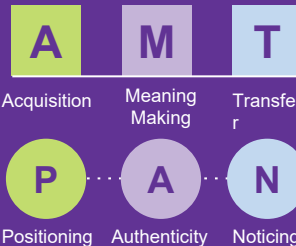

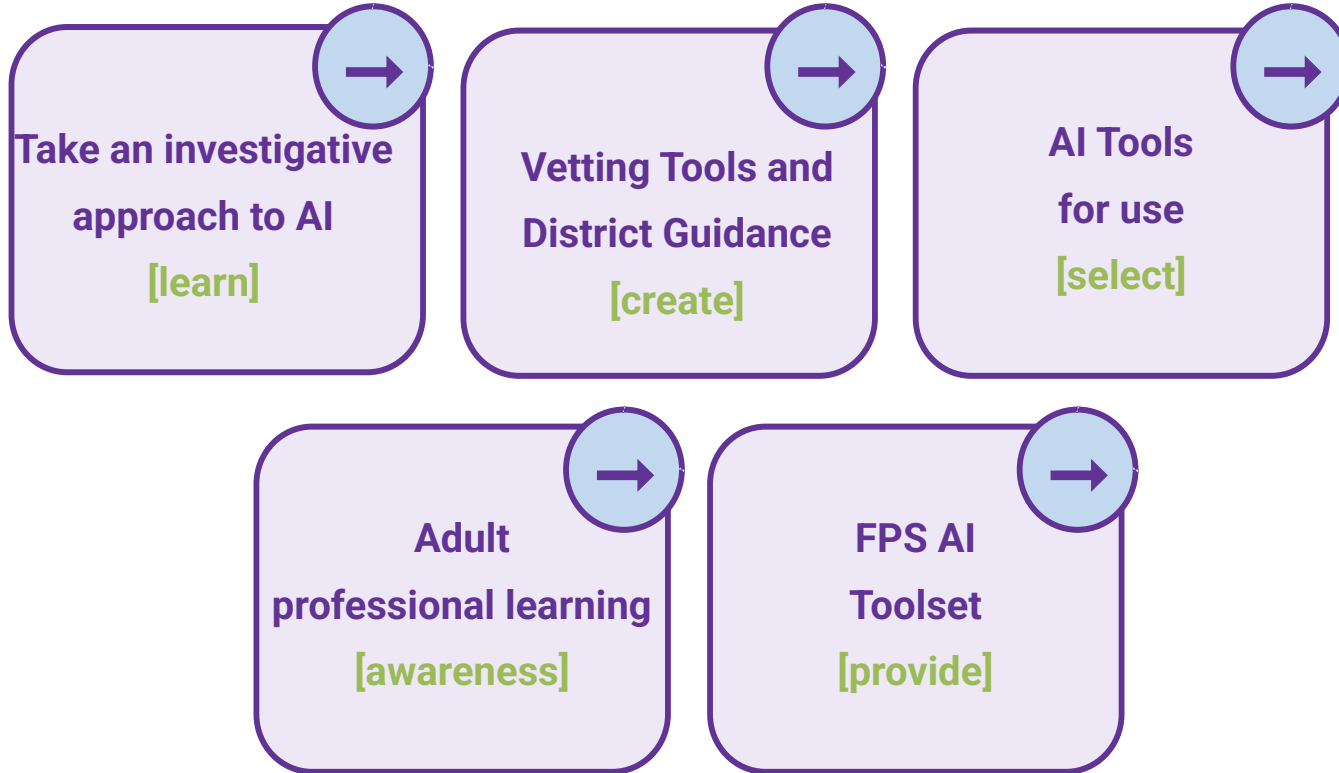

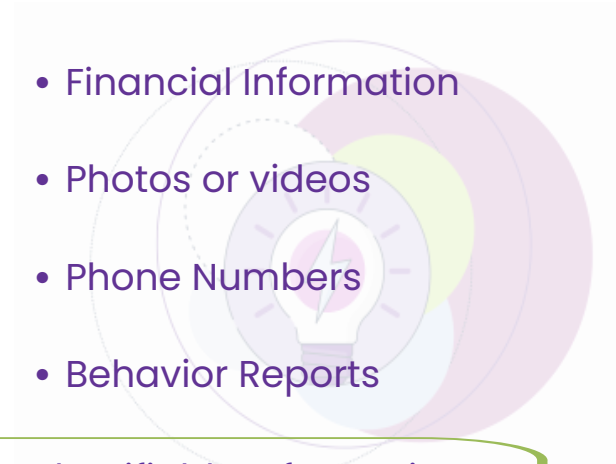

Disclosure Statement

A disclosure statement is an informal statement that **acknowledges** where and how AI was incorporated. If an assignment doesn't require formal citations but AI assistance was used, a disclosure statement should be included in the following placements:

- AI Credits section at the end of the assignment
- Within the text
- Beneath an image, etc.

Example disclosure statements (these can be tailored per teacher discretion)

- "Created by John Doe with editing assistance from ChatGPT" (Mar 7 version)
- "I used Copilot to help me brainstorm ideas for my project". (Feb 12 version)
- "I used ChatGPT to help me organize my thoughts into a finished product"
- "Image created in partnership with Adobe Firefly. Prompt: 'create a cartoonish image of a bored frog on a lily pad, surrounded by cattails. 16:9 Make it bright and colorful so that young children would enjoy it.'"

1. Policy 2005 – Behavior - Personal Electronic Devices (Update 19.01) Memo - March 2025	
Current FPS Policy Language	Proposed Adopted Language
Personal Electronic Devices Students may possess an electronic device while in school, but subject to the rules for use developed in each building. Building rules are to be designed by administration and staff members and may also include other stakeholders. While a student is in attendance at a school-sponsored activity or event, the devices may only be used in accordance with the building rules. Where use of an electronic device is permitted, students are expected to fully recognize and respect the privacy and confidentiality rights of their fellow students. A student who is given permission to use an electronic communication device, or a recording device, at school, may only use the device in a manner that is consistent with the narrow permission that has been granted. Device is defined as a privately-owned wireless and/or portable electronic handheld equipment that includes, but is not limited to, existing and emerging mobile communication systems and smart technologies, portable internet devices, hand held entertainment systems or portable information technology systems that can be used for word processing, wireless internet access, image capture/recording, sound recording and information transmitting/receiving/storing, etc. Students may not use personal electronic devices to broadcast or record audio, images, or video of any student, staff member, or other person in the school or while attending a school-related activity, unless the student has received permission from the person(s) to be broadcasted or recorded. This prohibition does not apply to curricular or extra-curricular activities for which personal recording is generally permitted (e.g., athletic events, arts performances, etc.). Students violating this policy are subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct. Devices operated in violation of this policy or a building rule, or for any illegal purpose, shall be confiscated and not returned until, where appropriate, a person(s)/guardian(s) conference has been held. The District shall not be responsible for any electronic device that is lost, stolen, or confiscated.	No Changes.

2. Policy 4003 *NEW* – Conditions of Employment - Employees and Recording Devices (add to the remainder of the existing Policy 4003 – Conditions of Employment).	
Current FPS Policy Language	Proposed Adopted Language
<i>No current policy exists.</i>	Personal Electronic Devices – Recording and Broadcasting For purposes of this Policy, “personal electronic device” means a privately owned device that is used for audio, video, or text communications, including cell phones, personal laptops, smartwatches and other wireless device connections. Employees may not use personal electronic devices to broadcast or record audio, images, or video of any student or staff member(s) during the instructional day, unless the employee has received permission from the student’s parent or staff member(s) to broadcast or record. This prohibition does not apply to curricular or extra-curricular activities for which personal recording is generally permitted (e.g., athletic events, arts performances, etc.).

Subject: Warming Cabinets

The Nutrition Services Department is requesting approval to purchase eight new food warming units for the following locations: Longacre Elementary (1), Hillside Elementary (1), Forest Elementary (1), Lanigan Elementary (1), and Farmington Early Childhood Center (4). Four units will supplement existing equipment due to increased hot food storage needs at the elementary level. The remaining four new units are necessary to support an updated meal delivery system at Farmington Early Childhood Center.

Four competitive bids were solicited, with pricing ranging from \$79,962 to \$84,831. The recommended vendor is Gold Star Products, which submitted the lowest bid at \$79,962.28. Pricing is guaranteed through December 24, 2025. Delivery of the equipment is scheduled for January 2026.

If approved by the Board, the purchase will be funded through the Nutrition Services Fund.

Introduction. Annually, the Oakland County School Boards Association (OCSBA) Government Relations Committee (GRC) establishes Legislative Priorities for the current legislative session. The Resolutions and Bylaws Committee then reviews the adopted legislative priorities and drafts new resolutions &/or amendments to previously adopted resolutions based on those legislative priorities. When there is alignment with MASB and/or NSBA resolutions, the MASB/NSBA resolution information is referenced.

Once reviewed by the Board of Directors, the proposed resolutions are presented to our member districts for consideration. Member School Districts only vote on proposed new or amended resolutions; continuing resolutions are not subject to re-vote. Resolutions that are approved by at least nineteen (19) Member School Districts shall be the official position of the Association as interpreted and pursued by its Board of Directors. Each Member District receives one (1) vote on the proposed Resolutions.

Voting Period. The proposed resolutions, legislative priorities and a ballot were transmitted to every Member and all Member School District Executive Assistants on November 18, 2025. The voting period shall remain open for at least forty (40) calendar days. **Completed ballots must be received no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, January 9, 2026.**

Important! This ballot must be completed, signed and returned to OCSBAboard@ocsba-mi.org prior to the deadline or your District's vote cannot be counted! OCSBA bylaws Article III, Section 2: Member School District votes shall be recorded upon receipt of the completed resolution or ballot indicating the vote of the Member School District's Trustees. Member School District votes must be received prior to the deadline indicated on the ballot or resolution.
