We have been participating in the district online professional development. These have been good for teach development and supporting best practice.



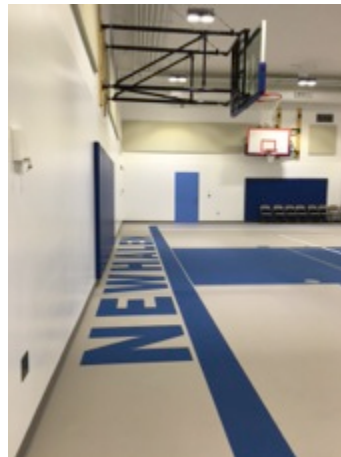

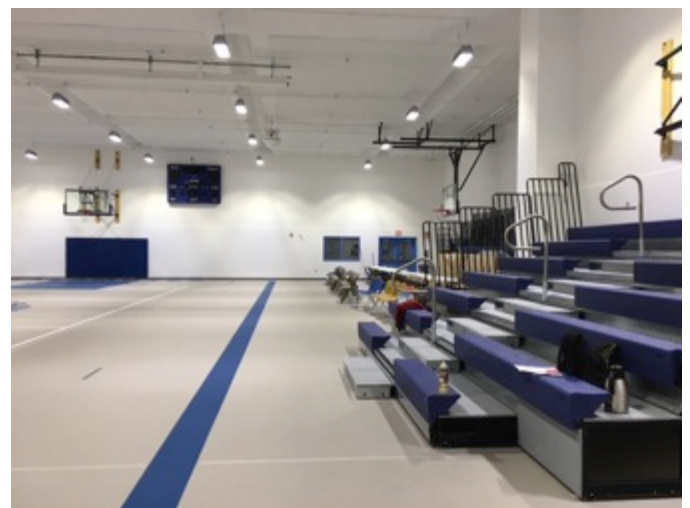

**Re: 2017 Impact Aid application information**

In accordance with Federal law the School District is providing the following information related to its 2017 Impact Aid Application.

The Lake and Peninsula School District has made an application to the U.S. Department of Education for Impact Aid funding available to school districts that have students whose parents live on Indian (Alaskan Native) Lands. The district's application indicates that 183 students out of 356 students district-wide are eligible for Impact Aid funding. A copy of the complete application is on file and available for review at each of the District's schools and the District Office in King Salmon. This summary of the application is being sent to Village Councils, Village Corporations and Regional Native Corporations within the District.

As required by federal law, the district informs Parents, Village Councils, Village Corporations and Regional Corporations of the application and ensures that parents and officials of these organizations have the opportunity to comment on student's equal participation in the district's educational programs, the educational programs and any planned modification of these programs.

While the District has not planned any modification in the delivery of its educational programs we encourage you to attend any local school advisory committee (LSAC) meeting to express any concerns related to the equal participation of students in educational programs and to provide input into the planning and development of educational programs.

The Lake and Peninsula School District Board will be reviewing information and comments received from the Local School Advisory Committees, parents and representative of other interested organizations at the October 2015 School Board meeting. As indicated above, you are invited and encouraged to provide direct comment to the School Board on educational programs and student participation in those programs. Personnel/Staffing for 16/17: Pat Manning graced us with his presence and called in for this section of the teleconference. Tate would like to be our Head teacher next year, working with AJ and Jeff splitting the elementary classroom. The DO reassured us that we will have a 3<sup>rd</sup> teacher for us next year, that person has not been identified yet.

New Business: New Zealand family slide shows to be shown at the next LSAC. Movie Night schedule was made and online classes were brought to our attention.

During discussion about online classes, LSAC voted against it. Many members of the community spoke out against it and Tate decided he would send out an email for online voting. Working on Algebra and graphing and a lot of chemistry and science. He handed out a pocket sized Periodic Table for those in attendance. The LSAC commented on how happy we were that the Gooden family was back with us and thanked them for their wonderful approach at teaching and guiding our children.
