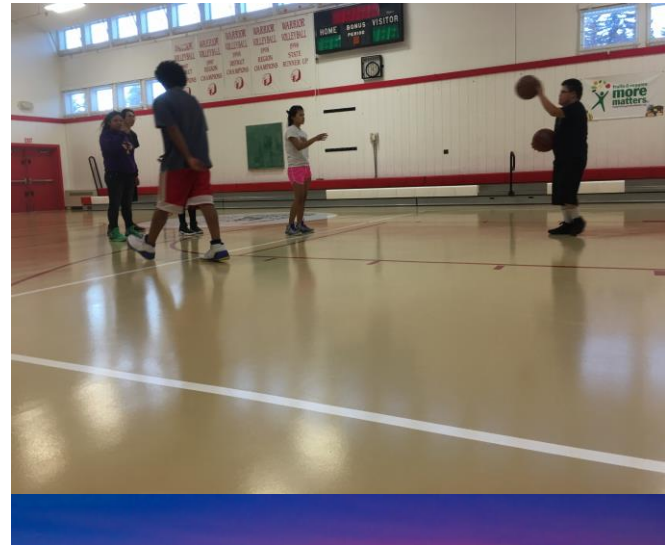
Staffing

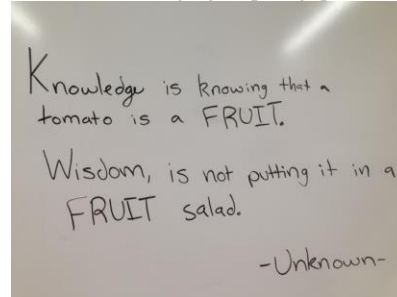
TECHNOLOGY PROGRESS:

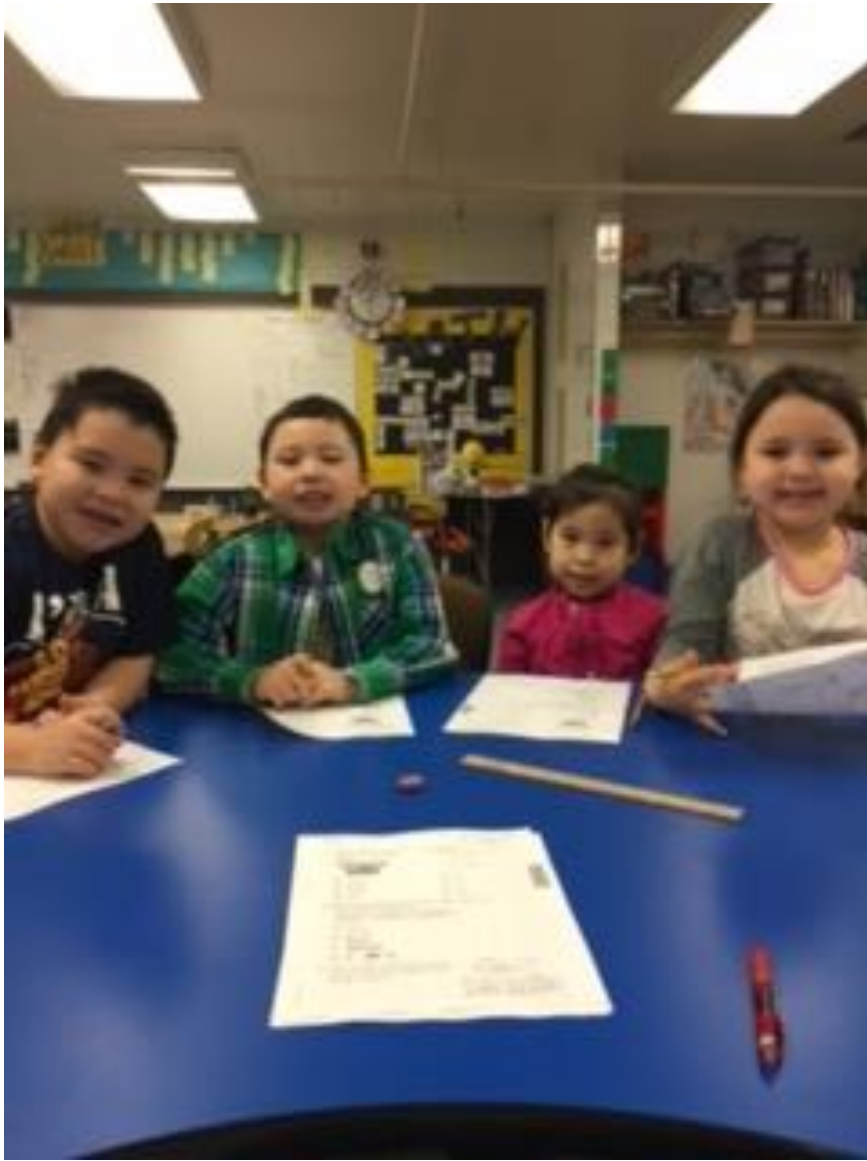


PERSONNEL:

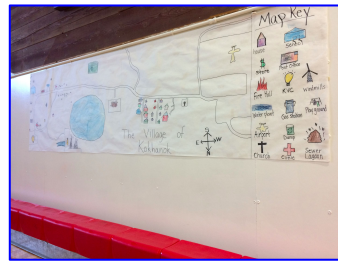

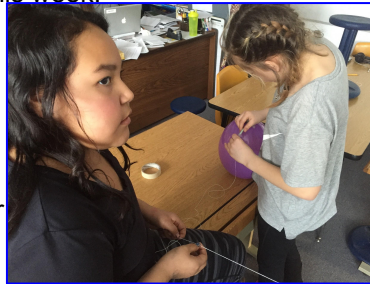
