**1 CALL TO ORDER**

Chair Goller called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Hermiston School Board members present: Mr. Josh Goller, Ms. Karen Sherman, Mr. Brent Pitney, Mr. Bryan Medelez, Ms. Bonnie Luisi, Ms. Ginny Holthus, and Mr. Mark Gomolski

Also in attendance were: Superintendent of Schools Dr. Tricia Mooney, Assistant Superintendent Bryn Browning, Director of Business Services Katie Saul, and Executive Assistant to the Superintendent and Board Briana Cortaberria

**2 INTRODUCTORY ITEMS**

**2.1 Pledge of Allegiance**

Chair Goller led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**2.2 Adoption of Agenda**

Dr. Mooney noted the addition of Action Item 8.3: 2021-2022 School Calendar.

**2.3 Approval of Minutes**

Regular Meeting, February 8, 2021 – A motion was made by Mr. Gomolski and seconded by Mr. Pitney that the Board of Education approves the minutes of the regular meeting held on February 8, 2021.

The motion passed 7-0.

Special Meeting, February 22, 2021 – A motion was made by Ms. Luisi and seconded by Mr. Medelez that the Board of Education approves the minutes of the special meeting held on February 22, 2021.

The motion passed 7-0.

**3 COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**3.1 Oregon School Employees Association**

Interim OSEA President Ms. Wright provided an OSEA statement, saying that elementary buildings are busy, as all grades are in the buildings now.

The board members offered thanks to the classified staff members, following last week's classified employee appreciation week.

**3.2 Hermiston Association of Teachers**

HAT Vice-President Ms. Cori Applegate spoke to the board on behalf of the Hermiston Association Teachers, commenting on all elementary grades in school face-to-face. She stated the teachers' excitement to welcome the students and efforts to update building blueprints in support of the students' return.

### **3.3 Student Board Representative**

Hermiston High School Student Board Representative Miss Violet Mitchell, shared an HHS Student Leadership update, stating the students' excitement to get back in the building and work with the building administration on activities for the spring. She commented on the "mood" change, now having students involved in athletics and activities.

## **4 REPORTS**

### **4.1 Board of Education**

The Board members shared of events and activities in which they participated or attended since the last Board meeting, sharing of building visits and classified staff appreciation, a Sandstone Middle School backpack drive, board committee meetings, public employees insurance changes, and the presence of students in neighborhoods.

### **4.2 Superintendent's Office**

#### **4.2.1 Enrollment Report**

Dr. Tricia Mooney shared the enrollment report as of February 26, 2021, showing a steady enrollment trend line.

Dr. Mooney invited Wenaha Project Manager Jose Aparicio up to speak on the invitation to bid process for Rocky Heights Elementary School. Reviewing the numbers, Aparicio stated his opinion that the district is in a great financial position to start the bond projects. He stated the next bid, for Loma Vista Elementary School, will be presented to the board at its next meeting.

Dr. Mooney invited Applegate forward to explain the Ed Council calendar preparation and deliberation process. Applegate shared that four drafts were presented to staff for a vote, and the staff survey yielded a clear winner, which is included in the board's agenda for action this evening.

### **4.3 Business Office**

#### **4.3.1 Financial Reports**

Director of Business Services Saul shared the January 2021 financial forecast reports, explaining a red revenue report and green expenditure report, which balance to yield a green ending fund balance report and an EFB of 14.66%.

## **5 STUDY ITEMS**

### **5.1 Return to In-person Learning Update**

Dr. Mooney provided an update for the board, providing information since the last board meeting. She spoke of Oregon Governor Kate Brown's March 5, 2021, announcement, highlighting the Governor's timeline. Mooney updated the board on elementary hybrid instruction for students physically in school and on a virtual learning transition for all-online students into Hermiston Online. Mooney shared of secondary hybrid instruction, referencing the timeline, cohorts, transportation, and schedule.

She explained the phase-in transition process to return students to class, relating it to the Ready Schools, Safe Learners (RSSL) guidance. Looking forward, Dr. Mooney stated an update will be made to the RSSL document by March 19, expecting information on the 35 square foot space requirement and cohort sizes. Dr. Mooney spoke to summer school and planning for that program, in preparation for students to return this fall.

## 5.2 Financial Planning Parameters

Ms. Saul recapped the last meeting's discussion, highlighting the ADMw (flat/no growth) and Ending Fund Balance (10%) assumptions set by the board.

Since the last meeting, Hermiston School District received its first State School Fund estimate from the state: \$9.1 billion, split 49/51, which equates to an \$8,509 per ADMw and is essentially flat funding from the 2019-2021 biennium.

Saul proceeded to review district reserve funds. She stated her recommendation that the district utilizes up to \$750,000 of the Biennial Reserve Fund if it is required to maintain current service levels and a sound EFB. It is the administration's recommendation to use up to \$500,000 from the PERS Reserve Fund if it is required.

Saul reviewed projected general fund payroll and accounts payable expenses. Outlining projected operations, Ms. Saul stated that the district will be deficit spending to utilize reserves and return to a 10% ending fund balance.

## 6 PUBLIC COMMENTS

Chair Goller read the public comment guidelines as posted to the meeting agenda.

Public comment was received via email prior to the board meeting regarding in-person learning and returning students to school five days a week for a full day of instruction.

In-person comments were received on returning students to the classroom full time, five days a week; the potential of a permanent OSHA space rule; the safety and health of youth when not in school; and a request for advocacy at the state level.

Board members offered thanks for the comments provided.

## 7 CONSENT ITEMS

Chair Goller and Vice Chair Sherman stated a potential conflict of interest to item 7.1.5. Personnel Contract Renewals.

Student Enrollment (ADMw) Assumption: Flat/no growth

Ending Fund Balance Threshold: 10%

State Fund Estimate: \$9.1 Billion split 49/51

Biennial Reserve Fund Allocation: \$750,000 if required

PERS Reserve Fund Allocation: \$500,000 if required

The board members offered thanks to Ms. Saul for the proposed recommendations and budget preparation.

### 8.2 ITB 002-2021 Rocky Elementary School Project

**3.1 Board of Education**

The board members spoke on activities and events in which they participated or attended, since the last board meeting, commenting on student athletics and activities and the district's livestream abilities.

**3.2 Superintendent's Office**

Dr. Mooney updated the board on graduation. She stated that a Toyota Center event will not occur. Instead, the district is planning a local graduation ceremony and a senior parade. Dr. Mooney provided a hard copy PacWest governmental affairs report to the members.

**4 STUDY ITEMS**

**4.1 Bond Projects Update**

Wenaha Group Senior Project Manager Scott Rogers provided a bond projects update, reviewing bid results, design and construction work, the current budget, work with the City of Hermiston, and the projects' schedule.

Rogers addressed questions on project bidding, including alternate and base bids.

**4.2 Return to In-person Learning Update**

Dr. Mooney updated the board on the district's plan for returning students to the classroom for in-person learning. She referenced Governor Brown's March 5, 2021, statement and directives.

Dr. Mooney highlighted portions of the March 15, 2021, Ready Schools, Safe Learners guidance, notably metrics and cohorting. She continued by sharing updated guidance released today, March 22, stating that HSD meets the threshold for all students to meet in-person, and the district will release a statement soon.

Dr. Mooney commented on the district's transportation bus routes and concerns. She offered her appreciation of MidCo for their efforts.

## 5 ACTION ITEMS

### 5.1 ITB 003-2021 Loma Vista Elementary School Project

A motion was made by Mr. Medelez and seconded by Mr. Gomolski that the board of education authorizes the superintendent, or her designee, to enter into a contract with Kirby Nagelhout Construction Company for the base bid amount of \$22,579,000, for the Loma Vista Elementary School Project, pursuant to Invitation to Bid 003-2021.

The members stated their excitement for the progress of the bond projects.

The motion passed 6-0.

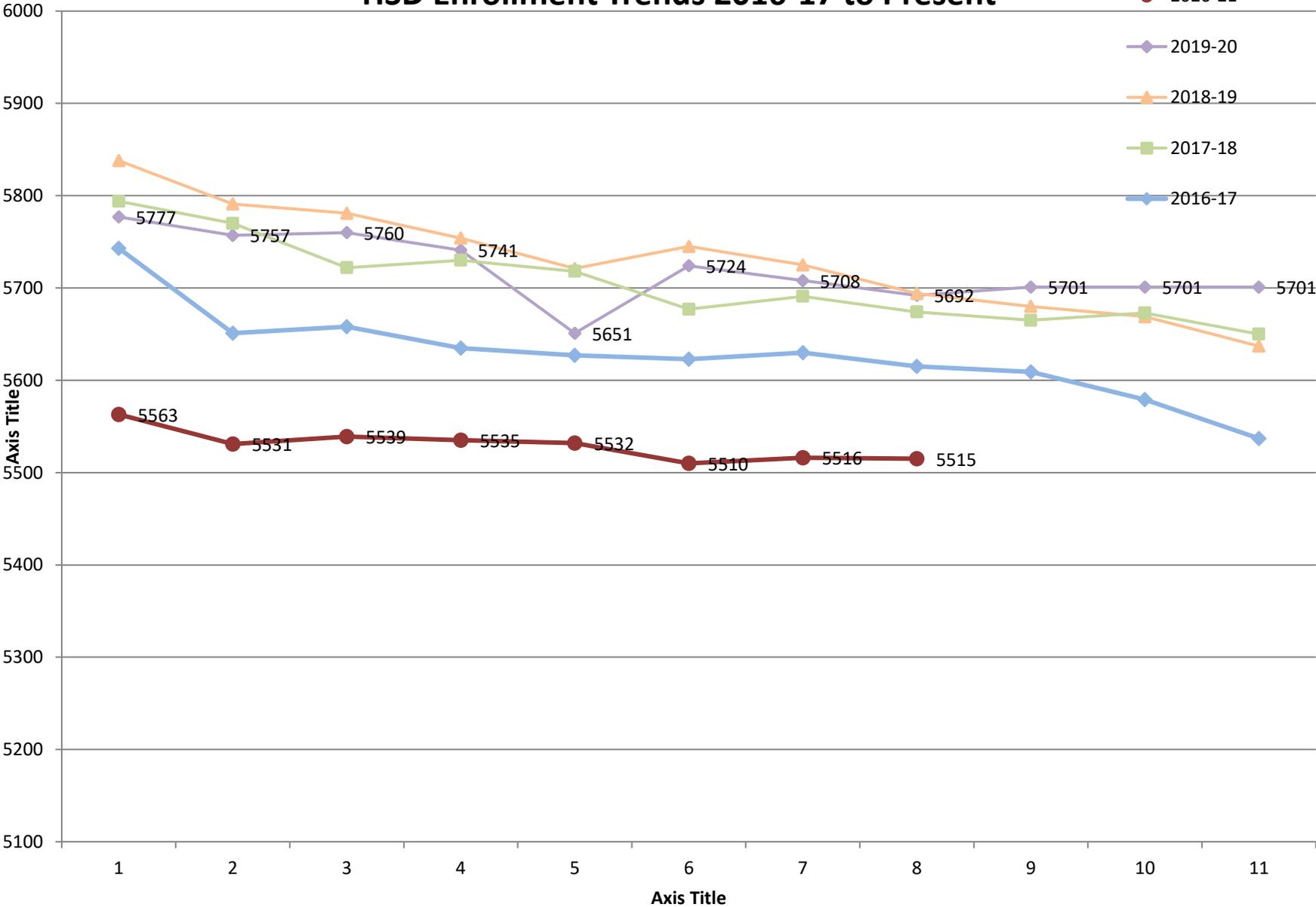

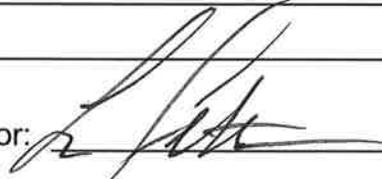

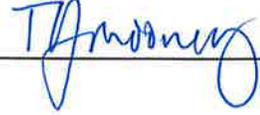
