

*Total Value of New Construction in Certified Market Value above \$962,779,867


**Value of Disputed New Construction in Protested Market Value Above \$14,308,880

Subject: Discussion and Consideration of an Order Authorizing Defeasance and Redemption of Certain Outstanding Bonds

Action Item

Executive Summary:

Shown is an order providing for the defeasance and redemption of certain outstanding bonds of the district; and resolving other matters incident and related to the defeasance of such obligations.

The principal amount to be redeemed or defeased will exceed \$11,000,000 and will be funded from the Interest and Sinking Fund. The interest savings will vary depending on the bond series selected and the timing of the redemption or defeasance. We believe that making this early debt payment will yield long-term benefits by strengthening GISD's overall financial position.

Recommended Motion for Action Items:

Move to adopt an order authorizing the defeasance and redemption of certain currently outstanding bonds of the District.

Financial Impact and Funding Source:

A payment of no less than \$ 11,000,000 and accompanying interest for the defeasance and redemption of bonds will be paid out the Interest and Sinking (I&S) Fund.

AN ORDER authorizing the defeasance and redemption of certain currently outstanding bonds of the District; and resolving other matters incident and related to the defeasance of such obligations

WHEREAS, pursuant to orders passed and adopted by the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Garland Independent School District (the "District"), the following described bonds were duly authorized to be issued and are currently outstanding, to wit: (1) "Garland Independent School District Unlimited Tax School Building and Refunding Bonds, Series 2015A," dated May 15, 2015 (the "2015 Bonds"), (2) "Garland Independent School District Unlimited Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 2016," dated May 15, 2016, (the "2016 Refunding Bonds"), and (3) "Garland Independent School District School Building Bonds, Series 2016," dated October 15, 2016 (the "2016 School Building Bonds" and together with the 2015 Bonds and the 2016 Refunding Bonds, the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Texas Government Code, Chapter 1207, as amended (the "Act"), the District is authorized and empowered to deposit funds and/or securities directly with the place of payment for the Bonds or other authorized depository, and enter into an escrow or similar agreement with such place of payment for the safekeeping, investment, reinvestment, administration and disbursement of such deposit; and such deposit, when made in accordance with the Act, shall constitute the making of firm banking and financial arrangements for the discharge and full payment of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District and its residents to defease and/or redeem the Bonds as herein provided in order to terminate the payment of interest thereon and to reduce the District's aggregate debt service requirements in the years subsequent to the redemption date; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1: All or a portion of the Bonds, in the aggregate principal amount of \$11,000,000 (but to include such additional amounts due to availability of funds, as hereinafter described), shall be defeased to their maturity or prior redemption date, as applicable. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Superintendent of Schools or the Chief Financial Officer to ultimately determine the principal amount of Bonds to be defeased and/or redeemed on the basis of the availability of funds for such purpose (the "*Redeemed Obligations*") by June 30, 2026 (the "Funding Deadline"); provided, however, that in no case shall the principal amount of the Redeemed Obligations be less than \$11,000,000. As directed by an Authorized Official (as defined below), the District shall transfer on or before the Funding Deadline, its lawfully available funds to U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, the paying agent/registrar for the Bonds (the "Paying Agent/Registrar"), or such other entity as determined by the Authorized Official (the "Escrow Agent"), in an amount sufficient (when combined with investment earnings on such initial deposit) to pay all costs of interest due and owing on Redeemed Obligations from the time of such deposit through their maturity or redemption, as applicable, plus the principal amount of the Redeemed Obligations due and owing at such time of maturity or redemption, as applicable (together, the "Funding Amount"); provided, however, if, prior to such deposit, the Board authorizes the issuance of refunding bonds for the defeasance and redemption of the Redeemed Obligations (the "Refunding Bonds"), an Authorized Official shall, in lieu of a deposit as heretofore described, cause the Funding Amount to be transferred as either (1) a District contribution in connection with issuance of the Refunding Bonds or (2) for payment of debt service on the Refunding Bonds coming due prior to the Funding Deadline.

SECTION 2: In the event the Superintendent of Schools or the Chief Financial Officer of the District determines to defease the maturities of the Bonds which are subject to redemption, the principal amount of such Bonds shall be called for redemption and shall be redeemed on the applicable redemption Date, at the price of par plus accrued interest to the date of redemption and the Superintendent of Schools or other Authorized Official is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of this Order with the Paying Agent/Registrar U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, the paying agent/registrar for the Bonds (the "Paying Agent/Registrar"), in accordance with the redemption provisions applicable to such obligations. Additionally, if necessary, the Paying Agent/Registrar is hereby authorized and directed to make a lot selection of the Bonds to be redeemed and make arrangements to notify bondholders of such lot selection as soon as possible thereafter. The Superintendent of Schools or other Authorized Official is hereby authorized and directed to transfer lawfully available funds to the Escrow Agent to accomplish the defeasance and/or redemption of the defeased bonds in accordance with the terms of the Escrow Agreement.

In the event the Bonds are called for redemption, the Superintendent of Schools or other Authorized Official is hereby authorized and directed to make all arrangements necessary to notify the holders of the Bonds of the District's decision to redeem such bonds on the date and in the manner herein provided and in accordance with the order(s) authorizing the Bonds.

SECTION 3: The President, Vice President, or Secretary of the Board, the District's Superintendent of Schools and the Chief Financial Officer of the District (each of the foregoing, an "Authorized Official"), and Bond Counsel to the District, is authorized to evidence adoption of this Order and to do any and all things necessary or convenient to effect the defeasance and, if applicable, redemption described herein and otherwise give effect to the intent and purpose hereof, including the selection of an escrow agent and verification agent and the execution of the Escrow Agreement.

SECTION 4: The Board delegates to each Authorized Official the authority to execute a special escrow agreement (the "Escrow Agreement") with the Escrow Agent, and, based upon the advice of the District's financial advisor, deposit money sufficient to pay in full the Bonds at maturity or to the redemption date and/or deposit in trust Government Securities, as defined in the order(s) authorizing the Bonds, which have been certified by an independent accounting firm to mature in such amounts and at such times as will insure the availability, without reinvestment, of sufficient money, together with any moneys deposited therewith, to pay when due the Bonds on their maturity date or date of redemption; all of which shall be provided in the Escrow Agreement finalized and executed by the Authorized Official.

SECTION 5: Furthermore, appropriate officials of the District in cooperation with the Escrow Agent are hereby authorized and directed to make the necessary arrangements for the purchase of the escrowed securities referenced in the Escrow Agreement, if any, and the delivery thereof to the Escrow Agent for deposit to the credit of the "SPECIAL SERIES 2026 GARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT DEFEASANCE ESCROW FUND" (referred to herein as the "Escrow Fund") or such other designation as provided for in the Escrow Agreement; all as contemplated and provided in the Act, this Order and the Escrow Agreement.

SECTION 6: The Board further hereby authorizes the Authorized Official to select a firm of independent public accountants (the "Verification Agent") to verify the sufficiency of the deposit to the Escrow Fund to accomplish the defeasance of the defeased bonds, to the extent such appointment is necessary or desired and in the event of the establishment of a net defeasance escrow fund; provided, however, that in the event of a gross defeasance of the

defeased bonds, the sufficiency of the deposit to the Escrow Fund to accomplish such defeasance shall be certified to the District by the District's financial advisor or another qualified financial institution.

SECTION 7: The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Order for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgement and findings of the Board.

SECTION 8: If any provision of this Order or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Order and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the Board hereby declares that this Order would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 9: Though such parties may be identified, and the entry into a particular form of contract may be authorized herein, the Board hereby delegates to the Superintendent of Schools and the Chief Financial Officer of the District the authority to independently select the counterparty to any agreement with the Escrow Agent, Verification Agent or any other contract that is determined by the Superintendent of Schools, Chief Financial Officer of the District, the District's financial advisor, or Bond Counsel to be necessary or incidental to carry out the provisions of this Order, as long as each of such contracts has a value of less than the amount referenced in Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code (collectively, the "Ancillary Contracts"); and, as necessary, to execute the Ancillary Contracts on behalf and as the act and deed of the District. The Board has not participated in the selection of any of the business entities which are counterparties to the Ancillary Contracts.

SECTION 10: It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Order is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Order, was given, all as required by Texas Government Code, Chapter 551, as amended.

SECTION 11: This Order shall be in force and effect from and after its passage on the date shown below.

Subject: Consider Approval of Setting the Tax Rate for the 2025-2026 School Year

Action Item

Executive Summary:

Revenues generated by the tax rate and other sources are identified by function in the District's budget. The local tax rate required to fund the proposed budget for the 2025-2026 General and Debt Service Funds are comprised of the following:

\$0.78690 Maintenance & Operations tax rate
\$0.3840 Interest & Sinking tax rate

For a total tax rate of \$1.17090. Shown is a copy of the resolution setting the ad valorem tax rate for 2025.

Recommended Motion for Action Items:

I move, that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of 1.170900, which is effectively a 26.82 percent increase in the tax rate. In the event the voters do not ratify this rate, the board hereby adopts a tax rate of \$1.0509 which is effectively a 13.82 percent increase in the tax rate.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Garland Independent School District finds that the tax for the year 2025, hereinafter levied for all lawful expenses of the school district and the carrying out of the duties and responsibilities placed upon said school district by law must be levied to provide the revenue requirements of the budget for the ensuing year; and

WHEREAS, all appropriate notices and hearings as required by Section 44.004 of the Texas Education Code have been made and done on a timely basis; and

WHEREAS, the budget adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Garland Independent School District for the 2025-2026 school year requires the levy and collection of certain ad valorem taxes for the purpose of funding the (a) maintenance and operations portion of such budget and (b) the interest and sinking fund;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Garland Independent School District that:

1. The maintenance and operations tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$0.78690 per \$100 valuation based on the Certified Estimated Values.
2. The interest and sinking fund tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$0.38400 per \$100 valuation based on the Certified Estimated Values.
3. The total tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$1.17090 per \$100 valuation based on Certified Estimated Values.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 16.49 PERCENT AND WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$120.00.

WHEREAS, all rates identified above are conditioned on the approval of the voters at the election ordered in the following agenda item. Should the voters not approve the rates set above, the Board of Trustees hereby adopt the total tax rate as follows:

1. The maintenance and operations tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$0.6669 per \$100 valuation.
2. The interest and sinking fund tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$0.3840 per \$100 valuation.
3. The total tax rate for the Garland Independent School District for the year 2025 shall be and is hereby fixed at \$1.0509 per \$100 valuation.

The rate in Paragraph 1 immediately above contains a maintenance and operations tax rate calculated with an additional rate of \$0.05 per \$100.00 of taxable value pursuant to Section 26.08(n), (n-1) of the Texas Property Tax Code.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

ORDER CALLING A VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE ELECTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 26.08
OF THE PROPERTY TAX CODE

On this the 12th day of August, 2025, the Board of Trustees of the GARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT convened in regular session with the following members present, to-wit:

constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings had by said Board of Trustees were the following:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Garland Independent School District (“the Board”) has adopted a tax rate that exceeds the District’s voter-approval tax rate; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 26.08 of the Texas Property Tax Code, the Board hereby finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable to hold a voter-approval tax rate election for and within the District to determine whether to approve the tax rate adopted by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. An election shall be held on the 4th day of November, 2025, in the Garland Independent School District, which date is seventy-eight (78) or more days from the date of the adoption hereof, and is a uniform election date pursuant to Texas Election Code, Section 41.001, for the purpose of voting for or against the following measure:

“Ratifying the ad valorem tax rate of 1.170900 in Garland Independent School District for the current year, a rate that will result in an increase of

16.49 percent in maintenance and operations tax revenue for the district for the current year as compared to the preceding year, which is an additional \$41,996,738.”

2. The ballot for the election shall be prepared and styled in accordance with the requirements of the Texas Election Code.

3. The election shall be administered by the Dallas County Elections Department and conducted as a joint election with participating entities in precincts that can be served by common polling places pursuant to Chapter 271 of the Texas Election Code: **Exhibit A**. All election judges, alternate judges, clerks, members of the early voting ballot board, central counting station officials, and other personnel designated by the Dallas County Elections Department to conduct the election in the precincts covered by this Order are hereby appointed and confirmed. The Dallas County Elections Department shall furnish all necessary election equipment, programming, ballots, and other election supplies necessary for a lawful election pursuant to the terms of the contract between the County and the District. Polling places may be combined for some precincts, pursuant to decisions by the Dallas County Elections Department.

4. The polls at the above designated polling places shall on Election Day be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

5. Heider Garcia is hereby appointed Early Voting Clerk. Early voting for the above designated election shall be held at the following locations within Garland Independent School District boundary: Makkah Masjid IDEA 3301 Buckingham Rd. Said places of early voting shall remain open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday, October 20, 2025-Friday, October 24, 2025; Saturday, October 25, 2025, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.; Sunday, October 26, 2025, from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.; Monday, October 27, 2025-Tuesday, October 31, 2025, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The Early Voting Clerk’s mailing address to which ballot applications shall be sent and where persons voting by mail shall deliver their voted ballots is Heider Garcia, Early Voting Clerk, Dallas County Elections Department, 1520 Round Table Drive, Dallas, Texas 75247. Emailed applications for Ballots may also be sent to the Early Voting Clerk at evapplications@dallascounty.org; or

DCECommunications@dallascounty.org with a copy sent to heider.garcia@dallascounty.org. Applications must be scanned and contain the voter's original signature.

The early voting locations are subject to change, based on decisions made by the Dallas County Elections Department.

6. Dr. Ricardo López, Superintendent, is authorized to contract with the County of Dallas and the Commissioners Court, or any other agency, on behalf of the School District for the carrying out of this election by the office of the Dallas County Elections Administrator in a joint election with other Dallas County government entities.

7. This Board of Trustees in conjunction with Dallas County Elections Department has determined that during this Joint Election, voters will cast their ballots on the following voting systems, that are approved by the Texas Secretary of State in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the Texas Administrative Code and hereby adopts this system for use in this election: the ES&S ExpressVote Universal Voting System Ballot Marking Devices ("BMD(s)"), and the ES&S DS200 Digital Vote Center Scanner ("Tabulators"). Each of these systems are accessible to voters with physical disabilities. Furthermore, the Elections Administrator will provide Electronic Poll Books, BMDs, Tabulators, and any other necessary equipment for this Joint Election, any Special Called Election and any related subsequent runoff elections. For Early Voting and on Election Day, the Elections Administrator will allocate voting equipment to the vote centers in amounts reasonably sufficient for the anticipated turnout of voters.

8. The manner of holding said election shall be governed, as nearly as may be, by the Election Code of this State, and the office of the Dallas County Elections Administrator shall furnish all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

9. The early voting ballots shall be processed by the Joint Election Early Voting Ballot Board appointed by Dallas County.

10. The Board of Trustees shall give notice of said election. The Board President, as the presiding officer of the Board of Trustees, is hereby authorized to execute the notice of election. The Secretary of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and instructed to post or cause to be posted said notice on the bulletin board used for posting notices of the meetings of the Board of Trustees.

Said posting shall be made at least 21 days (Tuesday, October 14, 2025) before the date of said election.

The Secretary shall also cause a copy of the election notice to be (1) posted on the District's website and (2) published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the County where the School District is located. Said newspaper publication shall be not more

than 30 days (Sunday, October 5, 2025), nor less than 10 days (Saturday, October 25, 2025) before the date of said election.

It is further found and determined that written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board located in the central administrative office in this School District, in a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and said notice, having been so posted, remained posted for the time required by law to precede the scheduled time of said meeting.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that the same does pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Board voted "AYE": Larry Glick, Johnny Beach, Linda L. PROPOSED POLICY

Note: For information related to the selection of instructional materials, see EFA.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that the District provides a wide range of library materials for students and faculty that support student achievement and present varying levels of difficulty, diversity of appeal, and a variety of points of view. This policy also provides standards for collection development and the selection and evaluation of library materials.

Collection Development Policy

In this policy, “library materials” is defined by law and may include printed and electronic library acquisitions, including online catalogs, and other ancillary or supplementary materials maintained in a campus library. [See EFB(LEGAL)]

The library collection development standards shall apply to all library materials available for use or display, including material contained in school libraries, classroom libraries, online catalogs, library mobile applications used in the District, and any other library catalog a student may access.

In developing library collections, the District shall consider the age groups, grade levels, and access to library material by all students on a campus.

Responsibility

The District shall ensure librarians, professional library staff, and other designated professional staff are trained or receive information on the proper collection development standards.

The Superintendent shall develop administrative procedures to ensure that library collections comply with applicable law, library standards, and the District’s collection development purpose and goals.

Collection Development Goals

In addition to the requirements in state law and rules, the District’s library collections shall:

1. Present multiple viewpoints related to controversial issues [see EMB regarding instruction about controversial issues].
2. Provide a wide range of background information that will enable students to make intelligent decisions in their daily lives.
3. Include accurate and authentic factual content from authoritative sources.
4. Have a high degree of potential user appeal and interest.

5. Offer a global perspective that promotes equity of access, including print and nonprint materials such as electronic and multimedia, to meet the needs of individual learners.
6. Represent diverse viewpoints and cultural groups of the state and their contributions to the state, the nation, and the world, to ensure the collection embodies the background of all students.

Recommendation
and Procurement of
Materials

Library materials shall be recommended and procured in accordance with guidelines adopted by the Texas State Library and Archives Commission and the District standards and priorities expressed in this policy.

Librarians and other professional staff shall develop recommendations to be presented to the Board. The librarians and other professional staff shall ensure that the materials:

1. Enrich and support the TEKS and the state and local curriculum, taking into consideration students' varied interests, maturity levels, abilities, and learning styles.
2. Foster growth in factual knowledge, literary appreciation, aesthetic values, and societal standards.
3. Encourage the enjoyment of reading, foster high-level thinking skills, support personal learning, and encourage discussion based on rational analysis.
4. Represent ethnic, religious, and cultural groups of the state and their contributions to the state, the nation, and the world.

The Superintendent shall ensure that administrative procedures regarding the development of recommendations of library materials consider at least two of the following factors:

1. Recommendations from students, parents or guardians, teachers, and District residents.
2. Consultation with District teachers and library staff.
3. Consultation with library staff from other districts.
4. Extensive review of the library material.
5. Context of the library material, including overall fit within the existing collection and support of District curriculum.
6. Reviews of the library material from sources such as professional journals in library science, recognized professional education or content journals with book reviews, national and state award recognition lists, library science field

experts, and highly acclaimed author and literacy expert recommendations.

7. Coverage of topics, authors, series, or genres that fill gaps in the school library collection.

The Board shall consider the list of library materials that have been donated or proposed by the administration for procurement. Each Board member may propose changes before the Board takes action on the list of donated or proposed library materials.

The Board shall either approve or reject the library materials that have been donated or proposed for procurement.

Donated and
Proposed
Procurement List

At least 30 days prior to the Board's vote to accept donated library materials or approve procurement of library materials, the Superintendent shall make accessible to the public the list of library materials in accordance with law.

Access Plan

The District shall allow efficient parental access to the District's library and any available online catalogs.

Online catalogs shall be publicly available. The District shall publish information about library material titles, including how and where material can be accessed.

Each campus shall communicate the following to parents and guardians:

- Access to policies relating to school libraries and library materials;
- Consistent access to library materials and resources; and
- Opportunities for students, parents and guardians, educators, and community members to provide feedback on library materials and services.

Parental
Involvement

Parents and guardians are the primary decision-makers regarding their child's access to library material. In general, a student is afforded the opportunity to self-select library materials as part of literacy development and the library program. District staff may assist a student in selecting library material; however, the ultimate determination of appropriateness remains with the student and parent or guardian. Parents and guardians are encouraged to communicate with the campus librarian and their child's teacher about special considerations regarding library materials self-selected by their child.

In accordance with state law and administrative procedures, parents or guardians may submit to the principal or a staff member

designated by the principal a list of library materials that the parent's or guardian's child shall not be allowed to check out or access for use outside of the school library. The Superintendent shall develop procedures that permit a parent or guardian to submit the request in at least one of the methods permitted by law.

The parent or guardian may select alternative library materials for their child. [For information on parental rights regarding instructional materials and other instructional resources, see EFA(LLEGAL).]

The District shall focus on maximizing transparency with parents while meeting student needs and providing enrichment opportunities with library materials. Parental involvement in library acquisition, maintenance, and campus activities is encouraged.

*Access
Procedures*

School Library

A parent or guardian who wishes to access a school's library shall first submit a request to the principal. The principal or a staff member designated by the principal shall work with the parent or guardian to determine a time to access the library that will not interfere with the delivery of instruction or disrupt student use of library services.

Library Catalog

A parent or guardian who wishes to access the catalog of library materials for any school in the District shall submit a written request to the school's principal. The principal or a staff member designated by the principal shall respond to the request in accordance with administrative procedures.

Protection from
Inappropriate
Material

In accordance with law and guidance from the Texas State Library and Archives Commission, library materials shall not include "harmful material"; any library material that is pervasively vulgar or educationally unsuitable; any library material containing indecent or profane content; any library material that refers a person to a website, including by use of a link or QR code, containing content legally prohibited under law; or any other material legally prohibited from inclusion in a public school library. [See EFB(LLEGAL)]

Obscene material is not protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.

Library materials shall comply with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA), including technology protection measures. [See CQ]

**Challenge of Library
Material**

A District employee, a parent or guardian of a District student, or District resident may challenge library material maintained in the District's library program.

Guiding Principles	<p>The following principles shall guide the review of a challenge of library material:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="552 373 1435 552">1. An individual may challenge library material used in the District's library program, despite the fact that the professional staff and the Board followed the proper procedure and adhered to the objectives and criteria for recommending and procuring library materials set out in this policy.<li data-bbox="552 569 1435 642">2. Access to challenged material shall be restricted during the challenge process. <p>In addition to compliance with state law and this policy, a criterion for the final decision on challenged library materials is the appropriateness of the material for its intended use. No challenged library material shall be removed solely because of the ideas expressed in the library material or the personal background of the library material's author or the personal background of the characters in the material.</p>
Informal Challenge	<p>When the District or a campus receives an objection to the appropriateness of a library material, the appropriate librarian or administrator shall try to resolve the matter informally. The librarian or administrator shall explain the selection process and discuss the intended purpose for the library material.</p> <p>The librarian or administrator shall offer a concerned parent or guardian an alternative library material to be used by the child in place of the material and, if requested, shall restrict the child's access to the material objected to by the parent or guardian.</p> <p>If the individual wishes to make a formal challenge, the administrator shall make available to the individual a copy of this policy and the form to request a formal challenge of the library material.</p>
Formal Challenge	<p>The District shall make the Texas Education Agency form to challenge library material available on the District's website.</p> <p>If a District employee, a parent or guardian of a District student, or a District resident wishes to challenge library material, they shall follow the procedures to complete and submit the challenge form.</p> <p>After a challenge form is submitted, the form shall be provided to the Superintendent. Copies of the form shall be provided to the school librarian, the Board, and any other staff designated in administrative procedures.</p>
<i>Challenge Committee</i>	<p>The Superintendent shall appoint a challenge committee and notify committee members in accordance with administrative procedures.</p>

The challenge committee shall include the librarian and at least one member of the instructional staff who is familiar with the material's content. Other members of the committee may include District-level staff, secondary-level students, parents or guardians, and any other appropriate individuals.

The District shall provide members of the committee the relevant materials to review in accordance with the deadlines established in administrative procedures and in accordance with law.

Any meeting of the committee must comply with the meeting requirements under Education Code 33.024(g) and (h), including required notices, meeting minutes, audio or video recordings, and submission of minutes and audio or video recordings of the meeting to the District.

All members of the committee shall review the challenged library material in its entirety and determine whether the material conforms to this policy and whether the material will continue to be available in the library. The committee shall prepare a written report of its findings.

The Superintendent, the school librarian, the individual submitting the challenge, and any other appropriate staff shall receive a copy of the committee's report.

Appeal

An individual who submitted a challenge may appeal the decision to the Board. The individual must provide the notice of appeal in accordance with administrative procedures.

The Board shall hear the appeal and render a decision in accordance with the timelines established in law.

When considering the appeal, the Board shall consider the factors in Education Code 33.027(f). The Board shall consider appeals in accordance with timelines set out in law.

*Frequency of
Review*

After a library material has been challenged and the Board determines not to remove the library material from a school library catalog, it may not be challenged again before the second anniversary of the Board's final decision not to remove the material.

Removal of Library
Materials

If a challenge to a library material results in the removal of the library material from the school library catalog, each teacher assigned as the classroom teacher at the grade level for which the library material was removed shall be notified and instructed to remove any copy of the library material from the teacher's classroom library, if applicable.

**Maintenance of
Library Materials**

In accordance with state guidelines and District administrative procedures, collections shall be evaluated and updated regularly based on the collections' age, relevance, diversity, and variety. The Superintendent shall ensure administrative procedures are established for regular maintenance of the library collection on each campus. Standard maintenance procedures for any library collection include repair, replacement, and removal of materials as necessary. Regular maintenance shall also include scheduled inventories of the collection. Disposal of any District-owned library materials shall be in accordance with District policy and procedures. [See CI]

Gifts and Donations

The Board shall accept gifts and donations of library materials with the understanding that the use and disposition of the materials and monies will be in accordance with District policy and the selection criteria noted above. [See CDC]

Policy Review

This policy shall be reviewed at least every three years and revised as necessary.

Persons Age 21 and Over

The District shall not admit into its public schools any person age 21 or over unless otherwise required by law.

Underage Students

Except as required by law, the District shall not admit an underage student.

Registration Forms

The student's parent, legal guardian, or other person having lawful control shall annually complete registration forms. A student who has reached age 18 shall be permitted to complete these forms.

Proof of Residency

In accordance with administrative regulations, the parent, guardian, or other person having lawful control of the student under order of a court shall present proof of residency. A copy of the validation document for residency shall be placed in the student's permanent record file. The District shall accept the following types of records as proof of residency:

1. A current contract or lease agreement for a dwelling within the District boundaries.
2. A current utility bill (water, gas, electricity) for an address within the District boundaries.
3. A current mortgage payment document for a dwelling within the District boundaries.
4. Written or verbal verification from an on-site supervisor of managed property that a student and/or either a parent or a legal guardian resides at the complex, which is located within the District boundaries.
5. A notarized affidavit stating that a student and/or either a parent or a legal guardian resides within the District boundaries with another homeowner/lessee. The affidavit shall be accompanied by a residency validation document for the homeowner/lessee.

For guidelines governing an interdistrict transfer for a student whose parent or guardian has a contract for a residence within District boundaries, see policy FDA.

In accordance with law, the District may make reasonable inquiries to determine whether the student is a resident of the District, including when a document submitted for purposes of proving residency is not in the name of the adult who is enrolling the student. Based on an individual's circumstance, the District may grant exceptions to the requirement to produce a document listed above. When required by law, the District shall waive the requirement to prove residency in the District boundaries.

Minor Living Apart

Person Standing in
Parental Relation

A minor student residing in the District but whose parent, guardian, or other person having lawful control under a court order does not reside in the District shall present a power of attorney or an authorization agreement as provided in Chapter 34 of the Family Code assigning responsibility for the student in all school-related matters to an adult resident of the District.

Misconduct

A minor student living apart who has engaged in misconduct that results in any of the consequences found in Education Code 25.001(d) shall not be permitted to attend a District school.

Exceptions

Based on an individual student's circumstance, the Superintendent shall have authority to grant exceptions to the requirement for a power of attorney or authorization agreement and to the exclusion for misconduct.

Extracurricular
Activities

The Superintendent shall determine whether a minor student living apart is present in the District for the primary purpose of participating in extracurricular activities.

**Students Not
Enrolled**

A student enrolled in a private school, including a home-school, shall not be eligible for concurrent enrollment in the District nor for participation in curricular or extracurricular activities. [See EEL and FM]

**Nonresident Student
in Grandparent's
After-School Care**

The parent and grandparent of a nonresident student requesting admission under Education Code 25.001(b)(9) shall provide to the Superintendent the required information on the grandparent's residency and complete a form provided by the District describing the extent of after-school care to be provided by the grandparent.

The Superintendent shall have authority to approve or deny such admissions requests in accordance with criteria adopted by the Board.

"Accredited" Defined

For the purposes of this policy, "accredited" shall be defined as accreditation by TEA, an equivalent agency from another state, or an accrediting association recognized by the commissioner of education.

**Grade-Level
Placement**

Accredited Schools

The parent, guardian, or other person having lawful control of a student enrolling in a District school from an accredited public, private, or parochial school shall provide evidence of the prior schooling outside the District. The student shall be placed initially at the grade level reached elsewhere, pending observation by the classroom teacher, guidance personnel, and the principal. On the basis of these observations and results of tests that may be administered by appropriate District personnel, the principal shall determine the final grade placement.

Nonaccredited
Schools

A student enrolling in a District school from a nonaccredited public, private, or parochial school, including a homeschool, shall be placed initially at the discretion of the principal, pending observation by classroom teachers, guidance personnel, and the principal. Criteria for placement may include:

1. Scores on achievement tests, which may be administered by appropriate District personnel.
2. Recommendation of the sending school.
3. Prior academic record.
4. Chronological age and social and emotional development of the student.
5. Other criteria deemed appropriate by the principal.

Transfer of Credit
Accredited Texas
Public Schools

Credit toward state graduation requirements earned in an accredited public school district in Texas shall be transferable and recognized by the District.

Other Accredited or
Nonaccredited
Schools

Before recognizing credit in a course earned in an accredited non-public school, an accredited school outside of Texas, or a nonaccredited school, appropriate personnel shall evaluate a student's records and transcript. The District may require the student to demonstrate mastery of the content or use alternative methods to verify course content for the award of credit.

Transition
Assistance

In accordance with law, when a student who is identified as homeless or in substitute care enrolls in the District, the District shall assess the student's available records and other relevant information to ensure credit, including proportionate credit, is awarded appropriately for all subjects and courses taken prior to enrollment.

Withdrawal

A parent or guardian wishing to withdraw a minor student shall present a signed statement that includes the reason for the withdrawal. A student who is 18 or older may submit a withdrawal statement without a parent's or guardian's signature.

The District shall make no distinction between absences for UIL activities and absences for other extracurricular activities approved by the Board. A student shall be allowed in a school year a maximum of ~~ten~~ **10** extracurricular absences not related to post-district competition, a maximum of five absences for post-district competition prior to state, and a maximum of two absences for state competition.

Executive Summary:

HB 1481 from the 89th Legislative session requires school districts to adopt a policy prohibiting student use of personal communication devices such as any type of cell phone, tablet, smartwatch, radio device, or other electronic device capable of telecommunication or digital communication on school property during the school day, and to include disciplinary measures for violations. HB 1481 also allows for disciplinary measures for violations.

School-issued devices are not considered personal communication devices and will continue to be provided for instructional purposes. The policy does allow the use of personal communication devices when needed to implement a student's IEP, for a documented medical need based on a physician's directive, or as necessary to comply with health and safety requirements imposed by law or the district's safety protocols.

PROPOSED POLICY

Note: For searches of personal communication devices or other personal electronic devices, see FNF.

Personal Communication Devices

In this policy “personal communication device” means a telephone, cell phone, tablet, smartwatch, radio device, paging device, or any other electronic device capable of telecommunication or digital communication. The term does not include an electronic device provided to a student by the District. Tex. Educ. Code § 37.082(d).

A student shall not use a personal communication device on school property during the school day. While on school property, the student shall store any personal communication device in accordance with administrative regulations.

A student who violates this policy or any regulations shall be subject to discipline in accordance with the Board-adopted Student Code of Conduct.

An authorized District employee shall confiscate a student’s personal communication device that is used in violation of this policy or any applicable regulations.

A confiscated personal telecommunications device shall be released for a fee determined by the Board or Superintendent. In accordance with the student handbook, the student or the student’s parents may retrieve the device after paying the fee.

If a personal communication device is not retrieved, the District shall dispose of the device after providing the notice required by law.

Exceptions

A student shall be authorized to use a personal communication device on school property during the school day only under the following circumstances:

1. The student’s use is necessary for implementation of the student’s individualized education program, a 504 plan, or a similar program or plan;
2. The student’s use is required due to a documented need based on a directive from a qualified physician; or
3. The student’s use is necessary to comply with a health or safety requirement imposed by law or as part of the District or campus safety protocols.

Use Involving Serious
Misconduct

If a personal communication device is used during the school day in connection with any of the following, the device may be held until the end of the academic year:

- Drug-related activity (e.g., use, possession, distribution, or coordination)
- Violent behavior or threats
- Major campus disruption
- Unauthorized recording of students or staff, such as recording a fight
- Bullying, cyberbullying, or harassment
- Refusal to comply with directives to surrender the device (see below)

In addition to confiscation of the device, consequences for violations will be assigned in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct and may range from In-School Suspension (ISS) to Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) or placement in a Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP), depending on the severity of the offense.

Implementation

The Superintendent shall develop regulations to implement this policy.

Compliance

Annually, the Superintendent shall report to the Board on the implementation and compliance of this policy.
