PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, dated August 11, 2025 by and between Frontier Cooperative Company, the "Seller" and Osceola Public Schools, the "Buyer" is made under the following terms:

1. Seller owns the following described real estate:

Osceola – LOTS 1-18 (LESS SW 60' X 150') BLK 13 & 1/2 VACATED VALLEY ST MORNINGSIDE ADDITION OSCEOLA more or less, as depicted on the attached aerial map.

2. Seller agrees to sell and convey to Buyer, and Buyer agrees to purchase approximately the parcel in Osceola, NE, as depicted on the attached aerial map. A survey will be up to the Buyer. Buyer and Seller will cooperate in determining the exact boundaries. Costs of said survey to be paid by Buyer. Seller and Buyer will each pay 1/2 of the cost of title insurance and escrow closing costs.
3. This purchase is conditioned upon Seller having marketable title to said real estate in fee simple. Seller agrees to obtain a release of this parcel from any and all mortgages, deeds of trust, liens and other encumbrances (except easements of record). Seller agrees to furnish an Owner's title insurance policy ensuring marketability.
4. Should any title defects exist, the Seller shall have a reasonable time after receipt of the title commitment to correct all such defects. Conveyances shall be by warranty deed free and clear from any and all liens, encumbrances, special assessments levied or assessed as of the date of the title insurance commitment, but subject to all easements, restrictions of record and applicable zoning & building regulations, as of the date of the title commitment, against such real estate.
5. For the above-described real estate, Buyer agrees to pay the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00), payable as follows paid with certified funds at closing.
6. OTHER TERMS.
 - a. Taxes: Seller shall pay all real estate taxes and assessments for the year 2025, and for all prior years, on or before the closing date. Documentary transfer tax due upon filing the deed shall be paid by the Seller.

- b. Environmental: To the best of Seller's knowledge, Seller is not aware of any adverse environmental condition on the above property which would give rise to liability for environmental cleanup or correction. All improvements on the property are sold in their condition "as is".
7. Full possession of said premises shall be given to Buyer on closing date. This agreement shall in no manner be construed to convey the property nor shall it be construed to give Buyer any present right of possession. Risk of loss or damage to the property, prior to the closing date shall rest with the Seller.
8. It is agreed that time is an essential element of this contract. In the event Buyer fails to consummate this purchase, Seller may, at Seller's option avail themselves of such other legal remedies as may be available to Seller. Neither Buyer or Seller may assign all or part of any rights and obligations accruing under this agreement to another party without the agreement of the other party. This agreement shall be binding on the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of each party.

SELLER'S ACCEPTANCE AND RECEIPT

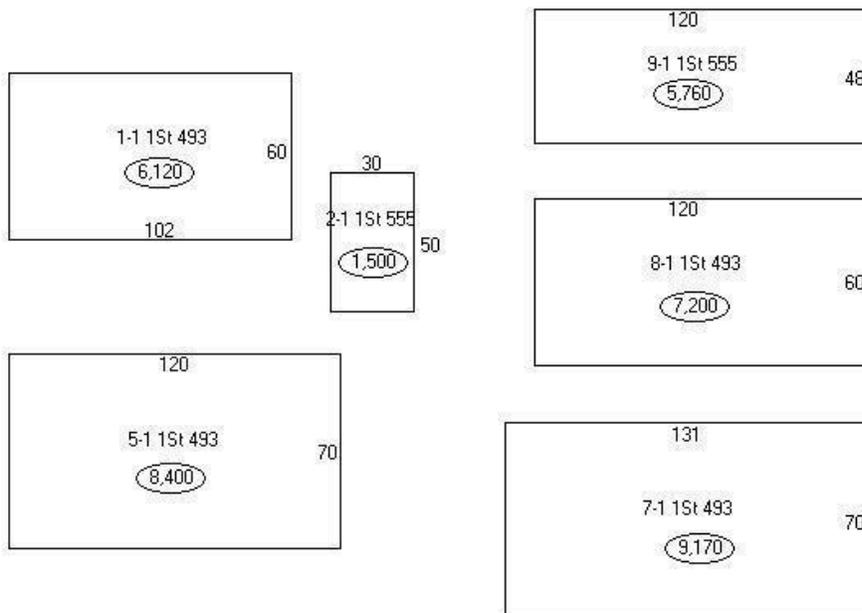
