Motion carried unanimously.

There was a brief discussion regarding a School Climate Survey.

Motion by Sawle, seconded by Iverson to pause moving forward with a School Climate Survey until the district has a new Superintendent. Motion carried unanimously.

The superintendent interview questions were briefly reviewed. No action was taken.

Motion by Iverson, seconded by Woxland to approve the second reading and adopt the following policies: #422 – Policies Incorporated by Reference and #423 – Employee-Student Relations. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Iverson, seconded by Michel to interview all six candidates that applied for the Superintendent position. Motion carried unanimously.

The following candidates submitted the required application materials for the Superintendent position: Benjamin Bernard, Principal, St. Charles JR/SR High School, St. Charles, MN, Bradley Berzinski, Principal, Molalla High School, Molalla, OR, Dan Blankenship, Special Education Teacher, Southwest West Central Service Cooperative and STARRS Academy, Windom, MN, Craig Ihrke, Superintendent, Caledonia Area Schools, Caledonia, MN, Chad Pederson, K-12 Principal, Buffalo Lake Hector Public Schools, Hector, MN, Bill Walters, Superintendent, Alta-Aurelia Community School District, Alta, IA.

Other Superintendent search discussion items: The special meetings to conduct the first and second round of interviews were already scheduled. The following times were set for March 28th and 29th for the first round of interviews; 5:00, 6:15 and 7:30 each night. The interview protocol was reviewed. Amy Woxland will make reference check calls on March 30th. Sample reference check questions were also reviewed. No action was taken.

Community Education - New Direction & Savings

The R-P District has been transferring money over a number of years to cover a recurring deficit within our preschool program that is one part of the overall Community Education Fund. Changes within the preschool program in 2018 quickly escalated this deficit to \$109,182 following the 2019-2020 school year.

Subsequent cost reduction changes within our preschool program and a transfer of \$36,750 from the General Fund helped to reduce this Community Education deficit to \$78,047 for FY2021. This \$78,047 deficit must be paid back to the General Fund.

With staff turnover came the opportunity to reorganize our programs with specific goals in mind.

- Cost Reduction - The #1 goal is to maintain and enhance programs and oversight while also stabilizing the Community Education budget.
- New direction for preschool, school aged child care, and community education
- Delegating public relations, fitness center, etc. to existing staff
- Facility management duties will be assigned to existing staff
- Replacing retiring head custodian and reorganizing oversight for building and grounds maintenance

The district hired a director for our school aged child care programs for the remainder of the 2021-22 school year and beyond. This director is also taking care of public relations needs and will serve as the district's Homeless Liaison.

A team effort was needed to cover community education during the 2021-22 school year with multiple people assisting. These duties will be integrated into the activity director's duties moving forward. Assisting in community education will be a current administrative assistant. Additional pay will result through an extended contract or stipend for summer work.

Preschool oversight will be integrated into the elementary principal's position with assistance from the preschool teacher on Fridays of each week. No additional pay.

Head custodian will be replaced by promoting an existing custodian to a building lead position. Oversight of building and grounds will be integrated into the duties of our activity director.

Overall savings for the district will be approximately \$66,282 with \$11,985 of those dollars benefiting the Community Education Fund.

Impact of savings within Community Education

The portion of district wide savings that will impact the Community Education Fund will be \$11,985. This results after 50% of Mr. Loney's teaching salary is moved from the General Fund to the Community Education Fund.

Mr. Loney's teaching will be covered by an existing teacher. The current 2nd grade will move from 3 sections to 2 sections in third grade and the extra teacher will move to special education. The part-time special education teacher hired in February of the 2021-22 school year will not return.

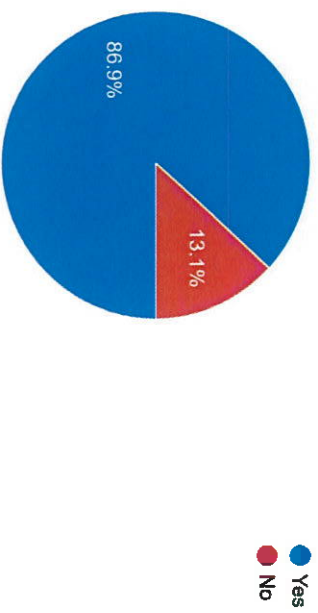

Negotiations with our E.S.P. has been progressing nicely and I do anticipate that we'll have a settlement to be approved by the Board at our May meeting.

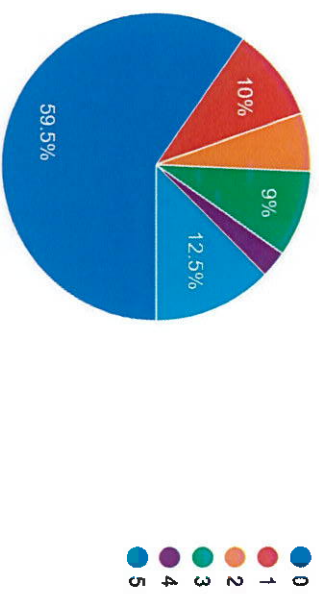
Do you eat hot lunch at school?

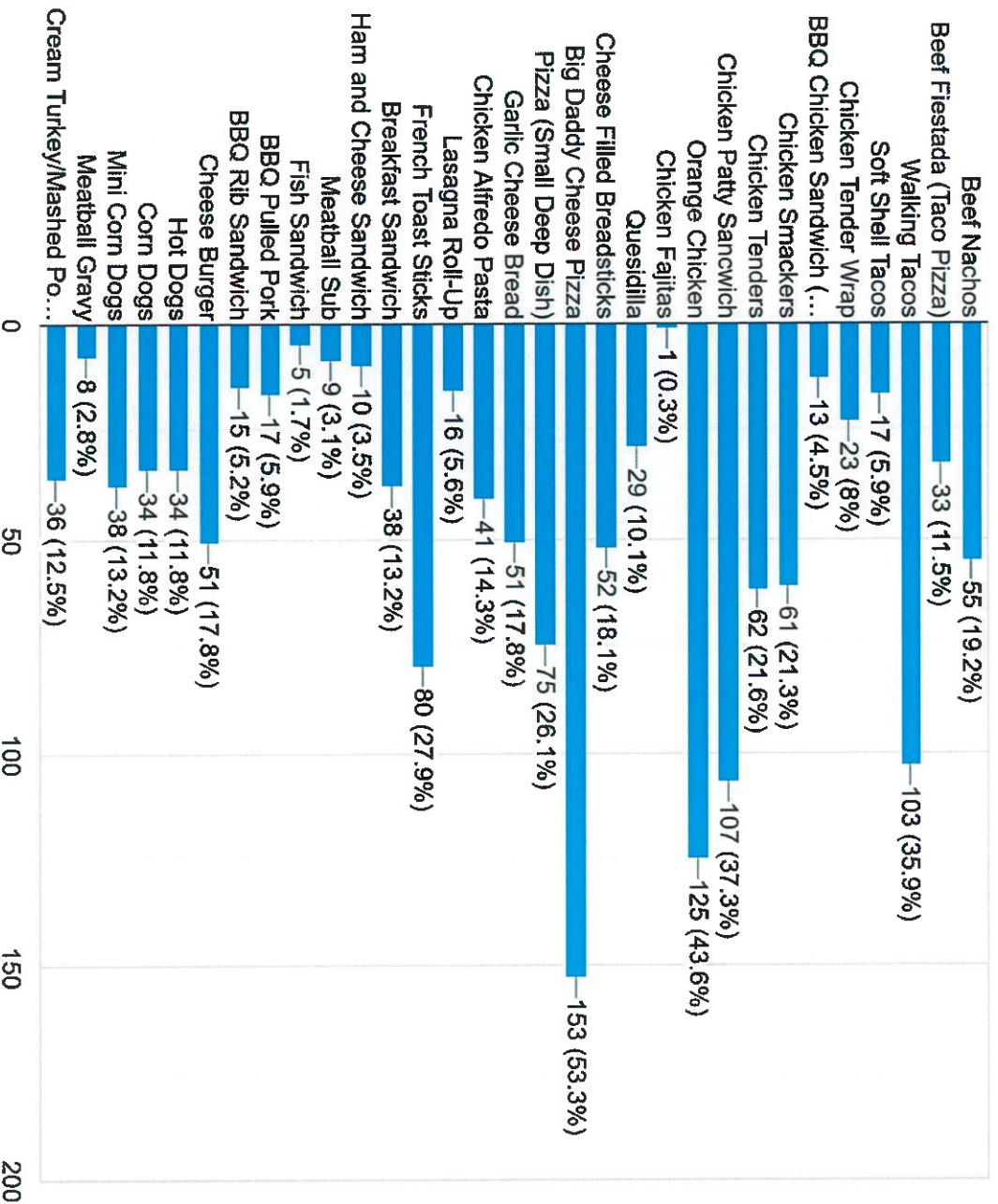
How often each week to you bring a lunch from home?

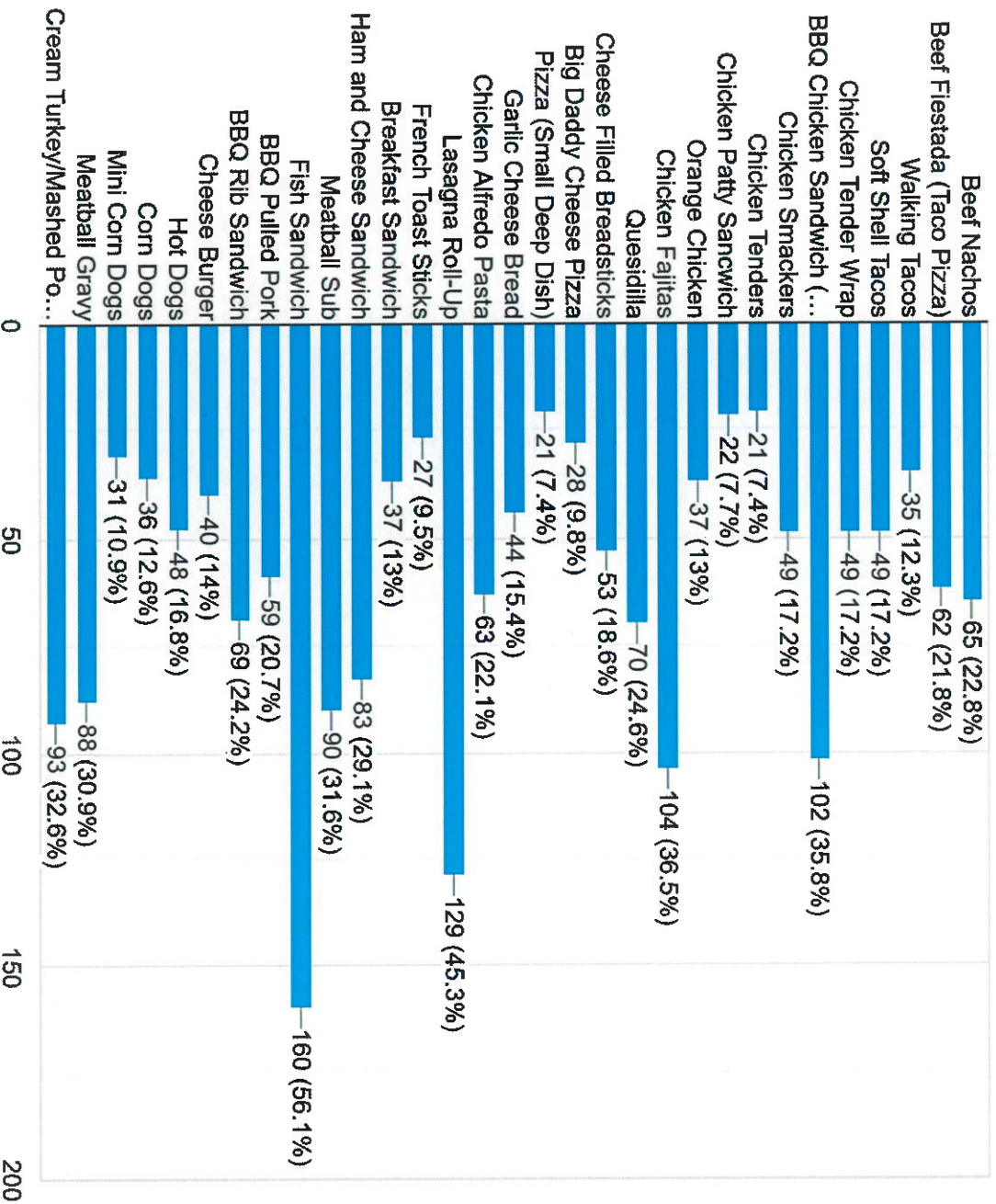
Please select your three FAVORITE school lunches.
