Background Information	<p>State law requires each Texas school district to hold a public hearing on the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). This is the 22nd year of School FIRST, a financial accountability system for Texas school districts developed by the Texas Legislature in 1999. Major changes to the School FIRST system were implemented by the Texas Education Agency in August 2015 that combined financial indicators with financial solvency indicators, in accordance with House Bill 5, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013. Another major revision of the indicators went into effect for the 2019-2020 school year. There are a total of 21 indicators.</p> <p>The primary goal of School FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of school districts' financial resources, a goal made more significant due to the complexity of accounting associated with Texas' school finance system.</p> <p>Midlothian ISD earned a "Superior" rating for the 2022-2023 fiscal year with a score of 94 out of 100 possible points. The School FIRST accountability rating system assigns one of four financial accountability ratings to Texas school districts, with the highest being "Superior Achievement." Midlothian ISD has received the highest rating since the inception of the FIRST rating. Midlothian ISD has received a perfect score in 15 of the 22 years the program has been in existence.</p> <p>The notice of the public hearing must be advertised one time in the newspaper of record for MISD not less than 14 days or more than 30 days prior to holding the public hearing. Background Information	<p>In August 1999, Midlothian ISD joined the City of Midlothian, Ellis County, and TXI Operations, LP in the formation of the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Two (TIRZ). Certain property taxes collected from taxpayers in this zone are diverted from the taxing authorities to the Midlothian Development Authority. Representatives from those taxing authorities serve as board members of the MDA. The revenues collected for the property inside the zone are used to create infrastructure of the zone in order to attract new businesses and investments in the TIRZ.</p> <p>The TIRZ is beneficial to MISD in that being in the TIRZ allows MISD to reduce its wealth in property taxes per students to maximize state funding as well as protection from Chapter 41 provisions.</p> <p>In 2011, the MISD began to lose state funding due to actions by the 82nd Texas Legislature. Because MISD continued to lose state dollars and because the TIRZ had an ample supply of revenue, MISD asked the TIRZ in May of 2013 to rebate or give back a portion of the taxes it was giving up. This was appropriate due to language in the original agreement that the TIRZ would, if resources were available, assist the school with operational costs, new facilities and the initial costs of opening new facilities. The original agreement was for \$1,000,000 per year for five years.</p> <p>Since that agreement rolled off the end of February, 2024, the TIRZ Board voted in October 2024 to execute a Third Agreement by authorized representatives of the Parties. This Third Agreement shall be deemed to be and have been effective on March 1, 2024 (the "Effective Date") and shall terminate on February 28, 2029 (the "Expiration Date"), unless terminated earlier as provided in accordance with Section 3.1, of the agreement.</p>
