RESOLUTION FILLING SCHOOL BOARD VACANCY BY APPOINTMENT

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of school board member with a term expiring the first Monday in January [insert year]; and

[NOTE: Pick ONE of the following three WHEREAS Clauses as it applies]

WHEREAS, the vacancy occurred more than ninety (90) days prior to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in the year the vacancy occurred in the first or second year of the vacant term;

WHEREAS, the vacancy occurred less than ninety (90) days prior to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in the first or second year of the vacant term;

WHEREAS, the vacancy occurred January 1 or afterwards in the third year of the vacant term or on any date during the fourth year of the vacant term;

[NOTE: Option 3 does not require a special election.]

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of [*insert name of district*], Independent School District No. ____, State of Minnesota, as follows:

[NOTE: Pick ONE of the following two paragraphs as it applies to the choice above. The first paragraph should be selected for the first two WHEREAS Clauses above. The second paragraph shall be selected for the third WHEREAS Clause above.]

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.09, Subd. 5b, (*insert name of appointee*) is hereby appointed to fill the vacancy and to serve until a successor is elected and qualified. The appointment shall be effective thirty (30) days after the adoption of this resolution unless a valid petition to reject the appointee is filed with the school district clerk pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.09, Subd. 5b(b) within that thirty (30) day time period.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.09, Subd. 5b, (*insert name of appointee*) is hereby appointed to fill the vacancy and to serve the remainder of the unexpired term. The appointment shall be effective thirty (30) days after the adoption of this resolution unless a valid petition to reject the appointee is filed with the school district clerk pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.09, Subd. 5b(b) within that thirty (30) day time period.

Steps to Fill a School Board Member Vacancy with Sample Application and Interview Questions

Step to Fill a Vacancy

1. Board member formally resigns. Such resignation must be provided to the district in writing and include the last date the member will be serving.
2. Board declares at vacancy will exist on the date provided by the resigning member.
3. Board decides on a process to choose who to appoint.
4. Board completes process and picks a person to fill the open seat. Nominations are voted on using a roll call vote in the order the candidates were nominated.
5. Board passes a Resolution Filling a School Board Vacancy by Appointment.
6. Board waits 30 days to allow the public the opportunity to petition against the appointment.
7. Between the appointment date and the end of the 30-day waiting period, appointee signs Acceptance of Office and Oath of Office in front of a notary.
8. At the appointee's first board meeting, appointee may say public oath. This oath is ceremonial and therefore optional.

9. Why would you like to serve on the (DISTRICT NAME) School Board?
10. Please describe your background and experiences with community involvement. How would these serve you as a board member?
11. What experiences have you had serving on either private sector or public sector boards, what was your role, and what were your take-aways from that experience?
12. Describe your understanding of the decision process for public school board. How would you react/respond if the majority of the board took an action that you voted against?

Interview Question Considerations

When deciding the method of collecting responses to interview questions, three options are available:

1. The board may include the interview questions in the application and not conduct an interview.
2. The board could ask some questions on the application and use this information to narrow the applicants before conducting interviews at a public meeting.
3. The board could use a simplified application and ask all interview questions at a public meeting.

No matter how the interview questions are posed, MSBA recommends evaluating the responses using a 3-point system (Exceeds, Meets, Does Not Meet) and then summarizing the collective responses before having a discussion at a public meeting. The applicant with the highest results on the points evaluation should not automatically be appointed. Board members may change their perspective after the discussion of the positive attributes of each of the applicants.

Data Privacy Considerations

Under Minnesota Statute 13.601, the following information about applicants is public data:

- (1) name;
- (2) city of residence, except when the appointment has a residency requirement that requires the entire address to be public;
- (3) education and training;
- (4) employment history;
- (5) volunteer work;
- (6) awards and honors;
- (7) prior government service;
- (8) any data required to be provided or that are voluntarily provided in an application for appointment to a multimember agency pursuant to section [15.0597](#) (**does not apply to school boards**); and
- (9) veteran status.

If there is a public data request for a School Board Member Vacancy application, the district is responsible for having all non-public data redacted.

Students will be staying in rooms grouped into 4's. The chaperone ratio will be 10:1 so the number of chaperones will be determined by the amount of participating students.

Probable Number of Students:

The trip is optional so the number of students has yet to be determined. An estimate based upon how many students have shown interest is around 60-70 band and choir students.

Transportation:

Motor coach buses: Company TBD

Travel Company and Cost:

The cost of the trip will be around \$1500 per student, which may be slightly lower or higher depending on the number of students attending. Chaperones will pay half of the student cost. The travel company handling the arrangements is Leisure Time Tours from St. Cloud, MN. The company has been handling the Becker Music department tours for nearly 30 years.

Fundraising:

Music department students have been fundraising since 6th grade and the money they raise stays in their individual accounts until they graduate. Any money accumulated throughout these years can be applied to the cost of the trip. This year there will be a few fundraisers for our music students to help offset their trip cost: Candybar sale, Wreath Sale, Coffee Sale

General Rules and Regulations

Any student not complying with the guidelines set below should expect disciplinary action. Discipline may range from a simple reprimand, room or bus confinement, to being sent home by airplane or bus at the expense of parents/guardians.

- 1. All Minnesota State High School League and Becker High School Handbook Rules and Expectations apply on this trip. The police department, as well as Becker High School, will handle any student involvement in alcohol, drugs, or tobacco. Any involvement in these substances will result in the student being sent home with a chaperone. Parents will pay for the cost of the plane/bus ride for the student and chaperone.**
2. Act in a manner that will leave every person in which we have contact with a good impression. We are representing our school, community, and state on this trip.
3. All students will attend every function and tour on the itinerary.
4. You should be with at least two other students at all times. DO NOT go anywhere by yourself.
5. Always be a few minutes early. If you are late, the whole group is late. This may jeopardize our scheduled events.
6. Be courteous to the chaperones and drivers

Motor Coach Conduct
