## **7. Hillside Presentation**

Hillside Principal Jones welcomed the Board of Education and reviewed the agenda for the evening. The highlights tonight include a PTSA Update, a Student Leadership Overview, and Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics.

## **8. Superintendent's Report/Update**

- a) The Board presented Above and Beyond the Call of Duty Awards to, staff nominated by peers, students, or parents in the community. The staff honored tonight include Nurit Foster, Stacey Griswold, Lorri Kingsbury, Bill Jones, Kari Wegienka, Min Yoo, and Joyce Pianin.
- b) Ms. Santer provided an update on the possibility of a Pre-K GSRP classroom(s). The district has applied and the application is under review. If approved, the classrooms will be made up of 4 year olds, 5 days a week. The income requirements have changes which makes the program likely to be able to fill. The classrooms will be housed at Old Village School and Ridge Wood.
- c) A Wellness Committee update was provided and included a brief description of who is on the committee, the agenda for the first meeting, and the next steps.
- d) Dr. Webber shared feedback from the Finals Site Stakeholder visits that took place last week.
- e) Ms. Pek explained how the E-Hall Pass system works and why the middle school and high school administration is interested in implementing the system. The E-Hall pass would Monitor Student Movement for Safety, Allow Staff to Focus on Critical Areas, Identify Students Needing Support, and Analyze Lost Instructional Time. The desire is to pilot a few different systems and select one for the 25-26 school year.
- f) Michigan Education Foundation Meeting Overview was provided by Dr. Webber. He joined Ms. Mitchell with the Northville Educational Foundation in Okemos as a partner for NPS.
- g) Dr. Webber updated the Board on Grading Practices and where that initiative is headed. He shared the five guidelines that came out of the first year of the grading practices committee.

- h) A brief Bond 2023 Update was provided by Mr. Kling and Mr. Banchero. The cafeteria addition at Amerman is underway and the next big thing is the office addition construction prep. At NHS the baseball softball fields are almost complete. At Meads Mill the construction journey will begin. Sitework will start during Spring Break. He shared a project update for the other buildings and included a timeline for upcoming work.
- i) Mr. Kling noted the 2020 Sinking Fund will need to be renewed as it expires in December of this year and the Board will have the opportunity to weigh in on the ballot language at the April 15<sup>th</sup> Committee of the Whole meeting.

RESA salutes, celebrates, and recognizes each of the women throughout this great county, state, nation, and especially those inside of our schools/districts, and within the RESA organization.
- RESA highlights the Livonia Early Childhood Center where Governor Whitmer took a tour and held a press conference recognizing the early childhood enrollment numbers in Michigan and the great work taking place in the Pre-K for all initiative in the Great Start Readiness Programs (GSRP). Livonia represented excellence at every turn hosting the tour for the Governor and her team and the Executive Director of MiLEAP, Dr. Beverly Walker-Griffea, and members from the MiLEAP team. Dr. Walker-Griffea has requested additional visits to GSRP programs in Wayne County. Visits will be scheduled in May for the MiLEAP team to continue to hear from GSRP providers, their students and families about the excitement around preschool and how we can look forward to removing barriers for families as we continue to ensure that all four year olds in Wayne County are connected to free, high quality, research based programming for early childhood.

- Kudos to the team who planned and executed the RESA All Staff meeting held February 28, 2025 which received rave reviews. Author Shawn Achor spoke about The Happiness Advantage/Orange Frog initiative. There were budget and legislative updates along with a breakout session of gratitude where staff members shared gratitude for others inside the organization. We look forward to the Fall meeting with presentations by each department.
- The School Finance Research Foundation (SFRF) released the Michigan Schools Facilities Study report the morning of March 19, 2025 to reporting agencies consisting of Senator Darrin Camilleri, Chair, Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on PreK-12; Representative Tim Kelly, Chair, House Appropriations Subcommittee on School Aid and Department of Education; the state budget director, the House and Senate fiscal agencies, and State Superintendent, Dr. Michael Rice. The report shows less than 1% of the school buildings in this state are in need of being replaced versus repaired. We should be excited about the stewardship of the dollars that districts raise and how districts are maintaining facilities, some that are extremely aged, at the best of their ability with the dollars that they receive. The hope from this report is that schools and districts will be appropriately funded in terms of capital needs. A media press conference will be held on March 20, 2025.
- The RESA Board will hold a Study Session immediately following the April Board meeting for the purpose of accreditation. Cognia would like feedback from the Board of Education as RESA continues the accreditation process.
- As things continue to change in our country, Wayne RESA will continue to follow both federal and state laws and where there is conflict in the language, we will seek clarity from the attorney general and continue to seek legal counsel. **NORTHVILLE YOUTH NETWORK PROGRAM REPORT  
March 2025**

**PROGRAMS, SERVICES & COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS**

This month, we held two successful Wellness Wednesday workshops. ***Finding Balance: Managing Expectations & Self-Care*** with nine youth in grades 6–8 at Meads Mill Middle School was facilitated by Kristie Wyler, MA, LLP, from McCaskill Family Services, and helped students learn how to balance the many demands of adolescence—including academic, social, and family responsibilities—while prioritizing their health and happiness. The program focused on practical stress management and self-care skills. ***Zumba Kids – Wellness in Action*** had 11 youth ages 5-9 in a high-energy class where they worked on teamwork, communication, and community building skills through movement, music, and fun interactive activities. We also completed two cohorts of ***Teen Talk*** and ***Project Respect***, with five and four participants, respectively. These restorative practice programs have been instrumental in helping youth understand and define their personal values and goals. Participants learn how their decisions and choices impact their future, ensuring alignment with their values and aspirations. Additionally, the programs emphasize the broader impact of their actions on others, fostering a deeper sense of responsibility and empathy. We also continue to make improvements to the curriculum based on participant feedback. And we facilitated a 6.5-hour training session of Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) with a cohort of six participants that included Northville parents and school staff, a police officer, a youth pastor, and an individual from a local non-profit that serves Northville youth. We are excited to offer this training opportunity to equip those individuals who are in regular contact with youth in our community with the skills to support their needs.

We opened registration for CAMP Hillside/Meads Mill with a “soft recruitment” period where I work with elementary school social workers to identify youth with higher needs, giving them an opportunity to register for the program before registration opens for all participants. We have had great success with this targeted early registration making sure that our youth who can benefit the most from this impactful program are included. I also was appointed to the newly formed Wellness Committee of Northville Public Schools that is charged with developing the district’s wellness policy and recommending strategies to support student holistic wellbeing. I look forward to this opportunity to further strengthen our partnership with NPS.

Finally, we participated in NTPD training of new officers and a NCPD roll call to orient and update officers on NYN programs and services to support their juvenile interactions and the referral process.

**GENERAL OPERATIONS**

We were honored to receive a donation from Meadowbrook Congregational Church in the amount of \$750.00. Donations like these from the community affirm the importance of our work and it’s quite heartening to see it be recognized and supported in this manner. We also completed a second draft of the strategic plan and presented it to the Strategic Planning Sub-Committee of the NYN Commission for review.

I also met with ITAC staff to discuss program marketing and social media promotion ideas. These meetings are helpful to increase awareness of NYN programs and services.

### YOUTH SUPPORT SERVICES

The tables on the next page indicate the status of referrals for March. The first table outlines the number of clients who are new, in progress, or have been discharged during this period. The second table provides a detailed breakdown of Youth Assistance Program (diversion program) referrals by reason, as well as behavioral health support referrals from all other sources (e.g., parent or school) by reason and type.

During March, staff collectively held 13 individual appointments with referred youth and/or parents.

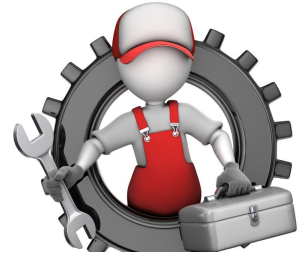
