1 CALL TO ORDER

Chair Goller called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Hermiston School Board members present: Ms. Karen Sherman, Mr. Josh Goller, Ms. Ginny Holthus, Ms. Bonnie Luisi, Mr. Dain Gardner, Ms. Sally Hansell, and Mr. Bryan Medelez

Also in attendance were: Superintendent of Schools Dr. Tricia Mooney, Director of Business Services Katie Saul, and Executive Assistant to the Superintendent and Board Briana Cortaberra

2 INTRODUCTORY ITEMS

2.1 Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Goller led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2.2 Adoption of Agenda

Dr. Mooney noted no changes to the agenda since it was released.

Ms. Hansell made a motion to remove Consent Item 7.3.1 from the agenda, which was seconded by Mr. Gardner.

The board members discussed the merit of the document for adoption and when to appropriately discuss the document and its points.

A secondary motion was made by Ms. Holthus to amend the main motion to remove Consent Item 7.3.1 from the agenda and identify a future time to discuss it further.

Mr. Medelez arrived at 6:35 p.m.

The motion passed 6-0-1, with Mr. Medelez abstaining.

The amended main motion to remove Consent Item 7.3.1 from the agenda and identify a future time to discuss it further passed 6-0-1, with Mr. Medelez abstaining.

A motion was made by Ms. Hansell and seconded by Mr. Gardner to add an item to the agenda to discuss district email communication procedures relative to the school board. The motion failed 2-5 with Ms. Hansell and Mr. Gardner voting in favor and Ms. Luisi, Ms. Holthus, Mr. Goller, Ms. Sherman, and Mr. Medelez voting against the motion.

A motion was made by Ms. Luisi and seconded by Ms. Holthus to adopt the amended agenda. The motion passed 7-0.

2.3 Approval of Minutes

Regular Meeting, August 9, 2021 – A motion was made by Ms. Holthus and seconded by Ms. Sherman that the Board of Education approves the minutes of the regular meeting held on August 9, 2021.

The motion passed 7-0.

Special Meeting, August 23, 2021 – A motion was made by Ms. Holthus and seconded by Ms. Luisi that the Board of Education approves the minutes of the special meeting held on August 23, 2021.

The motion passed 7-0.

3 COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

3.1 Oregon School Employees Association

Ms. Smith was not present to report. Chair Goller read comments that she had provided in advance.

3.2 Hermiston Association of Teachers

HAT President Tammy Fisher spoke to the board, stating HAT union members' excitement to have students in the classroom and commenting on the strong collaboration with district administration and the board in the face of challenges.

3.3 Student Board Representative

Mr. Nick Purswell introduced himself as this year's Student Board Representative. He provided a Hermiston High School student leadership update, commenting on homecoming, which is scheduled for October 8 with the dance set for October 9. He stated that a blood drive is planned for October 21, and the Rage in the Cage event after the first home football game was a success.

4 REPORTS

4.1 Board of Education

The Board members shared of events and activities in which they participated or attended since the last Board meeting, highlighting the start of school and school visits, the 20th Anniversary of 9-11, student athletic events, and district and school kick off events.

4.2 Business Office

4.2.1 Financial Reports

Director of Business Services Saul shared the revenue, expenditure, and the ending fund balance financial forecast reports for July 2021, all of which are green and yield a 12.22% ending fund balance.

4.3 Superintendent's Office

Dr. Mooney shared a brief slideshow highlighting the first day of school.

4.3.1 Enrollment Report

Dr. Mooney commented on the 10-Day deadline, which has not yet occurred.

District enrollment is currently down, just under the start of school last year.

Dr. Mooney referred to the whites of the eyes count, for which teachers count the students physically in each class and period.

Dr. Mooney provided an update on House Bill 2560, which will take effect in January, and stated how the district will meet the outlined requirements.

She continued by stating that the Oregon School Boards Association canceled its annual convention, and the Boundary Committee will commence in October.

5 STUDY ITEMS

5.1 Curriculum Adoption

Education Directors Jerad Farley and Scott Depew shared a presentation explaining the district’s curriculum adoption process and the upcoming adoptions. They proceeded to explain the benefits of adopting curriculum for the district, the district’s adoption cycle, the state approval process, the district adoption process, and a process timeline.

Mr. Farley explained three choices for an adoption: adopting one of ODEs recommendations, an independent adoption process, and postponing an adoption (for up to two years). Following an adoption, staff are trained in the adopted curriculum, which is outlined in the contract with the publisher.

Mr. Farley spoke to Critical Race Theory stating that it is not explicitly identified in a curriculum.

6 PUBLIC COMMENTS

The board heard comments from the community on the timing of public comment within the board agenda and the origin of House Bill 2560.

1 CALL TO ORDER

Chair Josh Goller called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

2 STUDY ITEMS

2.1 Board-Superintendent Operating Agreement

Chair Goller initiated discussion on the board-superintendent operating agreement with a PowerPoint presentation outlining its purpose and the board should adopt one, with supporting journal articles. He continued by explaining the role of the board versus the superintendent and reviewing the individual bullet points in the document, allowing the board members to share questions, objections, and discussion for each.

A motion was made by Ms. Sherman and seconded by Ms. Holthus to adopt the board-superintendent operating agreement as presented.

The members discussed the document, including the idea of having a 30,000-foot view and the Oregon School Boards Association's support of Hermiston and Eastern Oregon.

The motion passed 5-1, with Ms. Sherman, Mr. Goller, Ms. Holthus, Mr. Gardner, and Ms. Luisi in favor and Ms. Hansell casting a dissenting vote.

Chair Goller recessed the meeting at 6:11 p.m.

Chair Goller reconvened the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

3 INTRODUCTORY ITEMS

3.1 Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Josh Goller led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3.2 Adoption of Agenda

A motion was made by Ms. Holthus and seconded by Ms. Luisi to adopt the agenda as presented.

The motion passed 6-0.

4 PUBLIC COMMENT

The board members heard public comment on the city's Hermiston 2040 visioning project and the governor's vaccine mandate and exemption options.

A motion was made by Ms. Hansell and seconded by Mr. Gardner to grant Ms. Bolen additional time over the allotted three minutes to complete her statement. The motion passed 5-1, with Ms. Hansell, Mr. Goller, Ms. Holthus, Mr. Gardner, and Ms. Luisi voting in favor and Ms. Sherman voting against. Ms. Bolen further commented on the vaccine mandate.

Comments were also heard on the board-superintendent operating agreement, relating to board policy BDDH and public input.

5 PRESENTATIONS & COMMUNICATIONS

5.1 Sandstone Middle School Update

Sandstone Middle School Principal Lori Monaco-Mills introduced her team leaders in attendance and invited members of the SMS Chamber Choir forward to share a song. Monaco-Mills and her team continued with a presentation entitled Creating The Way Ahead: Vision 2025, which addressed three district initiatives and how Sandstone is putting those into practice.

5.2 Bond Projects Update

Wenaha Project Manager Jose Aparicio provided a bond projects update, commenting on project construction at the HHS softball facility and prototype elementary schools, design work on the HHS classroom addition and district-wide upgrades, and the project budget. He proceeded by sharing site plans and building layouts for the two elementary schools.

6 STUDY ITEMS

6.1 Board Email Communications

Chair Goller introduced the agenda item, addressing the question “should board members be included on the district staff email list.”

The board members were asked to consider whether the question is related to board or administrative work and should the board members be having a discussion on this issue?

The members went around the table providing their input. General comments were that district emails are administrative work. The members like to be in the know and appreciate receiving emails on topics about which they may be asked questions from the community.

A motion was made by Ms. Hansell to allow board members upon request to receive emails sent to the general staff. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gardner. It failed 2-4 with Ms. Hansell and Mr. Gardner voting in favor and Ms. Sherman, Mr. Goller, Ms. Holthus, and Ms. Luisi voting against. Chair Goller presented the second request for specific staff emails, sent by Assistant Superintendent Bacon, to be forwarded to the board members, notably COVID-related communications sent to staff groups. The board members provided their input on the question. No motion was made.

It was requested that the policy committee convene and consider public input and comment, relative to board policy BDDH. 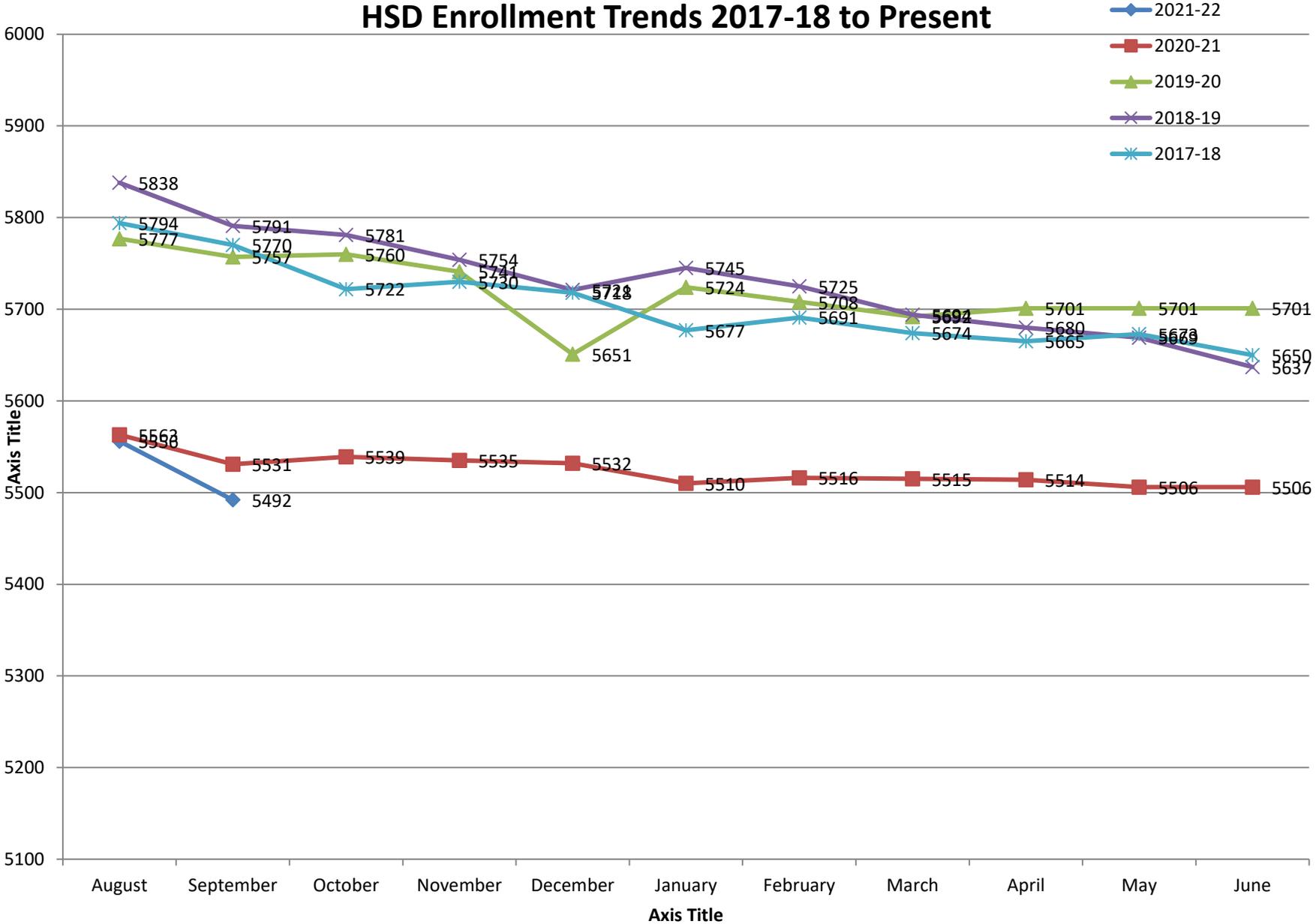
