employ a nonminority teacher whose ratings for the position in question are equal or inferior to those of the minority candidate(s) under consideration.
6. Exact a recommendation to hire from the principal and the assistant superintendent for personnel or designee.
7. Forward to the Board a formal recommendation to hire from the Superintendent.

*Hiring / Promotion
of Administrators*

Selection of administrators in the District rests ultimately with the Superintendent, subject to approval by the Board. The Superintendent and designee(s) shall set forth in administrative regulations the following as a part of the hiring/promotion process:

1. Post administrative vacancies (pay grades 106-115, 205-211) inside the District; request posting in area metroplex districts; and advertise in job placements websites and Garland ISD website when appropriate.

2. Conduct initial screening at the Superintendent's level of some candidates for entry-level positions (pay grades 106-115, 205-211). Screening of minority candidates shall be based on an objective rating system that considers job requirements as posted/advertised and contained in the job description. Screening of other candidates will also include ratings based on other credentials submitted at the time of application.
3. Refer to screening committees or to the appropriate assistant superintendent the highest-ranking candidates for the administrative positions. If there is a sufficient number of certified minority applicants for a position, at least 25 percent of those persons interviewed by the screening committees shall be minority persons. This 25 percent of minority applicants will include at least a proportion of Black applicants commensurate with the proportion of Black applicants for the vacancy.
4. Conduct interviews at the screening committee level of all persons referred by the Superintendent. Interview results shall be objectively quantified and combined with reference check results before forwarding a recommended list of finalists to the Superintendent for consideration. Persons interviewed during the past year may be considered without another interview.
5. Waive, at the Superintendent's discretion, the screening committee process for any applicant for a position at (pay grades 106-115, 205-211). When the Superintendent chooses to be responsible for the interviews, at least 25 percent of those interviewed should be qualified minority candidates, when available. This 25 percent of minority applicants will include at least a proportion of Black applicants commensurate with the proportion of Black applicants for the vacancy.
6. Document reasons for the failure to recommend to the Board any minority applicant whose ratings are equal or superior to nonminority candidates for the same position(s).

Recordkeeping

The District shall maintain for three years records that document vacancy announcements, applications received, applicants interviewed, rating criteria and results, persons selected, and written qualifications therefore.

*Penalty for
Discrimination*

The District shall not tolerate discrimination in any of the forms mentioned above practiced by any of its employees against any

other employees and will take appropriate disciplinary action against any employee who so discriminates.

Prohibited Conduct

In this policy, the term “prohibited conduct” includes discrimination, harassment, and retaliation as defined by this policy, even if the behavior does not rise to the level of unlawful conduct.

Prohibited conduct also includes sexual harassment as defined by Title IX. [See FFH(LEGAL)]

Prohibited Harassment

Prohibited harassment of an employee is defined as physical, verbal, or nonverbal conduct based on an employee’s race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by law, when the conduct is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that the conduct:

1. Has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the employee’s work performance;
2. Creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive work environment; or
3. Otherwise adversely affects the employee’s performance, environment, or employment opportunities.

Examples

Examples of prohibited harassment may include offensive or derogatory language directed at another person’s religious beliefs or practices, accent, skin color, gender identity, or need for workplace accommodation; threatening or intimidating conduct; offensive jokes, name calling, slurs, or rumors; cyber-harassment; physical aggression or assault; display of graffiti or printed material promoting racial, ethnic, or other negative stereotypes; or other kinds of aggressive conduct such as theft or damage to property.

Sex-Based Harassment

As required by law, the District shall follow the procedures below at Response to Sexual Harassment—Title IX upon a report of sex-based harassment, including sexual harassment, when such allegations, if proved, would meet the definition of sexual harassment under Title IX. [See FFH(LEGAL)]

Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination defined as unwelcome sexual advances; requests for sexual favors; sexually motivated physical, verbal, or nonverbal conduct; or other conduct or communication of a sexual nature when:

1. Submission to the conduct is either explicitly or implicitly a condition of an employee’s employment, or when submission to or rejection of the conduct is the basis for an employment action affecting the employee; or

2. The conduct is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the employee's work performance or creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive work environment.

Examples

Examples of sexual harassment may include sexual advances; touching intimate body parts; coercing or forcing a sexual act on another; jokes or conversations of a sexual nature; and other sexually motivated conduct, contact, or communication, including electronic communication.

Reporting Procedures

Any employee who believes that he or she has experienced prohibited conduct or believes that another employee has experienced prohibited conduct should immediately report the alleged acts. The employee may report the alleged acts to his or her supervisor or campus principal.

Alternatively, the employee may report the alleged acts to one of the District officials below.

Definition of District Officials

For the purposes of this policy, District officials are the Title IX coordinator, the ADA/Section 504 coordinator, and the Superintendent.

Title IX Coordinator

Reports of discrimination based on sex, including sexual harassment, may be directed to the designated Title IX coordinator. [See DIA(EXHIBIT)]

ADA / Section 504 Coordinator

Reports of discrimination based on disability may be directed to the designated ADA/Section 504 coordinator. [See DIA(EXHIBIT)]

Superintendent

The Superintendent shall serve as coordinator for purposes of District compliance with all other nondiscrimination laws.

Alternative Reporting Procedures

An employee shall not be required to report prohibited conduct to the person alleged to have committed the conduct. Reports concerning prohibited conduct, including reports against the Title IX coordinator or ADA/Section 504 coordinator, may be directed to the Superintendent.

A report against the Superintendent may be made directly to the Board. If a report is made directly to the Board, the Board shall appoint an appropriate person to conduct an investigation.

Timely Reporting

To ensure the District's prompt investigation, reports of prohibited conduct shall be made as soon as possible after the alleged act or knowledge of the alleged act.

Notice of Report

Any District supervisor who receives a report of prohibited conduct shall immediately notify the appropriate District official listed above and take any other steps required by this policy.

Any District employee who receives a report of prohibited conduct based on sex, including sexual harassment, shall immediately notify the Title IX coordinator.

**Investigation of
Reports Other Than
Title IX**

The following procedures apply to all allegations of prohibited conduct other than allegations of harassment prohibited by Title IX. [See FFH(LEGAL)] For allegations of sex-based harassment that, if proved, would meet the definition of sexual harassment under Title IX, see the procedures below at Response to Sexual Harassment—Title IX.

The District may request, but shall not require, a written report. If a report is made orally, the District official shall reduce the report to written form.

Initial Assessment

Upon receipt or notice of a report, the District official shall determine whether the allegations, if proved, would constitute prohibited conduct as defined by this policy. If so, the District shall immediately authorize or undertake an investigation, regardless of whether a criminal or regulatory investigation regarding the same or similar allegations is pending.

Interim Action

If appropriate, the District shall promptly take interim action calculated to prevent prohibited conduct during the course of an investigation.

District Investigation

The investigation may be conducted by the District official or a designee, such as the campus principal, or by a third party designated by the District, such as an attorney. When appropriate, the principal or supervisor shall be involved in or informed of the investigation.

The investigation may consist of personal interviews with the person making the report, the person against whom the report is filed, and others with knowledge of the circumstances surrounding the allegations. The investigation may also include analysis of other information or documents related to the allegations.

**Concluding the
Investigation**

Absent extenuating circumstances, the investigation should be completed within ten District business days from the date of the report; however, the investigator shall take additional time if necessary to complete a thorough investigation.

The investigator shall prepare a written report of the investigation. The report shall be filed with the District official overseeing the investigation.

District Action

If the results of an investigation indicate that prohibited conduct occurred, the District shall promptly respond by taking appropriate

disciplinary or corrective action reasonably calculated to address the conduct.

The District may take action based on the results of an investigation, even if the conduct did not rise to the level of prohibited or unlawful conduct.

Confidentiality

To the greatest extent possible, the District shall respect the privacy of the complainant, persons against whom a report is filed, and witnesses. Limited disclosures may be necessary in order to conduct a thorough investigation and comply with applicable law.

Appeal

A complainant who is dissatisfied with the outcome of the investigation may appeal through DGBA(LOCAL), beginning at the appropriate level.

The complainant may have a right to file a complaint with appropriate state or federal agencies.

Response to Sexual Harassment—Title IX

For purposes of the District's response to reports of harassment prohibited by Title IX, definitions can be found in FFH(LEGAL).

General Response

When the District receives notice or an allegation of conduct that, if proved, would meet the definition of sexual harassment under Title IX, the Title IX coordinator shall promptly contact the complainant to:

- Discuss the availability of supportive measures and inform the complainant that they are available, with or without the filing of a formal complaint;
- Consider the complainant's wishes with respect to supportive measures; and
- Explain to the complainant the option and process for filing a formal complaint.

The District's response to sexual harassment shall treat complainants and respondents equitably by offering supportive measures to both parties, as appropriate, and by following the Title IX formal complaint process before imposing disciplinary sanctions or other actions that are not supportive measures against a respondent.

If a formal complaint is not filed, the District reserves the right to investigate and respond to prohibited conduct in accordance with Board policies and administrative procedures.

Title IX Formal Complaint Process

To distinguish the process described below from the District's general grievance policies [see DGBA, FNG, and GF], this policy refers to the grievance process required by Title IX regulations for

responding to formal complaints of sexual harassment as the District's "Title IX formal complaint process."

The Superintendent shall ensure the development of a Title IX formal complaint process that complies with legal requirements. [See FFH(LEGAL)] The formal complaint process shall be posted on the District's website. In compliance with Title IX regulations, the District's Title IX formal complaint process shall address the following basic requirements:

1. Equitable treatment of complainants and respondents;
2. An objective evaluation of all relevant evidence;
3. A requirement that the Title IX coordinator, investigator, decision-maker, or any person designated to facilitate an informal resolution process not have a conflict of interest or bias;
4. A presumption that the respondent is not responsible for the alleged sexual harassment until a determination is made at the conclusion of the Title IX formal complaint process;
5. Time frames that provide for a reasonably prompt conclusion of the Title IX formal complaint process, including time frames for appeals and any informal resolution process, and that allow for temporary delays or the limited extension of time frames with good cause and written notice as required by law;
6. A description of the possible disciplinary sanctions and remedies that may be implemented following a determination of responsibility for the alleged sexual harassment;
7. A statement of the standard of evidence to be used to determine responsibility for all Title IX formal complaints of sexual harassment;
8. Procedures and permissible bases for the complainant and respondent to appeal a determination of responsibility or a dismissal of a Title IX formal complaint or any allegations therein;
9. A description of the supportive measures available to the complainant and respondent;
10. A prohibition on using or seeking information protected under a legally recognized privilege unless the individual holding the privilege has waived the privilege;
11. Additional formal complaint procedures in 34 C.F.R. 106.45(b), including written notice of a formal complaint,

12. Other local procedures as determined by the Superintendent.

Standard of Evidence	The standard of evidence used to determine responsibility in a Title IX formal complaint of sexual harassment shall be the preponderance of the evidence.
Retaliation	The District prohibits retaliation against an employee who makes a claim alleging to have experienced discrimination or harassment, or another employee who, in good faith, makes a report of harassment or discrimination, files a complaint of harassment or discrimination, serves as a witness, or otherwise participates or refuses to participate in an investigation.
Examples	Examples of retaliation may include termination, refusal to hire, demotion, and denial of promotion. Retaliation may also include threats, intimidation, coercion, unjustified negative evaluations, unjustified negative references, or increased surveillance.
Records Retention	<p>The District shall retain copies of allegations, investigation reports, and related records regarding any prohibited conduct in accordance with the District's records control schedules, but for no less than the minimum amount of time required by law. [See CPC]</p> <p>[For Title IX recordkeeping and retention provisions, see FFH(LEGAL) and the District's Title IX formal complaint process.]</p>
Access to Policy and Procedures	Information regarding this policy and any accompanying procedures shall be distributed annually to District employees. Copies of the policy and procedures shall be posted on the District's website, to the extent practicable, and readily available at each campus and the District's administrative offices.
