What does it mean for BHSD?

These policies come to the board through our Policy Plus subscription with OSBA. OSBA reviews how our current policies are affected by new legislation and state rules, then drafts tailored updates for the district.

Many changes in this batch trace to a single update affecting several policies, especially OSBA's effort to retire older board governance policies and replace them with a streamlined set built around public meetings law.

Drafts go next to the relevant administrators and staff for review, then return to the board for a first read, with a second read/adoption to follow.

Board vacancies

- OSBA has built the legal requirements for filling a board vacancy into a clear set of steps the board can follow
- Sets a minimum 20-day application period, posted on the district website, with the board able to extend or reopen it
- New administrative regulation adds a standard application form for candidates

BBE – Vacancies on the Board (new, optional) | BBE-AR – Board Member Vacancy Application (new, optional)

Board officers

- Clarifies how a board officer is replaced and the timing of related actions
- Updates language on board chair duties
- Clarifies delegation of the board spokesperson role

BCB – Board Officers (optional)

Public meetings overhaul

- Oregon public meetings law has changed over several years through legislation and Oregon Government Ethics Commission rules
- HB 4177 (2026) was vetoed by the governor and does not take effect; these drafts match the laws that are in force
- OSBA is retiring several older board governance policies and replacing them with a streamlined set
- Affects a group of B-series policies, listed on the next slide

Reflects current public meetings law; HB 4177 vetoed

Public meetings: the policy set

- Adopt new: BD – Board Meetings, Notices and Communications (highly recommended)
- Adopt new or revised: BCE – Board Committees; BDC – Executive Sessions; BDD – Board Meeting Procedures; BDDC – Board Meeting Agenda; BDDG – Recordings and Minutes; BBAA – Board Member's Authority
- Delete: BD/BDA – Board Meetings; BCF – Advisory Committees (folded into BCE); and the older versions being replaced

Public meetings law updates

Superintendent policies

- CBA – Qualifications and Duties of the Superintendent: updates qualifications and duties language (highly recommended)
- CBG – Evaluation of the Superintendent: minor update to evaluation language (required)
- Align with current superintendent contract as needed

CBA (highly recommended) | CBG (required)

Integrated pest management

- HB 2684 (2025) adds new requirements to the IPM plan
- Post the IPM plan and the list of low-impact pesticides on the district website; this can be part of the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan
- Review the IPM plan every five years for updates and readopt

EBB – Integrated Pest Management (required)

Nurse delegation

- New statutory language on nurse delegation, now in ORS 342.458
- Student Health Services policy is updated to reflect the new language
- Review any applicable collective bargaining agreement for impacted language

EBBA – Student Health Services (highly recommended) | SB 2948 (2025)

Panic alarm systems

- HB 3083 (2025) amends ORS 339.408, requiring emergency safeguards and policies on school building security
- When reviewing building security policies and procedures, the board must consider installing a panic alarm
- Reminder language has been added to the Access to Buildings policy

ECAA – Access to Buildings (optional) | HB 3083 (2025)

Educational equity and budget committee

- HB 4066 changes the requirement that an educational equity advisory committee member serve on the budget committee
- The requirement does not apply if no equity committee member is willing or eligible to serve
- Both the equity committee policy and the budget committee policy are updated

CEA – Educational Equity Advisory Committee (optional) | DBEA – Budget Committee (highly recommended)

Personnel definitions

- OSBA recommends deleting this optional policy if the district has it
- Its content is largely definitions already found in statute (ORS Chapter 342) and in agreements
- HB 2900 (2025) changed the “contract teacher” definition effective January 1, 2026; review against any applicable agreement

GAA – Personnel: Definitions (recommend deletion)

Veteran and state servicemember preference

- SB 808 (2025) amended ORS 408.225, 408.230, and 408.235 and added state servicemembers and former state servicemembers
- Four employment preference categories now apply under Oregon law, effective January 1, 2026
- Equal Employment Opportunity policy and its administrative regulation are updated; OAR 581-022-2405 language clarified

GBA – Equal Employment Opportunity (required) | GBA-AR – Servicemember Preference (highly recommended)

Sexual harassment

- Oregon law requires notice to individuals involved in reports of sexual harassment
- This update clarifies those notice requirements
- Applies to both the staff-facing and student-facing companion policies

GBN/JBA and JBA/GBN – Sexual Harassment (required)

Oregon leave laws

- Several changes to leave laws over recent years are reflected in the family and medical leave administrative regulation
- Version 1 (FMLA/OFLA) is for districts with 50 or more employees
- Version 2 (OFLA) is for districts with 25 to 49 employees
- Issued to the board as an information item per district procedures

GCBDA/GDBDA-AR(1) – Family and Medical Leave (highly recommended)

Oregon sick time

- SB 1108 (2025) adds a new allowable use for earned sick time
- Donating blood through a program approved or accredited by the American Association of Blood Banks or the American Red Cross
- Review current Collective Bargaining Agreement for related language

GCBDD/GDBDD – Sick Time (highly recommended) | SB 1108 (2025)

On the horizon

- Ethics. HB 4161 (2026) lets public officials accept food and beverage at meetings or official events and up to \$100 of merchandise per year. OSBA will provide sample policies in a future update.
- Immigration enforcement. SB 1538 and SB 1594 (both effective July 1, 2026) and HB 4079 (effective September 30, 2026) add new requirements. OSBA will release samples once the Attorney General publishes model policies.
- Website accessibility. District sites must meet WCAG 2.1 Level AA. Districts under 50,000 population have until April 24, 2027. OSBA is preparing an updated policy hosting site and possible policy reminders.

Previewed for awareness. No sample policies are up for adoption yet.

What's next for BHSD

- Draft policies go to the relevant administrators and staff specialists for review
- Policies return to the board for a first read
- A second read and adoption follow, typically across the next few meetings
- Policies marked for deletion are rescinded; new and revised policies are readopted
- Administrative regulations are provided to the board as information items

Student Vehicle Use

All students who drive vehicles to school are subject to parking and driving rules developed by the principal.

The district may require all students parking vehicles on district property on a regular basis to show evidence:

1. That the student driving the vehicle holds a valid driver's license;
2. That the vehicle is currently registered;
3. That the student driving is insured under a motor vehicle liability insurance policy or other satisfactory proof of compliance with the financial responsibility requirements of the state;
4. That the vehicle is in compliance with district rules by displaying the appropriate sticker.

Parking privileges will be subject to the specific requirements of this policy and any other applicable policy and/or rules of the district.

The district will post appropriate parking signs.

**Bicycle Use**

Students who live within a reasonable distance may ride bicycles to school. Bicycle riders are encouraged to observe safe and lawful practices. All bicycle riders must comply with Oregon helmet laws. Bicycles must be parked in a designated area on school grounds and should be locked. The district assumes no responsibility or liability for loss or damage to bicycles.

Skateboard/Roller blade/Scooter Use

Students who live within a reasonable distance may ride skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and other similar devices to school provided they wear appropriate safety equipment, and providing the skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and other similar devices are stored properly in a manner designated by the principal or designee during the school day. The district assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and other similar devices.

Due to the inherent dangers both to participant and non-participant, combined with the potential liability assumption, the use of skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and other similar devices on district property is not allowed. The district recognizes there may be circumstances when skateboards, roller blades, scooters, and/or similar devices, will be allowed. Such circumstances will be approved by the principal or designee and may require parent/guardian permission for student participation.

Motorized Bicycle/Motorized Scooter Use

Motorized bicycles (E-bikes) or motorized scooters (E-scooters) are prohibited on district property for persons under age 16.

Student Vehicle Use

All students who drive vehicles to school are subject to parking and driving rules developed by the school administration.

The district may require students parking vehicles on district property on a regular basis to show evidence:

1. That the student driving the vehicle holds a valid driver's license;
2. That the vehicle is currently registered;
3. That the student driving is insured under a motor vehicle liability insurance policy or other satisfactory proof of compliance with the financial responsibility requirements of the state;
4. That the vehicle is in compliance with district rules by displaying the appropriate tag/sticker, as applicable.

Parking privileges will be subject to the specific requirements of this regulation and any other applicable policy or regulation and/or rules of the district. Parking privileges, including driving on district property, may be revoked by the principal or designee for violations of policies, regulations or school rules. The district will post appropriate parking signs.

The district assumes no responsibility or liability for stolen or damaged vehicles.

Non-Licensed Motor Vehicles Not Allowed

Non-licensed motorized vehicles, such as minibikes, go-carts, all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiles, motorized scooters, and other similar devices are not permitted on district property.
