**1. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS ACT AND ROLL CALL**

#### **...4-1407. Act, how cited.**

Sections 84-1407 to 84-1414 shall be known and may be cited as the Open Meetings Act.

#### **84-1408. Declaration of intent; meetings open to public.**

It is hereby declared to be the policy of this state that the formation of public policy is public business and may not be conducted in secret.

Every meeting of a public body shall be open to the public in order that citizens may exercise their democratic privilege of attending and speaking at meetings of public bodies, except as otherwise provided by the Constitution of Nebraska, federal statutes, and the Open Meetings Act.

## **Annotations**

- Nebraska's public meetings laws do not apply to school board deliberations pertaining solely to disputed adjudicative facts. *McQuinn v. Douglas Cty. Sch. Dist. No. 66*, 259 Neb. 720, 612 N.W.2d 198 (2000).
- The primary purpose of the public meetings law is to ensure that public policy is formulated at open meetings. *Marks v. Judicial Nominating Comm.*, 236 Neb. 429, 461 N.W.2d 551 (1990).
- The public meetings law is broadly interpreted and liberally construed to obtain the objective of openness in favor of the public, and provisions permitting closed sessions must be narrowly and strictly construed. *Grein v. Board of Education of Fremont*, 216 Neb. 158, 343 N.W.2d 718 (1984).
- Although a committee was a subcommittee of a natural resources district board, it was not subject to the Open Meetings Act because there was never a quorum of board members in attendance and the committee did not hold hearings, make policy, or take formal action on behalf of the board. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- A county board of equalization is a public body whose meetings shall be open to the public. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).

#### **84-1409. Terms, defined.**

For purposes of the Open Meetings Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

(1)(a) Public body means (i) governing bodies of all political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska, (ii) governing bodies of all agencies, created by the Constitution of Nebraska, statute, or otherwise pursuant to law, of the executive department of the State of Nebraska, (iii) all independent boards, commissions, bureaus, committees, councils, subunits, or any other bodies created by the Constitution of Nebraska, statute, or otherwise pursuant to law, (iv) all study or advisory committees of the executive department of the State of Nebraska whether having continuing existence or appointed as special committees with limited existence, (v) advisory committees of the bodies referred to in subdivisions (i), (ii), and (iii) of this subdivision, and (vi) instrumentalities exercising essentially public functions; and

(b) Public body does not include (i) subcommittees of such bodies unless a quorum of the public body attends a subcommittee meeting or unless such subcommittees are holding hearings, making policy, or taking formal action on behalf of their parent body, except that all meetings of any subcommittee established under section 81-15,175 are subject to the Open Meetings Act, (ii) entities conducting judicial proceedings unless a court or other judicial body is exercising rulemaking authority, deliberating, or deciding upon the issuance of administrative orders, and (iii) the Judicial Resources Commission or subcommittees or subgroups of the commission;

(2) Meeting means all regular, special, or called meetings, formal or informal, of any public body for the purposes of briefing, discussion of public business, formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action of the public body; and

(3) Virtual conferencing means conducting or participating in a meeting electronically or telephonically with interaction among the participants subject to subsection (2) of section 84-1412.

## Annotations

- A township is a political subdivision, and as such, a township board is subject to the provisions of the public meetings laws. *Steenblock v. Elkhorn Township Bd.*, 245 Neb. 722, 515 N.W.2d 128 (1994).
- A county agricultural society is a public body to which the provisions of the Nebraska public meetings law are applicable. *Nixon v. Madison Co. Ag. Soc'y*, 217 Neb. 37, 348 N.W.2d 119 (1984).
- Failure by a public governing body, as defined under section 84-1409, R.R.S.1943, to take and record a roll call vote on an action, as required by section 84-1413(2), R.S.Supp.,1980, grants any citizen the right to sue for the purpose of having the action declared void. In this case such failure could not be later corrected by a nunc pro tunc order because there was no showing that a roll call vote on the disputed action was actually taken, and even if it was the record showed it was not recorded until over a year later. Sections 23-1301, R.R.S.1943, and 23-1302, R.R.S.1943, make it the duty of the county clerk to record proceedings of the board of county commissioners. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 208 Neb. 69, 302 N.W.2d 674 (1981).
- Although a committee was a subcommittee of a natural resources district board, it was not subject to the Open Meetings Act because there was never a quorum of board members in attendance and the committee did not hold hearings, make policy, or take formal action on behalf of the board. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- Although the Open Meetings Act does not define "subcommittee," a subcommittee is generally defined as a group within a committee to which the committee may refer business. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).
- The Open Meetings Act does not require policymakers to remain ignorant of the issues they must decide until the moment the public is invited to comment on a proposed policy. By excluding nonquorum subgroups from the definition of a public body, the Legislature

has balanced the public's need to be heard on matters of public policy with a practical accommodation for a public body's need for information to conduct business. *Koch v. Lower Loup NRD*, 27 Neb. App. 301, 931 N.W.2d 160 (2019).

- As an administrative agency of the county, a county board of equalization is a public body. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- The electors of a township at their annual meeting are a public body under the Open Meetings Act. *State ex rel. Newman v. Columbus Township Bd.*, 15 Neb. App. 656, 735 N.W.2d 399 (2007).
- The meeting at issue in this case was a "meeting" within the parameters of subsection (2) of this section because it involved the discussion of public business, the formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action of the public power district. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).
- Informational sessions in which the governmental body hears reports are briefings. *Johnson v. Nebraska Environmental Control Council*, 2 Neb. App. 263, 509 N.W.2d 21 (1993).

**84-1410. Closed session; when; purpose; reasons listed; procedure; right to challenge; prohibited acts; chance meetings, conventions, or workshops.**

(1) Any public body may hold a closed session by the affirmative vote of a majority of its voting members if a closed session is clearly necessary for the protection of the public interest or for the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual and if such individual has not requested a public meeting. The subject matter and the reason necessitating the closed session shall be identified in the motion to close. Closed sessions may be held for, but shall not be limited to, such reasons as:

(a) Strategy sessions with respect to collective bargaining, real estate purchases, pending litigation, or litigation which is imminent as evidenced by communication of a claim or threat of litigation to or by the public body;

(b) Discussion regarding deployment of security personnel or devices;

(c) Investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct;

(d) Evaluation of the job performance of a person when necessary to prevent needless injury to the reputation of a person and if such person has not requested a public meeting;

(e) For the Community Trust created under section 81-1801.02, discussion regarding the amounts to be paid to individuals who have suffered from a tragedy of violence or natural disaster; or

(f) For public hospitals, governing board peer review activities, professional review activities, review and discussion of medical staff investigations or disciplinary actions, and any strategy session concerning transactional negotiations with any referral source that is required by federal law to be conducted at arms length.

Nothing in this section shall permit a closed meeting for discussion of the appointment or election of a new member to any public body.

(2) The vote to hold a closed session shall be taken in open session. The entire motion, the vote of each member on the question of holding a closed session, and the time when the closed session commenced and concluded shall be recorded in the minutes. If the motion to close

passes, then the presiding officer immediately prior to the closed session shall restate on the record the limitation of the subject matter of the closed session. The public body holding such a closed session shall restrict its consideration of matters during the closed portions to only those purposes set forth in the motion to close as the reason for the closed session. The meeting shall be reconvened in open session before any formal action may be taken. For purposes of this section, formal action shall mean a collective decision or a collective commitment or promise to make a decision on any question, motion, proposal, resolution, order, or ordinance or formation of a position or policy but shall not include negotiating guidance given by members of the public body to legal counsel or other negotiators in closed sessions authorized under subdivision (1)(a) of this section.

(3) Any member of any public body shall have the right to challenge the continuation of a closed session if the member determines that the session has exceeded the reason stated in the original motion to hold a closed session or if the member contends that the closed session is neither clearly necessary for (a) the protection of the public interest or (b) the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual. Such challenge shall be overruled only by a majority vote of the members of the public body. Such challenge and its disposition shall be recorded in the minutes.

(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require that any meeting be closed to the public. No person or public body shall fail to invite a portion of its members to a meeting, and no public body shall designate itself a subcommittee of the whole body for the purpose of circumventing the Open Meetings Act. No closed session, informal meeting, chance meeting, social gathering, email, fax, or other electronic communication shall be used for the purpose of circumventing the requirements of the act.

(5) The act does not apply to chance meetings or to attendance at or travel to conventions or workshops of members of a public body at which there is no meeting of the body then intentionally convened, if there is no vote or other action taken regarding any matter over which the public body has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory power.

## Annotations

- There is no absolute discovery privilege for communications that occur during a closed session. *State ex rel. Upper Republican NRD v. District Judges*, 273 Neb. 148, 728 N.W.2d 275 (2007).
- If a person present at a meeting observes a public meetings law violation in the form of an improper closed session and fails to object, that person waives his or her right to object at a later date. *Wasikowski v. Nebraska Quality Jobs Bd.*, 264 Neb. 403, 648 N.W.2d 756 (2002).
- The public interest mentioned in this section is that shared by citizens in general and by the community at large concerning pecuniary or legal rights and liabilities. *Grein v. Board of Education*, 216 Neb. 158, 343 N.W.2d 718 (1984).
- Hearing in closed executive session was contrary to this section since there was no showing of necessity or reason under subdivision (1)(a), (b), or (c), but did not result in reversal of board decision. *Simonds v. Board of Examiners*, 213 Neb. 259, 329 N.W.2d 92

(1983).

- Negotiations for the purchase of land need not be conducted at an open meeting but the deliberations of a city council as to whether an offer to purchase real estate should be made should take place in an open meeting. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- Public meeting law was not violated where the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska voted to hold a closed session to consider the university president's resignation, and also discussed the appointment of an interim president during such session. *Meyer v. Board of Regents*, 1 Neb. App. 893, 510 N.W.2d 450 (1993).

**84-1411. Meetings of public body; notice; method; contents; when available; right to modify; duties concerning notice; virtual conferencing authorized; requirements; emergency meeting without notice; appearance before public body; applicability of section.**

(1)(a) Except as provided in subsection (9) of this section, each public body shall give reasonable advance publicized notice of the time and place of each meeting as provided in this subsection. Such notice shall be transmitted to all members of the public body and to the public.

(b)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(b)(ii) of this section, in the case of a public body described in subdivision (1)(a)(i) of section 84-1409 or such body's advisory committees, such notice shall be given by:

(A)(I) Publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting, (II) posting on such newspaper's website, if available, and (III) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper; or

(B)(I) Posting to the newspaper's website, if available, and (II) posting to a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers if no edition of a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction is to be finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper.

(ii) In the case of the governing body of a city of the second class or village, any advisory committee of such governing body, or the governing body of a rural or suburban fire protection district, such notice shall be given by:

(A)(I) Publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting, (II) posting on such newspaper's website, if available, and (III) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper;

(B)(I) Posting to the newspaper's website, if available, and (II) posting on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers if no edition of a newspaper of general circulation within the public body's jurisdiction is to be finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on the websites by the newspaper; or

(C) Posting written notice in three conspicuous public places in such city, village, or district.

Such notice shall be posted by the public body in the same three places for each meeting.

(iii) In the case of a public body not described in subdivision (1)(b)(i) or (ii) of this section, such notice shall be given by a method designated by the public body.

(iv) In case of refusal, neglect, or inability of the newspaper to publish the notice, the public body shall (A) post such notice on its website, if available, (B) request the newspaper submit a post on a statewide website, if available, established and maintained as a repository for such notices by a majority of Nebraska newspapers, and (C) post such notice in a conspicuous public place in such public body's jurisdiction. The public body shall keep a written record of such posting pursuant to subdivision (1)(b)(iv)(A) and (C) of this section and a written record of the request to the newspaper pursuant to subdivision (1)(b)(iv)(B) of this section. The record of such posting shall be evidence that such posting was done as required and shall be sufficient to fulfill the requirement of publication.

(c) In addition to a method of notice required by subdivision (1)(b)(i) or (ii) of this section, such notice may also be provided by any other appropriate method designated by such public body or such advisory committee.

(d) Each public body shall record the methods and dates of such notice in its minutes.

(e) Such notice shall contain an agenda of subjects known at the time of the publicized notice or a statement that the agenda, which shall be kept continually current, shall be readily available for public inspection at the principal office of the public body during normal business hours. Agenda items shall be sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. Except for items of an emergency nature, the agenda shall not be altered later than (i) twenty-four hours before the scheduled commencement of the meeting or (ii) forty-eight hours before the scheduled commencement of a meeting of a city council or village board scheduled outside the corporate limits of the municipality. The public body shall have the right to modify the agenda to include items of an emergency nature only at such public meeting.

(2)(a) The following entities may hold a meeting by means of virtual conferencing if the requirements of subdivision (2)(b) of this section are met:

(i) A state agency, state board, state commission, state council, or state committee, or an advisory committee of any such state entity;

(ii) An organization, including the governing body, created under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, the Joint Public Agency Act, or the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act;

(iii) The governing body of a public power district having a chartered territory of more than one county in this state;

(iv) The governing body of a public power and irrigation district having a chartered territory of more than one county in this state;

(v) An educational service unit;

(vi) The Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council;

(vii) An organization, including the governing body, of a risk management pool or its advisory committees organized in accordance with the Intergovernmental Risk Management Act;

- (viii) A community college board of governors;
- (ix) The Nebraska Brand Committee;
- (x) A local public health department;
- (xi) A metropolitan utilities district;
- (xii) A regional metropolitan transit authority; and
- (xiii) A natural resources district.

(b) The requirements for holding a meeting by means of virtual conferencing are as follows:

(i) Reasonable advance publicized notice is given as provided in subsection (1) of this section, including providing access to a dial-in number or link to the virtual conference;

(ii) In addition to the public's right to participate by virtual conferencing, reasonable arrangements are made to accommodate the public's right to attend at a physical site and participate as provided in section 84-1412, including reasonable seating, in at least one designated site in a building open to the public and identified in the notice, with: At least one member of the entity holding such meeting, or his or her designee, present at each site; a recording of the hearing by audio or visual recording devices; and a reasonable opportunity for input, such as public comment or questions, is provided to at least the same extent as would be provided if virtual conferencing was not used;

(iii) At least one copy of all documents being considered at the meeting is available at any physical site open to the public where individuals may attend the virtual conference. The public body shall also provide links to an electronic copy of the agenda, all documents being considered at the meeting, and the current version of the Open Meetings Act; and

(iv) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, subsection (1) of section 70-1014, subsection (2) of section 70-1014.02, or subsection (4) of section 79-2204, no more than one-half of the meetings of the state entities, advisory committees, boards, councils, organizations, or governing bodies are held by virtual conferencing in a calendar year. In the case of (A) an organization created under the Interlocal Cooperation Act that sells electricity or natural gas, (B) an organization created under the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act, (C) a governing body of a risk management pool and any advisory committee of such governing body, or (D) any advisory committee of any state entity created in response to the Opioid Prevention and Treatment Act, such organization, governing body, or committee may hold more than one-half of its meetings by virtual conferencing if such organization holds at least one meeting each calendar year that is not by virtual conferencing.

(3) Virtual conferencing, emails, faxes, or other electronic communication shall not be used to circumvent any of the public government purposes established in the Open Meetings Act.

(4) The secretary or other designee of each public body shall maintain a list of the news media requesting notification of meetings and shall make reasonable efforts to provide advance notification to them of the time and place of each meeting and the subjects to be discussed at that meeting.

(5) When it is necessary to hold an emergency meeting without reasonable advance public notice, the nature of the emergency shall be stated in the minutes and any formal action taken in

such meeting shall pertain only to the emergency. Such emergency meetings may be held by virtual conferencing. The provisions of subsection (4) of this section shall be complied with in conducting emergency meetings. Complete minutes of such emergency meetings specifying the nature of the emergency and any formal action taken at the meeting shall be made available to the public by no later than the end of the next regular business day.

(6) A public body may allow a member of the public or any other witness to appear before the public body by means of virtual conferencing.

(7)(a) Notwithstanding subsections (2) and (5) of this section, if an emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to the Emergency Management Act as defined in section 81-829.39, a public body the territorial jurisdiction of which is included in the emergency declaration, in whole or in part, may hold a meeting by virtual conferencing during such emergency if the public body gives reasonable advance publicized notice as described in subsection (1) of this section. The notice shall include information regarding access for the public and news media. In addition to any formal action taken pertaining to the emergency, the public body may hold such meeting for the purpose of briefing, discussion of public business, formation of tentative policy, or the taking of any action by the public body.

(b) The public body shall provide access by providing a dial-in number or a link to the virtual conference. The public body shall also provide links to an electronic copy of the agenda, all documents being considered at the meeting, and the current version of the Open Meetings Act. Reasonable arrangements shall be made to accommodate the public's right to hear and speak at the meeting and record the meeting. Subsection (4) of this section shall be complied with in conducting such meetings.

(c) The nature of the emergency shall be stated in the minutes. Complete minutes of such meeting specifying the nature of the emergency and any formal action taken at the meeting shall be made available for inspection as provided in subsection (5) of section 84-1413.

(8) In addition to any other statutory authorization for virtual conferencing, any public body not listed in subdivision (2)(a) of this section may hold a meeting by virtual conferencing if:

(a) The purpose of the virtual meeting is to discuss items that are scheduled to be discussed or acted upon at a subsequent non-virtual open meeting of the public body;

(b) No action is taken by the public body at the virtual meeting; and

(c) The public body complies with subdivisions (2)(b)(i) and (ii) of this section.

(9) This section does not apply to a meeting of the Nebraska Power Review Board or a public power district, a public power and irrigation district, an electric membership association, an electric cooperative company, a municipality having a generation and distribution system, or a registered group of municipalities if such meeting is subject to section 70-1034.

## Annotations

- Under subsection (1) of this section, the Legislature has imposed only two conditions on the public body's notification method of a public meeting: (1) It must give reasonable advance publicized notice of the time and place of each meeting and (2) it must be recorded in the public body's minutes. *City of Elkhorn v. City of Omaha*, 272 Neb. 867, 725 N.W.2d 792 (2007).
- An emergency is "(a)ny event or occasional combination of circumstances which calls for immediate action or remedy; pressing necessity; exigency; a sudden or unexpected happening; an unforeseen occurrence or condition." *Steenblock v. Elkhorn Township Bd.*, 245 Neb. 722, 515 N.W.2d 128 (1994).
- An agenda which gives reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at a meeting of a city council complies with the requirements of this section. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- When notice is required, a notice of a special meeting of a city council posted in three public places at 10:00 p.m. on the day preceding the meeting is not reasonable advance publicized notice of a meeting as is required by this section. *Pokorny v. City of Schuyler*, 202 Neb. 334, 275 N.W.2d 281 (1979).
- Teacher waived right to object to lack of public notice in board of education employment hearing by voluntary participation in the hearing without objection. *Alexander v. School Dist. No. 17*, 197 Neb. 251, 248 N.W.2d 335 (1976).
- A county board of commissioners and a county board of equalization are not required to give separate notices when the notice states only the time and place that the boards meet and directs a citizen to where the agendas for each board can be found. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- A county board of equalization is a public body which is required to give advanced publicized notice of its meetings. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- Notice of recessed and reconvened meetings must be given in the same fashion as the original meeting. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- True notice of a meeting is not given by burying such in the minutes of a prior board proceeding. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- An agenda notice which merely stated "work order reports" was an inadequate notice under this section because it did not give interested persons knowledge that plans for a 345 kv transmission line through the district was going to be discussed and voted upon at the meeting. Inadequate agenda notice under this section meant there was a substantial

violation of the public meeting laws; however, later actions by the board of directors cured the defects in notice, and such actions were in substantial compliance with the statute. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).

#### **84-1412. Meetings of public body; rights of public; public body; powers and duties.**

(1) Subject to the Open Meetings Act, the public has the right to attend and the right to speak at meetings of public bodies, and all or any part of a meeting of a public body, except for closed sessions called pursuant to section 84-1410, may be videotaped, televised, photographed, broadcast, or recorded by any person in attendance by means of a tape recorder, a camera, video equipment, or any other means of pictorial or sonic reproduction or in writing. Except for closed sessions called pursuant to section 84-1410, a public body shall allow members of the public an opportunity to speak at each meeting.

(2) It shall not be a violation of subsection (1) of this section for any public body to make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations regarding the conduct of persons attending, speaking at, videotaping, televising, photographing, broadcasting, or recording its meetings, including meetings held by virtual conferencing.

(3) No public body shall require members of the public to identify themselves as a condition for admission to the meeting nor shall such body require that the name of any member of the public be placed on the agenda prior to such meeting in order to speak about items on the agenda. The body shall require any member of the public desiring to address the body to identify himself or herself, including an address and the name of any organization represented by such person unless the address requirement is waived to protect the security of the individual.

(4) No public body shall, for the purpose of circumventing the Open Meetings Act, hold a meeting in a place known by the body to be too small to accommodate the anticipated audience.

(5) No public body shall be deemed in violation of this section if it holds its meeting in its traditional meeting place which is located in this state.

(6) No public body shall be deemed in violation of this section if it holds a meeting outside of this state if, but only if:

(a) A member entity of the public body is located outside of this state and the meeting is in that member's jurisdiction;

(b) All out-of-state locations identified in the notice are located within public buildings used by members of the entity or at a place which will accommodate the anticipated audience;

(c) Reasonable arrangements are made to accommodate the public's right to attend, hear, and speak at the meeting, including making virtual conferencing available at an in-state location to members, the public, or the press, if requested twenty-four hours in advance;

(d) No more than twenty-five percent of the public body's meetings in a calendar year are held out-of-state;

(e) Out-of-state meetings are not used to circumvent any of the public government purposes established in the Open Meetings Act; and

(f) The public body publishes notice of the out-of-state meeting at least twenty-one days before the date of the meeting in a legal newspaper of statewide circulation.

(7) Each public body shall, upon request, make a reasonable effort to accommodate the public's right to hear the discussion and testimony presented at a meeting.

(8) Public bodies shall make available at the meeting or the instate location for virtual conferencing as required by subdivision (6)(c) of this section, for examination and copying by members of the public, at least one copy of all reproducible written material to be discussed at an open meeting, either in paper or electronic form. Public bodies shall make available at least one current copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room at a location accessible to members of the public. At the beginning of the meeting, the public shall be informed about the location of the posted information.

- To preserve an objection that a public body failed to make documents available at a public meeting as required by subsection (8) of this section, a person who attends a public meeting must not only object to the violation, but must make that objection to the public body or to a member of the public body. *Stoetzel & Sons v. ### **84-1413. Meetings; minutes; roll call vote; secret ballot; when; agenda and minutes; required on website; when.**

(1) Each public body shall keep minutes of all meetings showing the time, place, members present and absent, and the substance of all matters discussed.

(2) Any action taken on any question or motion duly moved and seconded shall be by roll call vote of the public body in open session, and the record shall state how each member voted or if the member was absent or not voting. The requirements of a roll call or viva voce vote shall be satisfied by a public body which utilizes an electronic voting device which allows the yeas and nays of each member of such public body to be readily seen by the public.

(3) The vote to elect leadership within a public body may be taken by secret ballot, but the total number of votes for each candidate shall be recorded in the minutes.

(4) The minutes of all meetings and evidence and documentation received or disclosed in open session shall be public records and open to public inspection during normal business hours.

(5) Minutes shall be written or kept as an electronic record and shall be available for inspection within ten working days or prior to the next convened meeting, whichever occurs earlier, except that cities of the second class and villages may have an additional ten working days if the employee responsible for writing or keeping the minutes is absent due to a serious illness or emergency.

(6) Beginning July 31, 2022, the governing body of a natural resources district, the city council of a city of the metropolitan class, the city council of a city of the primary class, the city council of a city of the first class, the county board of a county with a population greater than twenty-five thousand inhabitants, and the school board of a school district shall make available

on such entity's public website the agenda and minutes of any meeting of the governing body. The agenda shall be placed on the website at least twenty-four hours before the meeting of the governing body. Minutes shall be placed on the website at such time as the minutes are available for inspection as provided in subsection (5) of this section. This information shall be available on the public website for at least six months.

- Under prior law, if a person present at a meeting observes and fails to object to an alleged public meetings laws violation in the form of a failure to conduct rollcall votes before taking actions on questions or motions pending, that person waives his or her right to object at a later date. *Hauser v. Nebraska Police Stds. Adv. Council*, 264 Neb. 944, 653 N.W.2d 240 (2002).
- Subsection (2) of this section does not require the record to state that the vote was by roll call, but requires only that the record show if and how each member voted. Neither does the statute set a time limit for recording the results of a vote, after which no corrections of the record can be made. If no intervening rights of third persons have arisen, a board of county commissioners has power to correct the record of the proceedings had at a previous meeting so as to make them speak the truth, particularly where the correction supplies some omitted fact or action and is done not to contradict or change the original record but to have the record show that a certain action was taken or thing done, which the original record fails to show. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 214 Neb. 85, 333 N.W.2d 652 (1983).
- Failure by a public governing body, as defined under section 84-1409, R.R.S.1943, to take and record a roll call vote on an action, as required by section 84-1413(2), R.S.Supp.,1980, grants any citizen the right to sue for the purpose of having the action declared void. In this case such failure could not be later corrected by a nunc pro tunc order because there was no showing that a roll call vote on the disputed action was actually taken, and even if it was the record showed it was not recorded until over a year later. Sections 23-1301, R.R.S.1943, and 23-1302, R.R.S.1943, make it the duty of the county clerk to record proceedings of the board of county commissioners. *State ex rel. Schuler v. Dunbar*, 208 Neb. 69, 302 N.W.2d 674 (1981).
- There is no requirement that a public body make a record of where notice was published or posted. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).

### **84-1414. Unlawful action by public body; declared void or voidable by district court; when; duty to enforce open meeting laws; citizen's suit; procedure; violations; penalties.**

(1) Any motion, resolution, rule, regulation, ordinance, or formal action of a public body made or taken in violation of the Open Meetings Act shall be declared void by the district court if the suit is commenced within one hundred twenty days of the meeting of the public body at which the alleged violation occurred. Any motion, resolution, rule, regulation, ordinance, or formal action of a public body made or taken in substantial violation of the Open Meetings Act shall be voidable by the district court if the suit is commenced more than one hundred twenty days after but within one year of the meeting of the public body in which the alleged violation occurred. A suit to void any final action shall be commenced within one year of the action.

(2) The Attorney General and the county attorney of the county in which the public body ordinarily meets shall enforce the Open Meetings Act.

(3) Any citizen of this state may commence a suit in the district court of the county in which the public body ordinarily meets or in which the plaintiff resides for the purpose of requiring compliance with or preventing violations of the Open Meetings Act, for the purpose of declaring an action of a public body void, or for the purpose of determining the applicability of the act to discussions or decisions of the public body. It shall not be a defense that the citizen attended the meeting and failed to object at such time. The court may order payment of reasonable attorney's fees and court costs to a successful plaintiff in a suit brought under this section.

(4) Any member of a public body who knowingly violates or conspires to violate or who attends or remains at a meeting knowing that the public body is in violation of any provision of the Open Meetings Act shall be guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor for a first offense and a Class III misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense.

- The Legislature has granted standing to a broad scope of its citizens for the very limited purpose of challenging meetings allegedly in violation of the Open Meetings Act, so that they may help police the public policy embodied by the act. *Schauer v. Grooms*, 280 Neb. 426, 786 N.W.2d 909 (2010).

- Under the Public Meetings Act, a county lacks capacity to maintain an action to declare its official conduct "void" for noncompliance with the act. *County of York v. Johnson*, 230 Neb. 403, 432 N.W.2d 215 (1988).
- When a petitioner under this section is successful in the district court, that court may allow attorney fees. *Tracy Corp. II v. Nebraska Pub. Serv. Comm.*, 218 Neb. 900, 360 N.W.2d 485 (1984).
- Informal discussions between the Tax Commissioner and the State Board of Equalization in which instructions were clarified, with such clarification leading to the amendment of hearing notices, did not constitute a public meeting subject to the provisions of this section. *Box Butte County v. State Board of Equalization and Assessment*, 206 Neb. 696, 295 N.W.2d 670 (1980).
- The right to collaterally attack an order made in contravention of the Public Meeting Act must occur within a period of one year as is specifically provided by this section. *Witt v. School District No. 70*, 202 Neb. 63, 273 N.W.2d 669 (1979).
- Statutory change, requiring "publicized notice" for board of education employment hearings, occurring between dates meeting scheduled and conducted, held not to void

proceedings. *Alexander v. School Dist. No. 17*, 197 Neb. 251, 248 N.W.2d 335 (1976).

- Voiding an entire meeting is a proper remedy for violations of the Open Meetings Act. Once a meeting has been declared void pursuant to Nebraska's public meetings law, board members are prohibited from considering any information obtained at the illegal meeting. *Wolf v. Grubbs*, 17 Neb. App. 292, 759 N.W.2d 499 (2009).
- Actions by the board of directors were merely voidable under this section, and not void. Pursuant to subsection (3) of this section, the plaintiffs were awarded partial attorney fees because they were successful in having the court declare that the board of directors was in substantial violation of the statute, even though the plaintiffs did not get the relief requested of having the board's actions declared void. *Hansmeyer v. Nebraska Pub. Power Dist.*, 6 Neb. App. 889, 578 N.W.2d 476 (1998).

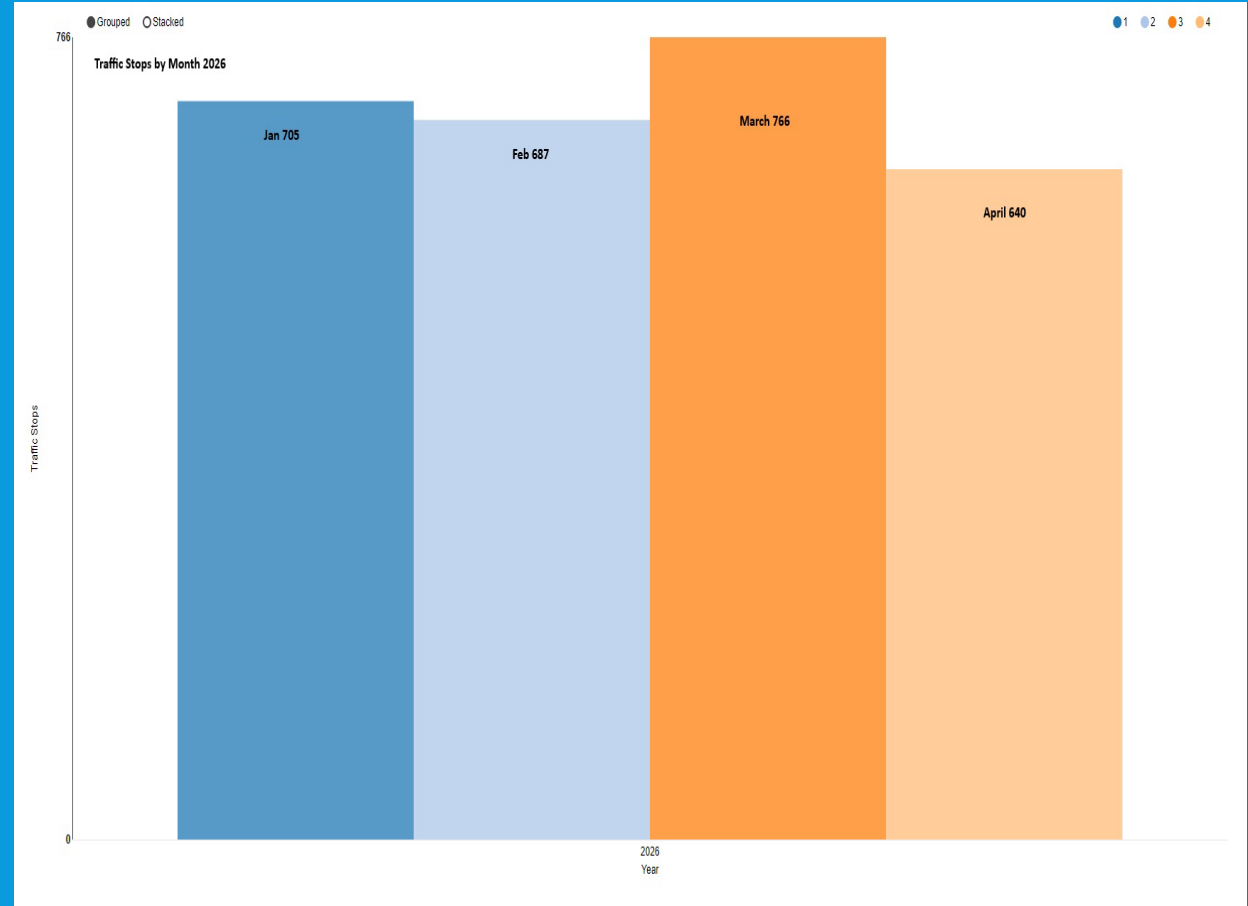
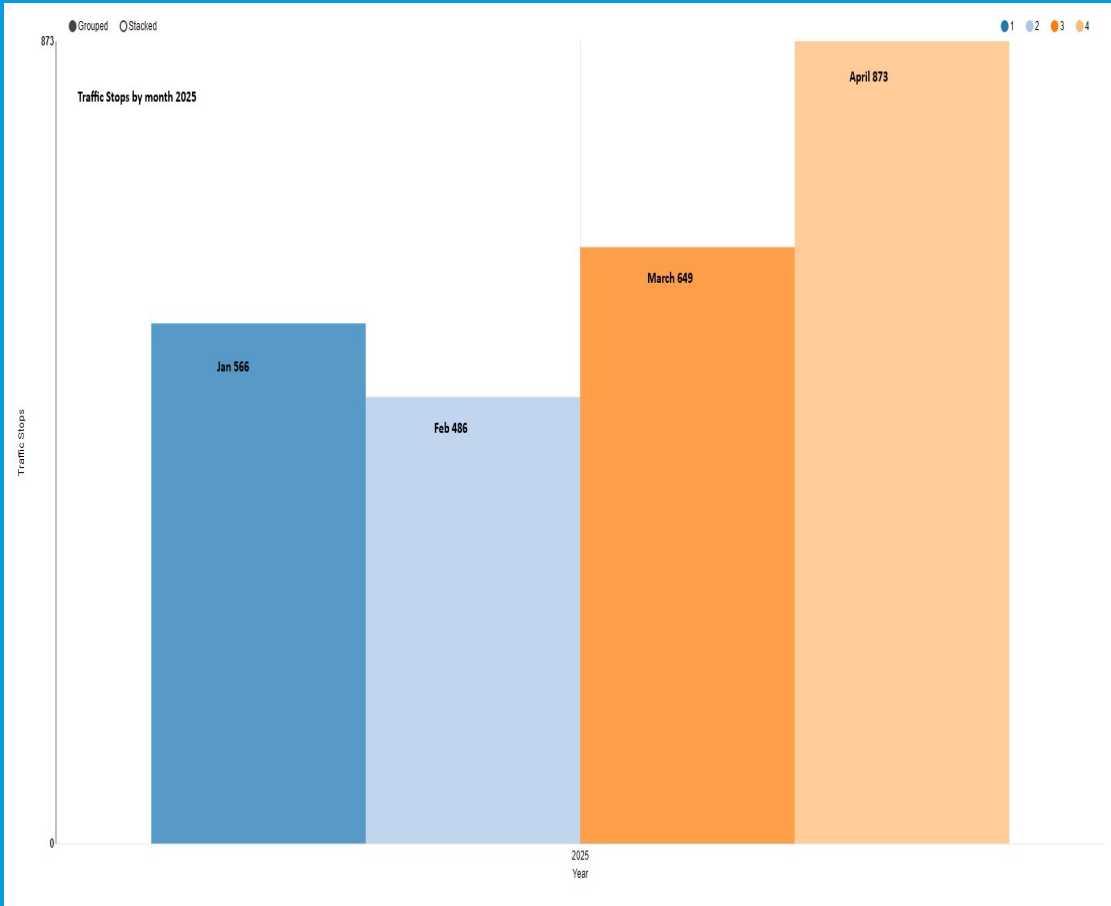

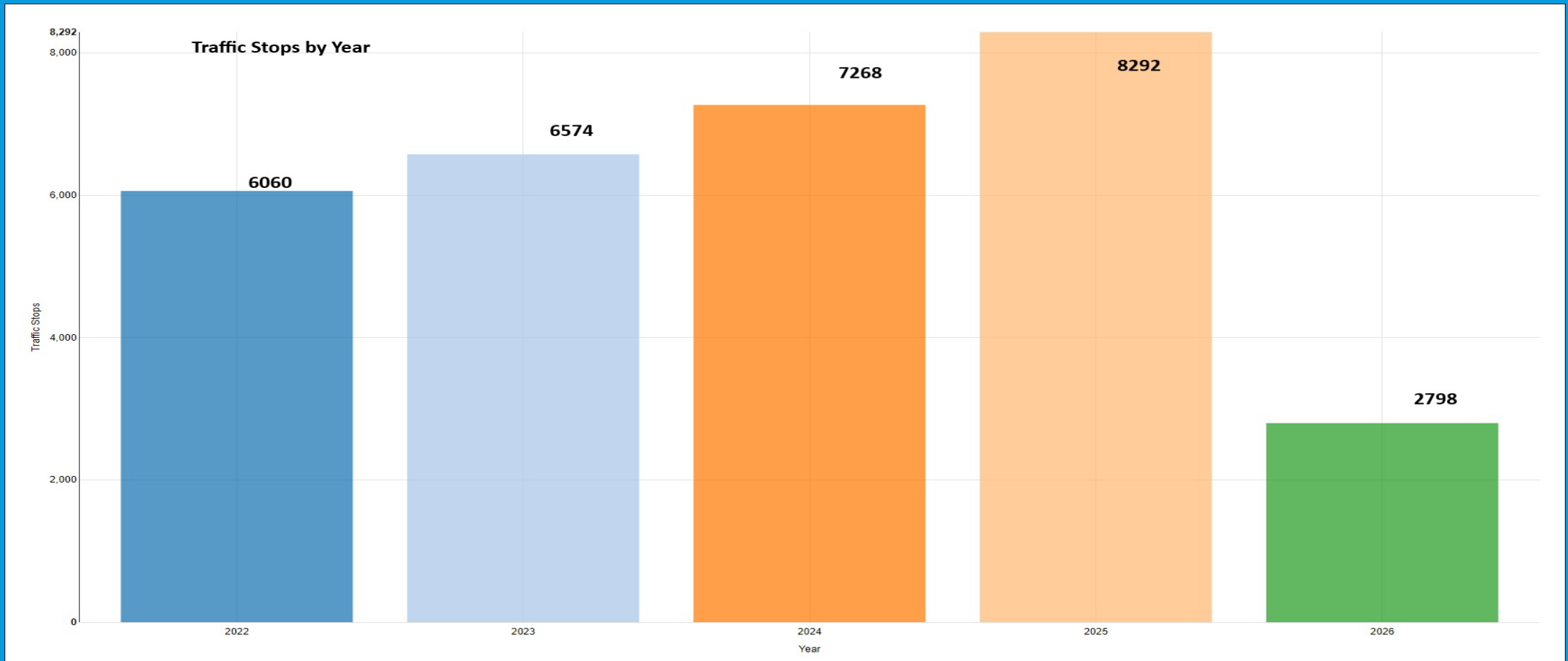

## • Trends—Traffic Stops by month



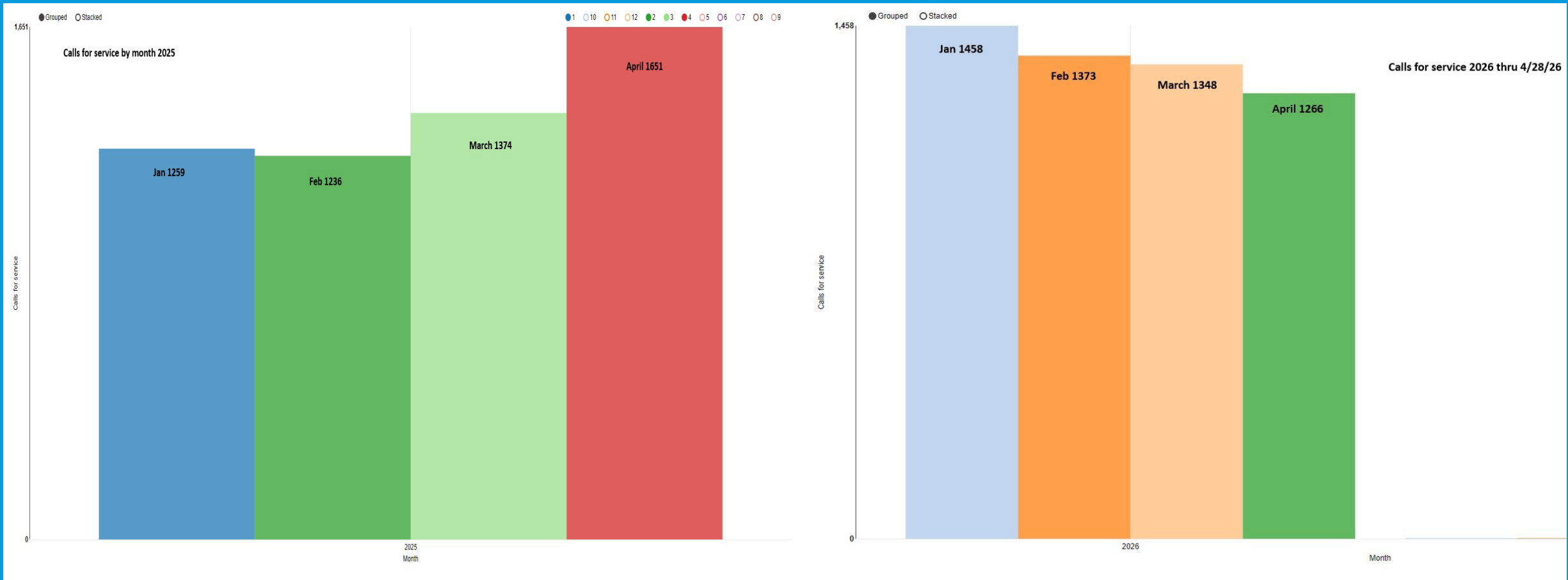

**RECOMMENDATION:**

To adopt the changes in ordinance § 50.35, changing it from Burning of Garbage to Handling of Solid Waste. Also, changing the ordinance requiring that solid waste be properly disposed once a week, either by a licensed hauler or the person responsible for the property.

**DISCUSSION:**

The purpose of this memorandum is to recommend the revision of Ordinance § 50.35 to increase its scope and improve the regulation of solid waste within the City of Columbus.

**Current Ordinance:**

The existing ordinance § 50.35, titled "*Burning of Garbage*," states:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to burn garbage or refuse within the limits of the city."  
(Prior Code, § 50.40) (Ord. 88-11, passed 3-21-1988) Penalty, see § 50.99

While this provision prohibits the burning of garbage, it is limited in scope and does not address broader solid waste handling practices that impact public health, sanitation, and community standards.

**Proposed Revision:**

It is recommended that § 50.35 be repealed and replaced with a new ordinance titled "*Handling of Solid Waste*," which expands regulatory authority to include the proper storage, removal, and disposal of solid waste. The proposed ordinance includes the following key provisions:

- Prohibits accumulation or disposal of solid waste in a manner that creates a nuisance or health hazard
  - Requires weekly removal and proper disposal of solid waste
  - Allows disposal through a licensed hauler or transport by the responsible party to the City Transfer Station
  - Establishes container requirements to prevent leakage, odor, and animal access
  - Prohibits open dumping and maintains the prohibition on burning of solid waste

- Requires transported waste loads to be properly secured or covered



**Handling of Solid Waste**

(A) No person shall accumulate, store, or dispose of solid waste upon any property in a manner that creates a nuisance, health hazard, or violates state or local regulations.

(B) All solid waste generated on any property shall be removed and properly disposed of at least once per week. Disposal shall occur by:

1. A licensed private waste hauler; or
2. The owner, occupant, or person responsible for the property transporting such waste to the City of Columbus Transfer station.

(C) Solid waste shall be stored in suitable containers designed to prevent leakage, odor, and access by animals.

(D) Open dumping and the burning of solid waste are prohibited within the limits of the city.

(E) The owner, occupant, or person in control of the property shall be responsible for compliance with this section.

(F) All loads of waste transported to the City of Columbus Transfer Station in vehicles shall be covered; provided, however, this requirement shall not apply when the entire load of waste is of such bulk that it is unlikely that any of such waste will blow out of or fall out of the vehicle when being driven at the speed of 55 miles per hour.

**RE:** Downtown Parking Regulations and Changes for Consideration

### **DISCUSSION:**

The City's existing downtown parking regulations are established under Resolution R04-123. This resolution outlines where two-hour parking restrictions apply, where they have been removed, and where overnight parking is prohibited. Recent discussions regarding downtown parking have highlighted concerns related to the existing two-hour parking limits and inconsistent compliance. As context, all public parking spaces are currently subject to a general 24-hour limit, with additional two-hour restrictions applied in only the select downtown areas detailed in R04-123.

### **Current Regulations:**

- **Two-hour parking restrictions** are in place Monday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (excluding holidays) on designated downtown streets and avenues.
- **Handicapped parking spaces** and select courthouse-adjacent spaces are exempt from these time limits.
- **Overnight parking restrictions** currently prohibit parking from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. on Mondays on specific downtown corridors to accommodate maintenance activities.

### **Proposed Changes:**

At its most recent meeting, the Downtown Business Improvement District (BID) reviewed parking concerns in detail and advanced a recommendation to the Public Property Committee. The recommendation proposes removing the two-hour parking restriction on downtown avenues where it exists currently, thereby reverting those areas to the standard 24-hour limit. They recommend continuing with the 2-hour limit on 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Street as specified.

This approach reflects a balanced compromise, supporting both short-term parking needs for customers and longer-term parking for employees, residents, and extended visits.

In addition, the Public Works Division has requested an amendment of the no-parking window on select roadways from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. to facilitate routine street sweeping and snow removal operations. This request was discussed with the BID and did not raise concerns.

No change is recommended to the handicapped spaces or spaces adjacent to the courthouse.

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
**1. Removal of Two-Hour Parking Restrictions on Avenues**

- Two-hour parking limits would be **removed from key downtown avenues**, particularly along 25th, 26th, and 27th Avenues between 12th and 14th Streets.
- These areas would revert to the standard 24-hour parking limit.

**2. Updated Overnight Parking Restrictions (2:00 a.m. – 5:00 a.m.)**


- Existing overnight restrictions would be modified and expanded as follows:
  - Every Tuesday year-round: No parking from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.
  - Seasonal (November 1 – March 31): No parking during the same hours on any day when snow has occurred or is forecasted
- Affected locations include:
  - 27th Avenue (12th–13th Streets)
  - 28th Avenue (12th–13th Streets)
  - 13th Street (23rd–30th Avenues)



**Recommendation:** Approve reallocation of capital improvement funds and the proposal from Wemhoff Refrigeration, Inc. to replace the air conditioning units at the Quail Run Pro Shop.

**Discussion:** The air conditioning units at the Quail Run Pro Shop have reached the end of their useful life and are no longer operational. Previous repairs have been made in recent years; however, the system has now failed and requires full replacement.

Staff obtained quotes from local vendors, and Wemhoff Refrigeration, Inc. provided a responsive and qualified proposal for the replacement of the units.

To accommodate this expense, we are requesting funds be reallocated from capital account **100-155-57200-26007**, which was originally designated for a roof replacement project at Van Berg. The allocated amount for that project is insufficient to complete the roof replacement as originally planned, making it an appropriate source for reallocation.

Replacing the AC units will ensure the continued operation and usability of the Pro Shop, particularly during peak seasonal use.

1 WELL NO 20 CONTROL BLOCK DIAGRAM

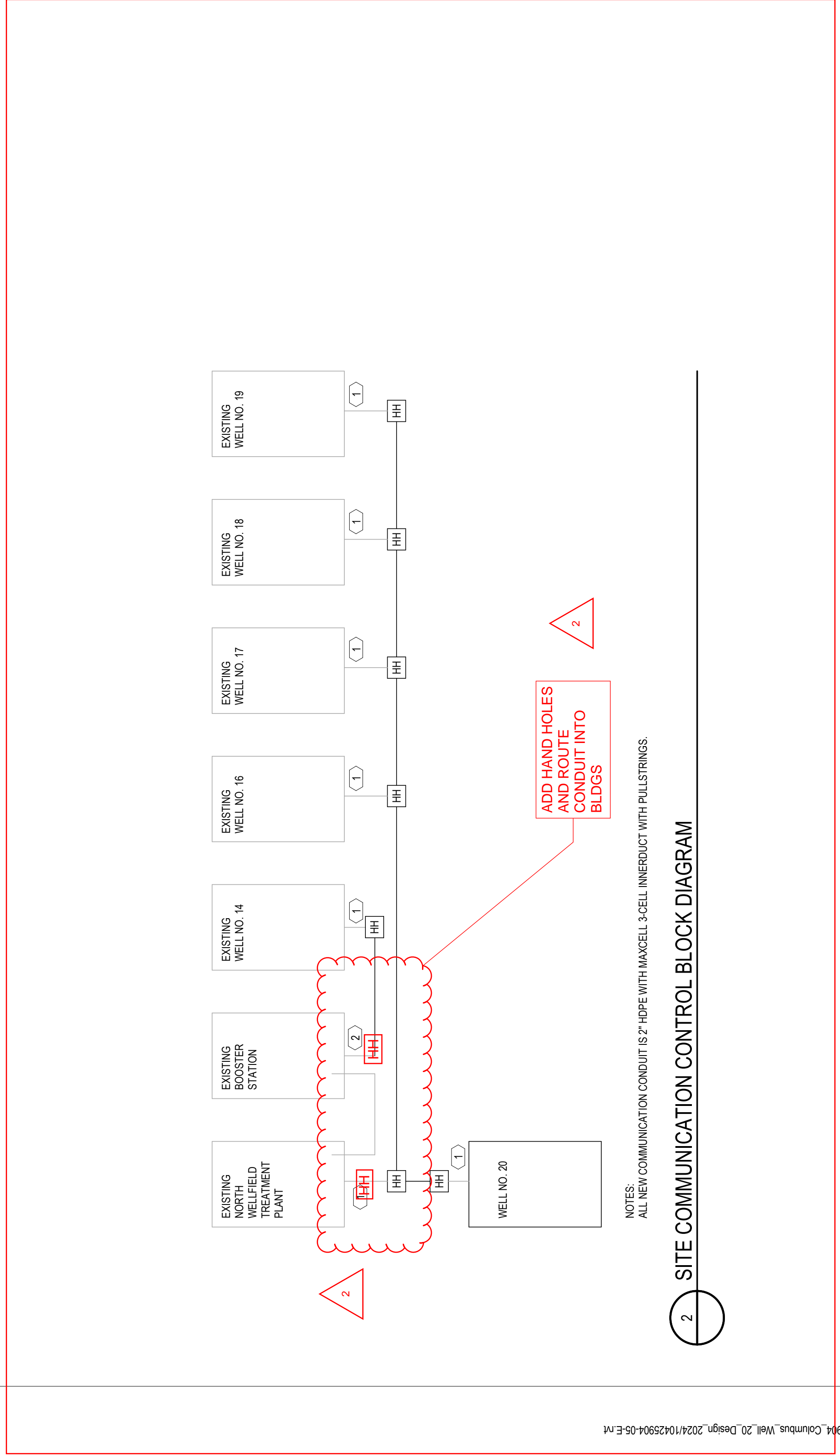

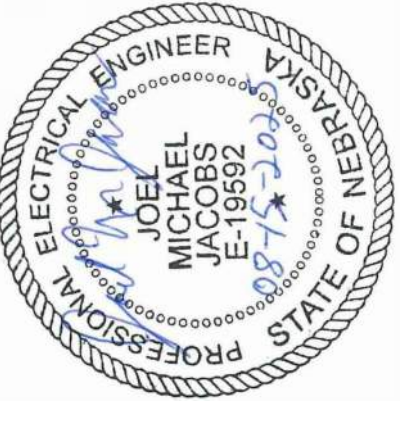

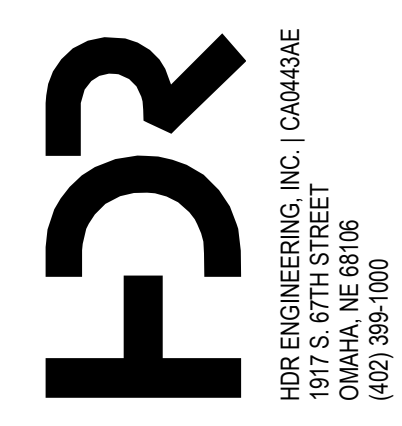

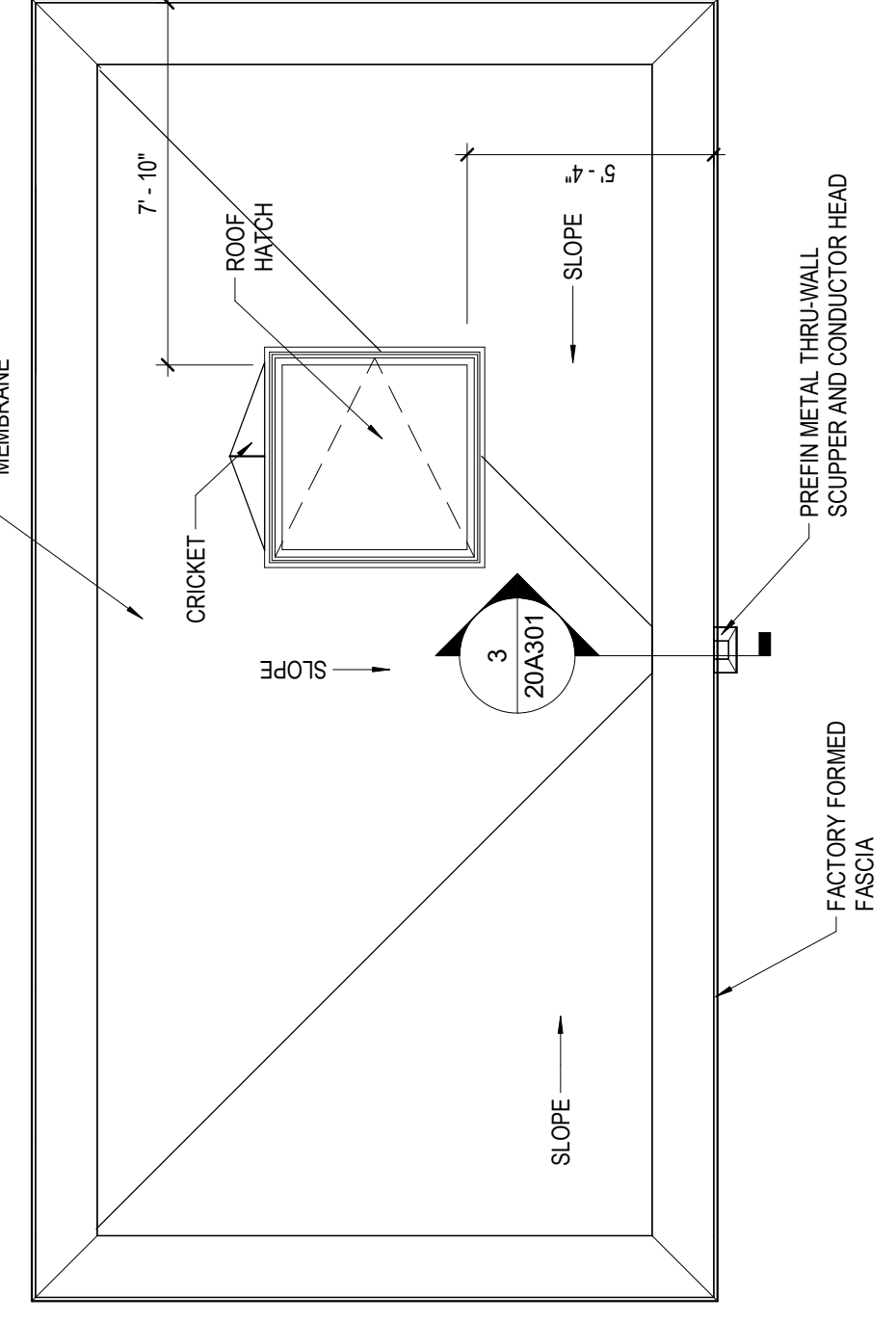

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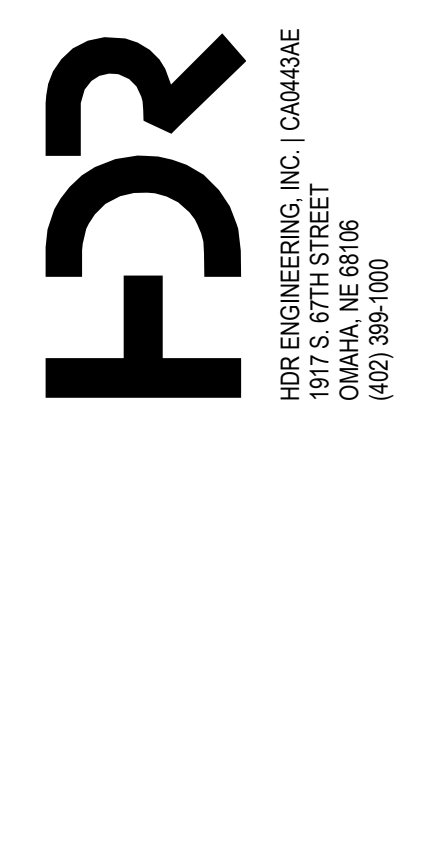

**RECOMMENDATION:**

I recommend reallocating funds and approval of the Agreement between Owner (City) and HDR Engineering for Professional Services for the South Water Treatment Plant Pilot Study in the lump sum amount of \$80,400.

**DISCUSSION:**

The 2024 Columbus Water Master Plan addressed the high levels of manganese in the City's drinking water and the recommended approach to provide partial treatment in the form of a greensand filtration system. This pilot plant study is to assess the effectiveness of greensand filter media to achieve enhanced manganese removal at the South Water Treatment Plant, and to identify expected filter loading rates, head loss characteristics and backwash requirements. The pilot plant study would need to be reviewed by the Nebraska Department of Water, Energy and Environment and used in the design of the facility.

The South Water Treatment Plant is next on the Water Rate Study List after Well No. 20. The pilot plant study would begin immediately upon receipt of notice to proceed and be completed by the end of August or first of September.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

\$80,400 reallocated funds from 2025-2026 budget CIP 25-67 in the amount of \$3,200,000. The North Well No. 20 construction bids were good and came in under budget. It is estimated that the North Well No. 20 expenses will be about \$2,300,000 leaving the excess for reallocation of Water Division needs and services.

**PART 1.0 PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**

The 2024 Columbus Water Master Plan evaluated options to address the high levels of manganese in the City’s drinking water. The recommended approach is the use of Greensand Filtration. The Nebraska Department of Water Environment and Energy (NDWEE) requires completion of pilot testing to confirm the proposed treatment process achieves the desired treatment goals.

The scope of work is for the completion of a pilot study to assess the effectiveness of greensand filter media to achieve enhanced manganese removal at the South Water Treatment Plant, and to identify expected filter loading rates, headloss characteristics and backwash requirements.

**Items of Work**

1. Coordinating the rental and delivery of the pilot system equipment.
2. Planning the filtration system pilot testing protocol and approach.
3. Coordinating with NDWEE to obtain approval of the pilot protocol and approach.
4. Providing the City with operational assistance during pilot testing and advising on changes to testing conditions.
5. Evaluating collected data and summarizing the findings.
6. Preparation of a technical memorandum that summarizes the findings and provides recommendations for the treatment plant modifications for NDWEE review and approval.

**Key Understandings:**

1. All travel will be in proximity to the City of Columbus, Nebraska.
2. All meetings and presentations will be at the City’s offices or on site.
3. Pilot study is for manganese treatment.
4. HDR will coordinate the delivery of the pilot study equipment to the South Water Treatment Plant.
5. HDR will pay costs for pilot equipment rental from Kurita, not to exceed \$40,000. Kurita will be a subcontractor to HDR.
6. Pilot equipment is assumed to be skid mounted and set up within existing South Water Treatment Plant.
7. Total pilot testing assumed to be no longer than seven (7) weeks of operation, in addition to one week of startup and training. A contract amendment will be requested if it is determined during pilot testing that it would be necessary or desirable to extend the pilot duration beyond 7 weeks.
8. Two (2) filter columns with different filter medias will be piloted simultaneously.

- One column will include 24 IN depth of Greensand Plus and 12 IN depth of anthracite media.
  - One column to include 24 IN depth of alternate primary media and a 12 IN depth anthracite.
10. OWNER will perform work related to the installation of the pilot equipment or hire a contractor to perform this work. Installation activities anticipated to include the following: Off-load pilot equipment upon arrival, installation of pilot equipment, suction and discharge pipe installation, installation of electrical services, and installation of backwash system and chemical feed system if applicable (pumps, tanks, instrumentation, and piping).
  11. Owner staff will operate the pilot equipment in accordance with the Pilot Test Protocol.
  12. Lab costs for water sample analyses will be paid for directly by OWNER, if beyond those analyses self-performed by OWNER.
  13. OWNER will perform work related to decommissioning the pilot equipment or hire a contractor to perform this work. Decommissioning activities anticipated to include the following: disconnect pilot equipment from existing unit processes and remove piping; preparation of the pilot units for shipment; and loading of pilot equipment in truck for return to pilot equipment supplier.
  14. The scope of work does not include preliminary or final design of the water treatment improvements.
  15. Weekly coordination meetings will be held virtually.

## 2. INSURANCE/INDEMNITY

ENGINEER agrees to procure and maintain, at its expense, Workers' Compensation insurance as required by statute; Employer's Liability of \$250,000; Automobile Liability insurance of \$1,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage covering all vehicles, including hired vehicles, owned and non-owned vehicles; Commercial General Liability insurance of \$1,000,000 combined single limit for personal injury and property damage; and Professional Liability insurance of \$1,000,000 per claim for protection against claims arising out of the performance of services under this Agreement caused by negligent acts, errors, or omissions for which ENGINEER is legally liable. If flying an Unmanned Aerial System (UAS or drone), ENGINEER will procure and maintain aircraft unmanned aerial systems insurance of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

However, neither Party to this Agreement shall be liable to the other Party for any special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages (including but not limited to loss of use or opportunity; loss of good will; cost of substitute facilities, goods, or services; cost of capital; and/or fines or penalties), loss of profits or revenue arising out of, resulting from, or in any way related to the Project or the Agreement from any cause or causes, including but not limited to any such damages caused by the negligence, errors or omissions, strict liability or breach of contract. The employees of both parties are intended third party beneficiaries of this waiver of consequential damages.

## 3. OPINIONS OF PROBABLE COST

Any opinions of probable project cost or probable construction cost provided by ENGINEER are made on the basis of information available to ENGINEER and on the basis of ENGINEER's experience and qualifications, and represents its judgment as an experienced and qualified professional engineer. However, since ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, or over the contractor(s)' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, ENGINEER does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual project or construction cost will not vary from opinions of probable cost ENGINEER prepares.

## 4. CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES

ENGINEER's observation or monitoring portions of the work performed under construction contracts shall not relieve the contractor from its responsibility for performing work in accordance with applicable contract documents. ENGINEER shall not control or have charge of, and shall not be responsible for, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures of construction, health or safety programs or precautions connected with the work and shall not manage, supervise, control or have charge of construction. ENGINEER shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of the contractor or other parties on the project. ENGINEER shall be

entitled to review all construction contract documents and to require that no provisions extend the duties or liabilities of ENGINEER beyond those set forth in this Agreement. OWNER agrees to include ENGINEER as an indemnified party in OWNER's construction contracts for the work, which shall protect ENGINEER to the same degree as OWNER. Further, OWNER agrees that ENGINEER shall be listed as an additional insured under the construction contractor's liability insurance policies.

## 5. CONTROLLING LAW

This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state where ENGINEER's services are performed.

## 6. SERVICES AND INFORMATION

OWNER will provide all criteria and information pertaining to OWNER's requirements for the project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations. OWNER will also provide copies of any OWNER-furnished Standard Details, Standard Specifications, or Standard Bidding Documents which are to be incorporated into the project.

OWNER will furnish the services of soils/geotechnical engineers or other consultants that include reports and appropriate professional recommendations when such services are deemed necessary by ENGINEER. The OWNER agrees to bear full responsibility for the technical accuracy and content of OWNER-furnished documents and services.

In performing professional engineering and related services hereunder, it is understood by OWNER that ENGINEER is not engaged in rendering any type of legal, insurance or accounting services, opinions or advice. Further, it is the OWNER's sole responsibility to obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or accountant to protect the OWNER's legal and financial interests. To that end, the OWNER agrees that OWNER or the OWNER's representative will examine all studies, reports, sketches, drawings, specifications, proposals and other documents, opinions or advice prepared or provided by ENGINEER, and will obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or other consultant as the OWNER deems necessary to protect the OWNER's interests before OWNER takes action or forebears to take action based upon or relying upon the services provided by ENGINEER.

## 7. SUCCESSORS, ASSIGNS AND BENEFICIARIES

OWNER and ENGINEER, respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the covenants of this Agreement. Neither OWNER nor ENGINEER will assign, sublet, or transfer any interest in this Agreement or claims arising therefrom without the written consent of the other. No third party beneficiaries are intended under this Agreement.

## 8. RE-USE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including all reports, drawings, specifications, computer software or other items prepared or furnished by ENGINEER pursuant to this Agreement, are instruments of service with respect to the project. ENGINEER retains ownership of all such documents. OWNER may retain copies of the documents for its information and reference in connection with the project; however, none of the documents are intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by OWNER or others on extensions of the project or on any other project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended will be at OWNER's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to ENGINEER, and OWNER will defend, indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including attorney's fees,

arising or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle ENGINEER to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by OWNER and ENGINEER.

#### 9. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

OWNER or ENGINEER may terminate the Agreement, in whole or in part, by giving seven (7) days written notice to the other party. Where the method of payment is "lump sum," or cost reimbursement, the final invoice will include all services and expenses associated with the project up to the effective date of termination. An equitable adjustment shall also be made to provide for termination settlement costs ENGINEER incurs as a result of commitments that had become firm before termination, and for a reasonable profit for services performed.

#### 10. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding upon the parties. One or more waivers by either party of any provision, term or condition shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same provision, term or condition.

#### 11. INVOICES

ENGINEER will submit monthly invoices for services rendered and OWNER will make payments to ENGINEER within thirty (30) days of OWNER's receipt of ENGINEER's invoice.

ENGINEER will retain receipts for reimbursable expenses in general accordance with Internal Revenue Service rules pertaining to the support of expenditures for income tax purposes. Receipts will be available for inspection by OWNER's auditors upon request.

If OWNER disputes any items in ENGINEER's invoice for any reason, including the lack of supporting documentation, OWNER may temporarily delete the disputed item and pay the remaining amount of the invoice. OWNER will promptly notify ENGINEER of the dispute and request clarification and/or correction. After any dispute has been settled, ENGINEER will include the disputed item on a subsequent, regularly scheduled invoice, or on a special invoice for the disputed item only.

OWNER recognizes that late payment of invoices results in extra expenses for ENGINEER. ENGINEER retains the right to assess OWNER interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month, but not to exceed the maximum rate allowed by law, on invoices which are not paid within thirty (30) days from the date OWNER receives ENGINEER's invoice. In the event undisputed portions of ENGINEER's invoices are not paid when due, ENGINEER also reserves the right, after seven (7) days prior written notice, to suspend the performance of its services under this Agreement until all past due amounts have been paid in full.

#### 12. CHANGES

The parties agree that no change or modification to this Agreement, or any attachments hereto, shall have any force or effect unless the change is reduced to writing, dated, and made part of this Agreement. The execution of the change shall be authorized and signed in the same manner as this Agreement. Adjustments in the period of services and in compensation shall be in accordance with applicable paragraphs and sections of this Agreement. Any proposed fees by ENGINEER are estimates to perform the services required to complete the project as ENGINEER understands it to be defined. For those projects involving conceptual or process development services, activities often are not fully definable in the initial planning. In any event, as the project progresses, the facts developed may dictate a change in the services to be performed, which may alter the scope. ENGINEER will inform OWNER of such situations so that changes in scope and adjustments to the time of performance and compensation can be made as required. If such change, additional services, or suspension of services results in an increase or decrease in the cost of or time required for performance

of the services, an equitable adjustment shall be made, and the Agreement modified accordingly.

#### 13. CONTROLLING AGREEMENT

These Terms and Conditions shall take precedence over any inconsistent or contradictory provisions contained in any proposal, contract, purchase order, requisition, notice-to-proceed, or like document.

#### 14. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT AND NONDISCRIMINATION

In connection with the services under this Agreement, ENGINEER agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of federal and state Equal Employment Opportunity for individuals based on color, religion, sex, or national origin, or disabled veteran, recently separated veteran, other protected veteran and armed forces service medal veteran status, disabilities under provisions of executive order 11246, and other employment, statutes and regulations, as stated in Title 41 Part 60 of the Code of Federal Regulations § 60-1.4 (a-f), § 60-300.5 (a-e), § 60-741 (a-e).

#### 15. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

OWNER represents to ENGINEER that, to the best of its knowledge, no hazardous materials are present at the project site. However, in the event hazardous materials are known to be present, OWNER represents that to the best of its knowledge it has disclosed to ENGINEER the existence of all such hazardous materials, including but not limited to asbestos, PCB's, petroleum, hazardous waste, or radioactive material located at or near the project site, including type, quantity and location of such hazardous materials. It is acknowledged by both parties that ENGINEER's scope of services do not include services related in any way to hazardous materials. In the event ENGINEER or any other party encounters undisclosed hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall have the obligation to notify OWNER and, to the extent required by law or regulation, the appropriate governmental officials, and ENGINEER may, at its option and without liability for delay, consequential or any other damages to OWNER, suspend performance of services on that portion of the project affected by hazardous materials until OWNER: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the hazardous materials; and (ii) warrants that the project site is in full compliance with all applicable laws and regulations. OWNER acknowledges that ENGINEER is performing professional services for OWNER and that ENGINEER is not and shall not be required to become an "arranger," "operator," "generator," or "transporter" of hazardous materials, as defined in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1990 (CERCLA), which are or may be encountered at or near the project site in connection with ENGINEER's services under this Agreement. If ENGINEER's services hereunder cannot be performed because of the existence of hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement for cause on 30 days written notice. To the fullest extent permitted by law, OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER, its officers, directors, partners, employees, and subconsultants from and against all costs, losses, and damages (including but not limited to all fees and charges of engineers, architects, attorneys, and other professionals, and all court or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) caused by, arising out of or resulting from hazardous materials, provided that (i) any such cost, loss, or damage is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than completed Work), including the loss of use resulting therefrom, and (ii) nothing in this paragraph shall obligate OWNER to indemnify any individual or entity from and against the consequences of that individual's or entity's sole negligence or willful misconduct.

#### 16. EXECUTION

This Agreement, including the exhibits and schedules made part hereof, constitute the entire Agreement between ENGINEER and

OWNER, supersedes and controls over all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may be amended, supplemented or modified only by a written instrument duly executed by the parties.

#### 17. ALLOCATION OF RISK

OWNER AND ENGINEER HAVE EVALUATED THE RISKS AND REWARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROJECT, INCLUDING ENGINEER'S FEE RELATIVE TO THE RISKS ASSUMED, AND AGREE TO ALLOCATE CERTAIN OF THE RISKS, SO, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF ENGINEER (AND ITS RELATED CORPORATIONS, SUBCONSULTANTS AND EMPLOYEES) TO OWNER AND THIRD PARTIES GRANTED RELIANCE IS LIMITED TO THE LESSER OF \$1,000,000 OR ITS FEE, FOR ANY AND ALL INJURIES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, LOSSES, OR EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY AND EXPERT FEES) ARISING OUT OF ENGINEER'S SERVICES OR THIS AGREEMENT REGARDLESS OF CAUSE(S) OR THE THEORY OF LIABILITY, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, INDEMNITY, OR OTHER RECOVERY. ENGINEER'S AND SUBCONSULTANTS' EMPLOYEES ARE INTENDED THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES OF THIS ALLOCATION OF RISK.

#### 18. LITIGATION SUPPORT

In the event ENGINEER is required to respond to a subpoena, government inquiry or other legal process related to the services in connection with a legal or dispute resolution proceeding to which ENGINEER is not a party, OWNER shall reimburse ENGINEER for reasonable costs in responding and compensate ENGINEER at its then standard rates for reasonable time incurred in gathering information and documents and attending depositions, hearings, and trial.

#### 19. NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, no third party beneficiaries are intended under this Agreement. In the event a reliance letter or certification is required under the scope of services, the parties agree to use a form that is mutually acceptable to both parties.

#### 20. UTILITY LOCATION

If underground sampling/testing is to be performed, a local utility locating service shall be contacted to make arrangements for all utilities to determine the location of underground utilities. In addition, OWNER shall notify ENGINEER of the presence and location of any underground utilities located on the OWNER's property which are not the responsibility of private/public utilities. ENGINEER shall take reasonable precautions to avoid damaging underground utilities that are properly marked. The OWNER agrees to waive any claim against ENGINEER and will indemnify and hold ENGINEER harmless from any claim of liability, injury or loss caused by or allegedly caused by ENGINEER's damaging of underground utilities that are not properly marked or are not called to ENGINEER's attention prior to beginning the underground sampling/testing.

#### 21. UNMANNED AERIAL SYSTEMS

If operating UAS, ENGINEER will obtain all permits or exemptions required by law to operate any UAS included in the services. ENGINEER's operators have completed the training, certifications and licensure as required by the applicable jurisdiction in which the UAS will be operated. OWNER will obtain any necessary permissions for ENGINEER to operate over private property, and assist, as necessary, with all other necessary permissions for operations.

#### 22. OPERATIONAL TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS

OWNER agrees that the effectiveness of operational technology systems and features designed, recommended or assessed by ENGINEER (collectively "OT Systems") are dependent upon OWNER's continued operation and maintenance of the OT Systems

in accordance with all standards, best practices, laws, and regulations that govern the operation and maintenance of the OT Systems. OWNER shall be solely responsible for operating and maintaining the OT Systems in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, and industry standards (e.g. ISA, NIST, etc.) and best practices, which generally include but are not limited to, cyber security policies and procedures, documentation and training requirements, continuous monitoring of assets for tampering and intrusion, periodic evaluation for asset vulnerabilities, implementation and update of appropriate technical, physical, and operational standards, and offline testing of all software/firmware patches/updates prior to placing updates into production. Additionally, OWNER recognizes and agrees that OT Systems are subject to internal and external breach, compromise, and similar incidents. Security features designed, recommended or assessed by ENGINEER are intended to reduce the likelihood that OT Systems will be compromised by such incidents. However, ENGINEER does not guarantee that OWNER's OT Systems are impenetrable and OWNER agrees to waive any claims against ENGINEER resulting from any such incidents that relate to or affect OWNER's OT Systems.

#### 23. FORCE MAJEURE

ENGINEER shall not be responsible for delays caused by factors beyond ENGINEER's reasonable control, including but not limited to delays because of strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns or stoppages, government ordered industry shutdowns, power or server outages, acts of nature, widespread infectious disease outbreaks (including, but not limited to epidemics and pandemics), failure of any governmental or other regulatory authority to act in a timely manner, failure of the OWNER to furnish timely information or approve or disapprove of ENGINEER's services or work product, or delays caused by faulty performance by the OWNER's or by contractors of any level or any other events or circumstances not within the reasonable control of the party affected, whether similar or dissimilar to any of the foregoing. When such delays beyond ENGINEER's reasonable control occur, the OWNER agrees that ENGINEER shall not be responsible for damages, nor shall ENGINEER be deemed in default of this Agreement, and the parties will negotiate an equitable adjustment to ENGINEER's schedule and/or compensation if impacted by the force majeure event or condition.

#### 24. EMPLOYEE IMMUNITY

The parties to this Agreement acknowledge that an individual employee or agent may not be held individually liable for negligence with regard to services provided under this Agreement. To the maximum extent permitted by law, the parties intend i) that this limitation on the liability of employees and agents shall include directors, officers, employees, agents and representatives of each party and of any entity for whom a party is legally responsible, and ii) that any such employee or agent identified by name in this Agreement shall not be deemed a party.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

I recommend approval of, and for City Engineer Richard Bogus to sign, the Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program Agreement between Nebraska Emergency Management Agency and City of Columbus for the Columbus Area Regional Flood Mitigation Assessment.

**DISCUSSION:**

The City of Columbus is the subrecipient of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program, for Columbus Area Regional Flood Mitigation Assessment, Grant Agreement No. DR-4778-NE, Project No. 0005, administered through the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA).

This study will enhance the knowledge, skills and expertise of stakeholders to expand or improve administration of flood mitigation assistance. This includes activities such as building code adjustments, partnerships, project scoping, flood hazard mitigation planning and other planning related activities. The objectives and mitigation outcomes of this regional flood assessment align with the following Continued Mitigation Actions as identified hazard mitigation plan: improve warning systems - specifically for flooding; improve emergency communications - specifically for emergency communications during flooding events; develop/implement hazard/emergency operations and response plan - specifically for emergency flood response; develop/update floodplain information - specifically to identify high risk flood zones where detailed studies are not available (not intended to update FEMA flood maps); and facility flood proofing - specifically for high-risk structures within 1% flood inundation areas. The study area includes rural populations in the southern portions of Platte County and Nance County, eastern portions of Howard County and southeastern portions of the Lower Loup NRD. The city will utilize appropriate local/state/federal procurement procedures to select a highly qualified professional consultant to provide assistance in the development of the flood risk reduction assessment.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

Grant in the amount not to exceed \$142,500 or 75 percent of allowable costs, whichever is less. City would pay 25 percent up to \$47,500 and all costs above this combined total \$190,000 amount as part of 2025-2026 CIP #20-03.

**I. AGREEMENTS**

- The recipient agrees to abide by the DHS Standard Terms and Conditions applicable at the time of the signing of this Agreement. Changes or modifications to the DHS Standard Terms and Conditions as a result of Court Orders or Agreements shall be incorporated into this Agreement.
- 2 CFR Part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards".

- Robert T. Stafford Disaster Assistance and Emergency Relief Act (Stafford Act), 42 U.S.C. § 5133, as amended by Section 102 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA).
- Title 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR).

The SUBRECIPIENT shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and policies as defined in the State of Nebraska Hazard Mitigation Administrative Plan.

The SUBRECIPIENT is actively encouraged to comply with the Build American, Buy America Act (BABAA), Section 70914 of Public Law No. 117-58 §§ 70901-52.

#### **IV. SCOPE OF WORK**

This AGREEMENT is to provide SUBRECIPIENT with federal assistance from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds for the above referenced mitigation grant. The federal share shall not exceed \$142,500.00 or 75% of the actual allowable project costs, whichever is less. The SUBRECIPIENT shall provide at least \$47,500.00 (25%) through local non-federal (cash and/or in-kind) sources for actual allowable project costs.

The SUBRECIPIENT Management Cost for the above referenced mitigation grant, 100% federally funded, have been approved \$9,500.00 (100% Fed Share). Management Costs are based on actual documented incurred management costs, up to 5% of the total amount expended on the project by the SUBRECIPIENT. Management Costs are subject to incremental funding obligations; therefore, FEMA has released to the state \$9,500.00 (100% Federal funds) in approved Subrecipient Management Cost funding for budget year one. These funds are to assist the SUBRECIPIENT with completing the approved scope of work in accordance with the work schedule, milestones, and scope of work that was submitted to and approved by NEMA and FEMA.

Any changes to the approved scope of work and/or amount budgeted must be submitted to and approved by NEMA prior to executing the changes. The SUBRECIPIENT is required to obtain all necessary permits before construction begins.

#### **V. ACTIVITY COMPLETION TIMEFRAME**

The approved activity completion timeframe for this project is from 03/03/2026 through 08/01/2029. All work shall be completed prior to the activity completion timeframe ending. The SUBRECIPIENT shall not incur costs or obligate funds for any purpose pertaining to the operation of the project, program, or activities beyond the expiration date of the activity completion timeframe.

If a time extension is needed it must be requested at least 75 days prior to the activity completion timeframe end date. All requests shall be supported by adequate justification submitted to NEMA in order to be processed. This justification is a written explanation of the reason or reasons for the delay; an outline of remaining funds available to support the extended activity completion timeframe; and a description of performance measures necessary to complete the project. Without the justification, extension requests will not be processed.

If the activity is not completed by the agreed upon end date, and no extension is granted, NEMA may suspend or terminate any further obligation to provide funding or demand return of grant funds authorized by the AGREEMENT.

## **VI. GRANT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM**

To ensure that federal funds are awarded and expended appropriately, the SUBRECIPIENT shall establish and maintain a grant management system. The standards for SUBRECIPIENT organizations stem from the Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) Uniform Administrative Requirements and Cost Principles. State, local and tribal organizations must follow the uniform administrative requirements standards in 2 CFR Part 200. These standards plus the requirements of the federal Cash Management Improvement Act constitute the basis for all policies, processes and procedures set forth in this grant management system for the SUBRECIPIENT.

The SUBRECIPIENT's grant management system shall include the following:

- Internal controls based on the American Institute for Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) definitions and requirements in the government-wide administrative requirements and cost principles.
- A chart of accounts that includes a separate cost center, fund, or accounting codes for each federal grant or program.
- Compliance with the Cash Management Improvement Act (CMIA), good business processes and Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).
- Procedures to minimize federal cash on hand.
- The ability to track expenditures on a cash or accrual basis.
- The ability to track expenditures in both financial and program budgets.
- Procedures to document all grant-related expenditures.
- Procedures to ensure expenditures are eligible and allowable.
- The ability to fulfill government-required financial reporting forms.

## **VII. PROCUREMENT**

All procurement under this AGREEMENT shall be executed by the SUBRECIPIENT. Procurement standards shall be in accordance with the written adopted procedures of the SUBRECIPIENT, provided that the local procurement standards conform to applicable State and Federal law and the standards identified in the 44 CFR and 2 CFR Part 200. The SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that every purchase order or other contract includes any clauses required by Federal statutes and executive orders and their implementing regulations. Failure to comply with applicable procurement statutes and regulations may result in additional conditions under 2 CFR § 200.208. If failure to comply continues by SUBRECIPIENT, additional remedies or termination of the award under 2 CFR §§ 200.339-200.340 may occur.

### **VIII. PAYMENT REQUEST PROCESS**

Payments to SUBRECIPIENTS are based on eligible expenditures that are specifically related to the approved grant budget and scope of work. SUBRECIPIENTS can request Reimbursement for allowable expenditures already paid at any time during the activity completion timeframe.

Payments shall be limited to the documented cash requirements submitted by the SUBRECIPIENT. The SUBRECIPIENT must submit a completed Payment Request Form and provide supporting documentation of eligible project costs to receive payment of funds.

Reimbursement requests shall include payment verification (i.e. paid invoices, receipts, payroll records with personnel activity reports, cancelled checks, general ledger print outs, etc.).

Payment of funds shall not be made to a SUBRECIPIENT until NEMA has this grant agreement signed and on file.

Payments to SUBRECIPIENT are based on eligible expenditures that are specifically related to the approved subaward budget and scope of work. SUBRECIPIENT has two options available to them when requesting payments from NEMA. SUBRECIPIENT may request either **Reimbursement** for allowable expenditures already paid or request an **Advance** for expenditures to be paid within 30 days. Advance payments will only be entertained for certain projects. Below notes whether or not this project is allowed advance payments:

Payments shall be limited to the documented cash requirements submitted by the SUBRECIPIENT. The SUBRECIPIENT shall submit a completed Payment Request Form and provide supporting documentation of eligible subaward costs to receive payment of funds.

- **Reimbursement** requests shall include payment verification (i.e. paid invoices, receipts, payroll records with personnel activity reports, cancelled checks, general ledger printouts, etc.). NEMA reserves the right to request that the SUBRECIPIENT submit additional documentation expenditures upon request. Additional documentation for Acquisitions: Purchase Offers, HUD Settlement Statements, and copies of tax assessment records, copies of appraisals if used as the basis for pre-flood fair market value, invoices, and copies of all payments.
- **Advance** payment requests shall include the detailed costs the SUBRECIPIENT is obligated to pay (i.e. invoices, accepted quotes, executed contracts, or other documents). Payment verification documents (same documents required for a Reimbursement request) for the advance shall be submitted to NEMA within 30 days after the advance, and before future advances are made.

A SUBRECIPIENT shall submit only reimbursement requests, and is not eligible for Advance payment, if SUBRECIPIENT is unable to demonstrate the following:

- The willingness to maintain written procedures that minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds and disbursement by NEMA;
- A financial management system that meets the standards for fund control and accountability as established in 2 CFR Part 200; or
- Is considered a High Risk subrecipient.

No more than thirty (30) days shall elapse between the date of receipt of a warrant and pay out of the funds by the SUBRECIPIENT. All supporting documentation shall be submitted to NEMA immediately following the SUBRECIPIENT's pay out of the funds.

Payment of funds shall not be made to the SUBRECIPIENT until NEMA has on file the following documents:

- FEMA Award Notification (attached to this AGREEMENT).
- Signed Subaward Agreement.
- Substitute W9/Vendor Update Form (if not already on file at NEMA).
- Chart of Accounts verifying that unique revenue and expenditure accounts, cost centers or account codes have been established within the SUBRECIPIENT's cash management/accounting system for each program included in this AGREEMENT.
- Procurement documents: written procurement and conflict of interest documents, method of procurement, bid specifications reviewed by NEMA, copy of approved and executed contracts between the SUBRECIPIENT and contractor.
- Signed certification from the SUBRECIPIENT's authorized representative for the payment request as outlined in 2 CFR, Part 200, Subpart D, Section 200.415.

#### **IX. MATCH VERIFICATION**

The maximum federal share to this mitigation grant shall not exceed 75% of eligible grant expenditures. Therefore, the matching funds (cash and in-kind) shall be at least 25% of eligible grant expenditures. The SUBRECIPIENT is responsible for submitting proof of the local non-federal match that was used for their mitigation grant to NEMA. Expenditures shall be in accordance with the approved scope of work and budget and in accordance with the 2 CFR §§ 200.29 and 200.306.

Cash match may be money contributed to the SUBRECIPIENT by the SUBRECIPIENT, other public agencies and institutions, private organizations and individuals as long as it comes from a non-federal source. Cash spent shall be for allowable costs in accordance with the SUBRECIPIENT's approved scope of work and budget and shall be applicable to the period to which the cost sharing or matching requirement applies.

In-kind match shall comply with the requirements of 2 CFR §§ 200.343 and 200.344. The value of in-kind contributions is also applicable to the period to which the cost sharing or matching requirement applies. The in-kind match provided shall be documented by the third party contributing the in-kind services. The in-kind match shall be specifically stated in the

SUBRECIPIENT's scope of work and budget before in-kind match will be allowed to match any mitigation grant. Documentation may be a letter (on letterhead) from the third party stating the scope of their work, what is being contributed as it relates to the scope of work, the value, a statement to the effect that the value is normally charged, and a statement that the value is being waived on behalf of the SUBRECIPIENT to meet the matching requirements to the SUBRECIPIENT's mitigation grant or a spreadsheet detailing in-kind contributions certified by the Authorized Representative.

If the local match is insufficient to satisfy the local match requirements for receiving all available federal funds, the awarded federal funds shall be reduced accordingly so as not to exceed the maximum federal share allowed under this award.

#### **X. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

The mitigation grant requires quarterly programmatic and financial reporting and progress relative to the approved scope of work. SUBRECIPIENTS shall complete the quarterly progress report forms that are provided by NEMA and submit them by the 15th day following each federal fiscal quarter. (See administrative plan for specific date.)

The SUBRECIPIENT shall attend and participate in monthly check-in meetings with RECIPIENT in a manner to be determined by NEMA. The purpose of the meeting is to evaluate project progress and address any other business relating to the project.

#### **XI. RECORDS AND DOCUMENTATION**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall be responsible for keeping records which fully disclose the amount and disposition of funds at all times, and the total costs of each project for which the funds are provided.

The SUBRECIPIENT shall retain all grant records for three (3) years after being notified by the Nebraska Emergency management Agency that the overall grant has been closed by DHS/FEMA.

The State requires the subrecipient to submit back-up documentation to substantiate all costs.

The SUBRECIPIENT shall give the federal awarding agency, the Comptroller General of the United States, and if appropriate, the State, through any authorized representative, access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, or documents related to the assistance; and shall establish a proper accounting system in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards or agency directives.

#### **XII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS OF APPLICANT**

The SUBRECIPIENT, its officers, employees, agents and council members shall all perform their obligations under this AGREEMENT as an independent contractor and not in any manner as officers, employees or agents of NEMA or the State of Nebraska.

### **XIII. CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

The SUBRCIPIENT shall establish safeguards to prohibit employees from using their positions for a purpose that constitutes or presents the appearance of personal or organizational conflict of interest or personal gain.

### **XIV. WAGE RATES**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall comply, as applicable, with the provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 276a to 276a-7), the Copeland Act (40 U.S.C. § 276c and 18 U.S.C. § 874), the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 327-333) regarding labor standards for federally assisted construction subawards.

### **XV. LOBBYING**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall comply with the provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 1501-1508 and §§ 7324-7328) which limit the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with federal funds.

### **XVI. AUDIT**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall comply with the required financial and compliance audits in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR part 200).

### **XVII. FLOODPLAIN**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall comply with all floodplain management laws and regulations including any special conditions placed on the grant.

### **XVIII. WAIVERS**

No conditions or provisions of this AGREEMENT may be waived unless approved by NEMA and the SUBRECIPIENT, in writing. Unless otherwise stated in writing, NEMA's failure to insist upon strict performance of any provision of this AGREEMENT, or to exercise any right based upon a breach, shall not constitute a waiver of any right or obligation specified under this AGREEMENT.

### **XIX. AMENDMENTS AND MODIFICATIONS**

This AGREEMENT may be amended or modified in reference to the grant funds provided, administrative procedures, or any other necessary matter, but shall not take effect until approved, in writing, by NEMA and the SUBRECIPIENT.

### **XX. COMPLIANCE, TERMINATION, AND OTHER REMEDIES**

Unless otherwise stated in writing, NEMA requires strict compliance by the SUBRECIPIENT and its Authorized Representative(s) with the terms of this AGREEMENT, and the requirements of any applicable local, state, and federal statute, rules, regulations; particularly those included in the Assurances attached to this grant agreement.

NEMA may suspend or terminate any obligation to provide funding or demand return of grant funds, following notice from NEMA, if the SUBRECIPIENT fails to meet any obligations under this AGREEMENT or fails to make satisfactory progress toward administration or completion of said project.

Any suspension or termination of funding or demand of return of grant funds by NEMA shall not relieve SUBRECIPIENT of liability for any obligation incurred by SUBRECIPIENT due to said project.

The SUBRECIPIENT understands and agrees that NEMA may enforce the terms of this AGREEMENT by any combination or all remedies available to NEMA under this AGREEMENT, or under any other provision of law, common law, or equity.

#### **XXI. INDEMNIFICATION**

It is understood and agreed by NEMA and the SUBRECIPIENT and its agents that nothing in this AGREEMENT is intended, nor may be construed, to create any rights, confer any benefits, or relieve any liability, of any kind whatsoever in any third person not a party to this AGREEMENT.

The SUBRECIPIENT, on behalf of itself and its successors and assignees, agrees to protect, save, and hold harmless NEMA and the State of Nebraska, and their authorized agents and employees, from all claims, actions, costs, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever by reason of the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the SUBRECIPIENT or its authorized representative, its contractors, subcontractors, assignees, agents, licensees, arising out of or in connection with any acts or activities authorized by this AGREEMENT. The SUBRECIPIENT's obligation to protect, save, and hold harmless as herein provided shall not extend to claims or causes of action for costs, damages, or expenses caused by or resulting from the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of NEMA, the State of Nebraska, or any of their authorized agents or employees.

The SUBRECIPIENT further agrees to defend NEMA, the State of Nebraska, and their authorized agents and employees against any claim or cause of action, or to pay reasonable attorney's fees incurred in the defense of any such claim or cause of action, as to which the SUBRECIPIENT is required to protect, save, or hold harmless said parties pursuant to paragraph 2 of this section. The SUBRECIPIENT's obligation to defend, or to pay attorney's fees for the defense of such claims or causes of action as herein provided, shall not extend to claims or causes of action for costs, damages, or expenses caused by or resulting from the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of NEMA, the State of Nebraska, or any of their authorized agents or employees.

#### **XXII. ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**

The SUBRECIPIENT shall include, in any public or private release of information regarding the project, language that acknowledges the funding contribution through NEMA by FEMA.

**XXIII. RESPONSIBILITY FOR PROJECT**

While NEMA undertakes to provide technical assistance to the SUBRECIPIENT and its authorized representative in the administration of the project, said project remains the sole responsibility of the applicant in accomplishing grant objectives and goals. NEMA undertakes no responsibility to the SUBRECIPIENT, or any third party, other than what is expressly set out in this AGREEMENT.

**XXIV. NOTICES AND COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN NEMA AND SUBRECIPIENT**

## **EXHIBIT A: Scope of Work-Reporting & Administrative Requirements-Project Budget**

### **1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT(S).**

**1.1 Project description:** This assessment will be an activity that will enhance the knowledge, skills, and expertise of stakeholders to expand or improve the administration of flood mitigation assistance. This includes activities such as building code adjustments, partnerships, project scoping, flood hazard mitigation planning, and other planning-related activities. The objectives and mitigation outcomes of this regional flood assessment align with the following Continued Mitigation Actions as identified hazard mitigation plan: improve warning systems - specifically for flooding; improve emergency communications - specifically for emergency communications during flooding events; develop/implement hazard/emergency operations and response plan - specifically for emergency flood response; develop/update floodplain information - specifically to identify high risk flood zones where detailed studies are not available (not intended to update FEMA flood maps); and facility flood proofing - specifically for high-risk structures within 1% flood inundation areas. A brief summary of specific project tasks is included below. Task 1: Project Management - Periodic coordination by the city and other stakeholders will be conducted to share progress reports, and coordinate the collection of data and input. Progress meetings will be conducted as well as contract administration. Task 1A: Grant Administration (Management Costs are not part of the overall project budget) - The City will coordinate with NEMA to ensure the project adheres to grant requirements, and that schedules and budgets are maintained. Quarterly progress reports will be prepared and submitted to NEMA. Task 2: Background Data Collection and Field Visits - Gather and review readily available information such as: pertinent historical records; information provided by local entities; Flood Insurance Studies; Bridge As-builts; Emergency Action Plans; Local Emergency Operation Plans; Historical Records of Flooding and Ice Jams; LiDAR, aerial imagery and other GIS data. Field visits to potential project locations will be conducted as needed to identify key features, such as at ice jam-prone bridges. Task 3: Hydrologic and Hydraulic Analyses - Available existing hydrologic data for the 50-year (2% annual chance exceedance) and 100-year (1% annual chance exceedance) events will be the focus of the hydrologic analyses. Hydraulic analyses will be performed utilizing HEC-RAS 2D and readily available topographic data. The hydrologic and hydraulic analyses will support development of high-risk or high-velocity flood zones in reaches of the Loup River upstream of the City, where a detailed flood study has not been completed and where a floodway has not been designated. The analyses will also support evaluation of upstream bridges, potential relief channels and river bends at known locations at risk to ice jams. Task 4: Stakeholder Collaboration and Public Engagement - To leverage support for the flood mitigation effort, multiple affected partner jurisdictions will be collaborating in this effort. In addition to the City of Columbus, it is anticipated that Platte County, Nance County, the Lower Loup NRD and other key stakeholders will be involved in the project. These partnerships will provide invaluable insight into current flood mitigation and response protocols as well as feasible alternatives. The partnerships will also promote community engagement, such as through educational project fact sheets, online surveys, etc. Partnerships and community engagement efforts will offer substantial benefits towards project implementation and risk

mitigation...WHICH IS THE ULTIMATE GOAL. Task 5: Evaluation of Mitigation Alternatives - A wide array of mitigation alternatives will be considered to reduce flood risks AND increase flood risk awareness considering current conditions, as well as future conditions. Climate change, new development patterns, population change, and other environmental factors all will be considered for future conditions. A 'no-action' alternative will be evaluated, providing a baseline for comparison to other alternatives, also outlining flood risks that will persist with no flood mitigation efforts. Flood mitigation alternatives will include nature-based solutions, structural and non-structural solutions, programmatic and procedural solutions all resulting in a more robust and resilient community response and risk-informed decisions to ever-changing conditions. Refer to the 'Alternatives' portion of this section for additional details and specifics pertaining to flood mitigation alternatives. Conceptual alternatives will be identified, and feasibility assessed based upon input and collaboration with stakeholders and other project partners. This information along with a preliminary benefit/cost assessment will then be used to determine feasibility for the identified projects and prioritize flood risk reduction actions that can be taken to mitigate flood risks in the study area. Task 6: Funding Strategy - A strategy will be developed in coordination with stakeholder collaboration for how to fund recommended structural, non-structural and programmatic mitigation alternatives. The strategy will consider external funding assistance such as grants from FEMA (HMGP or HMGP Post Fire). The strategy will also lay out recommended local funding responsibilities for the City (such as in the CIP), LLNRD, counties, communities and possible private entities. Task 7: FEMA Grant Application Development - A submittal-ready grant application for HMGP will be developed. The application will seek funding assistance for the highest priority, highest feasibility alternative evaluated as part of this assessment. The application will identify project costs and include a FEMA benefit-cost analysis where required. The application will also lay out local-share cost contributions for partner stakeholders, as well as a project schedule meeting grant requirements. Task 8: Deliverables - A draft flood mitigation assessment will be developed to describe the findings and summarize the mitigation alternatives. Potential summary of findings to include: hydrology and hydraulics results; collaboration and public engagement efforts; alternatives analyses and recommendations; funding strategies; grant application development; and associated figures and maps. The draft assessment will then be revised to incorporate input from the City and other stakeholders, and finalized.

**1.2 Project expenses:** Project expenses include those costs identified and approved in the application and budget. Documented pre-award costs related to the development of the grant application as noted in the subapplication and approved budget may also be used to meet local match requirements or reimbursed.

**1.3 Non-Federal Match:** This Grant Requires a non-federal match contribution of 25% of the total Grant budget. The non-Federal match is shared by the City of Columbus.

15.A. Ordinance No. 26-08 amending city code section 50.35 to add regulations regarding handling of solid waste.

**ORDINANCE NO. 26-08**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, NEBRASKA, AMENDING COLUMBUS CITY CODE (ORDINANCE NO. 24-01) SECTION 50.35 OF CHAPTER 50 OF TITLE V, TO ADD REGULATIONS REGARDING HANDLING OF SOLID WASTE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PORTIONS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM.

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus desires to amend city code to add regulations regarding the handling of solid waste.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 50.35 of Chapter 50 of Title V of the Columbus City Code shall be amended and revised to read as follows:

**Section 50.35 – Handling of Solid Waste**

- (A) No person shall accumulate, store, or dispose of solid waste upon any property in a manner that creates a nuisance, health hazard, or violates state or local regulations.
- (B) All solid waste generated on any property shall be removed and properly disposed of at least once per week. Disposal shall occur by:
  - (1) A licensed solid waste hauler; or
  - (2) The owner, occupant, or person in control of the property transporting such waste to the City of Columbus transfer station.
- (C) Solid waste shall be stored in suitable containers that prevent leakage, odor, and access by animals.
- (D) Open dumping and the burning of solid waste are prohibited within the city limits of Columbus.
- (E) The owner, occupant, or person in control of the property shall be responsible for compliance with this section.
- (F) All waste loads transported in vehicles shall be properly secured and covered; provided, however, this requirement shall not apply when the entire load of waste is of such bulk that it is unlikely that any of such waste will blow out of or fall out of the vehicle when being driven at the speed of 55 miles per hour.

Penalty, see § 50.99

Section 2. This Ordinance shall repeal all Ordinances or portions thereof and conflict herewith.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law. Publication shall be in pamphlet form as authorized by Nebraska Revised Statutes § 16-405 with distribution to be made by making copies available to the public upon request at the office of the city clerk.
