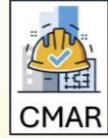

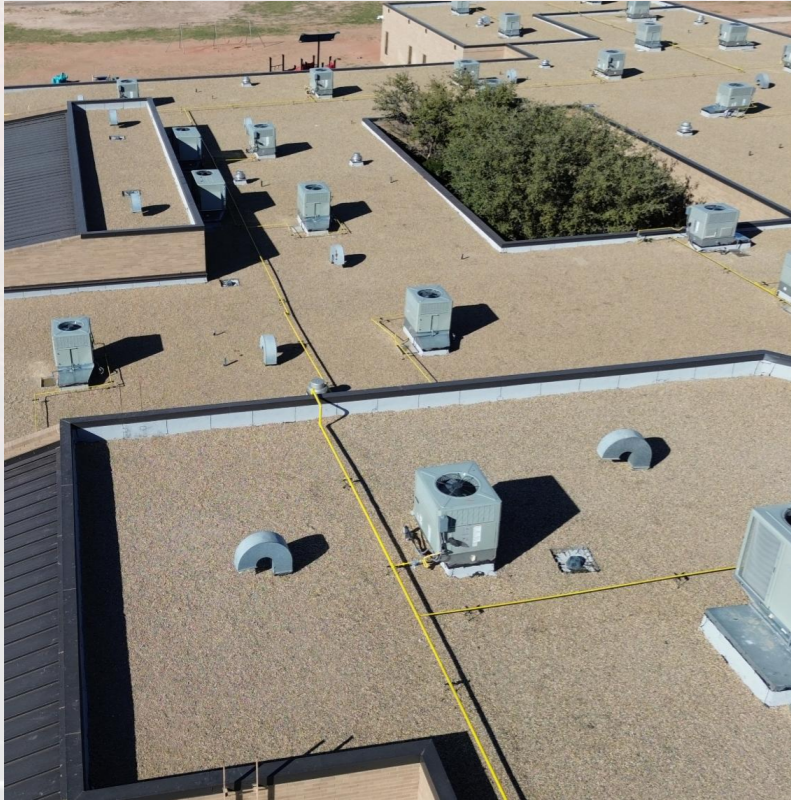

Summary

- Fly and Travis roofs are nearing completion. Contractors for both projects are working on final tasks. Inspection walkthroughs will take place at Burleson and Zavala this week. This walkthrough will allow the contractors to gather remaining¹⁵ tasks for completion.
- A contractor recommendation for roofing package 2 will be presented this evening. A schedule will be developed and work will be assigned accordingly.

Priority 1 and 2 Projects – Travis Elementary School



- Terrazzo team has mobilized and will start work soon.
- Installing finishing touches to plumbing, faucet replacements, and tile.
- Cleaners are onsite and started in south wing.
- Adjusting and replacing damaged ceiling grid and tile in north wing.

Technology

PA, Bell, Alarm and Clock Refresh

- The PA, Bell, Alarm, and Clock Bond Project continues to progress as scheduled.
- To date, 13 campuses have been fully completed, with upgraded systems now operational.
- The next campuses scheduled for installation are Cameron and Alamo.

Surveillance

- The Surveillance Camera Bond Project is nearing completion, with installations substantially finished across district campuses and facilities.
- The project is now in its final stage, with the last remaining site being Ratliff Stadium. Once work at Ratliff Stadium is finalized, Phase 1 of the districtwide surveillance project will be complete.
- Phase 2 will begin shortly after and will add additional door access cameras to campuses, further strengthening districtwide security.

DATE: January 20, 2026

This update revises the purchasing approval limit delegated to the Superintendent. The approval threshold for a single, budgeted purchase is proposed to increase from **\$50,000 to \$100,000**. Purchases at or above this amount will continue to require Board approval unless otherwise specified.

Administrative Recommendation:

District of Innovation Exemptions

In accordance with the District's innovation plan, the District is exempt from the state law requiring that purchases or leases of automated external defibrillators (AED) meets standards established by the federal Food and Drug Administration.

In accordance with the District's innovation plan, the District is exempt from the state law requiring that cooperative purchasing contract-related fees be presented annually in a written report to the Board in an open meeting.

In accordance with the District's innovation plan, the District is exempt from the state law prohibiting a district from considering a vendor's membership or relation with an organization and including in bid specifications, agreements or subsequent contracts language that would deny or diminish the right of a person to work because of the person's membership or relations with any organization.

Purchasing Authority

The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to make budgeted purchases for goods or services. However, any single, budgeted purchase of goods or services that costs ~~\$50,000~~ \$100,000 or more, except as provided below, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place.

The Superintendent is not required to obtain Board approval for the following types of budgeted purchases, regardless of cost:

1. A purchase made pursuant to a Board-approved interlocal contract or a cooperative purchasing program, in accordance with law;
2. A purchase made through a state purchasing program that satisfies the District's obligation for competitive purchasing [see CH(LEGAL) or CBB(LEGAL)]; or
3. A continuing or periodic purchase under a Board-approved bid or contract.

Exception for
Emergency
Contracts

In the event of a catastrophe, emergency, or natural disaster affecting the District, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to contract for the replacement, construction, or repair of school equipment or facilities in accordance with law, if emergency replacement, construction, or repair is necessary for the health and safety of District students and staff. Prior to the transaction, the Superintendent shall obtain the approval of the Board President.

The Superintendent shall report to the Board at the next regular meeting any contract made under this authority. [See Disaster Exception, CH(LEGAL)]

The delegation regarding emergency contracts does not waive competitive purchasing requirements under Education Code Chapter 44. Only the Board is authorized to waive competitive purchasing requirements under limited circumstances in accordance with Education Code 44.031(h). [See Emergency Damage or Destruction, CH(LEGAL)]

Purchasing Procedures The Superintendent shall develop purchasing procedures to implement the requirements of state and federal law. [See also CB, CBB, CH(LEGAL), and COA]

Purchasing Method The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to determine the method of purchasing in accordance with CH(LEGAL) or CBB(LEGAL), as appropriate.

Competitive Bidding If competitive bidding is chosen as the purchasing method, the Superintendent shall prepare bid specifications. All bids shall be in accordance with administrative regulations, and the submission of any electronic bids shall also be in accordance with Board-adopted rules. All bidders shall be invited to attend the bid opening. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for opening. Bids received after the specified time shall not be considered.

The District may reject any and all bids in accordance with state or federal law, as applicable.

Competitive Sealed Proposals If competitive sealed proposals are chosen as the purchasing method, the Superintendent shall prepare the request for proposals and/or specifications for items to be purchased. All proposals shall be in accordance with administrative regulations, and the submission of any electronic proposals shall also be in accordance with Board-adopted rules. Proposals received after the specified time shall not be considered. Proposals shall be opened at the time specified, and all proposers shall be invited to attend the proposal opening. Proposals may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time of opening. Changes in the content of a proposal, and in prices, may be negotiated after proposals are opened.

The District may reject any and all proposals in accordance with state or federal law, as applicable.

Electronic Bids or Proposals Bids or proposals that the District has chosen to accept through electronic transmission shall be administered in accordance with Board-adopted rules. Such rules shall safeguard the integrity of the competitive procurement process; ensure the identification, security, and confidentiality of electronic bids or proposals; and ensure

that the electronic bids or proposals remain effectively unopened until the proper time.

Responsibility for Debts

The Board shall assume responsibility for debts incurred in the name of the District so long as those debts are for purchases made in accordance with the adopted budget, state law, Board policy, and the District's purchasing procedures. [See CE] The Board shall not be responsible for debts incurred by persons or organizations not directly under Board control. Persons making unauthorized purchases shall assume full responsibility for all such debts.

Purchase Commitments

All purchase commitments shall be made by the Superintendent in accordance with administrative procedures, including the District's purchasing procedures.

Personal Purchases

District employees shall not be permitted to make purchases for personal use through the District's business office.

DATE: January 20, 2026

The mission of the SYGC is to provide youth in ECISD with a safe and supportive space to practice and develop their golf skills. To achieve this goal, SYGC will improve a portion of the Sunset Golf Course Property. The purpose of this project is to provide ECISD with a dedicated area to instruct golf students in the principles of the individual game and team sports.

Under the MOU, ECISD grants SYGC access and permission to begin planning and construction of the project. SYGC is responsible for executing and completing the Scope of Work, obtaining all necessary permits, and complying with applicable laws. The project is planned to begin in February 2026 and be completed by June 2026, focusing on the refurbishment of the driving range, practice putting green, and the existing clubhouse to include office and classroom space.

The MOU is effective January 20, 2026 and the term shall be for a period of seven (7) years or a period of five (5) years from project completion in accordance with Article III.2, whichever duration is longer.

Administrative Recommendation:

Approval of the proposed Memorandum of Understanding between Ector County ISD and the Sunset Youth Golf Center (SYGC) as presented.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between the **Ector County Independent School District** (“ECISD”) and the **Sunset Youth Golf Center** (“SYGC”), a nonprofit corporation, collectively referred to as the “Parties”, effective January 20, 2026 (the “Effective Date”).

I. PUBLIC PURPOSE

The mission of the SYGC is to provide youth in ECISD with a safe, acceptable, and supportive space to practice and develop their golf skills and to inspire a generation of young people who not only excel in golf but also carry the values of perseverance, respect and leadership into every aspect of their lives. SYGC strives to be a catalyst for positive change in ECISD, creating a future where all students, regardless of background or circumstance, have access to the tools and opportunities needed to succeed in life.

SYGC wishes to provide certain services including the improvement of the Sunset Golf Course Property (“the Premises”) located at 9301 Andrews Hwy., Odessa, Texas (“the Project”). The purpose of the Project is to provide ECISD with a dedicated area from which to instruct golf students in the principles of the individual game and as team sport. The proposed Scope of Work is intended to be a permanent improvement to the Premises currently owned by ECISD and to co-exist with any future structures or campuses that may be planned in the future for the Premises.

ECISD desires to have the Premises improved by means of the Project. Such improvements shall be intended solely for the benefit of the ECISD students Members of the community wishing to use the Premises must request access in compliance with applicable ECISD Board policy on use of school facilities.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS

Under this Agreement, the Parties agree to the following:

1. ECISD shall grant SYGC access to the Premises and permission to begin planning and construction of the Project.
2. Appropriate and adequate insurance coverage is to be acquired or provided by both Parties as required by ECISD and applicable law. Insurance coverage is to be in place before any construction begins on the Premises. ECISD already maintains general hazard insurance on the structures on the Premises and will continue to maintain insurance on the Premises. SYGC will maintain or require its contractors to maintain builder’s risk insurance during all phases of construction. SYGC shall maintain commercial general liability insurance coverage and workers compensation insurance.
3. SYGC will perform and complete the Scope of Work by using its own management team, machinery, materials, equipment, and other resources.
4. SYGC will notify ECISD immediately of any proposed or actual stoppages of work or other matters affecting or likely to affect the performance of the Work.

5. To the extent required and properly obtainable in its own name, SYGC will obtain all necessary permits, approvals, consents, authorizations, and licenses for the performance of the work.
6. SYGC shall comply with, and give notices required by, applicable laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities applicable to performance of the Work. In addition, SYGC shall authorize posting of any notices required of ECISD pursuant to Texas Business and Commerce Code, Section 16.0001, or any notices concerning the Workers Compensation insurance carried by other parties involved in the Project at the same location where SYGC or its Contractor posts notices regarding Workers Compensation. SYGC shall also be responsible for obtaining and paying all charges for all approvals for street closings, traffic control, parking meter removal and other similar matters as may be necessary or appropriate from time to time for the performance of the Work.
7. SYGC shall submit work on the Project to ECISD for approval:
 - a. Within the time frame specified or, if no time is specified, then a reasonable time, such drawings, samples, patterns, and models as may be required by ECISD;
 - b. During the process of fabrication, manufacture, production, and construction, and within such reasonable time as ECISD may require, such drawings of the general arrangement and/or details of the Work, or any portion thereof, as set out in this agreement, or as ECISD may reasonably require;
 - c. Within a reasonable period after receiving such drawings, samples, patterns, and models, ECISD shall communicate its approval or rejection. If ECISD rejects or comments on any drawings, samples, patterns, or models, the same shall be resubmitted within ten (10) working days. Copies of all drawings which require approval by ECISD shall be provided by SYGC.
8. ECISD and SYGC shall have the right at all reasonable times to inspect the work on the Premises.
9. SYGC must obtain ECISD's written consent before incorporating any new designs or features that are not a part of the original Scope of Work (Exhibit A).
10. Any and all rights to the improvements on the Premises shall vest to ECISD immediately upon completion by SYGC and acceptance of ECISD.
11. ECISD agrees to keep the Sunset name for the Premises for the term of this Agreement. However, ECISD reserves the right to rename the Premises in the future in accordance with the District policies on naming facilities.

III. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

1. ECISD will be responsible for hiring coaches and maintenance staff for the ongoing upkeep of the improved Premises. All staff hired by ECISD shall be the employees of ECISD. Alternatively, SYGC shall have the option to hire maintenance personnel to operate the facilities. In such case, SYGC shall be responsible for hiring, firing, paying, reporting and all other related employee responsibilities. SYGC may use contract workers to provide some of the services for the operations of the facilities. SYGC employees and contract workers shall be subject to mandatory background checks and District review. SYGC shall also be responsible for the monthly costs for electric, gas, water utilities.

2. The annual cost of operations, including staff salaries for groundskeeping maintenance and regular maintenance, will be paid by SYGC to ECISD on an annual basis, or if SYGC hires its own maintenance personnel, then SYGC shall pay all of such costs and shall provide evidence of such payments upon request to the District. These obligations of SYGC shall continue for a period of five (5) years from Project completion or until such time when ECISD completes construction of new facilities, structures, or campuses on the property and has a fully operational campus on the Premises, whichever is sooner. In the event access to City water may be required at any time during the term of this Agreement, SYGC agrees to be responsible for the cost of setting up access to City water and water utility bills attributable to the operation of the improved golf course during the term of this Agreement.

3. Nothing in this Agreement shall obligate ECISD to upkeep the golf course in perpetuity. ECISD reserves the right to suspend or permanently discontinue operation and maintenance of the improved golf course at any time following the completion and donation of the Project, if:

- a. SYGC has not provided funding as required herein or is otherwise in breach of this Agreement;
- b. Adequate funding is not appropriated by the District; or
- c. ECISD determines, in the District's sole discretion, that continued operation is not in the best interests of the District.

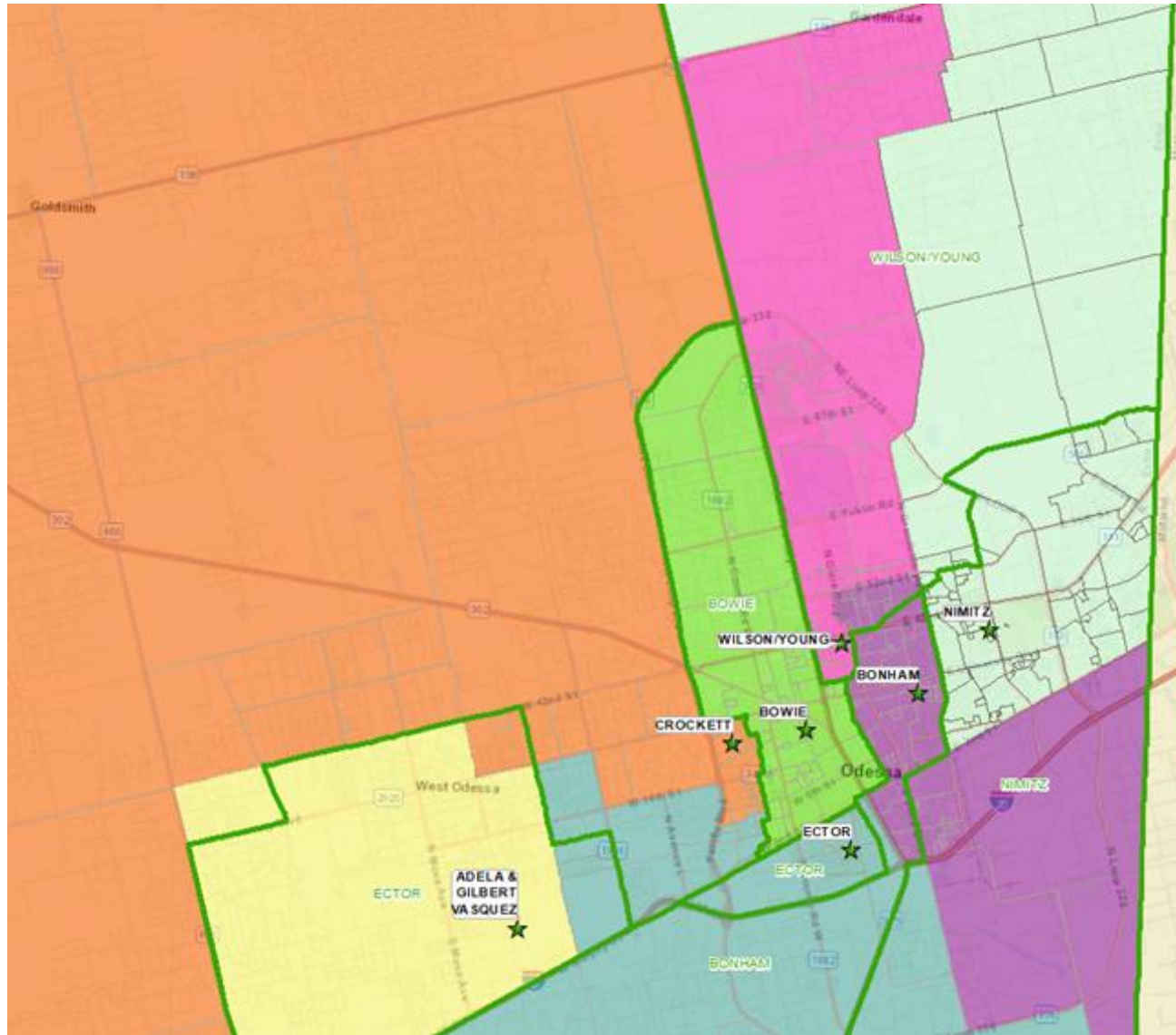

An analysis of Emergent Bilingual (EB) student performance has led to a potential shift in the program model to improve student outcomes.

Currently, ECISD implements a **Dual Language Immersion Two-Way** model at Cameron Dual Language Elementary and a **Dual Language Immersion One-Way** model at 20 elementary campuses.

**Board Workshop Meeting
December 9, 2025**

The review process, conducted over several months, included listening sessions with teachers and principals, an examination of academic performance trends, TELPAS results (which measure English proficiency), staffing capacity, program implementation, and a study of models used in other districts.

Recent academic data indicate declines in performance, with few students demonstrating English proficiency or exiting the Bilingual program. Research shows that staffing and professional development are critical to the success of Dual Language programs, along with high-quality resources and program structure. However, ECISD—like many districts across Texas and the nation—faces a shortage of certified Bilingual teachers. To address this challenge, ECISD recently hosted a lead researcher from The Meadows Center at the University of Texas, a recognized authority on state education trends, to help evaluate the current situation and identify the best path forward for students.

While the Dual Language One-Way model is considered a high-quality approach to Bilingual education, given ECISD’s staffing constraints, transitioning to an **Early Exit** model would be a pragmatic approach.

The **Transitional Bilingual/Early Exit** program provides instruction in literacy and academic content in both Spanish and English by teachers certified in bilingual education. Instruction begins primarily in Spanish from prekindergarten through second grade, then transitions to English in third grade.

Background / Purpose:

Ector County Independent School District provides certified school bus driver safety training services to Region 18 Education Service Center (ESC) to support initial certification and recertification of school bus drivers across the Region 18 service area.

The District's Director of Transportation is a state-certified school bus driver safety trainer and is qualified to deliver this training on behalf of the District. Region 18 compensates ECISD for these services, and ECISD compensates the Director of Transportation through District payroll as additional duty compensation.

House Bill 3372 (Texas Education Code §11.006) requires school board approval when a district administrator receives compensation for personal services performed for a regional education service center.

District Benefit:

Ector County ISD operates the largest transportation department within the Region 18 service area and employs the highest number of school bus drivers requiring initial certification and recurring recertification. Maintaining an in-house, state-certified school bus driver safety trainer provides direct operational, financial, and safety-related benefits to the district.

The ECISD-certified trainer provides initial certification and recertification for ECISD bus drivers and also delivers safety certification training to bus drivers from all participating school districts within the Region 18 service area. This regional training model strengthens inter-district collaboration while ensuring consistent, high-quality safety training standards.

District-specific benefits include increased scheduling flexibility, reduced reliance on outside training providers, faster onboarding of new drivers, and timely recertification that minimizes service disruptions. Having an in-house safety trainer reinforces ECISD safety expectations and supports ongoing compliance with state and federal transportation requirements.

Additionally, the partnership with Region 18 allows ECISD to offset training-related costs while positioning the district as a regional leader in pupil transportation safety and professional development.

Board Findings (Required by HB 3372):

The Board finds that:

1. The services provided do not create a conflict of interest for the district.
2. The services do not negatively impact the performance of the administrator's duties for ECISD.
3. The services are performed outside of the administrator's regular duty hours or during approved leave.


