THIS ITEM RELATES TO STRATEGIC PLAN PILLAR(S): Student Well-Being

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Each year, the Student Code of Conduct is reviewed and updated to reflect changes in law, guidance from the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) model handbook, and input from district administrators. The proposed 2025–2026 Student Code of Conduct includes updates based on recent legislative changes, including House Bill 1481, as well as input from campus administration. District leadership has reviewed the recommended changes to ensure alignment with district expectations, legal compliance, and support for a safe and productive learning environment. The updated Code of Conduct outlines student behavior expectations, disciplinary procedures, and due process protections.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION:

THIS ITEM RELATES TO STRATEGIC PLAN PILLAR(S): Student Well-being

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

For the 2025–2026 school year, the handbook has been revised in collaboration with campus and district administrators, with guidance from the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) model handbook and recent legislative updates. Notably, this year’s revisions include updates related to House Bill 1481, which addresses student use of personal communication devices on school property, as well as other changes that promote student well-being, academic accountability, and campus safety.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION:

Administration recommends approval of the 2025–2026 Student Handbook. Revisions reflect collaboration with campus and district leaders, incorporate guidance from the TASB model handbook, and address recent legislative changes, including House Bill 1481. AGENDA ITEM NAME: First Read and Adoption of Edits to Local Policy FNCE.

THIS ITEM RELATES TO STRATEGIC PLAN PILLAR(S):

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

House Bill 1481, passed during the 89th Texas Legislative Session, requires all public school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to adopt a policy prohibiting students from using personal communication devices while on school property during the instructional day. The law applies to cell phones, smartwatches, tablets, and similar devices, excluding those issued by the school. Districts may either ban these devices entirely or require students to store them out of sight in a secure location during the school day. Exceptions must be made for students with documented medical needs, IEPs, or 504 plans that require device use. The law aims to reduce distractions, increase student engagement, and promote a more focused learning environment.

ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION:

In accordance with the law, the district will require students to keep personal devices powered off and stored in their backpacks throughout the school day. The policy includes appropriate disciplinary measures for non-compliance and provides required exceptions for students with documented medical needs, IEPs, or 504 plans.
